SEC TELECONFERENCE

The 14 SEC coaches are featured on a teleconference three times beginning in January. Coach Wade is on at 10:28 a.m. CT. The teleconferences are still to be determined. To access the media only number contact SEC Media Relations Office (205-458-3010).

MEDIA SESSIONS

Coach Wade meets, when travel schedules permit, usually one or two days prior to games in non-conference play and usually on Mondays and Thursdays during the SEC season. The sessions take place in the practice facility meeting room. Times are announced based on practice plans with players usually one day a week. Some travel and scheduling issues may change the time and day so media should contact the Communications Office to confirm start time ... Player requests need to be in to Kent Lowe at clowe@lsu.edu no later than 24 hours in advance.

POST GAME

During the current season, post-game video sessions will be done remotely on zoom links that will be distributed to the media during the course of the game. There will be separate video zooms for each team and both will be conducted after the game when coaches and players are available the 10-minute cooling off period. Both home and away, Coach Wade will conduct his radio post-game show before beginning his zoom session with media on hand for the game and admitted remotely.

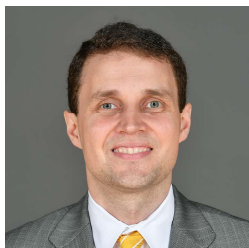

4th Year at LSU • 8th Year as a Head Coach

The buzz word when Will Wade arrived at LSU was consistency.

He wanted to make LSU basketball, a program which has had ultimate highs followed by periods of lows, be a consistent player on the college basketball scene.

A team with good players that produces consistent winning, regular post-season tournament appearances and playing an exciting brand of basketball that would see the Tigers contend for a top spot yearly in the Southeastern Conference.

His players would represent the University in a positive way both on and off the court.

Completing his third season as the head coach of the LSU Fighting Tiger basketball program, Coach Will Wade has been able to check all the boxes of program building and program stability that he set out to accomplish when he was named the 22nd head coach of the LSU program prior to the 2017-18 season.

In three years, the Tigers have won 67 games with two post-season appearances (and what would have been a third before post-season was canceled) with an SEC Championship in 2019 and a tie for second in 2020. The Tigers advanced to the round of 16 in the NIT in 2018 and to the Sweet 16 in the 2019 NCAA Championships.

In 2019, Coach Wade, his staff and players put together a team that posted a 16-2 record in the Southeastern Conference, winning the 11th regular season title in school history. In three seasons, the Tigers have won 36 games in league play.

It was all part of the vision the coach has for the program. It's a vision to have "unwavering commitment to put the team first, to put the state first, to put our school first to represent all of these folks in a first-class fashion. We are going to be a hard-working team that represents this great university that represents this great state."

Frank William "Will" Wade said those words on March 20, 2017 when he was named the head coach at LSU. He came to LSU after a stellar two-year stint as the head coach at Virginia Commonwealth University and two years at UT-Chattanooga.

He was the first LSU mentor to get the Tigers to post-season play in both of the first two seasons on the job. He is one of just five LSU coaches to lead his team to an SEC Championship and one of just four to take a team to the NCAA Sweet 16.

Wade has also brought analytics and trends to his coaching practices at LSU and his ability to know situations and tendencies has proven beneficial to the Tigers in his first three seasons.

Coach Wade has shown LSU followers that he looks to prepare his team for league play by producing a non-conference schedule that is competitive and among the best in the country. His schedule ranked fifth in the country in 2019 and eighth in the country in 2020.

This past season that non-conference schedule helped LSU open with eight straight conference wins as LSU tied for second place in the league one season after winning the league championship.

LSU was 8-1 in league play at the Maravich Center with a two-point win over Arkansas, a one-point win over Mississippi State (on a Skylar Mays buzzer beating jump shot) and a two-point win over Florida. LSU also won by four points at Texas A&M in overtime after rallying from six down in the final two minutes of regulation.

It was a season in which offense dominated the nights when LSU had success, averaging 80.5 points a game, marking the second straight year LSU averaged 80 points a game (80.4 in 2019) and the first time LSU has averaged over 80 points a game since the 1991 and 1992 seasons.

Four-year star Skylar Mays earned first-team All-SEC honors and showed his ability off the court earning his third College Sports Information Directors Association of America (CoSIDA) Academic All-America honor in 2020. He

was a second-team Academic A-A in 2018 and a first-team Academic A-A in both 2019 and 2020. The Baton Rouge native was named the CoSIDA Academic All-America of the Year for D1 men's basketball.

The highlight of Wade's three years came in 2019 when the Tigers won their first SEC title in 10 years and won two games in the NCAA Tournament to advance to the Sweet 16 for the first time since 2006. But it was also a year in which a coach and a team had to handle the worst possible tragedy, the death of a teammate.

Junior Wayde Sims was killed in the early morning of Sept. 28, 2018 just hours before what was to be the first team workout in preparation for the 2018-19 season.

It was a season in which time after time, the Tigers appeared to need a spark to stay alive for a win and things would turn around. LSU would go a perfect 9-0 in the league on the road, winning four overtime games and another at the buzzer.

As good as the players were in November when the season started, the team showed improvement from start to finish and that was all due to Coach Wade and his staff and the work that was put in on the court, in the video room, in scouting reports and so much more.

So far in three seasons, LSU under Wade has posted 18 wins in the Quadrant I rankings in the NCAA RPI/now NET rankings.

Between 2019 and 2020, the Tigers ran off 12 straight SEC road wins, the third longest streak in school history.

In the first three years, the Tigers have drawn five crowds that are in the top 12 single game attendances in the present seating configuration of the Pete Maravich Assembly Center. Fans are caring about LSU basketball, not just because of wins, but because of what they have seen on the court.

The fans have seen the things that Coach Wade promised when he took the job – an energized staff that was integrated in the game making coaching decisions and alterations as needed; player that were working hard to enact a game plan and making big plays.

Three member of the 2019 championship team – Tremont Waters, Naz Reid and Kavell Bigby-Williams – played in the NBA and G-Leagues in 2020.

Waters was a first-team All-SEC selection and the co-SEC Defensive Player of the Year while Reid made the league all-freshman team.

Wade, one of the younger coaches in Division I at 36, has also proven to be one of the most energetic both in practices and games, and his players have responded.

PRIOR TO LSU

The native of Nashville, Tennessee, directed VCU to a 51-20 record and two NCAA Tournament appearances in 2015-2016 and 2016-2017. The 2016 Rams advanced to the second round of the tournament, defeating seventh-seed Oregon State before losing to Oklahoma. Wade was the youngest head coach in the NCAA Tournament in 2016. In 2017, VCU lost to St. Mary's in the first round of the NCAA tourney.

The Rams were 28-8 over his two years in the Atlantic 10 Conference, posting 14-4 records both years. The team was 25-11 in 2016 and earned a share of the Atlantic 10 Conference regular season crown. The 2017 team won 26 games and finished

second in the league.

Wade previously served at VCU as an assistant with the Rams under Shaka Smart from 2009-13. He was part of the staff in 2011 when VCU advanced from the NCAA "First Four" all the way to the Final Four in Houston.

Wade is credited with being a key figure in four top non-power five recruiting classes in his four seasons at VCU.

Prior to becoming the head coach at VCU, Wade served as the head coach at Chattanooga for the 2013-14 and 2014-15 seasons.

His first Mocs squad went 18-15 in 2014, finishing 12-6 and second in regular season Southern Conference play. The team made the school's first postseason appearance since 2009 in the CIT.

The Mocs won 22 games in 2015 (15-3 in league) as Wade guided UTC to its first 20-win season since 2004-05.

In his seven years as a head coach, he has a combined record of 155-75 and 90-33 in conference play with five post-season appearances.

Wade's reputation, where ever he has coached, is a person who is a tireless worker and relentless recruiter. Wade was VCU Head Coach Shaka Smart's first hire upon being named the head VCU coach in 2009.

He served as an assistant to Tommy Amaker at Harvard in 2007-08 and 2008-09. Wade's coaching start came at Clemson where he served as Director of Basketball Operations (2006-07) and Graduate Assistant (2005-06) after four seasons as a student manager (2002-05). There he worked for coaches Larry Shyatt (2002-03) and Oliver Purnell (2004-07).

Wade is married to the former Lauren Deason, and the couple has one daughter, Caroline Elizabeth (3).

JUST IN CASE YOU FORGOT

The last time LSU played a game was the 2019-20 regular season finale when the Tigers scored a 94-64 win over Georgia. It assured a tie for second place finish in the league for LSU and a double bye for the Tigers in the upcoming SEC Tournament.

That tournament never took place. LSU was in Nashville and had practiced early on the morning of March 12 for its Friday quarterfinal game in the tournament, but shortly after returning to its team hotel, the SEC tourney and all of college basketball was called off.

LSU finished the year 21-10 and 12-6 in the SEC. LSU has won 49 games and 28 SEC contests in the past two seasons.

SO WHERE DO WE GO FROM HERE?

It appears we will go slowly and carefully through the season that is now topped out at 27 games for those teams in an MTE like this one in St. Louis. And, it was a bit of winding road to get to this opening weekend.

Both LSU and Saint Louis were scheduled for the Golden Window Classic in Lincoln, Nebraska but as of last Friday, Saint Louis withdrew and set up this Billiken Classic that started on Nov. 25 and will run through Saturday.

The Tigers were supposed to have opened their 2020-21 season on Nov. 10 against ULM in what was originally believed to be a normal season. Now the Tiger basketball team will have its latest season opener since the 1993-94 season when LSU opened at home against Texas on Nov. 26, 1993.

LSU is now scheduled to play five November/December non-conference home games against Southeastern (Nov. 30), Louisiana Tech (Dec. 6), UNO (Dec. 16), North Texas (Dec. 19) and VCU (Dec. 22). There will also be a non-conference neutral site game scheduled for Dec. 12 at the State Farm Arena in Atlanta, Georgia against South Florida. That will be

one of four games that day as part of the Holiday Hoopsgiving event.

LAST TIME IN ST. LOUIS

The Tigers were last in St. Louis for men’s basketball at the end of the 2017-18 season when the SEC Tournament was conducted at the ScottTrade Center, now the Enterprise Center. LSU lost to Mississippi State, 80-77. LSU last played the Billikens in St. Louis in Dec. 1956.

NUMBER CHANGES FOR 2020-21

There are several different jersey number changes among the returnees this year –

Darius Days will put on Skylar Mays’ 4 jersey after a season as 0. Four was Days’ high school number. In fact, Days will wear a different number for the third straight year after opening his LSU career as No. 22. Sophomore walk-on Parker Edwards will take No. 5 this season, after wearing “3” in 2019-20. Charles Manning Jr., who wore No. 11 in 2019-20, will wear No. 21 this season.

AND ON THE BENCH

There will be a couple of bench changes as Bill Armstrong has been promoted to Associate Head Coach for the 2020-21 season after serving as assistant coach the past three years at LSU. Returning as an on-floor coach this year will be Kevin Nickelberry, who last season served as assistant to the head coach. Armstrong has some 15 years of experience in the SEC at both Ole Miss and LSU and Nickelberry has been on basketball coaching staffs for some 20 years, including a combined 12 years as head coach at Hampton and Howard. Vernon Hamilton, who comes to LSU after coaching in the Korean Basketball League and with time in player development for the Dallas Mavericks, will take over the position as assistant to the head coach.

SOME OF THE NUMBERS

LSU returns three starters from a season ago and each started 30-of-the-31 games:

Sophomore Trendon Watford – 13.6 points and 7.2 rebounds
Junior Javonte Smart – 12.5 points, 3.5 rebounds and 4.2 assists
Junior Darius Days – 11.1 points and 6.8 rebounds

LSU returns 45.7 percent of its offensive production (45.1 points of an 80.5 season average); 20.7 rebounds of a 39.7 team rebound average (53.1%) and 57.0 percent of assists (227 of 398 total). Offensively, LSU had one of the most efficient offenses in February and March at 1.13 points per possession. According to NCAA.com, only Gonzaga (1.19) and Creighton (1.15) had higher points per possession levels during February/March.

FATHERS AND SONS

UCLA transfer Shareef O’Neal brings an addition to the list of Fathers and Sons who have been a part of the LSU men’s basketball program over the years. O’Neal will wear 32 this year and there are a number of things to consider with this number choice – 1) His dad wore No. 32 when he was the center for the Orlando Magic in the first stop on his NBA career and later with the Miami Heat and Phoenix Suns; 2) The younger O’Neal was very close to the late Kobe Bryant and of course Kobe’s two NBA numbers were 8 and 24 which also add up to 32. Shareef and father Shaquille O’Neal will become the latest in a line of father-son combinations that have played for the LSU Purple and Gold:

TIGERS IN OPENERS

This will be the first time LSU has opened away from Baton Rouge since the start of the 2013-14 season when LSU lost at UMass, 92-90. This will mark the first time LSU has opened in a neutral court game since playing in Hawaii in the 1995-96 opener against, ironically, Saint Louis in Honolulu.

LSU is 92-20 in its history in season openers, with a six-game winning streak in opening games.

SERIES AGAINST OPPONENTS

LSU and SIUE will mark the first game between the Tigers and the Cougars of the Ohio Valley Conference.

This will be the fifth time the Tigers have faced Saint Louis and LSU has only won one of the previous four meetings. That came in the first meeting in 1952 in the Sugar Bowl Classic in New Orleans. Saint Louis won the last meeting, the above-mentioned game in Honolulu in 1995 along with two meetings in the 1956 calendar year.

JAVONTE SMART

Smart started 30-of-31 games a year ago and has played in 65-of-a-possible-66 games over his two years at LSU with 48 wins over that time ... Last year he averaged 12.5 points, 3.5 rebounds and had 129 assists.

He is on the watch list for the Bob Cousy Award and the Jersey Mike's Naismith Player of the Year list. He was a second team selection on the media All-SEC team (two five-man teams) and is on the first team of the coaches' All-SEC selection (eight players).

Smart ended up with wonderful assist-to-turnover numbers and much of that came in league play. In his first five games last year, Smart had 25 assists and 26 turnovers. He finished the season with 129 total assists and 70 turnovers. For the last 26 games of the season, he posted a 2.93 assist-to-turnover ratio. For the entire 31 games season, Smart's 129-70 assist-to-turnover ratio was 1.84, fourth in the league.

In the 18 SEC games, Smart was equally as impressive with 65 assists and 31 turnovers (2.10 ratio) which was tops in the league. Smart has had no turnovers in three-of-the-last-four SEC games.

TRENDON WATFORD

Watford had a strong freshman campaign that earned him All-SEC Freshman team honors and he is on the watch list for the Karl Malone forward and the Jersey Mike's Naismith POY award as well. He was a first-team selection on the media All-SEC preseason squad and the coaches' All-SEC preseason team.

He averaged 13.6 points overall last season and was among the league leaders in rebounds averaging 7.2 rebounds for 31 games (30 starts) which was sixth in the league. He averaged an even better 8.1 rebounds in the 18 conference games for third in the league in league games only.

One of Watford's greatest improvements as the season went on was at the free throw line. After shooting 56.9 percent in non-conference games, he began to work with Coach Wade after every practice and shootaround and in the 18 SEC games he made 56-of-74 or 75.7 percent at the charity stripe.

From the field, he was 48.9 percent (157-of-321) with 18 made three-pointers.

DARIUS DAYS

Days also was among the league leaders in rebounds last year, averaging 6.8 boards overall (8th in the SEC) and 6.4 in conference games for No. 11 in the league games rankings.

Days averaged 11.1 points last year for the Tigers, hitting 48.6 percent of his field goal attempts (125-of-257) with 39 three-pointers.

Days also started 30-of-31 games and has played 66 games. After averaging 5.3 points as a freshman, Days more than doubled his scoring average and increased his rebound average from 4.0 to 6.8.

NEW FACES FOR 2020-21

Of the 15 players on this year's LSU Basketball team, only six were actually on the roster last year – Smart, Watford, Days, Edwards, Hyatt, Manning.

The Tiger coaching staff brought in the sixth ranked recruiting class with five-star Cameron Thomas, four stars Mwani Wilkinson and Eric Gaines and three stars Jalen Cook and Josh Gray.

LSU also has three transfers – center Bryan Penn-Johnson from Washington, Shareef O'Neal from UCLA and Josh LeBlanc from Georgetown. Penn-Johnson has already received his wavier, while O'Neal's is expected at any time, while LeBlanc (who arrived at LSU between semesters last season) will be eligible at the end of the first semester.

HOW YOUNG AND NEW IS THIS TEAM?

The Tigers are a bit on the new and young side based on research by Tom Gilbert of Kansas State prior to the season.

LSU's five returning letterman makes LSU one of 25 teams that will return five letter winners or less for the 20-21 season.

LSU's eight new players (three transfers, three signees) make it one of 37 teams to have at least eight players in their first year in Baton Rouge.

LSU is one of 23 basketball teams to have at least 10 underclassmen on the roster (freshmen, sophomores).

The Tigers are one of 17 teams to have four or less upperclassmen on the roster (junior, seniors).

Finally, LSU is one of just 12 teams to have one senior (Charles Manning Jr.) on the roster.

HOME GAME ADDED FOR MONDAY, NOV. 30

The Tigers will host Southeastern on Monday night (Nov. 30) at 7 p.m. at the Pete Maravich Assembly Center. The game will be broadcast on the LSU Sports Radio Network and streamed on SEC Network +.

WILL WADE RADIO SHOW DEBUTS ON TUESDAY

The first edition of the Will Wade radio show will debut on Tuesday night, Dec. 1, at 7 p.m. at TJ Ribs on Acadian Thruway. The show is presented by Hancock Whitney Bank on the LSU Sports Radio Network and tape delayed on CST. The show the rest of the season will air on Monday nights with the exception of weeks with a Tuesday game in which the show will air on Wednesday nights.
