Tigers Begin Five-Game Road Stretch at Southern University

Seventh-ranked LSU begins a five-game road stretch Tuesday at 6:30 p.m. as the Tigers face cross-town rival Southern University at Lee-Hines Field.

The game can be heard on the LSU Sports Radio Network, including flagship WDGL-FM 98.1 in Baton Rouge. The radio broadcast may be also be accessed at www.LSUsports.net.

The game will be televised statewide by Cox Sports Television (Cable Ch. 37 in Baton Rouge).

LSU coach Smoke Laval will send junior left-hander Lane Mestepey (4-1, 2.76 ERA) to the mound Tuesday. Mestepey will be making his first start since March 20, when he pitched three innings in a loss at South Carolina. He picked up a relief win last Wednesday against Southeastern Louisiana, allowing no runs on two hits in four innings with one walk and four strikeouts.

Southern coach Roger Cador plans to counter with sophomore right-hander Emary Frederick (1-0, 5.82 ERA).

LSU improved to 8-7 in the SEC last weekend as the Tigers recorded a series victory (2-1) over Georgia. LSU batted .343 (37-for-108) in the series with three doubles, two triples and three homers. The Tigers trail Ole Miss (11-4) by three games in the SEC Western Division entering this weekend's conference series at 10th-ranked Tennessee.

The LSU-Southern Series

LSU leads the all-time series with Southern, 38-1, with the Jaguars' only victory coming in 2001 at Alex Box Stadium. The teams met last season at Lee-Hines Field, but the game was canceled due to heavy rain in the top of the fifth inning with LSU holding a 3-2 lead.

Tuesday's game will mark LSU's third official visit to Lee-Hines Field. The Tigers posted wins in 1993 (8-7) and 1995 (14-9) at the Jaguars' on-campus facility.

The Tigers enter the Southern game Tuesday with an 10-1 mark this season against Louisiana schools. LSU has won 13 of its last 14 games versus its in-state foes over the last two seasons.

LSU has a 38-9 (.809) record against Louisiana schools during Laval's three-year tenure as head coach.

Tigers Win Four of Five Games Last Week, Including Series Victory vs. UGA

• LSU improved to 8-7 in the SEC last weekend as the Tigers recorded a series victory (2-1) over Georgia. LSU batted .343 (37-for-108) in the series with three doubles, two triples and three homers. The Tigers trail Ole Miss (11-4) by three games in the SEC Western Division entering this weekend's conference series at 10th-ranked Tennessee.

• Left fielder Ryan Patterson was superb in leading LSU to four wins in five games last week. He hit .500 (11-for-22) with two doubles, one triple, three homers, 11 RBI and five runs. Patterson posted a 1.091 slugging percentage, a .500 on-base percentage, and he recorded two stolen bases.

• In LSU's series victory over UGA, Patterson hit .462 (6-for-13) with one double, one triple, two homers, six RBI and three runs. Patterson, who is currently riding a 10-game hitting streak, is batting .339 (59-for-174) this season with seven homers and a team-high 40 RBI.

• Center fielder J.C. Holt batted .571 (8-for-14) in the UGA series with five runs and three RBI. Right fielder Jon Zeringue hit .545 (6-for-11) against the Bulldogs with one triple, one RBI and two runs.

• The Tigers hit .343 (61-for-178) for the entire five-game week with five doubles, three triples and five homers. Holt hit .545 (12-for-22) in the five games, while Zeringue batted .529 (9-for-17). Holt saw his cumulative average soar to .411 (65-for-168) with 12 doubles, two triples, four homers, 46 runs, nine steals and a .475 on-base percentage. Zeringue is now hitting .399 (57-for-143) on the year with 14 doubles, two triples, 33 RBI and a team-high 10 homers.

• Freshman left-hander Clay Dirks became the first SEC pitcher to record seven wins this season as he defeated Georgia on Saturday. Dirks worked eight innings against the Bulldogs, allowing just one run on seven hits with two walks and a career-high seven strikeouts. He earned his seventh win in seven decisions and improved to 3-0 in SEC games. On the year, Dirks has a 2.43 ERA in 59.1 innings with 10 walks, 54 strikeouts and a .199 opponents' batting average.

• Sophomore left-hander Jason Determann made his first career start Friday in an SEC regular-season game, and he responded with an excellent outing against Georgia. Determann, who took the Medical College Admissions Test (MCAT) the next morning, worked 8.1 innings, limiting Georgia to five runs on eight hits with one walk and five strikeouts. The Tigers won the game in 10 innings, 6-5. Determann, a biological sciences major, expects to receive his MCAT results in 6-8 weeks.

Mestepey Gets First Start Since March 20 at South Carolina

Junior left-hander Lane Mestepey will be making his first start tonight since March 20, when he pitched three innings in a loss at South Carolina. Mestepey picked up a relief win last Wednesday against Southeastern Louisiana, allowing no runs on two hits in four innings with one walk and four strikeouts.

The win over SLU marked Mestepey's 26th career victory and moved him into the LSU Top 10 list for pitching wins. He is tied with Mark Guthrie (26 wins, 1984-87) for 10th place on the all-time LSU list.

Mestepey, the 2001 Collegiate Baseball National Freshman of the Year, has a 26-9 mark during his three seasons on the mound for the Tigers.

Smoke Laval

HEAD COACH • THIRD YEAR

Raymond "Smoke" Laval enhanced his reputation as one of the country's top college baseball coaches, as, in just his second season at the helm of the LSU program, he guided the 2003 Tigers to the Southeastern Conference title -- LSU's first since 1997 -- and a berth in the College World Series.

Laval, the 2003 SEC Coach of the Year, directed LSU to a 45-22-1 overall record and a 20-9-1 conference mark, as the Tigers finished No. 5 in the final Baseball America rankings.

The magnificent '03 campaign augmented the success Laval enjoyed in his inaugural season as LSU's coach, as he led the 2002 Tigers to a 44-22 overall mark, an appearance in the NCAA Super Regional and a No. 11 final national ranking.

Laval, who served seven seasons (1994-2000) as the head coach at the University of Louisiana-Monroe, assumed control of the LSU program from Bertman, who led the Tigers to five NCAA championships and 11 College World Series appearances during an 18-year (1984-2001) tenure. Laval worked as Bertman's top assistant coach for 10 seasons (1984-93), helping lead LSU to its first two NCAA titles in 1991 and 1993. During Laval's 10 years as assistant coach, LSU posted a 483-182-1 record, won five SEC titles, appeared in six College World Series and captured two national championships.

Laval was known at LSU as one of the nation's best recruiters and brightest assistant coaches, as the Tigers reached the College World Series in only the third season (1986) of the Bertman-Laval regime. LSU followed the '86 CWS appearance with Omaha berths in 1987, 1989 and 1990 before the Tigers claimed the school's first baseball national title in 1991. After LSU captured its second NCAA crown in 1993, Laval departed Baton Rouge to become the head coach at Northeast Louisiana (now Louisiana-Monroe).

During his assistant coaching tenure at LSU, Laval -- who worked as the Tigers' primary recruiter - tutored 24 players who would eventually reach the major leagues. Some of the major leaguers with whom Laval worked include all-stars Albert Belle and Paul Byrd and first-round pick Todd Walker.

Laval compiled a 241-159 (.603) mark as the head coach at ULM, guiding the Indians to NCAA Regional appearances in 1995, 1999 and 2000.

Laval began his coaching career in 1977 as an assistant at Jacksonville University before moving to Wolfson High School in Jacksonville as a baseball and football coach. He served as a graduate assistant at LSU in 1979 under former Tiger head coach Jack Lamabe before working two years as an assistant at Gulf Coast Community College in Panama City, Fla.

Laval served as an assistant coach at Florida for two seasons (1982-83) before returning to LSU to work under Bertman.

Laval holds a bachelor's degree (1977) from Jacksonville in physical education and a master's degree (1979) from LSU in administration. The McDonald, Pa., native played two seasons at Gulf Coast Community College, where he lettered as a catcher. He completed his playing career at Jacksonville, where he led the ninth-ranked Dolphins in hitting at the 1976 NCAA South Regional.

Laval and his wife, Pam, are the parents of two children, Brandon and Jamie.

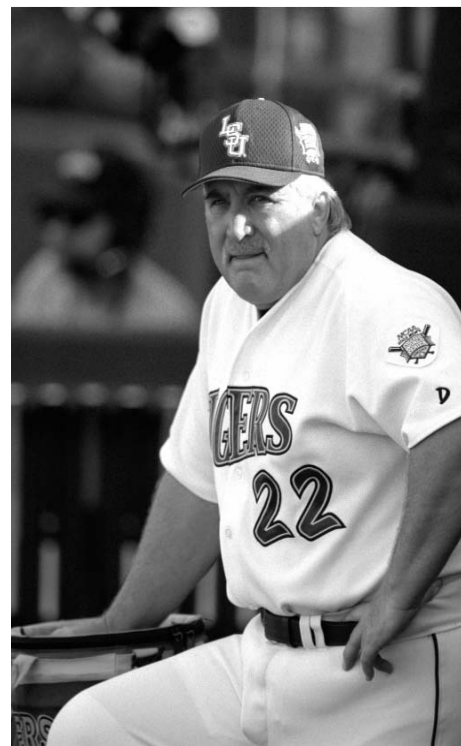
