

Explosive runner who combines speed and strength ... Opened year as LSU's starting running back before an injury against Florida sidelined the sophomore for two games ... Is LSU's primary running back on third down situations ... Returned to action on a limited basis against Louisiana Tech ... Was back at full strength in a back-up role to Justin Vincent for the final four games of season ... Played in 11 games with six starts ... Second on team with 521 yards on 112 carries ... Rushed for a pair of touchdowns ... Looked to have regained early season form against Georgia in the SEC Championship Game, rushing for 60 yards on eight carries ...
