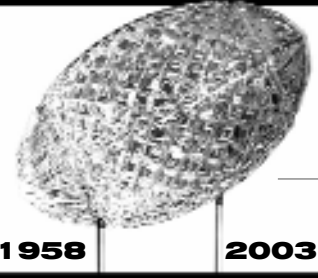

Tigers Looks To Rebound Against Mississippi State

LSU returns to Tiger Stadium on Saturday for a rare 11:30 a.m. contest against Southeastern Conference Western Division rival Mississippi State. The game will be televised by Jefferson Pilot, the first time JP has been to Tiger Stadium since the LSU-Mississippi State game in 2002. The Tigers enter the contest with a 2-1 mark, including an 0-1 SEC record following last week's 10-9 road loss to Auburn. Mississippi State, under first year coach Sylvester Croom, is 1-2 overall following a 9-7 loss to I-AA Maine last week in Starkville. LSU is ranked No. 13 in both national polls this week, while the Bulldogs are unranked. Last year, the Tigers posted a 41-6 win over the Bulldogs in Starkville. The Tigers enter the Mississippi State contest ranked second in the SEC in rushing defense (89.7 yards per game) and third in the league in total defense (272.3 ypg). The Tigers are holding their opponent to just 11.3 points per game, which ranks fourth in the league. Offensively, the Tigers are averaging 28.0 points per game. LSU is averaging 357 yards per game (160.7 rushing, 196.3 passing). Saturday's contest is being dubbed the "Gold" game and LSU fans are being asked to wear gold to the contest.

Auburn Scores Late To Hand LSU A 10-9 Defeat

Jason Campbell connected with Courtney Taylor on a 16-yard TD pass with just over a minute left to lift 14th-ranked Auburn to a 10-9 win over No. 4 LSU. The victory by Auburn snapped LSU's 10-game winning streak, one that dated back to a 33-7 win over South Carolina last October. The Auburn TD capped a contest that saw the LSU defense hold Auburn in check, limiting the Tigers to just 301 yards of offense, including only 131 yards on the ground. The LSU defense held Auburn's running back tandem of Carnell Williams (75 yards) and Ronnie Brown (67 yards) to 142 combined yards, 70 yards below their season average. LSU appeared to be in good shape early in the contest, taking the opening kickoff and marching 80 yards on 14 plays for a 6-0 lead following a **Marcus Randall** 9-yard TD pass to **Dwayne Bowe**. LSU's **Ryan Gaudet** pushed the PAT wide right, a point that would come back to haunt LSU. Auburn responded with a 14-play drive of its own that ended with a field goal. LSU, with **JaMarcus Russell** at QB, answered right back, going 55 yards on eight plays, capped with a 42-yard **Chris Jackson** field goal. That's all the scoring either team would get until the final minutes of the contest. LSU did have its chances in the second half, getting inside the Auburn 35-yard line twice, but the Tigers failed to capitalize on the opportunity. **Alley Broussard** led all running back with 84 yards on 10 carries, while Randall and Russell combined to hit on 12 of 28 passes for 168 yards and a TD.

For years outsiders viewed the LSU football program as an unpolished gem, a potential giant waiting to be reborn in the world of college football. With the wealth of resources LSU has to offer, its tradition and the available talent within the state of Louisiana, all the program needed was the right person to lead it. In four years as head coach of the Tigers, Nick Saban has proven to be that leader.

Since taking over a program that suffered through seven losing seasons in the 1990s, Saban has guided the Tigers to the pinnacle of college football - winning the 2003 BCS National Championship with a 21-14 victory over Oklahoma in the Nokia Sugar Bowl. The victory culminated a four-year ride under Saban that has been unmatched in the history of Tiger football. Since taking the reigns in 2000, Saban has guided the Tigers to a 41-13 overall mark, while claiming a pair of SEC titles in 2001 and 2003. LSU's 2003 BCS National Championship is just the second for the Tigers in football, and the first since 1958.

Saban's ability to successfully lead the Tigers comes from a management style that focuses on the entire program, one that puts his players in position to have success, both on the field and in the classroom. Armed with a plan that starts with recruiting quality people, outstanding football players and good students, Saban and his staff have transformed LSU into a team that is sure to be a fixture among the nation's elite programs for years to come.

On the field, Saban has developed a reputation as a defensive mastermind who is among the best in the game - professional or college - when it comes to game day coaching decisions. His defenses are physical, aggressive and deceptive, while offensively, the Tigers put up staggering numbers with a wealth of skill players leading the way. His teams play hard, make good decisions on the field and have proven that they are confident enough to overcome any type of adversity that is thrown in their direction.

It's a style and system that has proven to be successful, both for the team as well as the individual as six Tigers have earned First Team All-America honors in four years, while 18 of his LSU players have gone on to be selected in the NFL Draft, including six in the 2004 draft.

Off the field, Saban demands excellence from his players in both the classroom as well as the community. While the Tigers were marching to the 2003 national title on the field, the LSU football team combined for a 2.52 grade point average. A few months later, the squad bettered that mark with a 2.76 average for the spring semester as the Tigers had 50 players with a 3.0 or better during the spring and just six athletes that failed to reach a 2.0.

In addition to the honors the Tigers garnered on the field, LSU had 25 players earn a spot in the SEC Academic Honor Roll in 2003. Once again, numbers that show not only is Saban committed to academics, but his players are also dedicated to receiving an education as well. Since December of 2000, 51 football players who played under Saban at LSU have earned their degree, which includes 13 members of the 2003 national championship squad.

A major part of enhancing and cultivating the education experience for the student-athletes at LSU has been the addition of the \$15 million state-of-the-art Cox Communications Academic Center for Student-Athletes. Saban spearheaded the fundraising for the center, which included donating \$50,000 of his own money to the cause. The center, the best of its kind in college athletics, features a 1,000-seat auditorium with over 100 computers in a 54,000-square foot facility that gives all of LSU's student-athletes the best chance to have success in the classroom.

Saban's mission statement for the LSU football program is simple. He wants his players to become better people for having been a part of the program. He also wants to develop his players so they can reach their full athletic potential, which will enable them to have the opportunity to win a championship. Finally, it's his plan to help each player graduate and launch their career so that when they leave LSU they can have the best opportunities to be successful in life.

Prior to LSU, Saban spent five years as the head coach at Michigan State, where he built the Spartans into a perennial Big Ten contender after going to four bowl games in five years.

This Week

LSU returns to Tiger Stadium for an 11:30 a.m. contest against Mississippi State. The game will be televised to a regional audience by Jefferson Pilot. LSU comes into the contest ranked No. 13 in the nation in both polls, while the Bulldogs are unranked. The Tigers are 2-1 overall and 0-1 in league play following a 10-9 loss to Auburn last week. Mississippi State, after opening the year with a 28-7 win over Tulane, has dropped two straight and stands at 1-2 overall and 0-1 in league play.

Tigers Look To Start Another Winning Streak

LSU will look to get another winning streak started this week as the Tigers host Mississippi State. LSU had its 10-game winning streak snapped a week ago with a 10-9 setback to Auburn on the road. Prior to the Auburn game, LSU had not lost a football since a 19-7 defeat to Florida on Oct. 11, 2003.

In The Polls

LSU dropped nine spots to No. 13 in the USA Today/ESPN Coaches poll, which was released on Sunday. The Tigers dropped eight spots from No. 5 to No. 13 in the Associated Press poll following the Auburn loss. This week marks the first time since the Sept. 14, 2003 poll that the Tigers aren't in the top 10 in either the coaches poll or the AP Top 25. LSU has been ranked for 23 consecutive ranking periods in the coaches poll and for 22 straight in the AP poll.

About Mississippi State

The Bulldogs are 1-2 overall and 0-1 in league play ... MSU is coached by Sylvester Croom, who is in his first year with the Bulldogs after serving on the staff of the Green Bay Packers from 2001-03 ... Croom's in his first year as a head coach at any level ... The Bulldogs are averaging 16.3 points per game, while allowing 19.7 a contest ... MSU has lost 13 consecutive SEC road games ... Overall, the Bulldogs have dropped eight straight road games ... MSU's last SEC road win came against Kentucky by a 35-17 count in 2000 ... Offensively, MSU is led by QB Omarr Conner, who has connected on 46 of 77 passes for 465 yards and 2 TDs ... RB Jerious Norwood has rushed for 197 yards and 1 TD in three games ... Defensively, LB Rico Bennett leads the team with 21 tackles, while DB Jeramie Johnson has 2 interceptions.

LSU's Mississippi State Ties

LSU has a couple ties with the Mississippi State program as current MSU tight ends coach Freddie Kitchens served as a graduate assistant at LSU in 2000. In addition, MSU strength coach Jim Nowell was an assistant strength coach at LSU from 2000-01.

Magnolia State Tigers

LSU has 3 players on its roster who call Mississippi home. Among those are offensive guard **Will Arnold** from Gloster, defensive end **Sean Merrill** from D'Iberville, and tight end **Mit Cole** from Picayune.

LSU Welcomes Back Jefferson Pilot To Tiger Stadium

For the first time since the 2002 season, Jefferson Pilot returns to Tiger Stadium to televise an LSU game. The last time JP was in Baton Rouge, the Tigers posted a 31-13 win over Mississippi State. LSU is 5-11-1 all-time on JP, which includes a 2-2 mark in Tiger Stadium. Here's a look at LSU's JP games in Tiger Stadium:

Taking Note On The Tigers Under Saban

Here is a look at some notable trends for LSU during its first 54 games under **Nick Saban** ... LSU is 35-3 when leading at halftime and 33-3 when leading after three quarters ... The Tigers are 38-3 when scoring 20 or more points and 35-0 when scoring at least 25 points in a game ... On the other hand, the Tigers are 3-11 when failing to reach the 20-point mark ... LSU is 11-3 in games decided by 7 points or less and 5-2 in games decided by 3 points or less ... LSU is 27-1 when holding opponents to fewer than 100 team rushing yards and the Tigers are 20-0 when having a player rush for 100 yards.

Tigers Have Kept Opponents To Less Than 20 Points 33 Times Under Saban

By holding Auburn to 10 points, the Tigers have now limited their opponents to less than 20 points in 34 of the 54 games they have played under **Nick Saban**. Under Saban, the Tigers are 30-4 when holding its opponents to fewer than 20 points. Prior to the Florida game in 2003, LSU had won 18 straight contests when holding its opponent to less than 20 points. That streak dated back to a 14-3 loss to Arkansas in Little Rock in 2000. Of the 34 times that LSU has held its opponent to under 20 points, 18 of those have been when the opponent scored 10 points or less. LSU has also posted four shutouts under Saban.

LSU's Won Five Straight In Tiger Stadium

LSU will carry a 5-game winning streak in Tiger Stadium into the Mississippi State game. The Tigers are 2-0 this year at home after winning its final three games in Tiger Stadium last year. The last time LSU lost at home came on Oct. 11, 2003 when Florida posted a 19-7 win over the Tigers. Since then, LSU has outscored its opponents 210-65 at home for an average of 42-13 in those five games.

This Day vs. Night Thing In Tiger Stadium

Myth has it that LSU plays better at night in Tiger Stadium than they do during the day. The facts show that since 1960, LSU is 189-62-4 (.749) at night under the lights compared to a 16-21-3 (.437) mark in Tiger Stadium during the day. Since taking over in 2000, LSU coach **Nick Saban** has guided the Tigers to a 25-5 mark at home. LSU is 20-3 (.869) at night in Tiger Stadium under Saban and they are 5-2 (.714) at home during the day since 2000. Prior to Saban's arrival, LSU had only won 11 games at home during the day in 33 tries. From 1960 to 1999, LSU posted an 11-19-3 (.379) record at home during the day.

Still No Rushing TDs For The Opposition

LSU has now gone three games without allowing a rushing TD. The Tigers have only allowed four touchdowns in the first three games, all four of which were through the air. Dating back to last year's season-opener, LSU's defense has only allowed 7 rushing TDs, which covers a span of 17 games. Arkansas' Cedric Cobbs was the only player in the SEC to rush for a TD against the Tigers last year, and he did it with a 20-yard run in the final week of the regular-season.

LSU's Had At Least 1 Sack In 28 Straight Games

With 2 sacks against Auburn, LSU ran its streak of games with at least one sack to 28 straight. The streak dates all the way back to the Miami (Ohio) game in 2002 when the Tigers sacked Ben Roethlisberger three times. Since then, LSU has had at least one sack in every game, which includes all 14 games in 2003. This year, through three games, the Tigers lead the SEC with 8 sacks. LSU SS **LaRon Landry** is tied with Georgia DE David Pollack with a league-leading 2.5 sacks, while Tiger LB **Lionel Turner** is third in the SEC with 2 sacks.

LSU Offense Gets Off To Quick Start In Last Two Games

LSU's offense has been quick out of the gate in its last two games as the Tigers scored on their first two possessions against both Arkansas State and Auburn. Against Arkansas State, the Tigers scored on their first six possessions. A week later, QB **Marcus Randall** led the Tigers on a 14-play, 80-yard drive, capped with a 9-yard TD pass to Dwayne Bowe on LSU's first possession against Auburn. Tiger QB **JaMarcus Russell** followed that by leading LSU on an 8-play, 55-yard drive that culminated with a 42-yard **Chris Jackson** field goal on the second possession of the game against Auburn.

Alley Outruns The Cadillac and The Hummer

LSU's **Alley Broussard**, a hard-running pickup truck of a running back that's not even the first car out of the garage, outrushed The Cadillac (Carnell Williams) and The Hummer (Ronnie Brown) last week. Broussard, a sophomore from Lafayette, rushed for 84 yards on 10 carries, including a 38-yard run in the second quarter. LSU's defense limited Williams to 75 yards and no TDs on 18 carries, while Brown had 67 yards on nine carries for Auburn. The 84 yards rushing for Broussard marked the third-highest total in a single-game in his career. Last year, Broussard rushed for 108 yards against South Carolina and then had 106 yards and a TD against Louisiana Tech. For his career, Broussard has rushed for 488 yards and 4 TDs on 102 attempts for an average of 4.8 yards per carry.

That Tiger Stadium Mystique Is Back Under Saban

LSU coach **Nick Saban** has restored the mystique that has made Tiger Stadium one of the toughest places for opposing teams to play. In 4-plus seasons at LSU, Saban has put together a 25-5 mark at home, which includes a 12-4 record in SEC games. LSU finished its 2003 season with a 6-1 at home after going 6-1 in Tiger Stadium in 2002. Under Saban, the Tigers are 6-2 vs. Top 25 teams in Tiger Stadium.

Corey Webster The Multi-Tasker

LSU CB/WR/RS **Corey Webster**, who graduated last month with a degree in general studies, has taken his time management skills to another area and that's the football field. In 3 games in 2004, Webster has played on both sides of the ball as well as seeing action as LSU's punt returner against Arkansas State. In 3 games, Webster has 12 tackles and 3 PBUs on defense to go with one reception for a 6-yard TD on offense. Webster, who has seen action on 27 snaps of offense, has also returned 2 punts for 7 yards. Webster's 6-yard TD reception against Arkansas State was the first offensive TD of his career. He also scored on a 45-yard interception return against Florida in 2002. Webster is the first 3-way player at LSU since 2002 when Domanick Davis played on both sides of the football as well as returning punts and kickoffs.

The Arkansas State game, with a crowd of 91,611, marked the seventh straight sellout in Tiger Stadium dating back to the Georgia game last September. In all, LSU played five of its seven home games in 2003 in front of crowds of 91,000 or better. The Oregon State contest marked the first sellout for a season-opener at home for the Tigers since drawing 91,782 for the Tulane game in 2001. LSU RB **Shyrone Carey** will return to action this week against Mississippi State after serving a 4-game suspension. Carey, who missed the Sugar Bowl contest last year against Oklahoma as well as LSU's first 3 games this year, is a backup at both running back and punt returner for the Tigers.

Vincent Has 6th 100-Yard Rushing Game

LSU sophomore **Justin Vincent** recorded his sixth 100-yard rushing game against Arkansas State with 102 yards and 2 TDs on 13 carries. Vincent averaged 7.8 yards per carry against Arkansas State. For his career, Vincent has tallied six games of 100 yards or better, including a career-best of 201 yards against Georgia in the SEC Championship game last year. Vincent's first 100-yard rushing game came in last year's 31-7 win over Auburn in Baton Rouge. LSU is 6-0 when Vincent goes over 100 yards. The following is a look at Vincent's 100-yard games:

Bowe Knows TDs

LSU WR **Dwayne Bowe** continued his torrid reception-to-TD ratio with one touchdown reception on three catches against Auburn. This year, Bowe has caught 10 passes with four of those going for touchdowns. Bowe catches a TD pass every 2.5 receptions. He's also had two TD receptions called back due to penalties. Bowe's 4 TD receptions is currently tied with South Carolina's Troy Williamson for league-high honors.

Seeing Double At Quarterback

LSU continued its two-quarterback system on Saturday against Auburn with each QB leading the Tigers to points. **Marcus Randall** opened at quarterback for the third straight game and promptly directed the Tigers to a 14-play, 80-yard drive that resulted in a TD on the first possession of the game. **JaMarcus Russell** spelled Randall for the second series and guided LSU on an 8-play, 55-yard drive that ended with a 42-yard **Chris Jackson** field goal. For the game, the two QBs combined to hit on 12 of 28 passes for 168 yards and 1 TD along with 1 interception. Through three games, the duo has combined to connect on 40 of 92 passes for 589 yards, 6 TDs and just 2 interceptions.

Russell In Elite Company

With a pair of TD passes in each of his first two games in an LSU uniform, **JaMarcus Russell** did something that hasn't been done at the school since at least 1970. As far as detailed records account, Russell is the first LSU quarterback to toss at least 2 touchdown passes in his first two games as a Tiger. The only player since 1970 that came close was Tommy Hodson, who threw for a pair of TDs in his debut against Texas A&M in 1986. Hodson didn't throw any TD passes the following week in a 21-12 loss to Miami (Ohio).

Tigers Reach 50-Point Mark Again

For the third time in the last two seasons, LSU reached the 50-point mark with a 53-3 win over Arkansas State. The 50 points were the most for LSU since scoring 55 against Arkansas last November. LSU also did it in a 59-13 win over Arizona last September. In all, the Tigers have scored 50 points in a game four times under **Nick Saban**. The first time came in Saban's debut at LSU as the Tigers rolled to a 58-0 win over Western Carolina to open the 2000 season.

LSU's Defense Scores Again

LSU's defense was back up to its old tricks against Arkansas State as the Tiger "D" scored a touchdown, the eighth for the Tigers since the start of the 2003 season. Dating back to the first game in 2003, LSU has now scored eight defensive TDs in 17 games. Against Arkansas State, LSU linebacker **Ali Highsmith** intercepted a Nick Noce pass at the ASU 11-yard line and returned it to the 1-yard line where he fumbled, which was picked up by cornerback **Travis Daniels**, who walked into the endzone for the score. The defensive touchdown was the first of the year for the Tigers, who scored a school-record seven defensive TDs in 2003 (5 interception returns, 2 fumble returns). The touchdown was the second of Daniels' career as he returned an interception 45-yards for a score last year against Mississippi State.

Margin Of Victory

The 50-point win over Arkansas State was the largest for an LSU team since the first game of the Nick Saban era when the Tigers beat Western Carolina, 58-0.

Another Fourth-Quarter Comeback

LSU's comeback from a 15-7 fourth quarter deficit against Oregon State represents the sixth time under **Nick Saban** that the Tigers have rallied to win a game despite trailing in the final quarter. The last time the Tigers rallied to win in the fourth quarter came against Kentucky in 2002 when **Marcus Randall** connected with Devery Henderson on a 75-yard TD pass as time expired for a 33-30 LSU win. Over the six fourth-quarter comeback wins for the Tigers since 2000, Randall has been involved in three as he threw the game winning TD against Kentucky and Ole Miss in 2002 and then ran for the game-winning score against Oregon State in overtime. The following is a look at LSU's other fourth quarter comebacks under Saban that resulted in a victory for the Tigers:

LSU's Won 11 Straight Non-Conference Games In Tiger Stadium

LSU won its 11th straight non-conference game in Tiger Stadium with a 53-3 win over Arkansas State on Sept. 11. LSU hasn't lost a home non-conference game since dropping a last-second 13-10 decision to UAB in 2000.

LSU's 17-3 Against Non-SEC Foes Under Saban

The Tigers ran their non-conference record to 17-3 under **Nick Saban** following the 53-3 win over Arkansas State. The Tigers, who were 5-0 against non-SEC teams in 2003, haven't lost a non-conference game since dropping a 35-20 decision to Texas in the 2003 Cotton Bowl. LSU hasn't lost a regular season non-conference game since falling to Virginia Tech, 26-8, to open the 2002 season.

Randall Now 4-5 As LSU's Starting QB

LSU QB **Marcus Randall** has a 4-5 mark as LSU's starting quarterback, which includes a 2-1 record in 2004. Randall posted a 2-4 record as the Tiger signal caller in 2002.

Russell Shined In Debut

LSU QB **JaMarcus Russell** shined in his much anticipated debut as the redshirt freshman started the second half and rallied the Tigers to an overtime win over Oregon State. Russell led the Tigers on two second half scoring drives, which included tossing a 38-yard TD pass to **Dwayne Bowe** with just over a minute left in the contest to pull the Tigers to within 15-13. Russell then tied the game with a two-point conversion that sent the game into overtime. In overtime, Russell suffered cramps to his legs and was forced out of the contest midway through LSU's possession. For the game, Russell completed 9 of 26 passes for 145 yards and 2 TDs.

Tiger Defense Tough Against the Run

LSU held Oregon State to 84 net rushing yards extending the streak of holding the opponents under 100 yards rushing to three straight games and five of the last six dating back to last season. A year ago, the Tigers ranked third in the nation in rushing defense, allowing only 67 yards per game. The Tigers allowed only two opponents in 2003 to gain over 100 yards on the ground (Louisiana Tech and Arkansas).

Tigers Have Rushed For More Than Opponent In 11 Straight Games

For the 11th consecutive game, LSU had more rushing yards than its opponent as the Tigers put together 140 yards on the ground compared to 131 for Auburn last week. The last time a team gained more yards on the ground than LSU was Florida on Oct. 11, 2003. In that game, Florida had 81 yards on the ground compared to just 56 for the Tigers.

Jackson Handles All of LSU's Kicking Duties and He Can Hit Too

LSU specialist **Chris Jackson** continues to handle all of LSU's kicking duties, including serving as the Tigers' punter. In three games, Jackson is averaging 38.6 yards on 14 punts. He's 2-4 on field goals and 7 of 9 on extra-point attempts. Jackson also serves as LSU's kicker on kickoffs. Oh by the way, he's also expected to be a starting middle infielder for the LSU baseball team next spring. On the football field, Jackson is the first Tiger to handle placekicks and punting for LSU since 1985 when Matt DeFrank did both.

Webster Closing In On LSU Career Interception Mark

LSU senior CB **Corey Webster** enters the Mississippi State game needing only six interceptions to tie Mike Williams' school-record for interceptions at 20. Webster has 14 career interceptions to his credit after picking off seven passes in each of the last two seasons. Webster tied the school-record for interceptions in a single-game with 3 against Florida in 2002. Webster leads all active players in the SEC in both interceptions and pass deflections (44).

Spears Adds Sack To Run Career Total To 11; Oliver Still At 10

LSU senior DE **Marcus Spears** ran his career sack total to 11 against Oregon State. Spears, who also forced a fumble, recovered a fumble and broke up a pass against the Beavers, finished with 5 tackles against the Beavers. Spears is now just four sacks shy of tying Corey White for 10th place on LSU's career sack list with 15. DT Melvin Oliver has 10 career sacks to his credit. Rydell Melancon holds the school mark with 25 career sacks from 1980-83.

Green's Caught At Least 1 Pass In 18 Straight Games

LSU junior WR **Skyler Green** ran his streak of games with at least one reception to 18 straight games with two catches against Oregon State. Green, who did not play on offense against either Arkansas State or Auburn, is expected to return to action this week against Mississippi State. As a matter of fact, Green caught at least 2 passes in 15 straight games, including all 14 of LSU's games in 2003. Green's career high for receptions came against Louisiana Tech with 9 receptions. For his career, Green has 57 passes for 658 yards and 7 TDs.

Green Moves Into 10th Place On LSU Career Punt Return List

Skyler Green moved into 10th-place in career punt return yards in LSU with against Oregon State. Green finished with only one return for nine yards against the Beavers, but it was good enough to move past Chris Williams for the 10th spot. Green now has 471 punt return yards. Domanick Davis holds the school record with 1,126 yards on 94 returns from 1999-2002.

Defensive Line Shuffle

One of the philosophies of LSU coach **Nick Saban** is keeping players fresh by rotating players throughout the game. The Tigers opened the season by rotating eight different players on the defensive line. LSU's football roster features two former first round draft picks in the Major League Amateur Draft in freshman wide receiver **Joe Lawrence** and sophomore defensive end **Brian West**. Lawrence, who saw action in 55 games as a second baseman for the Toronto Blue Jays in 2002, was the 16th overall pick in the 1996 draft. West, in his second season with the Tigers, was picked with the 35th selection of the 1999 draft by the Chicago White Sox and advanced briefly to AAA before developing career-ending elbow problems.

Old Men On The Squad

Joe Lawrence at 27-years of age and **Andre Gill** at 26-years old are the two oldest members of the LSU football team. Lawrence, who is officially listed as a true freshman, is less than two-years younger than LSU defensive backs coach **Kirby Smart**. Lawrence spent eight years in pro baseball, while Gill spent time in the U.S. Armed Services.

LSU Ranks Ninth In Active NFL Players

With 33 former Tigers on active NFL rosters, LSU ranks ninth among all schools with former players currently in the NFL. Miami tops the list with 43 followed by Florida State with 39. Notre Dame and Tennessee are next with 38, followed by Florida, Georgia and Ohio State with 36 each. Michigan is next with 35, then LSU with 33 and Penn State with 32.

33 Former Tigers on NFL Rosters

A total of 33 former LSU football players have made NFL opening day rosters, including eight from the 2003 national championship squad. Highlighting that group is former All-American wide receiver and Baton Rouge native Michael Clayton, who became the 24th first-round draft pick in school history. Clayton was selected 15th overall by the Tampa Bay Buccaneers and is projected to make an immediate impact for his new club. Devery Henderson, the second-round selection of the New Orleans Saints, is also slated to see significant time as a rookie wide receiver. Former quarterback Matt Mauck will go into the season as the No. 3 QB for the Denver Broncos. Houston Texans' running back Domanick Davis, the 2003 NFL Rookie of the Year, looks to pick up where he left off last season after leading all rookies with 1,031 rushing yards, despite not starting until Week 6. Seven veterans have joined new teams this year including Kenderick Allen (Giants), Ryan Clark (Redskins), Trev Faulk (Rams), Howard Green (Saints), Mark Roman (Packers), Denard Walker (Raiders) and Brandon Winey (Giants).

I'd been warned prior to my first visit to Baton Rouge that the legendary Death Valley mystique was a myth. That assessment couldn't have been more wrong. Tiger Stadium was as loud as any I've ever heard during the dramatic fourth quarter of Saturday's Georgia game, the festivities surrounding it as advertised.

The streets were lined with purple and gold. Smoke emanated from the grills in the parking lot. Shouts of "Go Tigers" and "Tiger Bait" echoed from the stadium deep into the heart of campus.

• LSU began playing football in Tiger Stadium in 1924 and is currently in its 81st year in the venerable stadium on SATURDAY NIGHT.

• Under Nick Saban, the Tigers have posted a 25-5 HOME RECORD, including a 6-2 mark against ranked opponents. Against conference foes, Saban is 11-4 in Death Valley. In home games at night, LSU is 19-3 since Saban took over.

• LSU has won 13 OF ITS LAST 15 games at home, including a current five-game winning streak.

• More than 85,000 FANS have attended each of LSU's last 29 home games. In that span, the Tigers have eclipsed the 90,000 mark 20 times, including a school-record 92,251 for the Sept. 20, 2003 game that pitted No. 10 LSU against No. 7 Georgia. The Tigers won the game 17-10.

• Since national attendance figures began being kept in 1957, LSU has ranked in the top 20 all 45 seasons. The Tigers have been in the top 15 for 43 of the 45 years and in the top 10 on 37 occasions, including 32 straight from 1957-88. Fourteen times, LSU has ranked in the TOP FIVE IN THE NATION, including the last three.

Earthquake Game

October 8, 1988. Tommy Hodson connected with Eddie Fuller on 4-and-10 with 1:41 to play for the game-winning touchdown as LSU upset No. 4 Auburn. The play caused such a thunderous explosion from the crowd of 79,341 that the tremor caused by the vibrations measured on the seismograph across campus.

Halloween Night

October 31, 1959. No. 1 LSU trailed No. 3 Ole Miss, 3-0, late in the fourth quarter when Billy Cannon fielded a punt off the bounce at the 11-yard line. He raced 89 yards, careening off seven Rebel defenders, to paydirt to give the Tigers victory and all but clinch the 1959 Heisman Trophy.

Opportunistic Tigers Feast on Mississippi State, 41-6

LSU turned three Mississippi State turnovers into 21 points and the Tiger defense limited the Bulldogs to only 31 yards rushing as LSU rolled to a 41-6 win in Starkville. After a slow start, LSU took a 7-0 lead late in the first quarter on a 1-yard run by Shyrone Carey. Leading 10-0 after a Ryan Gaudet field goal, the Tigers stretched the margin to 17-0 midway through the second quarter on another 1-yard run by Carey. Carey's second TD was setup by an interception by Jack Hunt, who returned the pick to the MSU 1-yard line. The Tigers led 24-0 at halftime after Travis Daniels returned an interception 48-yards for a TD with less than a minute remaining in the first half. MSU then fumbled on its third play of the second half and the Tigers struck again one play later, this time Matt Mauck connected with Devery Henderson for a 36-yard TD pass to stretch the lead to 31-0. LSU led 34-0 before MSU finally scored with just over 10 minutes left in the contest. For the game, Mauck completed 12 of 19 passes for 171 yards and 1 TD, while Justin Vincent led the Tigers with 58 yards rushing and 1 TD on six carries. Carey added 50 yards rushing and 2 TDs on 13 carries. Henderson led all receivers with a career-best seven receptions for 114 yards and a score. Defensively, the Tigers sacked MSU quarterback Kevin Fant five times and limited the Bulldogs to only 239 yards of offense.

Pair of QBs Lead LSU To 22-21 OT Win Over Oregon State

JaMarcus Russell started the comeback and then Marcus Randall finished it as the Tigers rallied from an 8-point deficit with less than two minutes remaining to force overtime and eventually beat Oregon State, 22-21, in Tiger Stadium in the season-opener for both teams. Trailing 9-0 at halftime, Russell replaced an ineffective Randall and pulled the Tigers to within 9-7 late in the third quarter on a 16-yard TD pass to Skyler Green. OSU answered with a 9-play, 65-yard drive to extend its margin to 15-7. The score remained that way until Russell rallied the Tigers on a 4-play, 64-yard drive capped with a 38-yard TD strike to Dwayne Bowe. Russell then converted the two-point conversion to tie the score at 15-15 with just over a minute left. In overtime and with Russell out with cramps, Randall returned to the field and scored on a 5-yard run to give LSU its first lead at 22-15. OSU followed with a TD of its own, however the extra-point attempt sailed wide right, the third missed PAT for the Beavers, and the Tigers escaped with a 22-21 win. For the game, Russell completed 9 of 26 passes for 145 yards and 2 TDs, while Randall was 7 of 18 for 66 yards and 1 interception. Vincent led the Tigers with 48 yards rushing, while Bowe caught 5 passes for 103 yards and a score.

Tigers Overpower Arkansas State, 53-3

Justin Vincent rushed for 102 yards and 2 TDs and three LSU quarterbacks combined to hit on 12 of 20 passes for 210 yards and 3 scores as the Tigers rolled to a 53-3 win over Arkansas State in Tiger Stadium. LSU wasted little time in establishing itself as the dominant team as the Tigers took the opening kickoff and marched 54 yards in 6 plays for a 7-0 lead following a 5-yard TD run by Vincent just two minutes into the contest. The Indians fumbled the ensuing kickoff and three plays later, Marcus Randall found Corey Webster for a 6-yard TD pass running the score to 13-0. From there, the route was on as the Tigers extended their lead to 23-0 after the first quarter and 37-0 at halftime. Arkansas State got on the board midway through the third quarter with a 34-yard field goal. LSU responded with a pair of touchdowns in a 3-minute span to stretch the lead to 50-3. Ryan Gaudet added a 33-yard field goal in the fourth quarter for the final margin. For the game, the Tigers limited ASU to just 54 yards rushing and only 201 yards of offense. JaMarcus Russell led all LSU quarterbacks by connecting on 7 of 11 passes for 151 yards and 2 TDs, while Randall hit on 5 of 7 for 59 yards and one score. Craig Davis led the Tigers with 4 catches for 73 yards, while Dwayne Bowe caught a pair of TD passes.

Auburn Scores Late To Hand LSU A 10-9 Defeat

Jason Campbell connected with Courtney Taylor on a 16-yard TD pass with just over a minute left to lift 14th-ranked Auburn to a 10-9 win over No. 4 LSU. The victory by Auburn snapped LSU's 10-game winning streak, one that dated back to a 33-7 win over South Carolina last October. The Auburn TD capped a contest that saw the LSU defense hold Auburn in check, limiting the Tigers to just 301 yards of offense, including only 131 yards on the ground. The LSU defense held Auburn's running back tandem of Carnell Williams (75 yards) and Ronnie Brown (67 yards) to 142 combined yards, 70 yards below their season average. LSU appeared to be in good shape early in the contest, taking the opening kickoff and marching 80 yards on 14 plays for a 6-0 lead following a Marcus Randall 9-yard TD pass to Dwayne Bowe. LSU's Ryan Gaudet pushed the PAT wide right, a point that would come back to haunt LSU. Auburn responded with a 14-play drive of its own that ended with a field goal. LSU, with JaMarcus Russell at QB, answered right back, going 55 yards on eight plays, capped with a 42-yard Chris Jackson field goal. That's all the scoring either team would get until the final minutes of the contest. LSU did have its chances in the second half, getting inside the Auburn 35-yard line twice, but the Tigers failed to capitalize on the opportunity. Alley Broussard led all running back with 84 yards on 10 carries, while Randall and Russell combined to hit on 12 of 28 passes for 168 yards and a TD.
