Testing Echoes

A sound echoes when its waves bounce off an object and are reflected back. An echo makes a sound louder because the sound waves are multiplied. Today, experiment with echoes. Go into your bathroom and sing a song. Then, go outside and sing that same song. Notice the differences in volume. Why did the song sound different in your bathroom compared to outside?

Spot-the-sound

Many animals use sound to locate food, other animals, or predators. Test your hearing by playing a game of spot-the-sound. Pick one person to hide somewhere. Count to twenty, then call out, "make some noise!" The person hiding will make a sound of their choice, and you must guess their exact location, or else the hider wins. Switch roles and play again!
