## Talk to First Year Students/RIETS-5/4/01

1. Franz Rosenzweig/The Inaugural Address of the Frankfurt Lehrhaus; 1920:

"Then came the Modem Age. At one blow, it vastly enlarged our intellectual horizons and our very lives. The teaching of Judaism struggled to keep pace with this rapid expansion. What was new was not so much the collapse of the ghetto wall; even previously the Jew moved beyond the bounds of the ghetto. What was new was not that the Jew's feet could now take him farther than ever before. The new feature was that the wanderer no longer returned at dusk. The gates of the ghetto no longer closed behind him, allowing him to spend the night in solitary learning. And gradually, the wanderer found his spiritual and intellectual home outside the Jewish world.

We are the children of those wanderers..."

- **2.** Our dilemma: Our audience—syngg/school=the "wanderers," w homes elsewhere, while *our* in a main is the מקום...How reach them wo diluting our message, diminishing selves?
- **3.** First: Strengthen yourselves in ת״ת וגם באמונה...
- \*תורה exploit yr opportunities here...no outside jobs/school (unless permission ZC). Throw yrslvs into lrnng...& no neglect חשאר ירקות...
  - \*אמונה always rmmbr the שמע סעי"ן רבתי not שמא—not ....
- 4. 2<sup>nd</sup>: I-o to reach Wanderers, need t *communicate & persuade*. Can't do that successfully if appear dogmatic/unthinking... So how reconcile *conviction & communic'n?* שמש and אמש?
  - \*on basics—all שמש;
  - \*on applications—צשמאַ;
  - \* Inwardly—<u>ש</u>מש; outwardly must be שמא NOTE: שמא
- 5. Elaborate on שמא:
  - \*not=mealy-mouthed; just not dogmatic...
  - \*enough real and to keep you tolerant/respectful
  - \*& don't disparage ח"ח even if opposed own rebbeim; דן לכף זכות לכף זכות ריש לקיש מנהגו באוריתא סגין הוה נפיק ליה לבר מתחומא דשבתא והוא לא ידע ריש לקיש מנהגו באוריתא סגין הוה נפיק ליה לבר מתחומא דשבתא והוא לא ידע לקיים מה שנ' באהבתה תשגה תמיד(--ירושלמי ברכות פ"ה דף ט ע"א) in context="reel," be fartumelt by; but pun: תשגה)

<u>Note:</u> no question his ש"ר", no whisper'g campaigns; only—respect f hs greatenss, no assumption of guilt, knowing that Torah permits unconventional lives as well as conventional,
