
Looking ahead, I am excited about the future. LifeSpire's organizational priorities include **people, operational excellence and growth and mission advancement.**

While we faced some challenges, 2022 was a strong year for Lifespire's family of communities. The first full year of operations at The Summit contributed \$8 million to LifeSpire's record high of \$110.2 million in total operating revenue for the year.

Independent living occupancy remained strong throughout the year, averaging 94.1 percent. Assisted living, memory support and health care occupancy averaged 88.2 percent for the year, resulting in overall average occupancy of 92 percent, well above national industry benchmarks.

The challenges we faced are the same challenges the entire senior living industry is facing: staffing, inflation and investment market volatility. Revenue fell short of expectations due to investment portfolio losses and staffing shortages that required us to reduce capacity in our health care areas. Expenses outpaced revenue, resulting in a \$4.4 million operating loss. Staffing and wage pressure continue to drive increasing salary and benefit costs. Over the last three years, we have experienced more than 37 percent growth in wages and related benefit expense. We recognized eight to 15 percent inflation depending on goods and services purchased. Our management team worked diligently to control expenses while maintaining the quality of service provided to residents.



Despite these challenges, we have been successful by continually benchmarking financial, operational and staffing metrics, vigilantly monitoring our budgets and making appropriate adjustments. Above all, our team members' passion and dedication are key to our success.

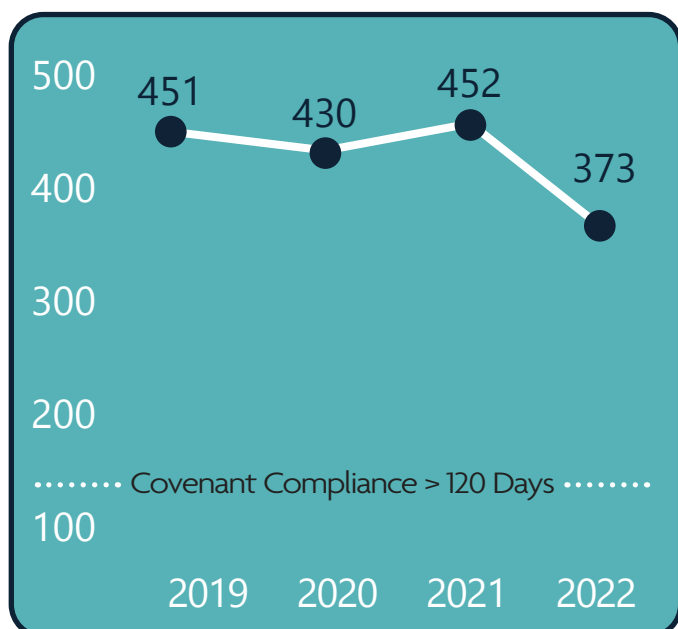

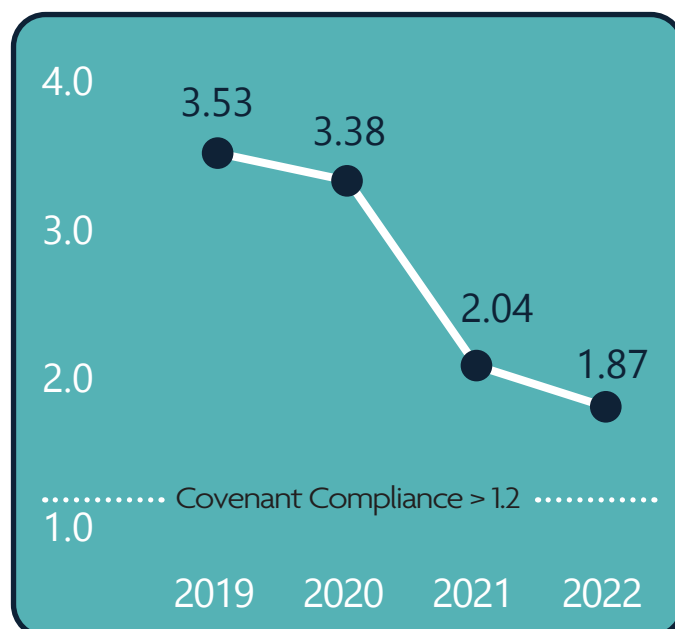

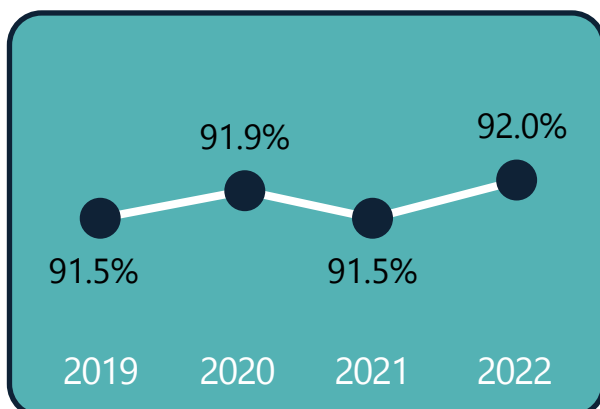

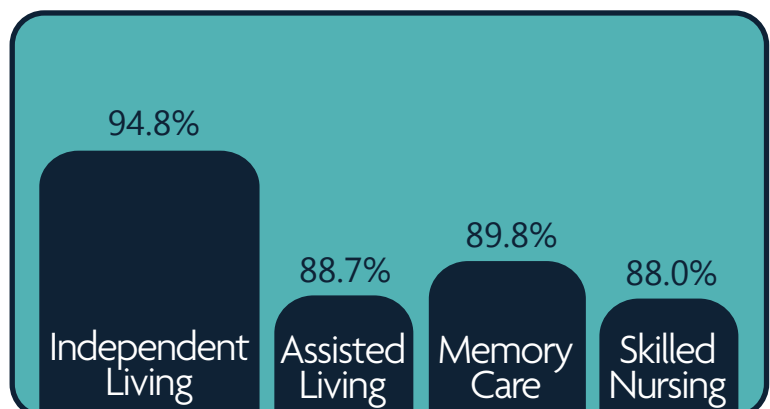
