Introduction

In 2017 Heathdale Christian College celebrated our 35th year. We reflected and celebrated our growth and achievements since we commenced in 1982 - when local Christian families heard the call to establish a Christian School in the Western Suburbs of Melbourne. Their heart desired a school that had more than an academic focus. A school who like them, saw the whole child and desired to see all aspects of a child's life flourish. This ethos is part of the College's DNA and has underpinned our mission and values to view education built on Christ-centred perspective.

Our unique style of education not only teaches our students' academically, but also how to make lifelong friendships, how to make the right decisions and how to stand up for their beliefs with conviction and truth. An integral part of this is achieved in our partnering with parents, so that these values and ideals are instilled in our students' as they are learn under our care and guidance.

Heathdale's programs are structured from four year old Kindergarten through to Year 12 to enable each student to have a strong base of literacy and numeracy, which is evidenced through well-above average NAPLAN results. The largest range of subjects occur through Year 7 & 8, as students learn up to three languages (Latin, French and Mandarin), compete in sports, study science, maths, creative and visual arts, leadership opportunities and community service programs. In short, the College tailors its curriculum and co-curricular programs, all based on God's Holy Bible, for each student to pursue and launch into the next phase of their life, where teachers encourage students to learn lifelong behaviours like integrity, honesty, respect, love, honour and truth.

As a non-denominational, co-educational Christian College we have grown to over 1,300 students across our Melton & Werribee campuses. The College's current Federal Government's ICSEA (Index of Community Socio-Educational Advantage) rating is 1135.

School Captain Reflection


We honour the role our School Captains have ably and confidently fulfilled for our students over the past year - here's some of their reflections.

Attendance Rates

At the end of 2017 there were 1,325 students enrolled in the College from Kindergarten to Year 12. Of this number, 48% were female and 52% were male. Average attendance rate of students in Years 1-10 in 2017, was 93.17%.

Parent Satisfaction

Each year the College seeks feedback from parents on various aspects of the College's operations. In most questions the majority of the feedback was met with either, agree or strongly agree. 92% (87% in 2016) of parents are happy to recommend the College to others and are satisfied with their decision to send their child(ren) to Heathdale Christian College. For both of these statements there were a number of responses that were neutral. As one reviews the comments provided by these respondents, a trend emerges where, with some additional information and processing, these respondents could easily change their response to "agree". This gives the potential to further strengthen the positive response to these two questions to approximately 98%, which would be an exceptionally high response.



Staff Satisfaction

It is both encouraging and reassuring that the vast majority of staff (92%) are satisfied with their jobs at Heathdale Christian College. Such a strong result would indicate that though Heathdale is not perfect, the vast majority of staff still want to be part of this community.

The other incredibly strong pieces of feedback provided by staff include:

- They feel they are making a significant educational difference in the lives of their students (94%)
- They appreciate the spiritual dimension to their work (98%).
- They understand the importance of nurturing students' spiritual development (92%.)
- They are able to maintain a high level of motivation for learning within their class (94%)
- Students seem to enjoy their classes (95%)

These strong results would speak into the heart of this community of the importance of learning excellence within the context of positive, nurturing relationships that enable students to grow spiritually. As one starts to think about the College's mission, it is pleasing to see that staff have such a strong understanding of and commitment to this call.

As students journey from Kinder through to Year 12, our staff encourage students to grow in wisdom and discernment, through all aspects of their education. Our General staff are committed in providing an atmosphere of excellence to our College with enabling our Teachers to focus on our Unique Distinctive of Christian Education to develop our students' academic, spiritual, physical and emotional learning.

Student Outcomes

Senior Secondary VCE

Our College Staff Team are extremely pleased and excited with our 2017 ATAR results. With a total of 57 students completing Year 12 in 2017, the 2017 results are close to the best set of results we have attained in several years.

Highlights of 2017 Class

- Our College Dux achieved an ATAR of 95.65. Three other students achieved scores in the 90's (92.95, 90.9 and 90.3). To gain four ATARs in the 90's is an outstanding achievement.
- One Yr. 12 Student gained a perfect Study Score of 50 in Music Industry & received the Premier's VCE Award.
- The average Study Score was 29.7. In 2016 the average was 29.3. This would indicate that, overall, the Year 12 cohort performed better in 2017.
- 7.4% of our study scores were above 40. The maximum study score a student can gain per subject is 50. A score of 25 is seen as a pass and a score of 40 is equivalent to an 'A'. Though as a percentage this is down on 2016 (9.4%) the average score achieved in the 40s was 43.53 and this was up on 2016 which was 42.94.
- There were considerably more students than in previous years with ATARs of 70+. 40% of our students gained an ATAR of 70 or greater. The average ATAR Score continues to trend in an upwards direction.
- Early Offers This year a total of 11 students received an Early Offer to a place in the course and University of their choice. This offer was made before they sat their exams. These places are offered based on academic performance as well as the candidate's character and commitment to serving the community.

Performing Arts Awards 2017

- Top Arts: Lucy Kim has had her artwork selected to be shown in the Education Departments
 Top Arts Exhibition. This exhibition identifies exceptional artwork from the Fine Art and Studio
 Art subjects. Lucy has also received a special award Top Arts Macquarie Group People's
 Choice Awards, first place.
- Top Sound, Top Class Music & Top Acts: Congratulations to Louise Gaul for achieving these significant awards for exceptional performance as part of her assessment for the Performing Arts. We also have pleasure in noting that this is the 3rd time in the last few years, that one of our students have received the Top Class Music award.

As a community we celebrate with them on their success. The students' results reflect their commitment to their studies, their determination to develop their God-given gifts and excellent support from their teachers.



Year 12 Offers

A total of 93% of students are going on to some form of tertiary study.

This is a very high rate and reflects Heathdale Christian College's reputation of academic excellence, enabling students to find their God-given potential.





We sincerely thank the school for the opportunity to serve our students and support them in experiencing a developing country. It really is a blessing to see how our God works in their hearts.



Camps & Exchanges

New Zealand Camp

Our New Zealand camp has been based on our historical involvement in the Duke of Edinburgh Award.

The purpose of this is to 'seek to provide participants with a unique, challenging and memorable experience.

The journey ... should be undertaken in a small team in an unfamiliar environment, requiring determination, physical effort, perseverance and cooperation to complete.' The terrain and remoteness of the environment in New Zealand provides excellent opportunities to fulfil these requirements. The students' feedback for the trip has been very positive. They have commented on the challenges of the hikes, such as the physical challenges, but also the mental challenges and preparation of food and equipment. The development of team building skills and new or strengthened friendships were also positive comments made by the students.

The staff witnessed students form new friendships and learn how to work as a team. As a team students developed how to be patient, kind, encouraging and resilient. They learnt to negotiate and compromise with one another when times were tough. 
Tyndale Exchange









Financial Activities Report
