Our College is dedicated in providing deep learning opportunities for every student, fostering excellence, curiosity, discernment and stewardship. Our strong literacy and numeracy programs are one of our key foundational blocks from which we launch an extensive range of subjects and programs.

We are a non-denominational, co-educational Christian College that has grown to over 1,300 students across our two campuses. Our Werribee campus caters for 4 year old Kindergarten to Year 12. Our Melton campus was purchased as a fully resourced school in 2013 and is continuing growth as a Prep to Year 6.

We encourage our students to strive for excellence in all areas, within a safe and caring environment. This prepares students to be a valued, contributing member of their community and a well-adjusted, confident individual.








Section B: Student Information





Staff Satisfaction

Staff Satisfaction has been measured using three sets of data -

- Staff attendance records
- Staff interviews & regular feedback from staff
- Staff exit interviews when leaving our College

Using these data sets, the College can determine that our Staff Satisfaction level is high. Furthermore, our high staff retention rate of 99.9% would further confirm that our staff are committed and value our College's students, leadership and work environment.

Parent Satisfaction

In our 2016 Parent Satisfaction Survey, parents were asked eight key topics, several of which had a series of sub questions. We received a total of 741 responses received, which is 40% of the invitations issued, which is an outstanding result and further validates the data. Please see our 'Intentional Update #2' released March 2017 for further details. Summary of findings covering both campuses -

- 87% of parents are happy to recommend the College to others
- 85% of parents are satisfied with their decision to send their child(ren) to the College
- 85% of parents believe that the quality of teaching at Heathdale Christian College is excellent.
- There are many pieces of feedback that speak of the 'staff's care for students, being powerful Christian role models and engaging, supportive teachers'
- 85% agree that the culture of Heathdale supports student's growth in their understanding of God's world & in their commitment to serving Christ in all areas of their life.
- 79% of parents indicated that they strongly agreed or agreed that the College successfully supported more able students.




Financial Activities Report
