Techniques

3 Stations for Flipped Learning



Flipped Station:

where the content is found; replaces T's direct instruction



Practice Station:

where Ss show mastery of the content through carrying out various activities





Independent Station:

activities that any S can work on; learning waiting room for other stations

4 Configurations for Stations



Sequenced:

Ss fulfill one task in one station before moving on to the next; linear



Looped:

similar to sequence but Ss can start at any station; flip station is outside so Ss can access as needed; circlular



Half -n- Half:

half of Ss access content independently and the other half work directly with the T; then the groups switch



Mixed:

Ss work at their own pace and choose their own stations; max. flexibility

Troubleshooting

Applying a Growth Mindset



Growth: new abilities can be developed through practice; problems are an opportunity to figure out new things and learn, new abilities can be developed through practice; fosters a love for learning



Fixed: avoid problems and conflicts; avoid feedback, threatened by others' success; believe basic things like intelligence are fixed
