You will also notice that our motto is engraved on it. It shows that life is precious and the pre-requisite to the carrying out of the tasks ahead. It urges us to make His way our way. It also reminds me of one of the speeches of Rabbi Lamm where he points out that whilst the making of images of God is strictly prohibited

^{אנחנו} in His image. Our life has to be a reflection of His ideals. By our life we have to show and bear witness to His creation and through our life we have to aim at realizing His Teachings.
