

ענין 'רצון לעוון

Dear Rabbi Lamm

Hello and שלום. I'm an admirer of your book Torah for Torah's Sake which is useful for clarifying the conceptual disagreements between the "Lithuanian" yeshiva world and the Chassidic world.

I have a question that I appreciate your addressing. On page 146 of your book you quote Rabbi Nachum of Chernobyl quoting the צ"ח that one who performs מצוות is greater than one who learns about the מצוות. This idea you present as a "ענין" of the צ"ח.

I see, I think, a resemblance between the צ"ח and הלכותא. In שו"ת קצ"ח (page 500 in Rabbi Raffach's edition) he critiques the "צ"ח" who studies מצוות but doesn't perform them. He goes to the extreme of saying *אם לא עשה מצוות לא יקרא חכם* *אם לא עשה מצוות לא יקרא חכם* *אם לא עשה מצוות לא יקרא חכם*

I don't know if the צ"ח was influenced by ר"ם especially since the tension between a life devoted to study and a life combining study and deeds goes back a long way. So I don't know if ר"ם is the originator of his idea. It just seems to me that ר"ם by praising the מצוות of אברהם/יצחק/יעקב in this way, does, in a way, prefigure the צ"ח.
