

### From the Rabbi's Desk

### Congratulations are in Order

Rabbi Dr. Norman Lamm was elected President of Yeshiva University in August and we unitedly extend our warm wishes to him and yasher koach to the Board of Trustees. Dr. Lamm, a classmate of mine in yeshiva, assumes this august office with a prestigious reputation as a prolific writer, scholar, orator, philosopher and a deeply committed love of Torah and Israel. I have had the privilege of knowing him well for almost three decades. He is successor to the sainted genius, Dr. Samuel Belkin 5"? and we pray that G-d crown Dr. Lamm, (Y.L.) with success in maintaining our great yeshiva and ascending to even greater heights for the honor of G-d, the Torah, and Klal Yisrael.

This past summer another reason for Jewish pride entered our history, the rescue in 90 minutes at Entebbe of over 100 hostages from the brink of death at the hands of terrorists directed by a syphilitic madman of Uganda. The daring Operation Thunderbolt was spectacular and ended miraculously. Despite the death, tragically, of innocent Jews, including a 75 year old lady on her way to a simcha, a blow was struck against international terrorism and Israel manifested heroically that the holocaust will not happen again.

As we approach the Yamim Noraim, the Days of Judgment when "all who come into this world pass before Him as sheep before a shepherd, we are obliged to consider what this event means to us. Is it only another incident in the long history of our people which we will read with some interest in the future? I suggest that the hand of G-d was seen once again in this unprecedented act of chesed, kind-

We must reach out to every Jew regardless of their religiosity or lack of piety—the 500 soldiers who participated in Entebbe did not ask whether the hostages preferred kosher food or not, whether they prayed or not. I suggest that you and I make it our serious business to greet every Jew warmly, invite our neighbors into our Young Israel family, eschew definitively any negative views and expressions about our fellow Jews, and by our expression of love bring further miracles of G-d to bring the final redemption. May this year be blessed with peace. May we be inscribed for a good and sweet year.
