



CONSTELLATION DOT2DOT



Perseus is a constellation named after the mythical Greek hero who killed a sea monster to rescue his wife, Andromeda. Draw lines to connect the sequence from dot 1 to dot 14.

Orion is a constellation named after a hunter in Greek mythology. Orion is easy to recognize by Orion's Belt, a pattern of three bright stars in the middle of the constellation. Draw lines to connect the following sequences of dots: dot 44 to dot 53 and dot H to dot L.

Cassiopeia is named after the mythical Greek queen who boasted too much about her beauty. This constellation is easy to spot in the sky by its distinctive "W" shape. Draw lines to connect the sequence from dot 15 to

Ursa Major is also known as the Great Bear. Draw lines to connect the following sequences of dots: dot 26 to dot 36 and dot C to dot F. A group of seven dots within this constellation forms the Big Dipper. Turn the page to spot the dipper and great bear shapes in this constellation.

Ursa Minor is also known as the Little Bear. The brightest stars in this constellation form the Little Dipper, a star pattern that includes the North Star. If you spot the North Star, you can always tell which way is north. Draw lines to connect the sequence from dot 37 to dot 43.

Cygnus means "swan" in Latin. Draw lines to connect the following sequences of dots: dot 20 to dot 23 and dot A to dot B. This shape gives Cygnus its other name - the Northern Cross.
