Trying to tame the East: LSU plays the SEC East leader for the second consecutive week when the Tigers travel to South Carolina.

- The Tigers knocked Georgia out of first place in the SEC East last weekend by sweeping the Bulldogs at Alex Box Stadium.
- LSU is currently tied for third in the SEC West with Mississippi St., 2 1/2 games behind overall league leader Alabama.
- LSU has won six consecutive games, including Tuesday's 13-2 victory over Southern at home. The win streak is the longest of the year and longest since an 8-game streak last April.
- The Tigers have now scored 40 runs in their last three games, the first time they have scored 10 or more runs in three straight since last year's SEC Tournament.
- The Tigers string of games with 10 hits ended at 11, as LSU had only nine against Southern.

Scouting Carolina: The Gamecocks took over first place in the SEC East by sweeping Vanderbilt last weekend.

- The Gamecocks enter the weekend 1 1/2 games ahead of Georgia and Florida in the East and tied with Ole Miss for second overall at 9-5 in the league.
- The Gamecocks are now on a five-game winning streak, including an 8-6 win at top-ranked Clemson on Wednesday.
- USC is the only league team to win a series from league leader Alabama, taking two of three at home Easter weekend.
- USC has been to a super regional each of the last two years, but lost in three games in 2000 to UL-Lafayette and in three last year at Stanford.
- The Gamecocks haven't been to the College World Series since 1985 under June Raines when they were in the Metro Conference. USC has been to Omaha five times, finishing second in 1975 and 1977.
- The Gamecocks have won 134 games since the start of the 2000 season, the most in Division I during that span.
- USC coach Ray Tanner was an assistant coach to former LSU coach Skip Bertman on the 1996 U.S. Olympic team.
- The Gamecocks feature one of the league's most dangerous sluggers in Yaron Peters, who is hitting .404 with 14 home runs and 56 RBI on the year, and closer Blake Taylor, who picked up his SEC-leading ninth save Wednesday against Clemson.

About the series: LSU has dominated the series since Carolina came into the SEC in 1992, holding a 15-4-1 edge.

- The Tigers have won all six series from the Gamecocks since the teams first met in 1992, three in Baton Rouge and three in Columbia. LSU's only three-game sweep came in 1992 in USC's first ever SEC series at Columbia.
- LSU won two of three last year in Columbia, winning the first two games before the Gamecocks salvaged the finale.
- The teams played to a 9-9 tie in 10 innings in 1993 at Baton Rouge when the Gamecocks left to catch their flight home. That game led to the institution of the current SEC travel policy.
- LSU holds a 2-0 edge in SEC Tournament games, winning 6-3 in 1992 at the Superdome in New Orleans and 6-0 in 1998 at Birmingham.

Tonight's Starting Pitcher

#46 Soph. LH Lane Mestepey (6-0, 187, Zachary–Central Private)

Lane Mestepey goes for his fifth consecutive victory tonight at South Carolina, one thing he hasn't done in his stellar career at LSU. To do it, the Tigers will have to overcome the Gamecocks' top pitcher this season, junior left-hander Steven Bondurant (5-0, 2.31).

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

2002: Has won his last four decisions to improve to 7-2 with a 3.33 ERA.

- Did not allow a walk over a span of 33.0 innings from Feb. 23 to Mar. 23.
- Allowing just 1.43 walks per nine innings.
- Pitched third complete game of the season and the seventh of his career to defeat Georgia (Apr. 12). Gave up just two runs and struck out five.
- Earned third straight victory with 6.2 innings at Auburn (Apr. 5), allowing just two earned runs and striking out four.
- Walked none in 6.1 innings to improve to 5-2 with win over Mississippi St. (Mar. 30).
- Picked up second complete game victory at Ole Miss (Mar. 23) despite walking a career-high five batters.
- Gave up five runs (four earned) on nine hits in last outing vs. Vanderbilt (Mar. 16), taking his first loss as a starter since last May 4 at Arkansas.
- Earned second consecutive LSWA Pitcher of the Week honor for effort vs. UL-Monroe (Mar. 9), giving up one run in eight innings.
- Earned complete-game victory at Houston (Feb. 23), giving up just one run on six hits in the final 7.0 innings.
- Followed up Houston game with brilliant 8.0 inning stint vs. Long Beach St. (Mar. 2, Game 2), striking out a career-best eight to improve to 2-0 to earn LSWA Pitcher of the Week honors.
- Struck out six in 7.0-plus innings against Birmingham-Southern on Feb. 9. Carried a shutout into the eighth inning.
- Has nine quality starts (6.0+ IP, <4 ER) out of 11 this season.

2001: Led the SEC in victories (11) and ERA (3.75), going 11-3 in 22 games (19 starts), pitching 139.1 innings.

- Named the national Freshman of the Year by Collegiate Baseball and was a third team All-American by the same publication.
- Named the 2001 SEC Freshman of the Year and was a first team All-SEC selection.
- Allowed two or fewer earned runs in 11 of 19 starts.
- Yielded only 2.39 walks per nine innings.
- Went 7.1 or more innings in his first eight SEC starts.
- Named SEC Pitcher of the Week on Apr. 16 for sterling Easter Sunday effort vs. Ole Miss. In complete-game victory, Mestepey walked none and scattered nine hits. Was 2-0 with a 1.20 ERA in two outings in 2001 against the Rebels.
- Four days before the Ole Miss victory, he allowed only one earned run over 7.2 innings against Tulane at Zephyr Field.
- Got victory in first career start vs. Kansas St. on Feb. 11, giving up six hits in 6.0 innings.
- Had superb effort in no-decision at Georgia on Mar. 10, giving up one earned run and striking out six in 7.2 innings.
- Fell just short of shutout on Mar. 24 at Mississippi St., allowing one run and no walks while fanning six over 8.1 innings.
- First complete-game came vs. Kentucky on Mar. 30, giving up one earned run and striking out five.
- Did not lose until Apr. 20 vs. Vanderbilt, and even in that loss, he threw a complete game.
- Turned in spectacular complete-game effort at Alabama on Apr. 27, giving up one earned run and fanning six to start LSU on its way to a three-game sweep in Tuscaloosa. He retired 18 of 19 batters faced in the fourth through eighth innings.
- Allowed no earned runs over 6.0 innings of victory vs. Ole Miss at SEC Tournament May 17.
- Made last effort of the year his best, going 10.0 innings and striking out six in Super Regional at Tulane, a game LSU won in 13 innings.

Hill, Pettit sweep LSWA honors

Aaron Hill and Bo Pettit made it a clean sweep for LSU in the Louisiana Sportswriters' Association weekly honors by taking Position Player and Pitcher of the Week, respectively.

Hill batted .450 (9-for-20) with two home runs and six RBI as the Tigers beat Tulane and swept a three-game series from Georgia. He is currently a team high .384 and is tied for the team lead with five home runs.

Pettit won two games last week, posting a 2.08 ERA with 12 strikeouts in 13 innings in those contests. Pettit, who was named the SEC's Pitcher of the Week on Monday, got his first SEC win in a month by beating Georgia.

Pettit is the fourth player to be honored by the LSWA this year. Hill, Lane Mestepey and Sean Barker have also been honored at various points of the season.

Can the Tigers keep momentum?

The last time LSU was this hot, the Tigers fell on their face. The best the purple and gold can hope for is for history not to repeat itself at South Carolina.

Last May, LSU was fresh off a three-game sweep of Alabama and took an eight-game winning streak to Arkansas, where the Razorbacks unceremoniously swept the Tigers right out of the top spot in one of the polls, sending LSU into a skid that would end its season short of Omaha.

Of course, the big difference this weekend is that there still will be four more weekends left after this, and South Carolina is a top-10 team, compared to Arkansas, which had a losing record.

If you're looking for another sweep, that might be too much to ask. LSU's last back-to-back sweeps came when the Tigers dusted off Arkansas and Kentucky in 1998. Only one team this year in the SEC has swept back-to-back series, and that was Ole Miss against Kentucky and Vanderbilt.

Three straight winning series is not too much to ask. The Tigers won seven consecutive series last year, and have had at least one inning streak of three or more SEC series in every season since 1989.

A win tonight would continue a trend by giving LSU its seventh straight victory. The Tigers have had at least one winning streak of seven or more games in every season since 1985, with the longest being a 19-0 start in 1997.

The run barrage continues

After breaking into double figures just five times in their first 35 games, the Tigers are certainly making up for lost time in a hurry.

LSU's 13-2 win over Southern on Tuesday gave the Tigers 10 or more runs in three straight games for the first time since last year's SEC Tournament when LSU did it against Florida and Ole Miss twice.

The longest 10-run streak of 2001 was six, done from Feb. 23 through Mar. 3 against Duquesne (three), Nicholls St. and Arizona St. (2), which tied the school record for consecutive 10-run game also achieved in the 1998 NCAA Tournament.

Prior to Saturday's game with Georgia, LSU had gone 22 consecutive games without scoring in double figures.



Phillips lighting it up

When LSU brought in two transfer catchers and the highly touted Jon Zeringue prior to the season, it was the surest signal that Chris Phillips would spend most of his senior year on the bench.

Instead, it's Phillips who finds himself playing everyday, taking advantage of the situation to become a catalyst for the Tigers both at the plate and behind it.

Phillips launched his fifth home run of the year on Tuesday against Southern, pulling him into a surprising three-way tie for the team lead with Aaron Hill and Wally Pontiff. The former Northwestern St. catcher is hitting a solid .309 with 23 RBI on the season, and has hit four home runs in the Tigers' last nine games. More importantly, three of his five home runs this year have come with runners on base, including Tuesday's two-run blast.

But it's defensively where Phillips' impact has been the greatest. The Shreveport native has thrown out only seven of 31 runners trying to steal, but he has picked off four others, while his ability to handle pitchers is a big reason LSU's ERA stands currently at 3.94 and why the hurlers are yielding just 2.71 walks per nine innings.

After platooning with Darren Welch and Dustin Weaver early this season, Phillips has now started the last 20 games to gain a stranglehold on the position.

Hill, Brian get first work of 2002

With LSU out to a commanding lead against Southern, two pitchers got the opportunity to throw their first inning of the season late in the game.

Senior right-handers Justin Hill and Billy Brian worked the seventh and eighth innings against the Jaguars, and each did not allow a run during their stint. However, neither pitcher is on the 25-man squad that made the trip to Columbia this weekend.

Both Brian and Hill have been plagued by arm trouble since the end of last season, but became the 14th and 15th pitchers for LSU this season.

Brian's last appearance in a game that counted came last May 26 in the regional against VCU, while Hill's last real appearance was last Apr. 22 against Vanderbilt.

The two have pitched this year, although it didn't appear in the stats, as both worked an innings on Apr. 3 in an exhibition game against the New Orleans Zephyrs.

Homers for the Tigers...none for the opponents

With 19 home runs in its last 10 games, LSU has certainly proven they can hit the long ball. However, this power surge has not been a two-way street, and that has favored the Tigers both at the plate and on the mound.

LSU has allowed a miniscule total of two home runs over its last 10 games, and none since Auburn's Javon Moran hit a sixth-inning shot on April 6. Since Moran's blast, LSU pitchers have worked 57 consecutive frames without allowing a ball to leave the park, and not surprisingly, LSU is on a six-game winning streak.

Tiger pitchers are allowing a measly 0.42 home runs per nine innings, and no LSU pitcher has yielded more than four this year.

This stinginess is nothing new, as LSU has yielded just 16 home runs in 38 games this year, and none in 24 contests. The last team to hit two in a game was Vanderbilt on Mar. 17, with both of those coming from Sean Luellwitz.

In the last 10 games, LSU pitchers have given up a total of 13 extra base hits (11 doubles, 2 HR) for a measly .320 slugging percentage, while the Tigers are slugging a solid .606 during the same stretch with 31 doubles, 3 triples and 19 home runs.

Columbus discovers the hit

The "big three" of Aaron Hill, Wally Pontiff and Sean Barker are a combined .429 (30-for-70) with 20 RBI during the Tigers' current winning streak. But the player leading LSU in hitting during this hot stretch will surprise many.

It's the once-forgotten Jason Columbus, who had a stretch of 11 straight games earlier this season without a plate appearance.

The New Mexico native has made the most of his new opportunity, going 6-for-12 with three doubles, a home run and six RBI during the streak, allowing the 2001 junior college home run champion to raise his average to .324 (11-for-34) on the year. Prior to the current hot stretch, Columbus collected just five hits in 22 at-bats (.217)

Columbus will get many opportunities to add to those numbers this weekend, as South Carolina will start three left-handed pitchers, although Columbus is a solid 6-for-13 against right-handed pitchers.



Starters getting the job done

Early in the season, LSU seemed to rely a little too much on its undermanned bullpen, as starting pitchers often struggled to get past the middle innings.

As Clay Harris proved on Tuesday, those problems are over. The true freshman turned in the best pitching performance of his young career, allowing Southern to get just two singles over five innings and facing only one batter over the minimum to earn his first win in exactly two months. Harris' other victory came in relief on Feb. 16 against Mercer.

In the Tigers' last five outings, LSU starting pitchers have yielded just five earned runs in 34.0 innings for a stellar 1.32 ERA, walking just four and striking out 21 while yielding just a .218 batting average against. For the year, LSU starters have a solid 3.52 ERA and have walked just 62 in 222.1 innings

Bo Pettit started two of the last five games, collecting wins over Tulane and Georgia. Pettit teamed with Lane Mestepey and Brian Wilson to help sweep Georgia, and the same trio will take the hill this weekend in South Carolina.

Beasts on the East

The sweep of Georgia last weekend continued the Tigers' traditionally strong play against the opposite division, and indeed LSU needs to just play .500 ball against South Carolina, Tennessee and Florida the rest of the way to assure themselves of a 10th straight winning record against the East. LSU is 101-39-2 (.718) against the East since the league split into divisions in 1992.

Despite a series loss to Vanderbilt on the first weekend of conference play, the Tigers have been strong this year against the East, going 4-2 and posting a solid 3.00 ERA. The Tigers' three starters for the Carolina series—Lane Mestepey, Brian Wilson and Bo Pettit—have given up just nine earned runs over 40.1 innings against Vanderbilt and Georgia, good for a 1.98 ERA.

At the plate, J.C. Holt has feasted on Eastern pitching, going 7-for-13 (.538), while Matt Heath has hit three of his four home runs this year vs. the other side while batting .474 (9-for-19) with 8 RBI and a 1.158 slugging percentage.

LSU's batting average is just two points higher against the East than the West (.317 to .315), the big difference is on the mound. LSU's ERA (3.00 to 5.74) and opponents' batting average (.262 to .339) soar when the Tigers play within their own division.

Tiger pitchers tough in the middle

If you want to get runs against LSU, get them early or late, because Tiger pitchers have proven to be tough in the middle innings.

LSU hurlers are yielding just a 2.84 ERA in the fourth through sixth innings, striking out 75 batters in 114 innings during the middle frames of the game. The Tigers have been toughest in the fifth inning, holding opponents to a .267 batting average against and a 2.61 ERA in the fifth.

The problem has been getting behind early or blowing leads late. LSU's ERA is 4.26 in the first three innings, including a 5.69 mark in the third inning alone (negating a 2.84 ERA in the second inning), while the Tigers' ERA zooms to 5.05 in the final three innings.

Tigers break out early

On the other hand, LSU has proven that a fast start often leads to victory.

The Tigers are batting a cool .354 in the first inning, scoring 45 runs in the opening frame, or 16.5 percent of the season total of 272. The Tigers have also tallied 60 runs in the second and third innings to outscore the opposition by a total of 105-71 in the first three innings.

Not surprisingly, LSU has outscored its opponents 30-8 in the opening three innings. LSU has trailed a total of two full innings during the last six games, and that's when Georgia took the lead last Friday in the top of the second, only to give it up when LSU scored four runs in the fourth. That was the only game during the streak in which the Tigers failed to score in the opening inning. LSU has scored runs in 26 of the 50 innings in which it has batted during the streak.

Taking something out?

Maybe this weekend is a good time to catch South Carolina. After all, the Gamecocks will be facing LSU in between games with top-ranked archrival Clemson. The Gamecocks won for the first time in three meetings with the Tigers of the ACC with an 8-6 victory Wednesday at Clemson. The two teams close their four-game season series next Wednesday at Columbia.

Last week, Georgia split a home-and-home series with Clemson, then came to Baton Rouge and got swept.



Defense not resting

Fittingly, the Tigers committed seven errors in their Feb. 24 loss at Houston, because it seemed at times as if LSU's defense was lost in space. For most of February and March, LSU was mired in 12th place in the SEC in fielding, which isn't good considering the league has only 12 teams.

Don't look now, but the Tigers' steady defense has been a key to their recent resurgence. Sure, there are still the occasional errors, but great plays and key double plays are also on the menu.

During the Tigers' current six-game winning streak, LSU has recorded 11 double plays, including a school record five in last Saturday's win over Georgia. LSU has also committed just seven errors in 251 total chances during that stretch, good for a solid .972 fielding percentage. Not surprisingly, the Tigers have turned at least one double play in all six of the games during the win streak, bringing the season total to 41.

The most improvement during this streak has come from Tiger second basemen Rocky Scelfo and J.C. Holt. The pair have combined to play error free ball during the streak, handling 40 chances without an error. But they aren't the only ones, as third baseman Wally Pontiff has also been flawless in 17 chances in the last six games.

LSU socking the southpaws

Earlier this year, a matchup like this weekend's with South Carolina would be scary, as the Gamecocks are trotting out three of the best left-handed pitchers in the SEC.

But that was then and this is now, and the Tigers are in the groove against the port-siders, batting a cool .398 (39-for-98) during their current six-game winning streak against lefties, allowing the Tigers to raise their season average against southpaws to .297, just five points lower than it is against righties (.302).

When breaking it down, the Tigers' lineup that usually starts against southpaws is batting .333 against left-handers as a group, led by a cool .444 mark (24-for-54) from Sean Barker and a .391 clip (18-for-46) mark by Aaron Hill, who are two of the Tigers' three leading hitters.

The power numbers are much better against lefties, as LSU is averaging a home run every 27.7 at-bats against southpaws (18 in 499 at-bats) compared to one every 42.2 against right-handers (20 in 843).

Pontiff in the books, looking for more
Since his 19-game hitting streak ended against Mississippi St., most of the LSU offensive attention has been focused on the hot Aaron Hill and the steady Sean Barker.

Meanwhile, Wally Pontiff seems to have rediscovered his stroke after a small slump, and he is on his way to the LSU record books.

Pontiff is already on the charts as one of the Tigers' top 10 hitters of all-time, as his .355 batting average (222-for-626) places him sixth all-time. The all-time leader is Todd Walker at .396, followed by Eddy Furniss at .371.

Pontiff is also very close to breaking into the top 10 career lists in doubles and hits. Pontiff has 42 career doubles, just two shy of 10th place, held by three players, and his 222 hits place him 12 behind 10th place Trey McClure. Also within reach this season is the top 10 in RBI, as Pontiff comes into the weekend with 132, 25 short of 10th place Grisham.

But Pontiff isn't the only Tiger currently on the top 10 career batting list. Although he's played just under two seasons, Sean Barker's .364 average (84-for-231) has moved him into fourth place, two points ahead of Wes Grisham and nine ahead of Pontiff. Barker just qualified for the all-time list recently, as he now has averaged more than 2 at-bats per game during his career.

As for this season, Pontiff's recent exploits have raised his season average to .382. The LSU captain is also proving to be big with two out, batting .423 with 15 RBI when the end of the inning looms.

Double vision goes bad against Jaguars

The only negative to come out of the Southern game was the end of the Tigers' string of 10-hit games. LSU collected just nine hits against the Jaguars, leaving LSU one game shy of the school record for 10-hit games, which was set in 1997.

The streak may have ended, but LSU is still hitting a not-too-shabby .331 in the last 12 games. Remember, prior to the streak starting on Mar. 26 at Southeastern Louisiana, LSU had 10 or more hits in a game just 11 times in its first 26 outings as the Tigers compiled a .282 batting average, a figure that now stands at an even .300.

LSU coach Smoke Laval
 Ray "Smoke" Laval may be following a legend at LSU in Skip Bertman, but Laval is no stranger to the LSU program, having served 10 years (1984-93) under Bertman as his top assistant and as a graduate assistant to Jack Lamabe (1979) before that.

Laval, who was named Bertman's successor on July 18, 2000, came back to Baton Rouge after seven successful seasons at Louisiana-Monroe. Laval guided the Indians to a 241-159 record from 1994-2000 and led ULM to three NCAA regional appearances, including the regional final in 2000 against LSU. He was named the Southland Conference Coach of the year in 1999 and led the Indians to the SLC crown in 1999 and 2000.

During Laval's tenure as Bertman's top assistant, LSU won 483 games, reached the College World Series five times, and won the national championship in 1991 and 1993. Laval worked with 24 future major league players during that time and recruited nine first-team All-Americans.

On deck for next week
 A reunion and a change to avenge the darkest weekend of 2001 highlight the slate for the final full week of April.

First up is the final game of the four-game road trip on Tuesday at Louisiana-Monroe. The Tigers swept the Indians in three games at Alex Box Stadium in March, but this will be more interesting as LSU coach Smoke Laval will coach his first game from the visiting dugout at Indian Field. Laval beat LSU twice at Monroe while the Indians' skipper in 1997 and 1999, although LSU won 16-4 last year. This marks the first time that LSU will be visiting Monroe in back-to-back years.

Arkansas invades The Box next weekend in a battle of SEC border rivals. The Razorbacks came into last year's series at Fayetteville just 8-16 in the SEC, but humiliated the Tigers by sweeping all three games, becoming the first SEC team to sweep LSU in five years and knocking the Tigers out of the top spot in the ESPN/Baseball Weekly poll. The good news for LSU is that the series is in Baton Rouge, where the Tigers are 14-2 all-time against the Hogs, compared to just 1-8 since 1998 away from The Box. LSU has scored 69 runs in its last four home against the Hogs, including a 27-6 bashing in the 1998 finale.
