Game 20: LSU vs. Vanderbilt-Friday, Mar. 15, 6:30 p.m., Alex Box Stadium

The real season begins: LSU welcomes Vanderbilt to Alex Box Stadium to open Southeastern Conference play.

- LSU comes into conference play on the heels of a 2-1 loss to Louisiana-Lafayette on Tuesday.
- The Tigers were 18-12 last year in the SEC and won their seventh West division title in the nine years since league play was revived in 1992. LSU was second in the overall conference race to Georgia.
- LSU has finished lower than third in the overall conference race only once since 1989, and that was a fourth-place finish in 1995. During that same stretch, the Tigers have won at least 18 league games in every year except 1995.
- LSU has enjoyed 17 consecutive winning seasons in SEC play, the longest streak in the league's 69-year history. Since 1999, every other league school has had at least one year in conference play at or below .500.

Scouting the Commodores: Coach Roy Mewbourne's club comes in at 11-3 after Wednesday's 10-7 win over Belmont.

- Roy Mewbourne is one of three SEC coaches who were at their current school before Skip Bertman arrived at LSU in 1984: Mississippi State's Ron Polk and Kentucky's Keith Madison are the others. Polk began his career at MSU in 1976, although he was out from 1998-2001, while Madison and Mewbourne began at their respective schools in 1979.
- The Commodores will start freshman left-hander Jeremy Sowers tonight, who is 2-0 with a 1.13 ERA. Sowers was drafted by the hometown Cincinnati Reds in the first round of last year's draft, but enrolled at Vanderbilt.
- Senior OF Karl Nonemaker is career .421 hitter against the Tigers and is tied for fifth on Vandy's all-time hit list with 232.

About the series: LSU has won six of the last seven from Vandy and holds a 40-19 all-time advantage.

- LSU won two of three last year at Alex Box Stadium, losing the opener 7-5, then winning the next two games 7-2 and 18-2.
- The Tigers have not lost a series to the Commodores since 1988, when Vandy won two of three in Nashville. It remains the only time the Tigers have dropped a series to the Commodores.
- LSU hasn't swept a three-game set from Vandy since 1997 at Alex Box Stadium.
- The teams first met in the 1950s when the SEC only counted division games, and again in 1974 and 1975.
- LSU holds a 2-0 edge in post-season meetings, winning in the 1990 and 1992 SEC tournaments.
- Tonight's game marks the first meeting for LSU coach Smoke Laval against an SEC East foe. In his seven years at Louisiana-Monroe, Laval played all members of the SEC West except Auburn.

## Tonight's Starting Pitcher

### #34 Jr. RHP Bo Pettit (6-0, 200, Houston–Sharpstown HS)

Bo Pettit takes the mound in the Tigers' SEC opener against Vanderbilt tonight looking for his first win in exactly a month.

#### CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

2002: Is 1–2 with a 4.09 ERA in 33.0 innings.

- Tied a career high with 12 strikeouts in the Tigers' Feb. 15 victory over Mercer.
- Struck out 10 in 6.1 innings and got no decision vs. UL-Monroe (Mar. 8).
- Went a career high 7.2 innings in Mercer game, not yielding an earned run and carrying a shutout into the eighth inning.
- Started season opener vs. Birmingham-Southern on Feb. 8 and struck out eight in 6.0 innings.

2001: Posted 4-0 mark with a 2.42 ERA, but only appeared in 7 games (4 starts) due to continuing shoulder ailments.

- Struck out five in two innings in his first appearance of 2001 vs. Nicholls St. on Feb. 27
- Earned his first win of the season against Southern on Mar. 13, going five innings and allowing two runs on two hits.
- Best outing of season came Mar. 23 at Mississippi St., as he allowed no earned runs in 6.1 innings to pick up the victory.
- Did not return to action again until May 1 at New Orleans, when he went three innings and allowed just one hit and no earned runs while striking out five.

2000: Went 5-3 with a 4.15 ERA in 16 games (7 starts), but season ended early due to tendonitis in his shoulder.

- Best effort came in Apr. 30 win at Ole Miss in first career SEC start. In that game, Pettit allowed one run on five hits and struck out a career-high 12 in seven innings.
- Earned his first career win in second game of doubleheader vs. Virginia on Feb. 12, starting and throwing six scoreless innings, striking out six and allowing just two hits.
- Threw two scoreless innings and allowed just one hit in relief stint vs. McNeese St. on Feb. 22.
- Hurlled four scoreless and hitless innings in start vs. New Orleans on Mar. 22, picking up victory with six strikeouts.
- Final outing of season came on May 6 at Kentucky, where he earned win with six strikeouts over 6.2 innings.

1999: Was granted a medical redshirt after pitching in only three early-season games.

- Made his first career appearance on Feb. 27 against Central Florida, going 1.1 innings and giving up two runs on four hits, walking one and striking out one.

**Success on the Eastern Front**  
 LSU has typically been very successful against the SEC East since the conference went to back to division play in 1992, and last year's 11-5 mark against the other division was no exception.

Since 1992, is 101-36-2 against the SEC East (.730)—89-33-2 in the regular season and 12-3 in the post-season. LSU has lost only one series to an SEC East team ever, and that was to Georgia in 2000.

LSU has never lost a series to SEC East members Vanderbilt and South Carolina.

**Starting on the right foot**  
 With a new opponent to open SEC play this year, the Tigers are hopeful of reversing the trend of the past two seasons.

In 2000 and 2001, Georgia took two of three from LSU to open the conference, and last year, it turned out that the Bulldogs won the overall SEC crown from LSU by two games. The Tigers haven't lost their first SEC series in three consecutive years since 1964-66, and those were all two-game series sweeps by archrival and former league member Tulane.

From 1991-1999, LSU won its first SEC Series of the season, including three-game sweeps of Vanderbilt at Alex Box Stadium in 1994 and 1997, as well as 2-1 series victories in Nashville in 1995 and 1996. During the stretch, LSU also took three at South Carolina in 1992 and three from Georgia at home in 1998.

Does winning the first SEC weekend series mean a lot? Not likely, as LSU won the league title in 1990 despite losing two of three to Mississippi St. on opening weekend, while on the other hand, LSU swept Tennessee in 1988 but missed the NCAA tournament.

This marks the fifth time Vanderbilt has been LSU's first SEC opponent, the most since the league went to round-robin play in 1986.

**Tigers don't want carryover effect**  
 It won't mean as much because it would happen over two seasons, but if LSU can't take two from Vanderbilt this weekend, they will have lost three consecutive SEC series, something the Tigers have had happen only once since Skip Bertman's arrival in 1984.

The Tigers ended 2001 by getting swept at Arkansas and losing two at home to Auburn to cost them the SEC overall title. LSU had won seven straight conference series prior to the Fayetteville implosion.

The last time it happened was at the end of 1995, when the Tigers lost two of three in consecutive weekends to Alabama, Auburn and Mississippi St. That was part of a stretch when LSU won only one of five series against the West division, also losing two of three to Ole Miss and winning two from Arkansas.



#### Close one with a twist

Yet another one-run game for LSU—it's a trend will likely continue giving the Tigers' strong pitching and almost non-existent hitting.

LSU is now 6-4 in one-run games and is just two close games shy of the total of 12 one-run games played in 2001, when LSU was 5-7. LSU has now played as many one-run games as it did in 1998 and more than in 1997 or 2000.

What was unusual about the 2-1 loss to UL-Lafayette on Tuesday was the score. It was the first 2-1 game for LSU since a victory over Florida in the College World Series on June 6, 1996, a span of 359 games.

LSU also had won 127 consecutive games when allowing two or fewer runs prior to the UL-Lafayette game, with the last loss coming in a 2-0 shutout at South Carolina on April 7, 1996.

The biggest flaw in the close games has been hitting. LSU is batting only .269 in one-run games, with nine players at .231 or lower. That low BA has pretty much negated a strong 3.57 ERA by the pitching staff in those same 10 contests. The Tigers have also committed 27 errors in one-run games, compared to just 12 in the other nine contests.

#### Terrific Tompkins

Smoke Laval's strategy to save Jake Tompkins for the UL-Lafayette game and hold him out of last weekend's UL-Monroe series paid off on Tuesday.

Although the Tigers were a 2-1 loser to the Cajuns, California native Tompkins certainly did nothing to harm the LSU cause, as he threw 6.0 shutout innings, giving up only three hits and one walk while striking out six. Tompkins allowed just three runners into scoring position, and at one point retired 12 consecutive batters. The game was scoreless through the first six innings until the Cajuns scored twice in the final three innings off LSU ace Lane Mestepey.

Tompkins' ERA continues its dramatic fall, going from 3.80 to 2.96 after last night's effort, and Tompkins has walked just six batters and fanned 27 in 27.1 innings, and his batting average against of .258 is best among Tiger starters.

In one-run games, Tompkins has been a bulldog, giving up just a 1.93 ERA in 14.0 innings pitched, walking just one and striking out 14 in two games.

#### Pontiff going for a dozen

After waiting until his final plate appearance to extend his hitting streak on Sunday, Wally Pontiff wasted little time in adding another notch to his string on Tuesday, lacing a first-inning single off of UL-Lafayette ace Justin Gabriel.

Pontiff, whose career batting average stands at .357 heading into the weekend, added singles in the sixth and ninth innings to give him his fifth three-hit game of the streak and raise his average to .585 (24-for-41) during the stretch. It's hard to believe his average was at .200 before the Houston series, but now Pontiff stands at .433 (29-for-67), and is also the team leader in on-base percentage (.552), while second in slugging percentage (.612), RBI (14) and runs scored (14).

Only two players had hitting streaks in 2001 longer than Pontiff's current streak: Ryan Theriot's 17-game streak from Mar. 30-Apr. 22, and a 14-game streak by Pontiff to end the season.

#### Mestepey takes rare setback

Lane Mestepey proved on Tuesday night that he is after all human, as he was the losing pitcher in a 2-1 setback to UL-Lafayette.

The loss was just the fourth for Mestepey in 28 career outings, and his first since last May 13, when, like Tuesday, he lost in relief, that day to Auburn. Mestepey also lost last year to Vanderbilt (the team he'll face this weekend) and Arkansas.

Prior to last night, Mestepey was 6-0 in his last 12 appearances dating back to the 2001 post-season.

Mestepey also lost his first career game against non-SEC foes, as the southpaw had been 6-0 lifetime vs. non-league foes.

#### Tough run

The 19 games LSU has played prior to starting SEC competition are the most in school history. Last year, LSU had 15 games under their belt before hitting league play.

Thirty of LSU's final 37 games are in the conference.



**Tigers bat better for Mestepey**  
It's rarely, if ever, been documented at LSU that the Tigers seem to hit better for one pitcher than others, but this year, this is especially the case.

In the five games in which Lane Mestepey has been the starting hurler, LSU has not only won all of those games, but they have batted .341 and scored an average of 8.0 runs per game for the southpaw.

Bo Pettit and Jake Tompkins, LSU's other Sunday starters, haven't fared so well. The Tigers are hitting just .268 in Tompkins' four starts, including just six runs in his last two outings.

Meanwhile, the Tigers are at just .259 in Pettit's five starts, although much of that can be attributed to the fact Pettit was matched against a pair of the nation's best pitchers in Houston's Brad Sullivan and Long Beach State's Abe Alvarez. LSU has been limited to 27 runs in Pettit's five starts, and unfortunately for Bo, he may be matched up against another great one in Vanderbilt freshman southpaw Jeremy Sowers, who is 2-0 with a 1.13 ERA this year.

Five other pitchers have started one game each for LSU, and the Tigers are batting .295 in those games but only 2-3 to show for it.

#### No Walking

LSU pitchers continue to exhibit outstanding control, entering the weekend with just 44 walks allowed in 175.2 innings, or just 2.32 per nine innings pitched.

Tiger hurlers have allowed two or fewer walks in seven consecutive games and in 11 of 19 overall this season. Lane Mestepey has walked only four batters in 38.2 innings this year, including none in his last 26 innings (a span of 97 batters), while Jake Tompkins has given out only six free passes in 27.1 innings.

Mestepey has allowed just 0.93 walks per nine innings, which is more than half a walk below the single season record of 1.47 per nine set by Gregg Paterson in 1987.

**Tigers' Clutch Hitting Stuck**  
LSU's .293 overall batting average may be cause for concern, but a bigger problem is LSU's constant inability to get runners home.

The Tigers are hitting a paltry .270 with runners in scoring position, 57 points lower than their season average of 2001 and 85 points lower than the championship season of 2000.

In fact, it's been so rough for LSU that even leading hitter Wally Pontiff has struggled. Pontiff came into this year a career .347 hitter with RISP, but the Tiger captain is at just .233 (7-for-30) this year in those same situations. Of players with at least 10 at-bats in RISP situations, only three are above .333: J.C. Holt (.455), Eric Wiethorn (.385) and Sean Barker (.346).

LSU has also struggled mightily with two outs. The Tigers are hitting just .249 in all situations with two outs, and with RISP and two out, that average falls below the "Mendoza Line" to .192.

#### Defense coming around?

For most of 2002, LSU's defense has been dead last in the SEC, especially after its seven-error folly in the series finale at Houston.

It may not be rapid improvement, but improvement is there. The Tigers have committed just three errors in their past four games. Starting with the seven-error game in Houston, the Tigers had a stretch of five consecutive games with at least two errors. The Tigers have played only four errorless games in 2002, but two of those came last weekend against UL-Monroe.

The Tigers' defense could get a boost this weekend with the possible return of shortstop Aaron Hill, a 2001 Freshman All-American who has been out for most of the past month with a separated shoulder.

#### Frozen at the Plate

LSU is continuing a distressing trend from 2001, and that's getting caught looking at far too many third strikes.

Of the Tigers' 129 strikeouts this year, 47 are of the called variety, or 36 percent. Last year, LSU got rung up on strikes on 136 of its 402 strikeouts, or just at one-third.

Sr.-1L, 6-3, 225, Bakersfield, Calif. (Bakersfield CC)

- Named SEC Player of the Week on Feb. 11 for his 9-for-15, 7 RBI effort in Birmingham-Southern series to open season.
- LSU's leader with 18 RBI.

**LSU coach Smoke Laval**  
 Ray "Smoke" Laval may be following a legend at LSU in Skip Bertman, but Laval is no stranger to the LSU program, having served 10 years (1984-93) under Bertman as his top assistant and as a graduate assistant to Jack Lamabe (1979) before that.

Laval, who was named Bertman's successor on July 18, 2000, came back to Baton Rouge after seven successful seasons at Louisiana-Monroe. Laval guided the Indians to a 241-159 record from 1994-2000 and led ULM to three NCAA regional appearances, including the regional final in 2000 against LSU. He was named the Southland Conference Coach of the year in 1999 and led the Indians to the SLC crown in 1999 and 2000.

During Laval's tenure as Bertman's top assistant, LSU won 483 games, reached the College World Series five times, and won the national championship in 1991 and 1993. Laval worked with 24 future major league players during that time and recruited nine first-team All-Americans.

- ◻ Willie Nelson's famous song "On the Road Again" certainly applies to the Tigers as LSU will play all four games away from Alex Box Stadium for the first time in a month.
- ◻ Tuesday finds the Tigers in Lafayette for the rematch with Louisiana-Lafayette at Moore Field. The Ragin Cajuns got a complete game from ace Justin Gabriel in a 2-1 triumph this past Tuesday at The Box, UL-Lafayette's second win in their last three visits to Baton Rouge. The Tigers haven't played in the Hub City since 1999, when they won 12-8 in 10 innings. The Cajuns haven't swept a two-game series from LSU since 1994.
- ◻ The Tigers' second SEC series is a critical one, as they visit Ole Miss and former LSU player and assistant Mike Bianco. The Rebels were tabbed as one of the favorites along with LSU and Mississippi St. to win the SEC West, and with a large nucleus of returning players, Bianco has the Rebels poised for a run at its first league title since 1977 under Jake Gibbs. LSU won four of five from the Rebels last year, including two in the SEC Tournament, but Ole Miss' lone victory is remembered more. That's because the Rebels laid a 23-10 humiliation on LSU, scoring more runs than any visitor ever has at The Box in its 64 years. Things got so bad for the Tigers in that game that shortstop Ryan Theriot was called on to pitch in the ninth and actually retired the side.
