Speedster who had an outstanding first year at the wideout position for the Tigers ... Moved from running back to wide receiver in the spring of 2002 and the results were immediate ...Missed the last two games of the season with a broken arm ... Returned to full strength during the spring ... Player with all of the tools necessary to excel at wide receiver ... Is very athletic, has good hands and turns routine plays into outstanding ones ... Was on the receiving end of perhaps the most memorable play in school history as he hauled in a 75-yard TD pass from Marcus Randall as time expired to beat Kentucky last year ... Dubbed "The Bluegrass Miracle," The Associated Press called it the Play of the Year in college football ... Also a member of LSU's 2001 National Championship Indoor Track and Field team.

JUNIOR SEASON (2002)

Missed the last two games of the season after breaking forearm against Ole Miss ... Injured the arm while making his eighth TD grab of the season just before halftime against the Rebels ... Underwent surgery a day later and had



14 screws and two plates placed in his arm ... Ranked second on team with 23 catches for 447 yards and a team-best eight TDs ...The eight TD receptions rank as the seventh-highest total in LSU history for a single-season ... Had perhaps the most memorable catch in school history, a 75-yard grab dubbed "The Bluegrass Miracle" as time expired in LSU's 33-30 win over Kentucky ... The catch has been called college football's play of the year by Sports Illustrated and the Associated Press ... Was also nominated for an ESPY ... That catch capped a five-reception, 201-yard, three-touchdown day for Henderson, a performance that earned him SEC Offensive Player of the Week honors ... Took a shovel pass vs.Kentucky and turned it into a 70-yard scoring play ... Caught two TD passes in win over Florida and had one each vs. Louisiana-Lafayette, Mississippi State and Ole Miss ... Missed the Arkansas and Texas games with a broken arm ... Eight TD receptions came over last eight games of his season.

SOPHOMORE SEASON (2001)

Played in 10 games and rushed for 273 yards on 47 carries during the regular season ... Rushed 13 times for 54 yards,including a long run of 17 yards, against Illinois in the Sugar Bowl ... Had 9 carries for 46 yards in the fourth quarter vs.Illinois ... Also returned a pair of kickoffs for 44 yards in the Sugar Bowl ...Had 50 yard run vs.Florida ...Scored on a 28-yard run vs.Mississippi State ...Member of LSU's national champion indoor track and field team ... Ran the second-fastest 60-meter time in school history (6.72 seconds) ... Member of LSU's NCAA-qualifying 4 x 100 relay team.

Scored on an 8-yard end-around against Kentucky ...Rushed for 26 yards on four carries,including a 22-yard run,vs. Ole Miss ... 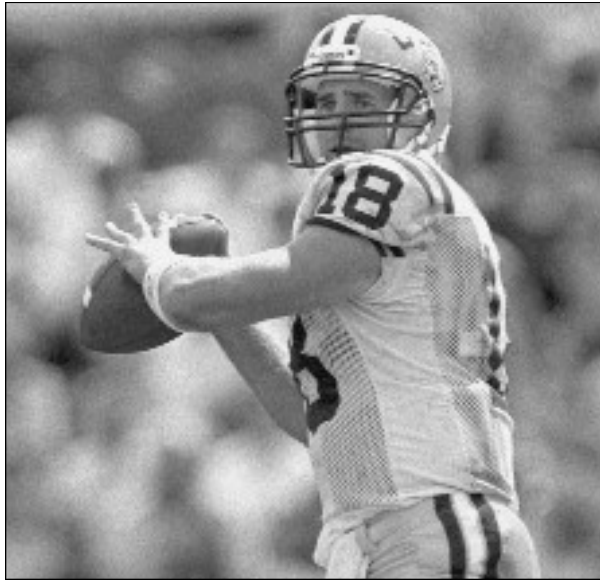

Athletic player who, along with Matt Mauck, gives the Tigers a pair of experienced quarterbacks heading into 2003 ... Took over the starting role for the Tigers after Mauck when down with a season-ending foot injury against Florida ... Started six of LSU's final seven games, including the Cotton Bowl ... Gives the Tigers a quarterback with good speed and a strong arm ... Likes to get out of the pocket and run ... Street and Smith calls Randall the most dangerous scrambler in the SEC in its preseason issue ... Smart player who is the brother of former Southern starting quarterback Eric Randall.

SOPHOMORE SEASON (2002)

Started six of LSU's last seven games, including the Cotton Bowl ... Posted a 2-4 mark as LSU's starting quarterback ... Inserted into starting lineup against South Carolina after Matt Mauck's season-ending injury vs. Florida and led the Tigers to a 38-14 victory ... Completed 87-of-181 passes for 1,173 yards, seven touchdowns and only five interceptions ... Four of the five interceptions came in loss to Auburn ... Had other interception vs. Texas in the Cotton Bowl ... Had a streak of 113 straight passes without an interception snapped in third quarter of the Cotton Bowl ... Rushed for 348 yards on 73 carries for a 4.8 average ... Had a pair of rushing TDs ... Capped season with a 19-of-45 performance for 193 yards and one TD vs. Texas in the Cotton Bowl ... Delivered one of the most memorable plays in LSU history - "The Bluegrass Miracle" - when he connected with Devery Henderson on a 75-yard Hail Mary TD pass as time expired to beat Kentucky ... That play was called the play of the year in college football by Sports Illustrated and the Associated Press ... Threw for a career-best three TDs in win over Wildcats ... Had TD passes of 75, 70 and 30 yards in Kentucky game ... Had outstanding game in loss to Arkansas, completing 14-of-25 passes for 203 yards and one TD ... Rushed for 26 yards and one score vs. the Razorbacks ... Became the first quarterback at LSU to win an SEC game in first collegiate start (beat South Carolina) since Sol Graves beat Georgia in 1990 ... Tore ACL in right knee in spring game in 2002 ... On the play, Randall simply dropped back to pass and the knee gave way ... Rehabbed over the summer and was back for fall camp in August.
