



Contemporary tradition

et around a courtyard, this 900-square-metre villa Saffronart looks inward and away from the thumping electro beats that its location on North Goa's Anjuna Beach is known for. Its Indo-Western design draws influences from Mediterranean and vernacular architecture. This is easy to spot along the facade with details such as a Greek colonnade, arched Portuguese-style doorways, a Mangalore-tiled roof and floral poolside trellises that appear to be a contemporary take on the Mughal jaali.

Space-wise, the sun-soaked residence includes a voluminous living-cum-dining area, five bedrooms with en-suite facilities, a private study, and a fully equipped kitchen (cutlery, crockery, microwave, et al.). Additionally, it comprises two staff quarters with a four-person capacity each,
