Northwestern St.
The 2003 Season Opener

Friday, February 7
6:30 p.m., Alex Box Stadium

The 108th season begins: LSU lifts the curtain on its 2003 season by hosting Northwestern St. this weekend at The Box.

- Baseball is the oldest intercollegiate sport at LSU, starting with a 10-8 victory over Tulane on May 13, 1893.
- This year's season opener is the earliest in LSU history, besting last year's February 8 opener.
- LSU will be looking to start 3-0 for the third time in the last four seasons. The Fighting Tigers swept Birmingham-Southern last year and Virginia in 2000.
- LSU but has won seven of its previous eight openers and 17 of its last 20. LSU lost to Kansas St. to begin 2001.
- LSU opened against Northwestern St. in 1993, taking an 8-3 victory to start the Tigers' second national championship campaign.
- LSU will be opening the season against a Louisiana foe for the first time since taking two games from USL in 1998.
- LSU has not opened away from Baton Rouge since the 1995 Winn-Dixie Showdown, and has not opened a season in an opponents' park since 1985 at Central Florida.

Scouting the Demons: Northwestern St. is rebuilding after winning the Southland Conference title in 2002 under first-year coach Mitch Gaspard.

- Despite the loss of seven starters, the Demons were picked to finish second in the SLC by the league coaches behind Southwest Texas. NSU was voted in a tie for fourth by the league sports information directors.
- Gaspard became the Demons' third coach in an eight-year stretch when he replaced John Cohen.
- Gaspard was an infielder on LSU's 1985 SEC West division championship team before transferring to Houston.
- Gaspard came to Natchitoches after serving seven seasons at Alabama as Jim Wells' top assistant.
- NSU catcher Anatole Vincent was a first team All-Southland Conference selection after batting .361 with 11 home runs and 60 RBI.
- The Demons' top returning pitcher is senior left-hander Casey Johnson, who went 11-1 with a 2.70 ERA to earn honorable mention All-Southland Conference honors.

About the Series: LSU holds a commanding 41-11 edge in the 76-year old series.

- The first four meetings took place from 1926-28 when NSU was known as Louisiana Normal.
- The teams split a home-and-home series in 2001, with both teams winning on their home field.
- LSU has won four of the last five games in Baton Rouge, with the Demons winning 12-6 in 1999.
- LSU will play a fourth game with the Demons on April 9 at Natchitoches.

Tonight's Starting Pitcher: #12 RHP Jake Tompkins
Sr.-1L, 6-0, 195, Auburn, Calif. (Sacramento City College)

Jake Tompkins gets the ball on opening night, and given the fact the JUCO transfer was a second-team All-SEC selection in 2002, he is the logical choice. Tompkins began the 2002 season in the starting rotation, but was shifted to the bullpen in late March. In his closer role, Tompkins was nearly at his best, going 5-1 with a 1.91 ERA in 19 appearances with four saves. Northwestern St. will counter on opening night with their top returning pitcher from 2002, senior left-hander Casey Johnson (11-1, 2.70).

2002: Second team All-SEC selection, going 7-1 with a 2.68 ERA in a team high 25 games.

- A 28th-round selection of the Texas Rangers in the 2002 first-year player draft, Tompkins opted to return to LSU for his senior season.
- Ranked No. 16 in Baseball America's pre-season survey of college baseball's top 50 seniors.
- Also rated by Baseball America as having best breaking ball and second best control among SEC pitchers.
- Is the latest in a long line of LSU players to come from Sacramento City College, joining former Tigers Conan Horton, Brandon Bowe, Jake Esteves and David Raymer.
- Allowed two of 20 inherited runners to score in 19 relief outings.
- Held opponents to a .198 batting average with runners in scoring position, and posted 32 of his 96 strikeouts (exactly one-third) in those situations.
- Yielded only 14 extra base hits in 317 at-bats.
- Gave up only one hit in 13 at-bats with the bases loaded.
- Was named the Most Outstanding Player of the NCAA Baton Rouge regional, when he went 2-0 with a 1.59 ERA.
- Earned a win in relief vs. Southern (5/31) in the regional opener by striking out eight in five innings of work as LSU won 6-5 in the bottom of the 9th.
- Came back with one day of rest to pitch 6.1 innings vs. UL-Lafayette (6/2, Game 1), allowing just one un-earned run and striking out five to keep the Tigers alive in the regional.
- Closed out SEC Tournament victory over South Carolina (5/23) by striking out four in 2.0 innings of scoreless relief.
- Struck out 10 in 4.2 innings in spot start at New Orleans (4/30), combining with Clay Harris and Brad David on a 13-0 shutout.
- Earned win in relief vs. Arkansas (4/28), allowing one earned run in 3.2 innings to help complete sweep of Razorbacks.
- Had spectacular weekend in series at Auburn (4/5, 4/7) allowing just four hits in 5.1 scoreless innings of work. Earned save in series finale to give Tigers their first SEC series victory of the season.
- Earned save in his relief debut vs. Mississippi St. (3/30), striking out four in 2.2 hitless innings of work.
- Struck out six in 6.0 shutout innings vs. UL-Lafayette (3/12).
- Pitched 8.0 strong innings in no decision vs. Long Beach St. (3/3) on sub-freezing day, walking none and striking out eight.
- Missed start at Houston (2/24) due to strained pectoral muscle.
- Gave up only one earned run and struck out six in 6.0 innings in victory over Mercer (2/17).
- Struck out seven in first career start, picking up win vs. Birmingham-Southern (2/10).

Opening against the state

For the first time in five years, LSU is beginning its baseball season against an in-state foe, as Northwestern St. pays a visit for a three-game series.

LSU last opened a season with a Louisiana opponent in 1998, when the Tigers took two games from USL, winning 11-7 and 15-0. The third game of the series was rained out and made up three days later after the Tigers defeated LSU-Shreveport.

In the modern era of LSU baseball (since 1965), LSU is 9-3 in season openers against Louisiana opponents, including the 8-3 victory in 1993 against Northwestern State. LSU's last loss to an in-state opponent in a season opener was a 6-2 setback to Nicholls St. in 1980.

Smoke faces familiar foe

LSU coach Smoke Laval is familiar with Northwestern St., going 14-16 vs. the Demons in his seven seasons as the coach at UL-Monroe from 1994-2000. Tonight's game marks the first of seven contests for the Tigers against Southland Conference teams. LSU will play four games against Northwestern St. and one each with Southeastern Louisiana, Nicholls State and UL-Monroe. Laval was 5-1 vs. the SLC in 2002, sweeping four games from UL-Monroe and splitting a pair with SLU.



Gaspard returns to The Box

Mitch Gaspard is no stranger to Alex Box Stadium, having come to Baton Rouge on several occasions as the top assistant to Jim Wells at Alabama from 1995-2001, and also during stints at USL (1989-92) and Northwestern St. (1993-94).

Tonight, Gaspard will become only the second former LSU player to return to The Box to face the Fighting Tigers. Gaspard was an infielder for Skip Bertman's first two LSU teams in 1984 and 1985. Gaspard was the starting second baseman on the 1985 team that won the SEC West and played in the NCAA Central regional. Gaspard, a Texas native, played his final two seasons at Houston.

The other player to lead a team against the Tigers is Ole Miss coach Mike Bianco, a catcher for LSU in 1988 and 1989 and an assistant coach under Skip Bertman from 1993-97. Bianco, who leads the Rebels to Baton Rouge April 11-13, also coached at McNeese St. from 1998-2000. Bianco is 3-5 against the Tigers at Ole Miss and 5-8 overall.

Ironically, when Bianco left to become an assistant at LSU in 1993, Gaspard took his place on Wells' staff.

Tigers to see Gaspard's predecessors, too
Mitch Gaspard is following in a line of highly successful coaches at Northwestern St., and LSU will face the previous three Demon mentors in Southeastern Conference play.

First in to Baton Rouge is John Cohen, the man whom Gaspard succeeded in Natchitoches. Cohen is now associate head coach at Florida, which visits Alex Box Stadium March 14-16 to open SEC play.

LSU will visit Alabama, led by Jim Wells, March 28-30, and the Tigers close the season at Arkansas May 16-18. The Razorbacks are in their first season under Dave Van Horn, who returned to his alma mater after leading Nebraska to back-to-back College World Series appearances.

Tompkins gets the call for opener

Senior right-hander Jake Tompkins takes the ball for the season opener, and although it's not uncommon for a junior or senior to start the first game, Tompkins' background makes him an unlikely starter.

Since 1987, the first team that was comprised completely of Skip Bertman recruits, the opening game pitcher has had at least two years of prior experience in the LSU system. Tompkins transferred to LSU from Sacramento City College in 2002 and earned second team All-SEC honors.

Bo Pettit, Sunday's starter, is a fifth-year senior, while Saturday starter Brian Wilson will be a true junior in 2003.

Old faces in new places

Three players who ended the 2002 season as starters for LSU find themselves in new positions as the 2003 season dawns this weekend against Northwestern St.

The most publicized move, obviously, is that of Aaron Hill from shortstop to third base. Hill would rather have not made the move, but was forced to with the tragic death of Wally Pontiff. Hill played third base for the United States national team that captured the silver medal at the World University Games in Italy in August.

In his LSU career, Hill, a California native, will now have played four positions (left field, second base, shortstop and third base), and served as the Tigers' designated hitter.

The other position shifts are in the LSU outfield. Jon Zeringue moves from left field to right field to replace the departed Sean Barker. Zeringue has shed 30 pounds, gained muscle and possess a cannon arm that makes him ideal for the long throws to third base required of a right fielder.

To Zeringue's right will be J.C. Holt, who was a freshman All-America at second base. Holt's move to center field will utilize his tremendous speed and ability to track down deep fly balls.

The only LSU position starter in the same place from 2002 is Blake Gill, who returns to man first base. However, Gill is so versatile he could very see time at second, third and the two corner outfield spots before the year is over.

Horwath unusual...and not so unusual
Matt Horwath is projected to start at shortstop for the Fighting Tigers in 2003, a position that has demanded experience in past years for LSU.

Since Skip Bertman came to LSU in 1984, no freshman has started at the key position in the infield. Transfers such as Andy Sheets, Brandon Larson and Josh Dalton have taken over at the position right away, but all were juniors. In fact, several LSU shortstops in recent years have started out at other positions in the infield, including Aaron Hill, Ryan Theriot, Jason Williams, and Russ Johnson.

But a freshman in the infield isn't rare at LSU. Several LSU freshmen have started their first year in the infield and gone on to distinguished careers, most notably three-time All-American Todd Walker, but also including Johnson, Williams, Theriot and Blair Barbier.



Looking back at 2002

The 2002 season fell short of a trip to the College World Series, but Smoke Laval's first LSU team more than upheld the Fighting Tigers' legacy of excellence. Some highlights from the 2002 season:

- Following a 16-12 start, LSU finished the season with a 28-10 surge, including a 22-7 run to end the regular season.
- During the 28-10 stretch, LSU raised its batting average by 33 points (.316 to .283) and lowered its ERA by 1.41 runs per game (2.81 to 4.22).
- LSU reached the NCAA super regional round for the fourth consecutive year, making the Tigers one of six teams to reach the super regional every year since the format began in 1999. The others are Clemson, Florida St., Miami, USC and Stanford.
- LSU coach Smoke Laval became the only first-year coach to take a team to an NCAA super regional.
- LSU won an NCAA regional for the seventh consecutive year, extending their current NCAA record.
- The Tigers continue to hold the highest all-time winning percentage in NCAA tournament play at .734 (94-34).
- The Tigers also hosted a regional for the 13th straight year, leaving LSU three short of the record for hosting held by Texas from 1979-94.
- LSU won 40 or more games for the 14th consecutive year and for the 18th time in the last 28 years.
- The Tigers' 19 SEC victories marked the 13th time in the last 14 years LSU has won 18 or more league games.
- LSU has posted a winning record in the SEC every year since 1985.
- LSU's pitching staff won its second SEC ERA crown in the last five years, posting a 3.42 mark, an improvement of 1.32 runs per game over 2001.
- LSU pitchers hurled five shutouts in 2002, tops in the SEC.
- LSU pitchers led the SEC with 14 complete games and gave up the fewest extra base hits in the league with 145.
- LSU's back-to-back shutouts of Arkansas on April 26 and 27 were the first against an SEC opponent since 1986 and the first against any opponent since 1996.
- LSU also led the SEC with 73 double plays, including a school record 5 vs. Georgia on April 13.

Remembering Wally

The LSU family suffered one of its most tragic losses on July 24, 2002 when Tiger third baseman Wally Pontiff died in his sleep at his parents' home in Metairie from a heart abnormality. The 21-year old was one of the most beloved figures in LSU baseball history, as well as one of the most talented, earning a first team All-SEC selection in 2001 and second team honors in 2002. Pontiff made an immediate impact as a freshman in 2000, breaking into the starting lineup to earn the MVP of the SEC Tournament and help LSU win their fifth national championship in 10 years.

Pontiff is gone from us on earth, but he will never be forgotten. His locker in the LSU clubhouse at Alex Box Stadium has been encased in glass, allowing all of the 2003 Tigers to feel Wally's spirit. His jersey number 31 will be unveiled on the center field wall prior to tonight's season opener, and he is memorialized on "The Intimidator", the billboard behind the right field fence.

At Tuesday's baseball and softball media day, the Tiger Athletic Foundation announced plans for the Wally Pontiff Memorial endowed scholarship fund, which was set up by George Boudreaux of Covington. The scholarship will be funded by sales of a commemorative art print painted by Shreveport artist Ron Atwood, 500 of which will be signed by Atwood, LSU athletics director Skip Bertman, coach Smoke Laval and Pontiff's father, Wally Pontiff Sr. The signed prints are \$300 each, while the regular print sells for \$85. Both are available from TAF by calling (225) 388-9500 or visiting the TAF website, www.lsutaf.org.

Pontiff completed the 2002 season in the top 10 in three LSU categories: hits (9th, 254), batting average (10th, .344) and doubles (7th, 49). Pontiff was also a two-time member of the SEC Academic Honor Roll and a 2002 academic all-district selection with a 3.25 GPA in biological sciences.

Tigers keep the turnstiles spinning

LSU set two NCAA attendance records in 2002 as the Tigers maintained their position as the nation's attendance leader for an unprecedented seventh consecutive year.

The first came on April 10 at the Louisiana Superdome, as a paid crowd of 27,673 witnessed the Fighting Tigers' 9-5 victory over Tulane. The actual crowd of 25,101 also broke the former attendance mark of 24,859 at the 1999 College World Series for a session that featured Alabama, Miami, Rice and Oklahoma St.

When the Tigers wrapped up the NCAA Baton Rouge regional title, a grand total of 271,159 fans had passed through the turnstiles, setting a record for per-game attendance of 7,532 for 36 home dates.



Tigers picked to win SEC

For the third consecutive year, LSU has been picked as the pre-season favorite to win the Southeastern Conference championship by the league's coaches.

LSU, which has not won the league championship since 1997, was picked by seven league coaches to win the championship. Mississippi St. was picked by four coaches, and defending conference champion South Carolina received the final first-place vote. Coaches were not allowed to vote for their own school.

LSU was also tabbed as the favorite to win the SEC West division championship, ahead of Mississippi St. and Auburn, both of whom are ranked in at least two of the three major pre-season polls. Defending division champion Alabama was picked fourth, followed by Ole Miss and Arkansas.

In the East, South Carolina was picked to win its fourth consecutive division championship, followed by Florida, Georgia, Tennessee, Vanderbilt and Kentucky. The pre-season order of prediction mirrors the final 2002 standings in the SEC East.

The league's 30-game schedule opens on March 14 and runs through April 18. The top eight teams in the conference standings qualify for the SEC Tournament in Birmingham May 21-25.

Tigers only unanimous Top 10 in SEC
LSU begins the 2003 season as the only SEC team to be ranked in the top 10 of all three major pre-season polls. The Tigers start 2003 ranked sixth by *Collegiate Baseball*, seventh by *ESPN/USA Today Sports Weekly*, and ninth by *Baseball America*. The Fighting Tigers finished 2002 ranked 11th in all three polls after losing to Rice in the super regional.

South Carolina, the defending SEC champion and national runner-up in 2002, is ranked 8th by both *collegiate Baseball* and *USA Today*, but only 14th by *Baseball America*. Mississippi St. and Auburn were the only other SEC teams to be ranked in the pre-season polls.

LSU ranks highly in *Baseball America* pre-season survey
LSU's baseball program garnered several lofty honors in *Baseball America's* pre-season survey. The Tigers are ranked ninth by the Durham, N.C. magazine in its pre-season poll.

The Tigers were picked by *Baseball America* to win the SEC West, with two LSU players, Aaron Hill and Brian Wilson, earning selection to the pre-season all-conference team. Hill, who moves from shortstop to third base this season, was also named a second team all-American by the magazine. Hill was rated #15 on the list of the nation's Top 50 juniors.

Hill also was rated as the league's top "pure hitter" and the #3 baserunner in the SEC. Hill was also projected as the league's #3 draft prospect for 2003 behind South Carolina catcher Landon Powell and Mississippi St. left-handed pitcher Paul Maholm.

Wilson was rated by the magazine as possessing the best fastball in the SEC, while fellow hurler Jake Tompkins was rated as having the best breaking ball and #3 control in the SEC. Wilson was also ranked #26 among the nation's top 50 juniors, and Tompkins was #16 among the nation's top 50 seniors, just behind fellow hurler Bo Pettit at #15.

Freshman shortstop Matt Horwath was listed fourth among the top newcomers in the SEC despite going undrafted out of Lake Mary High School in Florida.

The Box among the best ballparks

Baseball America also surveyed the nation's coaches and baseball sports information directors to name the best ballparks in America, a survey last done by the magazine in 1998.

LSU's Alex Box Stadium, which was not ranked among the top 15 in the last poll, came in fifth among the poll of SIDs, while tying for fourth in the coaches' survey with Nebraska. Coaches and SIDs were asked to rank their top five ballparks based on several criteria, including aesthetics, dugout, batting cage and clubhouse facilities, playing conditions, fan friendliness, playing conditions and tradition.

Auburn's Hitchcock Field at Plainsman Park was named the nation's best ballpark by both the coaches and SIDs, with Arkansas' Baum Stadium ranking second among coaches and third among SIDs. Mississippi State's Dudy Noble Field was second in the SID poll but only sixth in the coaches' poll. Other SEC ballparks in the top 20 included Georgia's Foley Field and South Carolina's Sarge Frye Field.

Alex Box Stadium enters its 66th year of service this season. The facility has hosted 14 NCAA regional tournaments, one super regional and four SEC tournaments since 1984, during which time a total of 2,858,648 fans have watched LSU compile a 575-132-1 (.813) mark at home.

Cox Sports Television announces new deal with LSU

Six LSU baseball games in 2003 will be televised live as part of a new partnership between Cox Sports Television and LSU athletics. The deal was announced on Tuesday as part of baseball and softball media day.

Cox Sports Television, which airs on cable channel 38 in Baton Rouge and on 17 cable systems throughout Louisiana, will air tape delay broadcasts of all LSU football games, replays of all four LSU coaches' shows, as well as live programming in many of LSU's Olympic Sports. Cox's first LSU baseball telecast is actually part of the company's partnership with Southern University, as the Tigers visit the Jaguars for the renewal of the cross-town rivalry on March 18 at Lee-Hines Field.

The addition of the Cox Sports games gives LSU 23 live television dates in 2003. LSU appeared on live television 22 times during the 2002 season and holds an all-time mark of 150-82-1 (.646) in televised games.

The complete television schedule appears on page 7 of these notes.

Changes for 2003

There are several changes on the college baseball landscape in 2003, the biggest of which involves the game's showcase event, the College World Series in Omaha.

The tournament format changes from a single national championship game to a best-of-three championship series between the winners of the two four-team brackets. The CWS is set to run from June 13 through June 23 at Omaha's Rosenblatt Stadium. The change in format coincides with ESPN's new 10-year, \$13 billion contract with the NCAA to televise the NCAA women's basketball tournament and the CWS in their entirety.

Major rule changes include:

- Zero tolerance enforcement of the NCAA's no-tobacco policy.
- The strike zone has been redefined and illustrated in the NCAA rule book.
- Players are now allowed to wear only one elbow pad no longer than 10 inches.
- The obstruction rule has been clarified
- The ball remains in play if a fielder steps into a bench or dugout and does not lose body control.
- It is recommended (not required) that bat handlers wear a helmet.



LSU Coach Smoke Laval

Smoke Laval had a very successful first year as LSU's coach, leading the Tigers to the NCAA Super Regional round for the fourth consecutive year and posting a 44-22 record. For his efforts, Laval was named the Louisiana Sportswriters' Association Louisiana coach of the year.

Laval was named Skip Bertman's successor on July 18, 2000, and spent the 2001 season as the LSU administrative assistant. From 1994-2000, Laval coached for seven years at Louisiana-Monroe, guiding the Indians to three NCAA regional berths (1995, 1999, 2000) and a 241-159 mark. Among Laval's pupils at ULM was Ben Sheets, a 2000 member of the United States Olympic gold medal team and a 2001 major league all-star with the Milwaukee Brewers.

Laval was Bertman's top assistant at LSU from 1984-1993, helping the Tigers reach the College World series six times and win the national championship in 1991 and 1993. Laval was also a graduate assistant at LSU under Jack Lamabe in 1979 and an assistant at Florida in 1982 and 1983.
