show your hatred of the Catholic
Church. Perhaps it may surprise you
to hear that on special occasions
the Jewish people are prayed for in
all our churches, can you say as
much about yours? During World War
II, the Pope saved hundreds of Jews,
even kept them hidden in the Vatican,
from Hitler and his army. Christ our
Lord was a Jew, and gave His life
for all, but He was too lowly
to suit the Jews. No wonder He
left over Jerusalem, and the Gospel
tells us, "He came unto His own, and
His own received Him not." You a
Rabbi ought to have charity in your
heart for all. Remember, this country is
for Jews and Gentiles, and also that
you should all study the Ten Command-
ments, and devote much ^{more} time to chasing
