Dear Rabbi Lamm,

First, I would like to thank you on my behalf and on P.S.'s as well, for all the help and support you gave us during our stay in the United States. I do believe that without your moral support and warm endorsement of our cause, we definitely would not have been as successful as we were. I know that you do not, normally, become involved in causes such as ours, and for that reason, we are doubly indebted to you.

I feel terrible at the inconvenience which the Robin affair has caused you. P.S. and I left instructions with Sheffer and Kahn to take care of any monies that would reach you for any reason. I called Sheffer and Kahn this Thursday - immediately after receiving your letter, and instructed Kahn to see to it that the \$400 are sent to you without delay.

I will contact them in a few days to see whether the matter has been taken care of. I won't leave it until I am sure that they have taken care of the money and that the \$400 are in your hands. It may take a little while, but I guarantee that we will straighten it out or make a bundle.

Here, everything is o.k. we are indeed busy, but we are achieving excellent results. Our initial optimism as to the results of the N.Y. trip is being borne out by the field work that we are doing in 94 towns and cities and we are confident that we will succeed.

Please write me about your plans. What have you worked out at Yeshiva? How about C.A.P.? What is new with the Myerovitch Fellowship? Do you intend visiting Israel soon? Please keep us informed. I shall hope we will maintain a constant correspondence.
