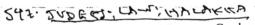

Better to move backward, let the wind have its way, but retain the sense of direction.

In the face of the storm it is often harder to fly backward than forward; and to do so with dignity demands more of people, as of gulls. True, flying backward, people and gulls alike make little progress. But they keep their sense of direction, know which way is forward.

Only with the marks along the way obliterated, humans, less fortunate than the gulls, can no longer depend upon that inner mechanism to inform them which way is forward. And those who sulk, lose composure, grow desperate, cry "all is lost," cannot understand the dilemma of gradual retreat while keeping sight of the goal.

Soloveitchik was invited to address an event at the Chaim Berlin School in Stone Avenue, Brooklyn, in 1942, he said the following: What is the difference between working for a Synagogue and working for a Yeshiva? This can be compared to builders and farmers.

Builders are engaged in something very constructive, something very important. In addition, the builder gets pleasure out of the immediate gratification of his ambitions and he sees the structure rising before his eyes and then reaching perfection. However, once it is done, it is done, and it is then subject to the vicissitudes of climate, accident, and natural decay.

A farmer, contrariwise, must control his desire for immediate satisfaction, and delay his gratification. He plants seeds which take a long time to grow, and trees even longer. However, once he has done this, he now not only has the fruit or grain, but also seeds for future generation and in future areas.

Working for a Synagogue is like constructing a building. You have it, it is a thing of beauty and holiness -- but it usually does not and cannot endure. However, working for a Yeshiva or a day school is like planting a tree or seeds -- it is the agriculture of culture, seeding the future in the present, and the consequences of one's efforts last on and on.

And so he is skeptical about progress as the march of humanity toward a well-defined goal, and prefers what his contemporary Karl Popper described as piecemeal engineering, that is, mending and improving upon those areas of human activity in which we may be able to predict the outcome of our deeds.
