Both clinics kept growing in June, together crossing 11,000 people served since launch.

## Dear Kwanda,

June was another strong month across both of your clinics. Together, Safe City and Care Circle have now served **11,195 people since launch**, continuing the momentum from last month's 10,000-patient milestone.

**Safe City** served 353 patients in Oworoshoki, with returning patients making up over two thirds of all visits – a sign of the deep trust the team continues to build in the community. **Care Circle** served 348 patients in Itire-Surulere, staying above 300 patients for the fourth month running, with new patients again making up well over a third of all visits.

### WHO WE ARE REACHING

Safe City patients live on an average of **\$7.06 per person per month** -- still well below the poverty line, and still without any affordable alternative for primary care.

### WHERE PATIENTS CAME FROM

Patients came from **Oworoshoki, Mushin (12.1 km away), Bariga (5.3 km away), and Ebute Metta**. Returning patients made up over two thirds of all visits this month, a continuing sign of trust in the community.

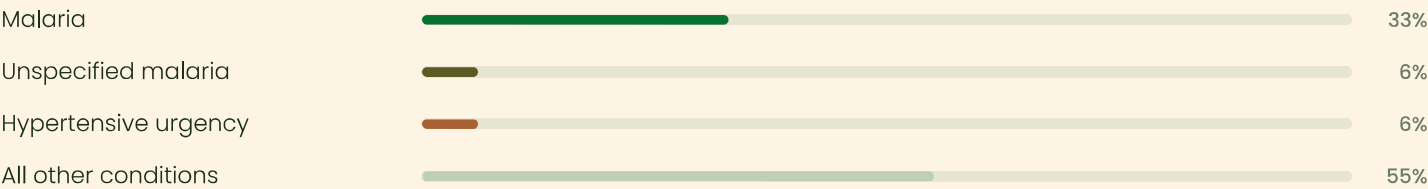

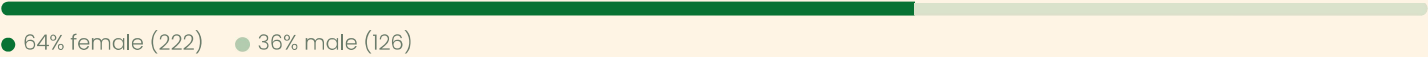

The average Care Circle patient lives on **\$5.08 per person per month** -- a household of four surviving on ₦28,808. The global poverty line is \$2.15 a day. For these families, free care is not a convenience -- it is the only option.

**Sustainability in action:** Care Circle's community plastic waste collection centre converted waste into cash again this month, directly supporting clinic operations. Each bag collected also eliminates a mosquito breeding site -- cutting malaria risk in the same community the clinic treats for it. One act, two impacts.
