JEWISH WAR PLEA! VEXES PRESIDENT

Opposition to Vietnam Aims Proves Worry to Johnson

WASHINGTON, Sept. 10—President Johnson had another opportunity this week to raise with Jewish visitors one of his persistent plaints about some members of the American Jewish community.

The President was reported to have commented to the leaders of the Jewish War Veterans of the United States of America that sentiment in the Jewish community puzzled him, for he knew Jews to be highly moral and compassionate, among the best-informed on foreign affairs, deeply concerned about Communist rule in other nations and eager for the United States to support other small countries, such as Israel.

Veterans Back Policy

Mr. Tarlov and several associates reported to Mr. Johnson on their organization's support of his stand in Vietnam after a vigorous debate at their national convention last month in Atlantic City.

Touchy Issue in Israel

The Israeli Government has supported the Administration's policies in Vietnam, partly because it feels dependent on a vague commitment of military support from the United States. Another reason is the Israeli Government's gratitude for the economic aid and military equipment sales made possible by the Johnson Administration. The Israelis, however, are worried that lack of support

The Israells, morried that lack of support for the President among American Jews might injure their interests in the United States. They, too, have therefore urged leaders of the Jewish community to try to contain the criticism.

Majority Worried

American Jewish organizations are divided on the issue of Vietnam, but the majority have voiced concern over escalation of the war.

Some Orthodox spiritual leadors have privately expressed concern that the spread of Communist domination is usually accompanied by suppression of Jewish cultural and spiritual rights.

- 1. Withdraw from Vietnam and let the Communists win the war by default? Remember Chamberlain, Munich, Hitler and Appeasement? We'd only be forced to fight a bigger war somewhere else!
