LSU BATTLES SECOND-RANKED TENNESSEE FOR SEC TITLE

Two of the nation's hottest teams will square off on Saturday in the Georgia Dome as the 20th-ranked LSU Tigers face second-ranked Tennessee with the Southeastern Conference title on the line. LSU, winners of four straight and six of its last seven, are 8-3 overall and finished with a 5-3 league mark. LSU is playing in its first SEC Championship game after beating Auburn, 27-14, last week in Baton Rouge. Tennessee, winners of seven in a row, is 10-1 overall. The Vols are coming off a 34-32 win over Florida. The Tigers have seven SEC titles to their credit with the last coming in 1988. Since going to divisions in 1992, LSU has shared the SEC Western Division title three times - 1996, 1997 and 2001.

LSU KNOCKS OFF AUBURN TO CLINCH BERTH IN TITLE GAME

LaBrandon Toefield rushed for 120 yards and scored his SEC-record tying 19th rushing TD of the season and Josh Reed caught 10 passes for 186 yards as LSU beat Auburn, 27-14, to clinch a berth in the SEC Championship game. LSU jumped on Auburn early as the Tigers used some trickery, opting for an on side kick on the game's first play. LSU recovered and scored six plays later for a 7-0 lead. Auburn responded with a 72-yard TD pass from Jason Campbell to Tim Carter on its first possession to tie the game at 7-7. From there it was all LSU as the Tigers increased the lead to 14-7 early in the first quarter on a Rohan Davey to Reed pass. LSU stretched the margin to 21-7 just before halftime on a 7-yard run by Donarick Davis. A pair of field goals by John Corbello put the game out of reach at 27-7 early in the fourth quarter.

LSU and Tennessee meet for the 27th time overall and the second time this season on Saturday in Atlanta ... The teams met only three times in the 1970's (once coming in the Astro-Bluebonnet Bowl), four times in the 80's and just twice in the 90's ... Last year, LSU posted a thrilling 38-31 overtime win over the Vols in Baton Rouge ... This will be the first neutral site game between the teams since 1972 when the Vols posted a 24-17 win over the Tigers in Houston at the Astro-Bluebonnet Bowl ... LSU coach Nick Saban is 1-1 vs. Tennessee.

LSU FOOTBALL NOTEBOOK

LSU will play for its first SEC Championship since 1988 when the Tigers face second-ranked Tennessee in Atlanta ... LSU is making its first appearance in the SEC Championship game since the league went to the divisional format in 1992 ... Tennessee is 2-0 in SEC Championship games ... LSU has won four straight and six of its last seven heading into Saturday's title game ... The Tigers, who are bowl-eligible for the fifth time in seven years, finished with a 5-2 home record this season after posting a 6-1 mark at home last year ... LSU was 3-1 in road games this year, only the fourth time since 1990 that LSU has posted a winning mark away from home ... LSU is 16-1 under Nick Saban when scoring at least 20 points in game ... On the other hand, the Tigers are 0-6 under Saban when failing to reach the 20-point mark ... LSU is 13-2 under Saban, including an 8-1 mark this year, when scoring first - the lone loss came to Tennessee ... LSU is also 14-1 under Saban (8-1 in 2001) when leading at halftime and 13-1 under Saban (8-1 in 2001) when leading after three quarters ... Over his last 16 games (including the 2000 Peach Bowl), QB Rohan Davey has thrown 31 TD passes compared to just 11 interceptions ... LSU hasn't been shutout since the Alabama game on Nov. 9, 1996 - a span of 61 games ... The Tigers are 7-0 under Saban (4-0 in 2001), and 39-9 since 1990 when an LSU running back rushes for 100 yards in a game ... LSU has won nine straight games when having a 100-yard rusher ... WR Josh Reed enters the SEC Championship game only 24 yards shy of becoming the SEC's all-time leader in career receiving yards ... Reed has 2,941 career receiving yards ... Boo Mitchell (Vanderbilt, 1985-88) holds the mark with 2,964 yards ... Davey is the first 3,000-yard passer in LSU history (he did it 10 games) ... Davey's season total stands at 3,263 yards ... RB LaBrandon Toefield needs only one rushing TD to break the SEC's single-season record ... Toefield is currently tied with Garrison Hearst and Shaun Alexander for most rushing TDs in a season with 19 ... Over their last four SEC games, the Tigers have forced 10 turnovers and they have responded with touchdowns on six of the 10 takeaways.

TIGERS LOOK TO CLAIM EIGHTH LEAGUE TITLE

LSU will go after its eighth SEC Championship on Saturday against second-ranked Tennessee. The Tigers, charter members of the SEC, won conference titles in 1935, 1936, 1958, 1961, 1970, 1986 and 1988. The Tigers have claimed at least a share of the SEC Western Divisional title three times - 1996, 1997, and 2001. This is the first time LSU will appear in the SEC Championship game.

JARVIS GREEN NAMED SEC PLAYER OF THE WEEK

LSU defensive end Jarvis Green was named SEC Defensive Player of the Week on Monday after recording seven tackles and one sack in the Tigers' 27-14 win over Auburn. Green, a senior from Donaldsonville, ran his career sack total to 20, the fourth highest total in school history. The SEC Player of the Week Award is the first for Green in his career and marks the fourth for the Tigers this year. Other SEC Player of the Week awards for LSU this year are Trev Faulk vs. Mississippi State, Josh Reed vs. Alabama and LaBrandon Toefield vs. Arkansas.

LSU ON CBS

LSU will make its fourth appearance of the year on CBS against Tennessee. LSU is 2-1 this year on CBS with wins over Alabama and Arkansas with the loss coming to Florida. LSU is 13-12-1 all-time on CBS. Saturday's contest will be the first between LSU and Tennessee to be televised by CBS.

JOSH REED WITHIN REACH OF SEC ALL-TIME RECEIVING YARDS MARK

Josh Reed enters Saturday's contest against Tennessee needing only 24 receiving yards to become the SEC's all-time leader in receiving yards. Reed, who is just in his second full season at wide receiver, has caught 163 passes for 2,941 yards and 17 TDs in his career. Vanderbilt's Bo Mitchell holds the all-time receiving yardage mark in the SEC with 2,964 yards from 1985-88. This year, Reed has already set the SEC mark for receptions in a game (19 vs. Alabama), receiving yards in a game (293 vs. Alabama) and receiving yards in a season (1,680 and counting).

REED NAMED ALL-AMERICA BY FOOTBALL WRITER'S ASSOCIATION

LSU wide receiver Josh Reed has been named to the 2001 Football Writer's Association All-America team, the organization announced last week. Reed, a junior from Rayne, La., currently leads the nation with 152.7 yards receiving a contest and he ranks third nationally with 8.2 receptions a game. Through 11 games, Reed has caught an LSU record 90 passes for a Southeastern Conference record 1,680 yards and seven touchdowns. Reed becomes the first Tiger to earn All-America honors since 1998 when defensive tackle Anthony McFarland and center Todd McClure were each named to an All-America team. Other SEC players named to the Football Writer's All-American team include Florida wide receiver Jabar Gaffney, offensive lineman Mike Pearson, and defensive end Alex Brown, Tennessee defensive tackle John Henderson and running back Travis Stephens.

REED NAMED ONE OF THREE FINALISTS FOR BILETNIKOFF AWARD

LSU's record-setting receiver Josh Reed has been named one of three finalists for the Biletnikoff Award, which annually recognizes college football's top receiver, the Tallahassee Quarterback Club announced. Reed joins Florida's Jabar Gaffney and Wisconsin's Lee Evans as the three finalists. Reed becomes the first LSU receiver to ever be named a finalist for the Biletnikoff Award. The winner of the Biletnikoff Award will be announced on Thursday in Orlando, Fla. The award is sponsored by the Tallahassee Quarterback Club Foundation and it is named in honor of former Florida State and Oakland Raiders wide receiver Fred Biletnikoff. Past winners of the award include Antonio Bryant of Pittsburgh (2000), Troy Walters of Stanford (1999), Troy Edwards of Louisiana Tech (1998), Randy Moss of Marshall (1997), Marcus Harris of Wyoming (1996), Terry Glenn of Ohio State (1995) and Bobby Engram of Penn State (1994).

REED CONTINUES TO LEAD THE NATION IN RECEIVING YARDS PER GAME, RANKS IN NATION'S TOP 10 IN TWO OTHER CATEGORIES

LSU wide receiver Josh Reed continues to lead the nation in receiving yards per game as the junior from Rayne, La., is averaging 152.7 yards per contest. Reed leads the SEC in receiving yards per contest by over 44 yards - Florida's Jabar Gaffney ranks second in the SEC with 108.3 yards per game. Reed's 8.2 catches a contest leads the SEC and ranks third nationally. In addition, Reed leads the SEC and ranks eighth in the nation in all-purpose yards with 163.6 yards per game, 10 yards ahead of Kentucky's Derek Abney (153.8 per game). Reed and Florida's Rex Grossman are the only players in the SEC to lead the league in three different categories.

CLAYTON AND REED ARE THE NATION'S NO. 1 RECEIVING DUO

Statistically speaking, Michael Clayton and Josh Reed are the nation's best receiving duo. Clayton and Reed are averaging a combined 216.3 yards receiving a contest, 12 yards better than Florida's duo of Jabar Gaffney and Reche Caldwell, who combine for 204.6 yards per contest. Through 11 games, Clayton and Reed have combined for 133 receptions for 2,380 yards and 13 TDs.

TIGERS BREAK TEAM OFFENSIVE SINGLE-SEASON RECORDS

LSU has already seen its share of individual records fall this season, but the Tigers have also had their share of team records fall as well. This year's LSU offense will go down as the best in school history as the 2001 Tigers became the first team in school history to record 5,000 yards in total offense in a season. LSU enters the Tennessee contest with 5,133 yards of total offense, well ahead of the previous mark of 4,843 set by the 1987 team. In addition, LSU is averaging 466.6 yards per game, well ahead of the previous mark of 440.3, also set in 1987. Last week, LSU also broke the school record for completions in a season with 224, breaking the old mark of 220 set in 1985. LSU has already set the school record for passing yards with 3,427 - breaking the mark of 2,839 set in

1989. LSU's per game passing average is 311.5 yards per game, over 50 yards higher than the previous mark of 258.1 set in 1989. As a matter of fact LSU can not pass for a single yard against Tennessee and still break the school-record for passing yards per game.

REED SHINES ON CBS

In three games this season on CBS, Josh Reed has 32 catches for 599 yards and two TDs, averaging nearly 200 yards a game. Reed caught six passes for 123 yards against Florida on Oct. 6, posted SEC records of 19 catches and 293 yards against Alabama on Nov. 3 and had seven catches for 183 yards against Arkansas on Nov. 23.

REED CONTINUES HIS ASSAULT ON LSU AND SEC RECORD BOOKS

Josh Reed continues to rewrite LSU and SEC history. In only his 10th game of the season, a 41-38 victory over Arkansas, Reed broke the SEC single season receiving yardage record of 1,357 yards set by Travis McGriff of Florida in 1998. Last weekend against Auburn, Reed became the first player in SEC history to surpass the 1,500-yard mark with a 186-yard effort. With still one game to go, Reed has already added 300 yards to the single season SEC record for receiving yards. This weekend he can break the SEC career receiving yardage mark and the single season receptions mark.

In addition, Reed broke the LSU career receiving yardage mark of 2,708 by Wendell Davis (1984-87), as he is up to 2,941 career yards. With 10 receptions last weekend, he also broke the LSU single season record for receptions of 80, set by Wendell Davis' 15 years ago.

REED EIGHT CATCHES AWAY FROM ANOTHER SEC SINGLE-SEASON MARK

With 10 catches for 186 yards against Auburn, Josh Reed moved within seven receptions of tying the SEC single season record for catches. Reed has 90 receptions on the year for an SEC-record 1,680 yards. With eight catches he can break the 18-year-old SEC record for single season receptions - 97, held by Keith Edwards of Vanderbilt. Reed is currently tied for second on the all-time list with James Whalen of Kentucky, who posted 90 catches in 1999. The following is a look at the SEC's single-season receptions leaders:

In 25 games at the position, Reed has now reached the century mark an LSU record 17 times. The Tigers are now 13-4 (8-2 this year) when Reed reaches the century mark. REED'S RECEPTIONS = FIRST DOWN FOR THE TIGERS

Perhaps the only thing as amazing as Josh Reed's 90 receptions this season is the fact that 71 of them have gone for first downs (78.8 percent). Of Reed's 10 receptions against Auburn last weekend, eight went for first downs. Against Arkansas all seven of his receptions went for first downs, while against Alabama 15 of his SEC record 19 receptions went for first downs.

DAVEY VERSUS TENNESSEE

Rohan Davey will be remembered at LSU for many things, but arguably his greatest Tiger Stadium moment was leading the Tigers to a 38-31 overtime victory over Tennessee in 2000. Davey threw for 318 yards and four touchdowns passes despite limited mobility from a severe ankle sprain. Davey threw for 356 yards and a pair of TDs in the Tigers' 26-18 loss to Tennessee earlier this season. In two games against the Vols, Davey is 44 for 78 with 674 yards passing and 6 TDs. DAVEY FIRST TIGER QB TO REACH 3,000 YARDS IN A SINGLE-SEASON

Rohan Davey continues to rewrite the LSU passing record book and added one more chapter to his phenomenal senior season. Against Arkansas he became the first LSU quarterback to reach 3,000 yards in a single season. On his final completion of the day, Davey moved to 3,018 yards for the season. In the Tigers' previous outing he broke Tommy Hodson's 12-year-old school single season record of 2,655 yards passing. Davey enters the SEC Championship game with 3,263 yards passing on the season.

DAVEY POSTS FIFTH 300-YARD GAME OF THE SEASON

Rohan Davey overcame four interceptions against Arkansas on Nov. 23 to become the first Tiger to ever post three consecutive 300-yard passing games, by virtue of a 359-yard passing effort. It marked the fifth time this year that Davey surpassed 300 yards and the sixth time in his career, extending his own LSU record. Davey now has twice as many 300-yard games as the next closest quarterback in LSU history and has six of LSU's 16 all-time 300-yard games. Davey owns the LSU single game passing record with 528 yards earlier this year against Alabama and now has four of the top eight passing days in LSU history. LSU is 5-1 when Davey surpasses 300 yards. The following is a look at the top single-game passing performances in LSU history:

TOEFIELD 26 YARDS SHY OF 1,000 YARDS FOR SEASON

LaBrandon Toefield enters the Tennessee contest needing only 26 yards to reach 1,000 for the year. Toefield has 974 yards and 19 TDs on 223 carries. If he reaches 1,000 yards, Toefield will become the first LSU running back since Kevin Faulk in 1998 to reach 1,000 yards. Faulk had 1,279 yards rushing in 1998. In its history, LSU has had nine 1,000-yard rushers.

TOEFIELD POSTS FIFTH MULTIPLE-TD GAME

With three touchdowns against Arkansas, LaBrandon Toefield posted his fifth multiple-touchdown game of the season, the most by a Tiger since Kevin Faulk in 1998. The mark matches the LSU record for most multiple touchdown games in a season, accomplished seven times previously - three times by Faulk, twice by Dalton Hilliard and twice by Charles Alexander. LSU is 5-0 this year when Toefield rushes for more than one TD.

DAVEY MOVES UP TOUCHDOWN PASS LIST

With a touchdown pass against Auburn, Rohan Davey moved into sole possession of fifth place on the all-time LSU touchdown pass list with 29, breaking a tie with former Tiger great Bert Jones. Davey now needs two to tie Alan Risher and move into fourth place. In addition, he now has 18 touchdown passes on the season, tying him with Herb Tyler third on the all-time LSU single season touchdown pass list. Davey needs one to match Tommy Hodson's 1986 total of 19, the second highest mark in school history. Hodson owns the LSU single-season record with 22 in 1989.

DAVEY EYES SINGLE SEASON COMPLETION MARK

Rohan Davey enters the Tennessee game with 208 completions this season, the second highest total in LSU history. Davey needs only one completion to tie Jeff Wickersham's school record of 209 in 1985 and just two completions to break the mark. Davey broke the LSU single game record earlier this year with 35 completions against Alabama.

TOEFIELD BREAKS LSU RUSHING TD MARK, SEC RECORD NEXT TO FALL

With three rushing TDs vs. Arkansas on Nov. 23, LaBrandon Toefield broke the LSU single-season mark of rushing touchdowns of 17 held by Charles Alexander in 1977. Toefield then added another rushing TD vs. Auburn to run his season total to 19, tying the SEC mark currently held by Garrison Hearst of Georgia (1992) and Shaun Alexander of Alabama (1999).

In addition, Toefield broke the all-time LSU single season scoring mark and now has 114 points. He bettered the previous LSU mark of 104 by Charles Alexander, also in 1977. Toefield's total of 114 points ranks as the sixth-highest total in SEC history. Alexander of Alabama holds the mark with 144 points in 1999.

TOEFIELD NEARLY UNSTOPPABLE AT THE GOALLINE

The mark of any successful team is the ability to score within the red zone. LaBrandon Toefield makes the Tigers one of the most efficient teams near the goal line. Of his LSU record 19 touchdowns, 14 have come from inside the 10 yard line. He demonstrates breakaway speed too, however, as he has two touchdowns of better than 60 yards. LSU 6-0 ALL-TIME WHEN TOEFIELD REACHES THE CENTURY MARK

A balanced offensive attack is the goal of every successful offense. The Tigers are able to throw the ball with consistency behind the combination of Rohan Davey and Josh Reed, but are at their best when getting balanced rushing attack to match. LaBrandon Toefield came up huge in the Tigers' back-to-back victories over Arkansas and Auburn getting better than 100 yards in each game. The Tigers are 4-0 this season when Toefield hits the century mark and 6-0 all-time. Toefield has only rushed for a combined total of 100 yards in the Tigers' three losses.

CLAYTON CONTINUES REMARKABLE FRESHMAN SEASON

When LSU announced that Reggie Robinson would miss the entire 2001 season, everyone wondered how the Tigers' receiving corps would fare with Josh Reed receiving a majority of the attention on double teams. True freshman Michael Clayton has provided the perfect compliment to Reed and has developed into the deep threat to help Reed remain open on the underneath routes. Clayton hauled in a 60-yard touchdown pass from Rohan Davey in the third quarter against Arkansas, his sixth touchdown reception of the year and his seventh touchdown overall. Clayton's seven TDs are the most by a Tiger true freshman since Dalton Hilliard posted 16 in 1982 - 11 rushing and five receiving. His six receiving touchdowns are the most ever by an LSU true freshman and the most by a first year LSU receiver since Carlos Carson had 10 in 1977. Through 11 games, Clayton has caught 43 passes for 700 yards. The 43 receptions rank eighth in the SEC, while the 700 yards is the 10th highest total in the league.

20 POINTS THE MAGIC NUMBER FOR LSU

With 27 points in its victory over Auburn, LSU improved to 16-1 under Nick Saban when scoring 20+ points with the only loss coming this year against Ole Miss. LSU has won 16 of 17 overall when scoring 20+ points dating back to the 1999 season. Nick Saban is 15-7 as head coach at LSU and has never won when failing to reach 20 points. In LSU's seven wins this season they've averaged 35.4 points. In their three losses they've scored a combined total of 57 points, or 19 points a game.

TIGERS TOUGH WHEN SCORING FIRST

Against Auburn, the Tigers scored first for the eighth time in 11 games this season. LSU is 7-1 when scoring first with the only exception coming against Tennessee in September. LSU is 1-2 when failing to score first with their only victory coming against Utah State. LSU has scored first in each of its last four games, all wins.

THE RESULTS HAVE BEEN GOOD WHEN TIGERS LEAD AT HALFTIME

LSU has led at the half in nine of its 11 games this season and the Tigers have gone on to win eight of those contests, with the lone exception being the Tennessee game when they led 7-6 at the half before falling 26-18. The only two games in which LSU has trailed at halftime this year are Florida (down 27-9 and lost 44-15) and Ole Miss (down 21-10 and lost 35-24). LSU is 14-1 under Nick Saban when leading at the half.

DAMIEN JAMES LEADS SEC IN INTERCEPTIONS

Damien James continues to lead the SEC in interceptions with five for an average of .45 per game. That figure ranks 16th nationally. As a defensive unit, the Tigers lead the SEC with 18. In all, LSU has had seven different players intercept passes this season with five of the players having at least two interceptions.

REED BECOMES SECOND PLAYER IN SEC HISTORY TO REACH 1,000 YARDS IN BACK-TO-BACK SEASONS

Josh Reed added another chapter to his record book against Alabama as he joined Joey Kent of Tennessee as the only players in SEC history to have back-to-back 1,000-yard receiving seasons. Actually, Reed and Kent were the only two players in the history of the league to have 1,000-yards receiving in more than one season. Period. Kent did it in 1995 and 1996. Since the Alabama game, Florida's Jabar Gaffney has joined Reed and Kent on the list.

LSU FINISHES WITH WINNING ROAD RECORD FOR FIRST TIME SINCE 1997

One of Nick Saban's top priorities heading into the 2001 season was for his Tigers to take care of business on the road after managing only a 1-3 record away from Baton Rouge in his first season at LSU. The Tigers answered his call, taking a 35-21 decision at Alabama on Nov. 3 to finish 3-1 on the road during the 2001 season. The Tigers finished with a winning record on the road for the first time since 1997 when they went a perfect 4-0. It marked only the fourth time since 1990 that the Tigers had a winning record

away from Baton Rouge. From 1998 to 2000, the Tigers were 2-11 on the road.

LSU STREAKS TO NOTE

Josh Reed has caught a pass in 25 straight games ... Jerel Myers has caught a pass in 12 straight games, while Michael Clayton has done it in 11 consecutive games ... Myers has at least one pass in 33 of 35 career games with the lone exception being the Tigers' 20-9 victory at Ole Miss in 2000 ... Ryan Clark has started 34 straight games at free safety, while Trev Faulk has 31 straight starts.

LSU'S FINALLY TAKING ADVANTAGE OF OPPONENTS TURNOVERS

LSU has finally started taking advantage of the turnovers that it forces as the Tigers have scored touchdowns on six of their last 10 takeaways dating back to the Mississippi State contest. Against Miss. State, LSU turned four MSU turnovers into 28 points and then against Ole Miss, the Tigers turned an Eli Manning interception into a TD. six plays later. Prior to the Mississippi State contest, LSU had only scored 17 points all season off of its 13 takeaways. The Tigers also went a span of three games - Tennessee, Florida, and Kentucky - of not scoring off a turnover. Over that three-game span, LSU had six takeaways that resulted in no points.

TIGERS SPREAD THE WEALTH IN PASSING GAME

One thing is for sure, LSU can never be accused of focusing on one receiver in its passing game as 14 different players - six split ends, four tight ends, three tailbacks and one fullback - have caught passes for the Tigers this season. Spreading the football around has become a trademark of the Jimbo Fisher offense as last year, 13 Tigers caught passes during the regular-season. The Tigers have five players - three wide receivers, one tight end and one running back - with at least 10 receptions this year.

REED'S BIG PLAYS CONTINUE

Josh Reed continues to pile up huge chunks of yardage every time he gets his hands on the ball. Reed has at least one 30-yard reception in 10 of LSU's 11 games, and for the season, he has 21 receptions of 30 yards or better, including three against Auburn last week. The following is a look at Reed's receptions, catch-by-catch, this season:

TIGERS TURN REVERSAL OF FORTUNES IN THE THIRD QUARTER

After being outscored 37-7 in the third quarter in their first five games of the season, the Tigers have outscored their opponents 62-17 in the third quarter of their last six games. LSU's third quarter turnaround started against Mississippi State as the Tigers put up 21 points against the Bulldogs. LSU followed that with 14 points against Ole Miss that gave them a 24-21 lead heading into the final quarter.

LSU'S SPECIAL TEAMS COVERAGE HAS BEEN OUTSTANDING

LSU's special teams coverage continues to be outstanding as the Tigers are allowing an SEC-best 15.0 yards per kickoff return and only 3.1 yards per punt return. On 48 kickoff returns this season, the Tigers have allowed 20 yards or more on a return just 14 times. LSU has kicked off 56 times this year and its opponent has started outside the 20-yard line only 23 times.

LSU CONTINUES TO BE THE BEST IN THE LEAGUE ON THIRD DOWN

LSU continues to be the best in the SEC when it comes to third down situations as the Tigers have converted on 80 of their 155 third down opportunities this year for 51.6 percent. Ole Miss is a distant second in the league at 47.6 percent.

Saturday's attendance of 92,141 was a Tiger Stadium record, the third time in seven home games this season that the mark fell. LSU first broke the record in the season opener against Tulane, then again with 92,010 against Florida. It marked the fourth time this season that LSU drew better than 90,000 fans and the seventh time since the stadium was expanded to its current capacity prior to the 2000 season. All seven of LSU's 2001 games rank in the top 10 in all-time Tiger Stadium attendance. LSU broke the season figure for average attendance during the 2001 season, averaging 90,491, the first time LSU has ever averaged better than 90,000. 633,439 fans walked through the gate during the 2001 home season, easily outdistancing the previous mark of 614,704 (an average of 87,815) in 2000.

JARVIS GREEN MOVES UP CAREER SACK LIST

With a sack against Auburn, Jarvis Green moved into fourth place on the all-time LSU sack list with 20, breaking a tie with current Atlanta Falcon Chuck Wiley. For Green, it was his fourth sack of the season as he became only the fourth man in LSU history to reach 20 career sack. With a sack against Tennessee, Green can move into a third place tie with Gabe Northern. Green would have to come up with three sacks to reach Ron Sancho for second place on the LSU all-time sack list.

TIGERS STRIKE EARLY AND OFTEN

LSU scored at least 20 points in the first half for the sixth time in 11 games in its victory over Auburn. LSU is 6-0 when reaching 20 points in the first half. The following is a look at LSU's 20-point halves this year and how the game finished:

Rohan Davey's Hail Mary attempt on the game's final play fell just short as LSU dropped a 26-18 decision to seventh-ranked Tennessee in Knoxville on Sept. 29.

Davey threw for a career high 356 yards and a pair of touchdown passes, but the Tiger defense could not contain Tennessee receiver Kelley Washington, who hauled in 11 passes for 256 yards, including a 70-yard touchdown reception.

The Tigers led 7-6 at halftime by virtue of a 67-yard strike from Davey to true freshman Michael Clayton.

Tennessee took over the game in the third quarter, however, scoring a pair of touchdowns before building what proved to be an insurmountable 26-7 lead early in the fourth quarter.

The Tigers added a touchdown and a field goal in the fourth quarter and were inside the Vols' 45-yard line when time expired. Josh Reed hauled in seven passes for 125 yards and a TD for the Tigers.

LaBrandon Toefield rushed for 173 yards and 3 TDs and Rohan Davey passed for 359 yards and 3 scores as the Tigers held off 24th-ranked Arkansas, 41-38, in Tiger Stadium. Toefield scored on a 62-yard run just four plays into the contest, however the Tigers kept the Razorbacks in the game with five turnovers, including three in the first half. Arkansas led 13-7 early in the second quarter before the Tigers came back to take a 20-19 lead at halftime. The Tigers stretched their lead to 41-25 with 8:21 to play on a 17-yard TD run by Toefield, the 18th of his career, which broke the LSU record for single-season rushing TDs. Arkansas scored a pair of TDs in the final 6:29 of the contest, the last with 2:27 to play, but the Razorbacks never got the ball back again. Josh Reed broke the SEC single-season receiving record in the game as he caught seven passes for 183 yards to run his total for the year to 1,494 yards.
