ON TOP OF THE  
**College Football World**

**L**SU coach Nick Saban likens his team's weekly journey through the college football season to a person climbing a mountain, taking it one step at a time until reaching the summit. There are treacherous steps along the way (see Florida game), but it's how a team handles the adversity (see South Carolina game the following week) that determines the fate of the squad.

Well, in 2003, the Tigers maneuvered their way up the proverbial college football mountain and staked the LSU flag atop the summit with a 21-14 win over Oklahoma in the BCS National Championship game to claim the school's first national title in football in 45 years. The win over the Sooners in the Nokia Sugar Bowl, coupled with the 34-13 win over Georgia in the SEC title game, capped a season that saw Saban earn national coach of the year honors from three organizations, including the Associated Press, while four Tigers were named first team All-Americans and another two were selected Academic All-Americans.

LSU's journey to a 13-1 season, which ranks as the most victories by a team in school history, saw the Tigers use an offense that featured balance. For the first time in LSU annals, the Tiger offense featured both a 1,000-yard rusher (Justin Vincent with 1,001 yards) as well as a 1,000-yard receiver (Michael Clayton with 1,079 yards). With steady quarterback Matt Mauck calling the signals, the Tiger offense set the school standard for points in a season (475), total yards (5,857) and first downs (298).

Defensively, the Tigers employed an aggressive style that featured numerous blitzes and disguises that seemed to rattle opposing quarterbacks on a weekly basis. Only once during the season did an opponent manage to score 20 points in a game and that came in week 12 when Arkansas punched across a late TD in a 55-24 setback to the Tigers. With Chad Lavalais leading the way up front and two of the best cornerbacks in the nation in Corey Webster and Travis Daniels providing support down the field, the Tigers led the nation in both scoring (11.0 points per game) and total defense (252.0 yards per game). Furthermore, LSU's defense held opponents to just five rushing touchdowns, while sacking opposing quarterbacks a school record 44 times.

**LSU WINS SECOND NATIONAL FOOTBALL TITLE, CLAIMS NINTH SEC TITLE**

LSU's victory over Oklahoma in the BCS National title game marked the second national championship in football for the Tigers, and the first since 1958. LSU's other national title came under Paul Dietzel when the

Tigers, behind the play of Billy Cannon, posted an 11-0 mark on their way to the 1958 national title. In addition, the Tigers claimed their ninth SEC title in 2003. LSU's 34-13 victory over Georgia gave the Tigers their second SEC title in three years. LSU also improved to 2-0 in SEC Championship games, both of which have come under Saban. LSU's SEC titles have come in 1935, 1936, 1958, 1961, 1970, 1986, 1988, 2001 and 2003.

**SABAN NAMED NATIONAL COACH OF THE YEAR**

Nick Saban became LSU's fourth national coach of the year recipient, but the first as selected by the Associated Press when the organization selected the fourth-year Tiger leader as national coach of the year. Saban also earned the distinction of being named the Bear Bryant Coach of the Year as well as the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year in 2003. Saban joined Paul Dietzel (1958), Charles McClendon (1970) and Jerry Stovall (1982) as LSU's national coach of the year winners. Dietzel and McClendon were recognized by the American Football Coaches Association, while Stovall was honored by the Walter Camp Foundation. The national coach of the year honor is the first of Saban's career. Saban was also named SEC Co-Coach of the Year by the AP in 2003, sharing the award with Ole Miss coach David Cutcliffe.

**FOUR TIGERS EARN FIRST-TEAM ALL-AMERICA HONORS**

LSU placed four players on at least one First-Team All-America list in 2003 with DT Chad Lavalais leading the way by being named a consensus All-America. Lavalais earned All-America honors from Walter Camp, AP, Sports Illustrated, ESPN.com, Football Writers, Sporting News, and Collegefootballnews.com. CB Corey Webster earned a spot on the American Football Coaches Association Team, while return specialist Skyler Green was selected to the Sports Illustrated and ESPN.com's All-America squads. OG Stephen Peterman picked up First-Team All-America honors from Sports Illustrated, ESPN.com, and Sporting News. In all, LSU has had six players earn First-Team All-America status in four years under Nick Saban.

**TIGERS NO. 1 IN ESPN/USA TODAY COACHES POLL; NO. 2 IN AP POLL**

The Tigers capped the 2003 season ranked No. 1 in the nation in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll and No. 2 in the Associated Press poll.



LSU was ranked behind Southern Cal in the AP Poll. The No. 1 ranking marked the highest for the Tigers since 1959 when LSU was ranked No. 1 in the AP poll for the first eight weeks of the season. LSU finished the year ranked in the AP Top 10 for 13 straight ranking periods, while they were in the USA Today/ESPN Coaches poll top 10 for the 14th consecutive rankings.

**LSU SETS SCHOOL RECORD WITH 13 VICTORIES**

LSU set the school record for single-season victories with 13 wins in 2003. The 13 wins surpassed the previous mark of 11, which was set during LSU's national championship season in 1958. The Tigers were 11-0 in 1958. LSU has now won 10 or more games twice under Nick Saban and they've won at least 10 games in a single-season seven times in its history.

**LSU VS. THE TOP 25**

LSU posted a 5-0 mark against ranked teams in 2003. LSU posted wins over No. 1 Oklahoma, 21-14, over then No. 5 Georgia, 34-13, then No. 7 Georgia, 17-10, then-No. 15 Ole Miss, 17-14, and then-No. 17 Auburn, 31-7. The Tigers are 13-7 in games against Top 25 teams under Saban, which includes a 3-2 mark in 2000, a 4-2 record in 2001 and a 1-3 record in 2002.

**TIGERS RUN BOWL RECORD TO 17-17-1**

LSU's win over Oklahoma not only claimed the national title for the school, but also moved the Tigers' bowl record to 17-17-1. LSU, which is now 5-7 in Sugar Bowls, is 3-1 in bowl games under Saban.

**SABAN'S 39 WINS MOST-EVER FOR COACH AT LSU IN FIRST FOUR YEARS**

LSU coach Nick Saban's 39 wins in his first four years are the most-ever by a Tiger coach over a four-year span. Saban's record at LSU stands at 39-13, which is five more victories than Bernie Moore won during his first four years with the Tigers. In addition, the 39 victories are the most by an LSU coach over a four-year span since Charles McClendon won 36 games from 1970-73.

**TAKING NOTES ON THE TIGERS UNDER SABAN**

Here is a look at some notable LSU trends during its first 52 games under Nick Saban ... LSU is 34-2 when leading at halftime and 32-2 when leading after three quarters ... The Tigers are 36-3 when scoring 20 or more points and 34-0 when scoring 25 or more points ... On the other hand, LSU is 3-10 when failing to reach the 20-point mark ... LSU is 10-2 in games decided by 7 points or less and 4-1 in games decided by 3 points or less ... LSU is 25-1 when holding opponents to fewer than 100 yards rushing and the Tigers are 19-0 when having a 100-yard rusher.

**THAT TIGER STADIUM MYSTIQUE IS BACK UNDER SABAN**

LSU coach Nick Saban has restored the mystique that has made Tiger Stadium one of the toughest places for opposing teams to play. In four seasons at LSU, Saban has put together a 23-5 mark at home, which includes a 12-4 record in SEC games. LSU finished its 2003 season with a 6-1 record at home after going 6-1 in Tiger Stadium in 2002. Under Saban, the Tigers are 6-2 vs. Top 25 teams in Tiger Stadium. LSU's 18 wins over Saban's first three years in Baton Rouge is the most over a three-year period for LSU in Tiger Stadium since the Tigers won 18 homes games from 1972-74.

**LAVALAIS WAS A FINALIST FOR BOTH OUTLAND AND NAGURSKI AWARDS**

DT Chad Lavalais was a finalist for two national awards in 2003. The senior from Marksville, La., was one of three finalists for the Outland Trophy, which is presented annually to the nation's top interior lineman, and he was one of five finalists for the Nagurski Award, which goes to college football's top defensive player. In 14 games in 2003, Lavalais has recorded 61 tackles with 16 of those going for losses. He also had seven sacks to go with 23 quarterback hurries. He also blocked one field goal and intercepted a pass.

**LSU "D" RATED NO. 1 IN NATION IN SCORING DEFENSE AND TOTAL DEFENSE**

LSU capped its national championship season by having the nation's No. 1 rated defense in both scoring and total defense. In 14 games, the Tigers allowed an average of 11 points a contest, while limiting their opponent to just 252 yards of offense per game. The Tigers allowed only two teams to reach the 100-yard mark in rushing yards - 201 by Arkansas and 121 by Louisiana Tech. LSU's defense yielded only 17 touchdowns all season - five rushing, 12 passing. The Tigers allowed only 53 first-half points in

2003, and only one team scored more than 20 points in a game against LSU, as Arkansas scored 24 points in the regular season finale. LSU's streak of 11 straight games of holding its opponent to less than 20 points tied the mark set by LSU teams in 1958, '60, '61 and '62.

**MAUCK CAPS LSU CAREER WITH 18-2 RECORD AS A STARTING QB**

With the win over Oklahoma, Matt Mauck ran his record to 18-2 as LSU's starting quarterback. The 18-2 record by Mauck as the Tiger signal-caller is the best winning percentage for a starting quarterback in school history. Mauck's 18-2 mark as a starter is the best for an LSU player since Herb Tyler posted a 16-2 mark over his first 18 games as a starter before finishing with a 27-11 career record.

**CLAYTON SETS SCHOOL-RECORD FOR TD RECEPTIONS; RANKS SECOND IN RECEPTIONS**

Michael Clayton capped his LSU career with a school-record 21 TD receptions, breaking the previous mark of 19 held by Wendell Davis (1984-87). Clayton, who caught at least one pass in all 40 games of his career, completed his career ranked second in LSU history in receptions with 182. He's also fourth in receiving yards with 2,582. Clayton's junior season saw the Baton Rouge native catch 78 passes for 1,079 yards and 10 touchdowns. Clayton joins Josh Reed (1,740 yards in 2001 and 1,127 yards in 2000), Wendell Davis (1,244 yards in 1986) and Eric Martin (1,064 yards in 1983) as the only players in school history to have 1,000-yards receiving in a season.

**VINCENT SETS LSU FRESHMAN RUSHING RECORD WITH 1,001 YARDS**

Justin Vincent moved past Dalton Hilliard into first place on LSU's all-time freshman rushing list with 1,001 yards as a rookie in 2003. Vincent broke the record with 117 yards against Oklahoma in the Nokia Sugar Bowl. Vincent's total bettered the previous mark of 902 set by Hilliard in 1982.

**LSU PICKED UP FOUR SEC PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS IN 2003**

QB Matt Mauck earned SEC Offensive Player of the Week honors after LSU's 55-24 win over Arkansas, running the Tigers' total of league player of the week honors to four in 2003. Other SEC Player of the Week honors for LSU in 2003 include CB Corey Webster - SEC Defensive Player of the Week vs. Georgia; DT Chad Lavalais - SEC Defensive Player of the Week vs. Auburn and Ole Miss.

**VINCENT HAS FIVE 100-YARD RUSHING GAMES; NAMED MVP OF SEC TITLE GAME AND SUGAR BOWL**

Justin Vincent capped his rookie season in grand style as he was named MVP of both the SEC title game as well as the Nokia Sugar Bowl. Vincent, who had five 100-yard rushing games in 2003, rushed for 201 yards against Georgia in LSU's 34-13 win over the Bulldogs in the league title game. He followed that with 117 yards and one TD in LSU's 21-14 victory over Oklahoma to claim the BCS National Championship.

**LSU SHATTERS NINE SCHOOL RECORDS IN 2003**

While LSU's defense has garnered most of the publicity in 2003, the Tiger offense put up some pretty impressive numbers as well. In all, the Tigers set the school standard on nine different offensive categories in 2003. The following is a look at the team records that fell in 2003:

**TIGER DEFENSE SCORES SCHOOL-RECORD SEVEN TIMES IN 2003**

LSU's defense scored a school-record seven touchdowns in 2003 as the Tigers returned five interceptions for scores, while the other two came on fumble returns. The Tigers scored defensive touchdowns in the final three games of the season, including a 20-yard interception return by Marcus Spears against Oklahoma in the BCS National Championship game. The following is a look at LSU's defensive touchdowns in 2003:

**TIGERS KEEP OPPONENTS TO LESS THAN 20 POINTS FOR 32ND TIME UNDER SABAN**

By holding Oklahoma to 14 in the BCS National Championship Game, the Tigers have now limited their opponents to less than 20 points in 32 of the 52 games they have played under Nick Saban. Under Saban, the Tigers are 29-3 when holding its opponents to fewer than 20 points. Prior to the Florida game, LSU had won 18 straight contests when holding its opponent to less than 20 points. That streak dated back to a 14-3 loss to Arkansas in Little Rock in 2000. Of the 32 times that LSU has held its opponent to under 20 points, 16 of those have been when the opponent scored 10 points or less. LSU has also posted four shutouts under Saban.

**MAUCK THROWS LSU RECORD 28 TDs IN 2003**

Matt Mauck threw an LSU record 28 touchdown passes in 2003. The 28 TD passes bettered the previous mark of 22, which was originally held by Tommy Hodson in 1989. For his career, Mauck tossed 37 touchdown passes, which ranks as the third-best total in school history. In 20 games as LSU's starting quarterback, Mauck has tossed at least three TD passes in a game seven times, which includes a school-record tying four TD passes three times. Hodson holds the LSU career mark with 69 TD passes.

**WEBSTER RUNS INTERCEPTION TOTAL TO 14**

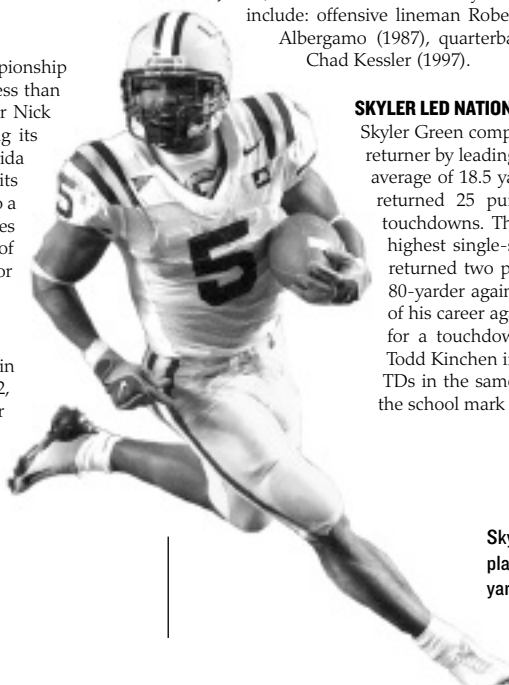
With an interception against Oklahoma, Corey Webster ran his career total to 14, which ranks second in school history. Webster, who played his first year with the Tigers as a wide receiver, has now intercepted seven passes in each of the past two seasons. Webster's 14 career interceptions trails only Chris Williams (1977-80), who had 20 picks during his LSU career.

**LSU'S RODNEY REED NAMED NATIONAL SCHOLAR-ATHLETE**

Rodney Reed, who is one of the most decorated student-athletes in LSU football history, added another honor to an already impressive resume as he was selected a National Scholar-Athlete by the National Football Foundation. The award is one of the top academic honors available to a college football player and it carries with it an \$18,000 post-graduate scholarship. Reed is one of only 15 football players covering all NCAA divisions as well as NAIA to receive the award. He also becomes the second National Scholar-Athlete in as many years for LSU, joining Bradie James, who was honored last year. Past LSU recipients of the award include: offensive lineman Robert Dugas (1977), linebacker Nacho Albergamo (1987), quarterback Sol Graves (1990) and punter Chad Kessler (1997).

**SKYLER LED NATION IN PUNT RETURNS**

Skyler Green completed his first season as LSU's punt returner by leading the nation in the category with an average of 18.5 yards per return. For the year, Green returned 25 punts for 462 yards and a pair of touchdowns. The 462 yards ranks as the fourth-highest single-season total in LSU history. Green returned two punts for TDs in 2003, including an 80-yarder against Florida. On the first punt return of his career against Arizona, Green raced 62 yards for a touchdown. Green is the first player since Todd Kinchen in 1991 to have two punt returns for TDs in the same season, which is one shy of tying the school mark of three set by Pinky Rohm in 1937.

**2003 LSU OFFENSE BY THE NUMBERS**

**1,079** Yards receiving for Michael Clayton, making him the first player in LSU history to have at least 700 receiving yards in 3 straight seasons.

**418.4** Yards per game LSU is averaging on offense, which currently ranks as the third-best total in school history.

**475** Points scored by LSU this year, the highest single-season total in school history.

**161** Combined career starts by offensive line.

**34-0** LSU's record under Nick Saban when scoring 25 or more points in a game.

**28** TD passes thrown by QB Matt Mauck, the LSU record.

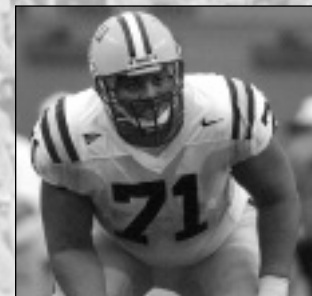
