Dear Rabbi Klavan:

At the end of last month, I sent a note to Rabbi Levovitz concerning ways of increasing the distribution of TRADITION and A TREASURY OF TRADITION. In it, I made some recommendations, which would include the above, whereby a great deal of publicity could emanate from the RCA and be used officially by synagogue bulletins.

I realize that we have had a very busy convention in Israel in the meantime, but I hope the letter will not be a total loss. I have received no acknowledgement of it as yet either from Rabbi Levovitz or from yourself or Rabbi Wurtzburger, to whom I sent copies.

Upon rereading my suggestion, I think it has merit and humbly suggest that it be pursued by the Executive.
