Read Genesis 29:18-30, Isaiah 41:10, Psalms 23:1-6

Discussion Questions: Pick a few of the questions below to guide your time.

Starting Sharing: Choose a question or two to create openness.

- Share one takeaway from David and Blake's story. What inspired you and gave you hope?
- In your opinions, what makes relationships so complicated?
- How were you surprised to find such complicated relationships in the Bible?

Start Thinking: Choose a question or two to think critically about the subject.

- How could seeking God first save us from created or getting tangled in messy relationships?
- Why are we reluctant to turn to God when things are messy in our lives?
- Respond to the statement "no person will ever be enough only God is enough". What makes this difficult to truly accept?

Make it Personal: Choose a question or two to help you identify your best next step.

- Why is it hard to believe Jesus will never reject us?
- If you could uncomplicate a relationship, which one would that be?
- What does it look like to seek God first this week to help you win relationally?

Next Steps: Everybody has a next step. Check out some ideas below to help you grow by doing.

- **Seek God First-** Make God your first priority by spending time with Him. Our relationships con only win when He gets first place above our spouse, kids, friendships or dating relationships.
- **Be Straightforward-** The best way to keep relationships simple is to be honest and set the games aside. Communicate truth and grace and don't worry about image-management. Seek what is best for the other person by loving them out of the love you have received.
