Listed as the backup to sixth-year senior Kirston Pittman at defensive end going into the 2008 season ... Expected to see a great deal of action due to LSU's two-deep rotation on the defensive front ... A player with good quickness and extraordinary athletic ability at the defensive end spot ... Brother is starting safety for the Tigers - Chad Jones ... For career, has played in 18 games with no starts ... Has IO tackles, 5.5 tackles for loss, and a pair of sacks during his career.

Defensive Tackle 6-3 • 294 • Sr. • 2L Breaux Bridge, La. Breaux Bridge HS

Projected to return to the starting lineup at defensive tackle in 2008 after missing most of the 2007 season with a knee injury ... Started first three games of 2007 season before he was sidelined with a season-ending injury (ACL) to his right knee during a Wednesday practice the week of the South Carolina game ... Of Alexander's knee injury, LSU All-America defensive tackle Glenn Dorsey said, "Charles is a great player. We lost a lot when we lost him. He kept players off of me. We missed him a lot." ... Had knee surgically repaired in October and returned to the field on a limited basis during the spring ... Expected to be at full strength for the season opener against Appalachian State ... Played in 16 games with eight starts during career.

JUNIOR SEASON (2007)

Started first three games at defensive tackle alongside All-American Glenn Dorsey before an injury to his right knee the week of the South Carolina game sidelined him for the rest of the year ... In three games, recorded six tackles and had a pair of quarterback hurries ... Made a career-high tying four tackles against Middle Tennessee State ... Had one tackle against both Mississipi State and Virginia Tech.

SOPHOMORE SEASON (2006)

Played in a total of 13 games with six starts ... Started final six games of season, including LSU's 41-14 win over Notre Dame in the Sugar Bowl ... ... Finished the year as the Tigers' second-leading tackler with 65 stops, including 36 solo tackles ... Was also credited with four tackles for loss, 2.5 sacks, an interception and a quarterback hurry ... Recorded the first pick of his career in the Tigers' victory over Tennessee ... Turned in a season-high II tackles in the Tigers' win over Fresno State ... Was also credited with a tackle for loss and a sack in that victory ... Against Arizona, had nine tackles to go along with a career-high 1.5 TFL and 1.5 sacks ... Was nearly as good against Auburn, leading the team with eight tackles ... Played key role in LSU's 41-14 win over Notre Dame, posting four tackles for a Tiger defense that limited the Irish to only 292 yards of offense.

LSU's starter at left offensive tackle ... One of the veterans on the LSU offensive line ... Goes into junior season having started 27-straight games at left tackle ... Played a school-record I,03I snaps from scrimmage in 2007 ... Joined Herman Johnson (1,030 snaps in 2007) as the only two players in school history to see action in over I,000 plays from scrimmage in a single season ... Teams with center Brett Helms and left guard Herman Johnson to give the Tigers one of the strongest left sides in college football ... Intense competitor who excels at both run and pass blocking ... Rarely takes a play off and has been on the field for every snap for the Tigers over the past two years with the exception of those plays when the game had already been decided ... Team leader on offense.

SOPHOMORE SEASON (2007)

Played and started all I4 games at left offensive tackle ... Earned second-team AlI-SEC honors from the SEC Coaches ... Helped pave the way for an LSU team that ranked second in the SEC and IIth in the country in rushing offense, averaging 2l4 yards per game ... Set a school record by playing I,03I snaps from scrimmage in 2007 ... In all, was on the field for 97.8 percent (I,03I of I,054 snaps) during LSU's national championship season ... His I,03I plays ranked first on the squad, one play ahead of Herman Johnson's I,030 snaps ... Played every snap in games against South Carolina (69), Florida (80), Kentucky (9I), Auburn (68), Alabama (80) and Tennessee (8I) ... Led team with five pancake blocks and ranked second with 74 knockdown blocks ... Gave up just one sack last year ... Was impressive in back-to-back games vs. Florida and Kentucky, posting II knockdown blocks in each effort ...

Had a season-high two pancake blocks in the win over Auburn ... Continues a trend at LSU that has seen the Tigers start only two players at left tackle since the start of the 2002 season ... Andrew Whitworth, now a member of the Cincinnati Bengals, started at left tackle for four years from 2002-05, never missing a game ... Black has followed that with 27-straight starts at the position in 2006 and 2007.

REDSHIRT FRESHMAN SEASON (2006)

Started all I3 games at left tackle ... Was in on 739 of LSU's 818 plays in 2006, recording 81 knockdown blocks and 19 pancakes ... The 739 snaps from scrimmage was the most of any Tiger lineman ... Against Kentucky, recorded a career-high 12 knockdown blocks and two pancakes ... Had 10 knockdowns and a career-high seven pancake blocks in the win over Tennessee ... Recorded 10 knockdowns and a pancake vs. Arkansas.

TRUE FRESHMAN SEASON (2005)

Redshirted as a true freshman in 2005.

HIGH SCHOOL

A blue-chip offensive lineman rated among the best in the state of Texas and nationally ... Ranked the nation's No. 14 offensive tackle by ESPN ... One of the top all-around athletes in the state of Texas and the nation as a senior ... A standout, dual-threat quarterback at MacArthur High School as a senior ... LSU's starter at the "X" receiver position on offense ... Emerged as one of LSU's top receivers a year ago after transferring from Pearl River Community College ... Player with big-play capability every time he touches the football ... Has tremendous hands and is a precise route runner ... Has shown the ability to outrun cornerbacks ... Considered one of the top receivers in college football heading into the 2008 season ... Did not start playing football until his senior year of high school ... One of the few players in the history of college football who have played for a national title in both the junior college team (Pearl River CC) lost to Blinn (Texas), 19-7, in the Pilgrim's Bowl, the junior college national championship game, in 2006.

JUNIOR SEASON (2007)

Junior college transfer who made an immediate impact in his first year with the Tigers ... Played in all I4 games with six starts ... Ranked first on the squad in receiving TDs (7), second in receiving yards (621) and third in catches (35) ... Nine of his 35 receptions went for at least 20 yards and had four catches of 35 yards or better, including two against Alabama ... After going without a catch in two of his first three games, caught at least one pass in final IO games ... Had career-best six receptions against Alabama and Arkansas ...
