Possible Benefits	<ul> <li>Opportunity to empower ELs (Zhao, 2014)</li> <li>Chance to explore L2 identity (Atsushi, 2016)</li> <li>Personalize class content (Hanauer, 2012)</li> </ul>

# Dos and Dont's for Teaching Poetry

DO	<ul> <li>be sensitive to students' feelings about their own writing*</li> <li>encourage a personal relationship with the poem*</li> <li>allow time for multiple readings*</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>provide opportunities for students to write their own poems*</li> <li>support students with finding authors who speak to them</li> <li>find ways to make poetry come alive</li> </ul>
DON'T	<ul> <li>spend too much time explaining a poem*</li> <li>gives tests on poetry*</li> <li>overly concern yourself with specific techniques*</li> <li>force students to memorize poems</li> <li>worry about grammar or if something "makes sense"</li> <li>underestimate your students' abilities</li> </ul>
