Dear Rabbi Dr. Lamm.

I just received Abe's letters of 13th and 18th March and we are definitely making progress. I also snatched some hours to copy Rabbi Apple's tapes and hope to send them to you still this week.

May I digress for a minute and refer to a theme developed by you suggesting that when we are introduced to new perposes we should not so much refer to their profession or activities, but develop a sensitivity to the human being as we meet him or her.

Now, in the past, it has been my custom to say a couple of words when introducing friends and acquaintances and I felt that to know something of their activities and past achievements may be a great help in developing a contact between those people who make an acquaintance for the first time. If I understood the words on the tape correctly you do not seem to be in favour of this, but on the other hand I may have misunderstood you and therefore I raise this point.

Whilst the seminars are taking shape, I will have to consider the individual or series of lectures which some of our American visitors may want to give to the groups whom you addressed in Melbourne and Sydney and to groups in Adelaide, Brisbane and possibly Perth. Since you know the people and since you have had the reaction of the various groups with whom you were in contact, it would be exceedingly helpful if we could get some guidance and reaction from you on this point.
