## Suggested Themes for Term Papers

(students may suggest their own subjects to instructor)

- 1. Describe the character and career of the itinerant preacher, as he emerges from the tales and legends in <u>In Praise of the Baal Shem Tov</u>. (For general context of <u>Maggidim</u> throughout history, see <u>Jewish Encyclopedia</u>, vol. VIII, pp.252b ff., and Louis I. Newman, <u>Maggidim and Hasidim: Their Wisdom</u>, Bloch, 1964, pp. xliii-lv). Then compare results with Joseph G. Weiss, "A Circle of Pneumatics in Pre-Hasidism," <u>Journal of Jewish Studies</u>, VIII (1957).
- 2. Describe the self-image of the Besht, includig his vocation as a writer of amulets, as it emerges from the stories in <a href="In Praise...">In Praise...</a>. How does this self-image compare with what others thought of him?
- 3. Compare the self-image of the Besht, as evident from <u>In Praise</u>..., with the self-image of R.Isaac Luria as it emerges from <u>Tales in Praise of the Ari</u>, by Klein (Jewish Publication Society, 1970)
- 4. Collect and delineate the anti-Rabbinic nuances in <u>In Praise</u>... and compare your results with the attitude of R.Yaakov Yosef of Polonnoye (see Dresner, <u>The Zaddik</u>...).
- 5. Describe and analyze the attitudes of <u>In Praise</u>... to the following three groups: Sabbatians, Frankists, Christians.
- 6. How does <u>In Praise</u>... deal with sexuality? What picture does it give of the mores of the <u>shtetl</u> of thosedays? Waht is its attitude to women?
- 7. According to <u>In Praise...</u>, what were the relations between the Besht and R. Gershon of Kutov? and R. Yaakov Yosef?
   and the Great Maggid? On all three, cf. Wiesel, <u>Souls on Fire</u>.
- 8. Hasidic Thought as reflected in Hasidic music. See A.Z. Idelsohn, <u>Jewish Music and its Historical Development</u>, and Velvel Pasternak, <u>Songs of the Chassidim</u>.
- 9. Compare the differing perspectoves on the nature and value of Hasidic story-telling and legend of the following: M.Buber (Introduction to <u>Tales of the Hasidim</u>; "Interpreting Hasidism," in <u>Commentary</u>, Sept. 1963); Scholem ("Martin Buber's Hasidism," in <u>Commentary</u>, Oct. 1961 -- reprinted in his <u>The Messianic Idea in Judaism</u>, Schocken 1971); Wiesel (<u>Souls on Fire</u>).
- \*10. Compare the treatment of the Besht and the early movement by Graetz; Dubnow, <u>Toledot Ha-Hasidut</u>, chap.1; Horodetzky, in his preface to his edition of <u>Shivhei Ha-Besht</u>.
  - \*11. The Besht as a scholar of Halakhah and Kabbalah. Compare the treatment by <u>In Praise.</u>.. with Scholem's article in <u>Molad</u> (XVIII),1960.

- 12. Develop the following concepts as they appear in <u>In Parise</u>... :
  a) Prayer; b) <u>Devekut</u>; c) observance of the commandments
- 13. The same for: a) saintliness (kedushah);b) ascetic practices
- 14. The same for: a) friendship; b) Ahavat Yisrael
- 15. Compare the attitudes to the Mitnagdim (with special attention to the Gaon of Vilna) by the Karlin Zaddikim and the mdur Hasidim (see W.Z.Rabinowitch, <u>Lithuanian Hasidism</u>)
- \*\*16. The famous Friday Night incident in Kotzk; summarize the treatment of the incident in Heschel, Kotzk, vol. II, pp.559 -577, and Wiesel, Souls on Fire.
- \*17. Prepare a summary of one of the following (of the series edited by Bromberg , 5000 (500, 500) and compare with the treatment by Wiesel (Souls...)
