


Faithful to God's story


The way forward

- Fostering a cohesive Christian staff community that encourages professional development opportunities and supports personal and collective spiritual growth.






Leading the education of tomorrow


- O Development of a multi-faceted business plan for the next 10 years, which will position the College as a leading provider of Christian Education in the Western suburbs.
