SIBLING DISCOUNTS

Sibling discounts are applicable to tuition fees only.

- 2nd child discount of 15% of tuition fees.
- 3rd and subsequent child discount of 25% of tuition fees.

NOT INCLUDED IN TUITION FEE OR LEVY

- Camps (Year 5 and Year 7)
- Uniforms
- Most textbooks and stationery items for students in Prep to Year 9 (as per lists provided in Term 4 2021)
- · General non-compulsory activities: optional overseas trips (Year 9) extra-curricular and School Exchanges etc.
- User pay services: buses, music lessons, canteen, Before and After School Care, Vacation Care etc.

ENROLMENT CONFIRMATION FEE

A non-refundable Enrolment Confirmation Fee is payable per student within 14 days of the date of the offer letter received to secure their place. This fee does not form part of the annual fees and levies and is as follows:

- Prep to Year 6 entry \$500 per child
- Year 7 to Year 10 entry \$1,000 per child

This Fee Schedule should be read in conjunction with the Enrolment Agreement Terms and Conditions available on our website. A portion of school fees goes toward funding the Kindergarten.
