



Digital Downloads

This PDF package has been put together to give you options when it comes to printing. Some PDF file downloads may contain some documents larger than an 8-1/2" x 11" image. Pages and patterns that are larger than 8%x11 have been provided in two formats:



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<u>Pattern PDF files</u> are typically laid out as follows: Cover (if applicable), instructions sheets (if applicable), pattern 1 – full sized, pattern 2 – full sized, pattern 2 – tiled, pattern 3 – full sized, pattern 3 – tiled. ...Etc.


<u>Doodle Page PDF files</u> are typically laid out as follows: Front – full sized, front – tiled, back – full sized, back – tiled (Some Doodle Pages do not have backs).

<u>eBook PDF files</u> contain 1 (one) full eBook. All pages in the PDF are full sized. This means that you may have to take the PDF to a print shop for certain oversized books if your home printer cannot print the larger pages.

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NOTE: Some patterns may reference tools, and other items no longer available.

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From Tony Laier's Bench: Concho & Bead Belt

Concho and Bead Belt

You will need:

5/32" Black Suede Lace 3" Nickel Austin IV Conchos Turquoise 8mm Pony Beads Silver Metallic 8mm Pony Beads

Step 1: Cut 5 pieces of lace, two times longer than waist size, plus 3 feet. For example, if waist size is 30 inches, each piece of lace will be 96 inches long.

Step 2: Lay 5 pieces of lace together, matching up ends. Fold lace in the middle, forming a loop (see Illus. A).

Step 3: Slide one concho onto lace, stopping 3 inches from loop formed in Step 2 (Illus. B). Keep lace separated into 5 lace groups.

Step 4: Slide Pony Beads onto laces as shown in illustration C. You will need 16 silver beads and 9 turquoise beads for each diamond-shaped section of beadwork.

Step 5: Continue adding conchos and bead sections (Illus. D) until you have approximately 1½ feet of lace fringe left. Make sure you end with a concho.

Step 6: To secure belt around waist, thread 1½ feet of lace fringe through loop formed in Step 2, and tie in an overhand knot (see Illus. E).
