Tough performer who is not afraid to take on defenders.

SOPHOMORE SEASON (2003)

Played in 12 games with six starts ... Second on team with 521 yards on 112 carries ... Rushed for a pair of touchdowns ... Opened year as LSU's starting running back before an injury against Florida sidelined the sophomore for two games ... LSU's primary running back on third-down situations ... Returned to action on a limited basis against Louisiana Tech ... Was back at full strength in a back-up role to Justin Vincent for the final five games of season ... Looked to have regained early season form against Georgia in the SEC Championship game, rushing for 60 yards on eight carries ... Opened season with 81 yards on 15 attempts in 49-7 win over Louisiana-Monroe and followed that with 86 yards and two TDs in win over Arizona ... Has good hands out of backfield and he led all running backs with 12 catches for 74 yards and a TD ... Scored on a 17-yard TD reception from Matt Mauck in season-opener against Louisiana-Monroe.

REDSHIRT FRESHMAN SEASON (2002)

LSU's No. 3 tailback ... Played in 12 games with one start ... Started season-opener at fullback against Virginia Tech ... Ranked third on squad with 438 yards on 80 carries ... Rushed for four TDs, including a 63-yarder on the first play of the second half vs. Kentucky ... Averaged 5.5 yards per carry ... Rushed for 91 yards on nine carries in win over Kentucky ... Had 98 yards and a pair of TDs in victory over Louisiana-Lafayette ... Scored LSU's only TD vs. Auburn ... Caught six passes for 81 yards ... Redshirted in 2001 as a true freshman.

Played in two games for the Tigers ... Finished season with 27 yards rushing on eight carries ... Had 28 yards on seven carries in season-opener vs. Tulane ... Also had one carry for minus-1 yard vs. Kentucky ... Granted a medical redshirt.

Named All-American by both ESPN and Fox Sports and was rated among the top 100 players in the nation by Rivals.com and by ESPN's Tom Lemming ... Member of the Houston Chronicle Top 100 ... First-Team 5A All-State in Texas as well as First-Team All-District and All-County ... Played quarterback in high school ... As a senior, completed 37-of-91 passes for 425 yards ... Rushed for 1,429 yards on 159 carries for an average of 8.9 yards per carry ... Rushed for 26 touchdowns and returned eight kickoffs for 380 yards for an average of 47.5 a return ... Clocked at 10.7 in the 100 meters and 22.1 in the 200 meters ... Coached in high school by Charles Perridon.

Member of the 2004 United States Olympic Team ... Qualified for the Olympics in the 400-meter hurdles with a third place finish at the U.S. Olympic Trials in July ... Clocked with a personal-best and school-record time of 48.05 seconds at the Olympic Trials to earn a spot in the Summer Games ... Only the second athlete in LSU history to qualify for the Olympics in the 400-meter hurdles, joining Slats Hardin, who competed in the 1932 and 1936 Summer Games ... Speedster who should be a deep threat for the Tigers in 2004 ... One of the fastest players to ever wear an LSU football uniform ... World-class track athlete who is the only player in LSU history to win national titles in two sports - track and field and football ... Expected to see increased action in 2004 at wide receiver ... Continues to improve pass catching skills ... Split time during the spring working with the football team during the week, while spending time with track and field squad on off days for football as well as the weekend ... In three years as a member of the LSU track and field team, has been a part of three national champion relay teams - the 4x400 in 2003 and the 4x100 in 2002 and 2003 ... Runner-up in the 400-meter hurdles at the NCAA Outdoor Meet in 2004 ... Placed fourth in the 400-meter hurdles at the 2003 NCAA meet to help the Tigers to a fourth place national finish at the event ... Has earned nine All-America honors in two years on the track and field team ... Member of LSU's national champion outdoor track and field team in 2002 and LSU's national champion indoor team in 2004.

SOPHOMORE SEASON (2003)

Speedster has become a consistent contributor on LSU's special teams as the season wore on ... Played in 11 games for the Tigers in 2003 ... Did not record any offensive statistics for the Tigers ... Did however make his mark on kickoff and punt coverage ... Recorded eight special teams tackles for LSU, including three in win over Ole Miss and one against Oklahoma in the national championship game.

REDSHIRT FRESHMAN SEASON (2002)

Caught three passes for 28 yards in nine games for LSU in 2002 ... Caught one pass for 12 yards in first collegiate game against Virginia Tech and had two receptions for 16 yards in win over Louisiana-Lafayette ... Played a key role in LSU winning the 2002 NCAA Outdoor Track and Field title in the spring of 2002 ... Anchored LSU's 4x100 meter relay team that won the national title and then 20 minutes later finished second in the 400-meter hurdles with a school-record time of 48.30 ... Clinched the NCAA team title for the Tigers in the last event of the meet, anchoring LSU's third place 4x400 meter relay team ... Named SEC Male Track and Field Freshman of the Year in 2002.

TRUE FRESHMAN SEASON (2001)

Redshirted as a true freshman in 2001.

HIGH SCHOOL

Caught 36 passes for 967 yards and 10 touchdowns as a senior ... Member of the Houston Chronicle Top 100 and was selected as an All-American by USA Today ... Proved to be the perfect compliment to fellow running back Justin Vincent during LSU's run to the 2003 national title ... Coming off an exceptional spring ... LSU coach Nick Saban says of Broussard, "the more confidence he gets in how to run our plays and do some things in the passing game, I think the better off we're going to be."

TRUE FRESHMAN SEASON (2003)

Played in 13 games with no starts ... Missed the Arkansas game with bruised ribs ... Had breakout game against South Carolina, rushing for 108 yards on 19 carries ... Added 106 yards and one TD on 16 rushes in win over Louisiana Tech ... Ran for 79 yards and a TD in road victory over Alabama ... Had 47 yards on eight carries in win over Georgia in SEC Championship Game ... Rushed twice for 6 yards against Oklahoma in the national championship game ... Finished rookie season ranked third on team with 389 rushing yards and four TDs ... Caught one pass for five yards ... Also played on LSU's special teams ... Teamed with Daniel Francis to tackle Georgia punter Gordon Ely-Kelso in the endzone for a safety and an 8-0 LSU first quarter lead in the SEC Championship Game.

Member of the Baton Rouge Advocate Super Dozen, the Shreveport Times Top 20, the New Orleans Times-Picayune's Top 25 Blue Chip list as well as the Orlando Sentinel All-South team ... Named to the Super Southern 100 by the Atlanta Journal-Constitution ... Ranked No. 8 by ESPN.com and No. 6 by College Football News ... Continued his torrid play into the 5A playoffs with over 700 yards on the ground spearheading the Rams to the state semifinals ...
