L. GREETING.

- A. Pleasure to be with you on this first Annual Chanukah Banquet since my coming to Springfield. All this past year ll\(\frac{1}{2}\) months have had series of "firsts" lst High Holidays, Purim, Simchas Torah etc. This is the "last of my firsts", for in a very short time I will have completed the first cycle in Kodimoh.
- B. Ordinarily, would say it is inappropriate to have a Kodimoh Festival, a purely Congregational celebration, on Chanukah. EIN ME'ARVIN SIMCHAH BE'SIMCHAH, ... so as not to detract from either one (thus, weddings on Cho. Hamoed, Purim etc.) But today both Kodimoh's personal and Isreal's national Chanukah Festivals coincide in essence: LO VA'CHAYIL VE'LO BA'KOACH KI IM BE'RUCHI AMAR HA'SHEM TZVA'OS. And what is all this if not a festivity in honor of our purpose which is the RUACH, the sprit of Torah and Judaism.

II. PROGRAM REVIEW AND PREVIEW.

- A. The program of Kodimoh in its ritual, educatuonal, administrative and auxilliary aspects is actually the story of the implementation of that RUACH, that Divine-like spirituality, in all phases of our congregational life. All that has been done and that will be done, is geared to that premise that the primary function of a synagogue is nothing if not the advancement of the RUACH HA'SHEM TZVAOS, the advancement of Torah in the lives of those whom Kodimoh serves.
- B. I have been asked to present to you, in brief outline form, both a review of the past year and some previews of what we expect this coming year, Please G-d.I shall not, however, make that clean-cut division of review and preview, of last year and next year. At the present we are in a state of flux, of continuing activity and progress. A great Hebrew poet once said something which in English would be, "Today by tomorrow will be yesterday". Let us look upon Kodimoh's program as a continuous and unbroken program of implementing RUACH HA'SHEM, the Spirit of Judaism and Torah.

C. RITUAL

1. High Holidays. Pre-Slichos Social (type of Service, attendance, young people);
Distribution of Honors with formality & dignity befitting the occasion; same principle in matter of notification of honors, the dress of the official and officers of the synagogue; Yizkor Service was made more true to its real aim by certain revisions.

2. Other. Bar Mitzvahs according to set pattern, no speeches; Torah Reading so that less time-consuming; additional Sunday morning Minyan-Breakfast. Plant to continue all this, improve from time to time; plan something special coming Shvuoth.

3. Friday Nite Late Services. Gave talks more character of lecture than sermon. Some new, young faces being seen. Attempted experiment whereby some changes introduced. I FAILED. THE EXPERIMENT DID NOT SUCCEED. As a result, we had to scrap the venture, at least for the present.

May I add, in passing, that I am not ashamed of admitting the faliure.

It is true that I am fa still far from satisfied with conditions as they are.

But— and I hope others will understand me — I prefer to know in the future that

I tried and failed that never to have tried at all. This holds true for all thatI

mention — much of what we attempt may fail. But al least we will have the
satisfaction of having tried. It is far more honorable than doing mothing.

III. INSTALLATION .

A. THE BOARD MEMBERS.

- 1. Chanukah represents not only a military victory, but a spiritusl triumph as well. The reason for the title CHANUKAH is that in those days they celebrated the CHANUKAS HA'MIZBEIACH, the rededication of the Altar. Today we too indulge in a sort of CHANUKAS HAMIZBEIACH. It is the rededication of the ALTAR OF SERVICE, the Installatuon of those who minister at this Altar of Service. It is the CHANUKAS HA'BOARD OF DIRECTORS.
- 2. Call Names; ask to Rise.
- 3. The MIZBETACH which is Kodimoh is in your keeping. You are entrusted with its safety and care. Like the Kohanim of old, do you too remember that the care of this Altar is not only a privelege but a heavy responsibility. Bring to this Altar of Service the diligence and vigilance upon which its safety depends; the solemn sense of dedication and loyalty which have imbued you with the willingness to accept the charge; the talents with which G-d has graced you.
- 4. Our sages of old said: MIZBETACH NIVRA LE'HAARICH YAMAV SHEL ADAM, the Altar was created to lengthen the days of man. May the Altar of Public Service at which you now rise to minister, fill lengthen your days and those of your dear ones; may it fill those days with the joy that comes from a selfless task well-done; with the happiness of a mission successfully acheived; and with the knowledge that you have served G-d and advanced the cause of Israel. May it bring a blessing into your homes, even as you strive to bring blessing into the lives of others.

B. THE GABBAIM.

- 1. Chanukah is one of two holidays on which we reite soecial thanksgiving prayers which we introduce with a short verse which reads: AL HA'NISSIM VE'AL HA'PURKON VE'AL HA'GVUROS V'AL HA'TESHUOS V'AL HA'MILCHAMOS SHE'ASSISA LA'AVOSEINU BA'YAMIM HA'HEIM BA'ZMAN HAZEH, We than Thee for the Miracles, Redemption, Mighty Deeds, Triumphs and Battles, which Thou didst perform for our our fathers in those days at this season.
- 2. I like to think that this verse describes as well the tasks and duties of our Kodimoh Officers.
- 3. First, AL HA'NISSIM. For the Miracles. To my mind it is a sheer miracle that a synagogue membership is not in revolt and does not vibbently depose its GABBAIM. I do not envy their duties. Imagine having to satisfy over 400 members, each and every one of whom is convinced that he has been purposely mistreated and should get Shlishi or Shishi or Maftir every other Shabbos. For the GABBAIM to still maintain their equanimity and Congragational Peace is a true miracle. It is even a miracle that they manage to multiply the Hosafos in geometric progressioj and still keep the Rabbi from complaining.

 ***ST: many kinds miracles...two Hassidim:My Rebbe miracle that G-d peforms His will...yours: miracle he performs G-d's will...**Our Gabbaim our such that

will...yours: miracle he performs G-d's will....**Our Gabbaim our such that we expect them to be pious, knowledgable Jews. The miracle is that G-d acts as a sort of super-Gabbai for them.

4. Call Names, Rise.

5. Your task, as Elders of Cong, a sacred one. Upon you depends the smooth and proper functioning SEDER HA'TEFILLAH. Go to your new duties with renewed vigor, dedication. Remain open new ideas, suggestions; so you can marshall all kinds forces, talents &ideas for accomplishment your noble lofty goals. And even as you peform Gd's will...kids, grandkids.

C. SEC*TREAS.

- 1. Next in the list of AL HANISSIM is Purkon and Gevuros, Redemption and Mighty Deeds.
- 2. In our Biblical and Talmudic languages, PURKON, or Redemption, has, frequently, a financial interpretation, even asit sometimes does in English. It means "to pull through", "to keep out of trouble". The Treasurer of the Synagogue, the Chancellor of Kodimoh's Exchequer, is the guardian of Purkon, or our Redemption.
- 3. The Secy of the Cong is the recorder of GEVUROS. Heis our official historian. From his MINUTES do we glean the HOURS of GEVURAH, of Spiritual Strength, religious Fortitude and Jewish Progress of our Congregation.
- 4. Call Names, Rise
- 5. (to Treas). Remember that the monies which pass thru your hands are not just so many dollars; they represent the devotions of a community, the concretized loyalty of a congregation. It is not merely money; it is value the kind of value that emanates not from a bankbook to a bank-acct, but from a prayerful heart to a Prayer-book and a House of Prayer. Let that knowledge be with youat all times. Let it lend to your mundane task the gracefulness of holiness. Let it imbue your mission with meaningfulness, and let it fill your life and the lives of your loved ones with the blessing which is your due.
- 6. (to Secy). Mr. Bernstein, your business in this administration is words. Buta secy is more than a Recorder, a human dictaphone. Also a lever of the Board, who can by insight and intelligence use his talents for the good of the Cong. and the glory of the G-d of Israel.

Words, Bernie, can be more than hollow phrases and prosaically recording dry facts. Words are wings of the mind, born in the heart, shaped on the tongue and recorded in the Minuted of the Cong, but whoch have the capacity to soar in hard and enduring syllables in the hearts of those who have come to dwell in the shadow of this Cong. Use those words in that manner, soas to make them thr records of GEVUROS, the mighty accomplishments of Kodimih. Use them as pellets of meaning with which to spur on your colleagues to new horizons, greater vistas and deper religiius experience in this House of G-d.

May G-d be with you and your family, and may your home be blessed by Him.

- 1. Must now instal 2 VPs.
- 2. VP is right-hand man Pres. Proper to refer to 2 VPs as the Two Right Hands of the Pres? if so, not far Rabbi, Rebitzen: 2 left feet.
- 3. TESHUOS. Triumphs. Precisely what expected of those in whom resides the fut hope for the Cong's future Triumphs. VP as Pres' Executive officer expected acheive, accomplish and be successful. Upon them that devolves task transforming the idea into fact, the plan into reality. VP has reached next to highest level of leadership. Sign to his fellow workers that the VP is what we expect and hope of him is: PERFORMANCE i.e. TESHUOS.
- 4. Call Ti White, Tillman.
- 5. Dr. Tillman: You not new this Cong. But this lst time you have been honored by coreligionists, & honored them by accepting, this office. You bring to it a personality clearly stamped with Sincerity, Loyal Devotions. We have no doubt you'll lend office Dignity & Distinction, Reliability & Loyalty. May you mix these ingredients well in the Crucible of your personality, add the catalyst of your own experience, and produce TESHUOS unending religious Triumphs, Spiritual Victories, and health of soul & mind for the entire community, and not the least for you, your dear wufe and your entire family.
- 6. Mr. WHITE, You seem to have endeared yourself to so many people in this Cong. We find in you a refreshing spirit combined with unfailijg loyalty to Kodimoh. We suspect that there where there is LIVELINESS, there will be found LIFE. Your TESHUOS, Triumphs, abve been many and diverse.

As you continue in this role, we thank you for your service in the past with the Traditional Hebrew greeting which expresses the hope that you comtinue it wever increasing vigor in the future: YE'YASHAR KOCHACH, May Your Strength Be Enhanced. May your Triumohs be many, and be greater. Let us conitnue to be warmed by your sincerity, your vitality, andthe appearance of Leadership qualoties in our younger ranks. With Patience, Love and Loyalty, remember that SOF HAKAVOD LAVO, that greater glories are yet to come.

The most appropriate charge I can give you is the one G-d gave your mamesake SOLOMON when he was installed as a Jewish leader, when he like you asked of G-d not riches, not personal gain, not even health, but something much more enduring:

**BECAUSE THOU HAST NOT ASKED FOR THYSELF LONG LIFE, OR RICHES, OR THE LIFE OF THINE ENEMIES, BUT HAS ASKED FOR THYSELF UNDERSTANDING AND WISDOM TO BISCERN JUSTICE, BEHOLD I HAVE DONE ACCORDING TO THY WORD, I HAVEXELFURNER SHALL GIVE THEE A WISE AND UNDERSTANDING HEART....AND I HAVE ALSO GIVEN THEE THAT WHICH THOU HAST NOT ASKED BOTH RICHES AND HONOR ALL THY DAYS. AND IF THOU WILT WALK IN MY WAYS, TO KEEP MY STATUTES AND MY COMMANDMENTS THEN I WILL LENGTHEN THY DAYS".

May G-d give all that to you, your dear wife, your entire family.

E. PRESIDENT.

- 1. Reread AL HA'NISSIM, translate (see P.3; III,B,1).
- 2. Miracles, Redemption, Might and Triumph are the expected accomplishments of the officers so far installed. But all nought, if not for Leadership, Foresight & Vision President, who is the General in the MILCHAMOS HA'SHEM, the Wars of the Lord.

Indeed, it is true: Relgious Leadership requires many of the hard qhalities of militart leadership: Vigilance, stamina, endurance towithstand opposition & criticism; courage to lead to new horizons; and a profound and unwavering commitment to the cause for which you are fighting.

Relgious leadrship, and Presidency of an ORTHODOX CONG in particular, means a conitinuing battle against a 3-eyed Monster: that is

- * Indifference
- * Ignorance
- * Inertia

It is a grueling tasl, and the battle is never over. Of course, the President has with him the Rabbi, whose life is dedicated just to this battle, and his officers. But he, by himself, must be willing, able and dedicated to the task.

- 3. Sam Black, Rise.
- 4. As Presidemt Of an ORTHOD CONG, you must tread a dangerous path. You must work with the Rabbi in ensuring Dignity & decorum, without letting it ossify into stuffihess and mere formality.

You must make the Synagogue attractive, without violating its holy funvtuon and reducing to a merely gorgeous show-place. You must lead in amanner which will be satisfying w.o. appeasing, pleasing but not obsequious.

You must remember, as an Orthodox lay-leader of this year 1954, that your loyalties must transcend local institutions. Remember that if it were not for its embodiment of the principles of Torah, Kodimoh would not be worth uir devotions. And that therefore your leaddship must extend outward too, remembering that CHAVEIRIM KOL YISRAEL, that all Israel is one.

Above all, remember that you now represent an Orthodox Synagogue. Toremember that at all times and under all conditions is a heavy burden and a wearying task.

But Kodimoh recognizes that in you it has found a valiant warrior in the MILCHAMOS HA'SHEM. It places in you its trust and congidence to guide its fortunes in this year to come. For it knows that you will do so in a most exemplary fashion, SHE'ASSISSA LA'AVOSEINU BA'YAMIM HA'HEIMERICAN FOR YOU have done so in years gone by. You have been battle-tested in the War for Torah, the War in which the secret weapons are Educatuon, Goodness, Humility and Sympathy.

Now, BAZMANHHAZEH, this time, this year, go forth into that battle with the knowledge that your congregation is with you, and that G-d will be with you. We place Kodimoh, this Fortress of Judaism, this Citadel of Torah, in you keeping. Do it Justice. "eep aloft the banner of Judaism. May you reap the spoils of victory in success for Kodimoh, in blessing for your wife and your home, and in the rich rewards of satisfaction and happiness in the pursuance of our common noble aims.
