Dear Rabbi Lamm:

I take this opportunity to once again express to you and your family, my best wishes for 5727. May the New Year bring good health, nachas from family and achievements and exciting opportunities to continue the upbuilding of Torah life in the American Jewish community.

Because of the high esteem in which you are held in our Rabbinic Alumni ranks, we are inviting you again this year to participate in the Shimush Program. This course which is being implemented due to the leadership and cooperation of the Yeshiva University Rabbinic Alumni will now, for the first time, be an accredited course toward the Masters Degree in the Department of Supplementary Rabbinic Training at Rabbi Isaac Elchanan Theological Seminary, Yeshiva University. Each participating student will be assigned to a Metropolitan New York area rabbi, as well as to an out of town rabbi. Essentially, in addition to the Sabbath visitation to your community and home, you would be asked to arrange at mutually convenient times, as the occasions arise, for the student to accompany you when you officiate at religious ceremonies. Our first class session, when a student will be assigned to you, will take place on October 14th, 1966. Until then, I really will not know how many students have registered for the program. I am enclosing, for your general information, the letter that was sent to the students, together with an outline of the requirements they must fulfill within the period of one year.

It is of prime importance for all participating rabbis to assist us in evaluating the young semicha students by noting their comments on several evaluation sheets which I will send along to you shortly, together with record sheets upon which we would ask you to kindly record that the student did attend services, preach, accompany you at a funeral, unveiling, wedding etc. These record sheets should be returned to my office so that we may provide the student with credit for the Masters Degree when he has completed all requirements.

Your personal guidance and that of your "Ayshes Chayil" will, I am sure, be of great significance to the semicha student (and his wife). More than anything else, it is important for those of our colleagues in the rabbinate to enthusiastically encourage these young men to enter the field so that they might taste of the rewards which have made your own rabbinic experience so satisfying and have enabled you to achieve prominence in the Torah community.

All of us on staff hope and pray that this course will, in some measure, encourage more of these semicha students to take their rightful place as leaders in the Jewish community. Your role will be unlimited in helping us achieve this goal. We are most grateful to you and your wife for your generous hospitality to the semicha students and for the spiritual inspiration which you will provide.

Dear Semicha Student:

I take this opportunity to wish you and your dear ones a Gemar Chasima Tova. May 5727 be a fruitful year of study and growth as a student in our Semicha program. In order to assist you in preparing for the exciting challenges in the rabbinate as a career, our Shimush program is being offered as a regular course in the Department of Supplementary Rabbinic Training and is listed in the bulletin as "SR 123" under the title, "Rabbinic Practicum."

This Shimush Rabbinic Training program which I will be privileged to coordinate will provide one academic credit toward the Masters Degree for thirty credited hours of practical rabbinics training. The Rabbinic Practicum will be conducted in cooperation with a large number of our outstanding musmachim serving orthodox synagogues in greater New York and out of town. With their cooperation, you will be introduced to the various functions of the rabbi, as the head of a congregation, as a religious functionary and as a religious leader in the community at large. The course will be designed to provide opportunities for you to spend three Shabbosos with two rabbis (one out of town) and to team up with them during a given period of several weeks so that you may become familiar with synagogue administration, adult education, afternoon or Day School proceedings and The enclosed cultural meetings with youth groups, etc. sylbbus outline will give specific allocation of course hours for each experience. In all instances, evaluation sessions will be arranged on given Friday mornings for an exchange of ideas and discussion about these experiences.

For those of you planning to enter the field of Chinuch, we will arrange for you to meet with a leading rabbinic educator in a nearby Day School or community Talmud Torah. Here you will gain insights in the administration, curriculum development, teacher-principal relations, guidance, and the general role of the rabbinic educator vis a vis his pulpit colleague.

I urge you to register immediately for the Shimush Program - "Rabbinic Practicum" SR course 123. Our first meeting will take place on Friday, October 14th, 1966 from 11:00 A.M. to 12:40 P.M. in room 309 Furst Hall, Yeshiva University. I and my colleagues on staff look forward with anticipation to the privilege of working closely together with you in your practical development as you prepare to serve the Jewish community in a rabbinic or educational career.
