

## Doodle Page Digital Download

This PDF file contains 1 (one) Doodle Page. The PDF has been put together to give you options when it comes to printing. Pages and patterns that are larger than 8½x11 have been provided in two formats:



#### 1) Full Size

If you would like to have a full size print out, take the full size pages to your local print shop and they can print it for you. All full size Doodle Pages are 11x17



#### 2) Tiled

The tiled pages give you the option of printing the full sized Doodle Pages at home. You print the tiled pages and then assemble them to make the larger patterns.


The Doodle Page PDF files are typically laid out like this:


Front – full sized, front – tiled, back – full sized, back – tiled (Some Doodle Pages do not have backs)

Please note: When printing on a home printer, the edges may get cut off. To avoid this, make sure "Page Scaling" is set to "Shrink to Printable Area" in the Adobe Reader print dialogue box. This will decrease the size of the Doodle Page a very small amount.



You may take this PDF file to your local print shop to have the full-size pages printed for your own personal use.





### **ECOLOGY**

Since Ecology has become a household word, we are constantly aware of the need to alert everyone of it's importance. To aid in this, many groups are being formed, and in case your group wants to utilize leather, here are some items that can be adopted.


**Billfold Design:** Bars and field behind the "E" should be dyed green.

Badge Design: This can be cut from a rounder. First, trace the "E" and the "dots". These dots are to guide the placement of Craftools Z999L and Z999R, also Z998. Use the heel of Z998 at the dot next to "E". Aim the point toward the outer dot. Strike this tool lightly. Use Z999L. Place curved end at outer dot and heel halfway between marks made by Z998. Strike lightly. Now, do the same with Z999R. When these are all located satisfactorily, place rounder on Poundo Board and repeat use of Z999L and Z999R. Only this time, strike hard enough to cut through the leather. Remove outside edge of rounder and attach pin. The pin is simply a small piece of leather with two holes punched. Push a safety pin through these and cement leather to badge.


Rounder Designs: Tracings include three items that can be promoted, but others can be substituted. These can be dyed and with pins attached to back, can serve as a badge. They can be attached to beads and worn as a necklace. They can be made into a concho belt for the ladies.

**Buckle:** You will need two pieces of leather. One for front and one for back. Back part should have base of four Dot Fasteners attached. This can be cemented to the carved front. Edge can be laced or smoothed with an edger.

**Belt:** The landscape should be in center of belt. Some of the suggested Ecology designs can be used to complete the belt. Measure belt to exact size and fix top of dot fasteners as shown on sketch. Rounder designs can be used as a buckle in the same manner if a round buckle is preferred to a rectangular one.







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
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
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PIN FOR REAR OF BADGE
