This letter concerns the note to me by Mr. Feurestein on May 4, 1962, a copy of which I sent to you.

I quite agree with him that "Mebasser" leaves much to be desired. There has been too much reprinting of trite sermons and other collections of platitudes, and too little evidence of creative material relevant to Indian Jewry.

I would appreciate it if you would, in your next letter to Jhirad, emphasize the above as well as the three points made by Moe.

Enclosed you will find a letter from Jhirad to me, which came together with a copy of a letter he sent to you.

I think its in place for you to answer the letter he mailed directly to you. Meanwhile, would you do me a personal favor and include in it mention of the fact that I am presently much too occupied to write to him, and that if Providence should once more send me to India I would be most happy to fulfill his personal requests.
