**Tigers Look To Stay Unbeaten As Florida Comes To Tiger Stadium**

LSU will look to remain undefeated as the 5-0 Tigers host Florida at 2:30 p.m. in Tiger Stadium. The game will be televised to a national audience by CBS. The Tigers were off last Saturday and enter the Florida contest with a 5-0 overall mark and a 2-0 Southeastern Conference record. LSU beat Mississippi State, 41-6, in its last outing on Sept. 27. Florida stands at 3-3 overall and 1-2 in league play after a 20-17 loss to Ole Miss last week. The Tigers will look to improve to 6-0 overall for the first time since the 1973 squad won its first nine games. LSU will also look to run its SEC record to 3-0 for the second straight year. Last year, the Tigers won their first three league games before a road loss to Auburn. Saturday's contest will mark the 50th meeting between LSU and Florida with the Gators holding a 26-20-3 lead in the series. Last year, the Tigers posted a 36-7 victory over Florida in Gainesville. LSU heads into the Florida game ranked first in the SEC in scoring offense (40.2) and scoring defense (8.6), while the Gators are averaging 35.3 points a game and giving up 18.2 points a contest. The Tigers also rank first in the SEC and fourth nationally in total defense, allowing 256.0 yards per game - 58.2 rushing and 197.8 passing. LSU hasn't allowed a first half touchdown this season as the Tigers have yielded only three first half points all season.

**Opportunistic Tigers Feast on Mississippi State, 41-6**

LSU turned three Mississippi State turnovers into 21 points and the Tiger defense limited the Bulldogs to only 31 yards rushing as LSU rolled to a 41-6 win in Starkville. After a slow start, LSU took a 7-0 lead late in the first quarter on a 1-yard run by Shyrone Carey. Leading 10-0 after a Ryan Gaudet field goal, the Tigers stretched the margin to 17-0 midway through the second quarter on another 1-yard run by Carey. Carey's second TD was setup by an interception by Jack Hunt, who returned the pick to the MSU 1-yard line. The Tigers led 24-0 at halftime after Travis Daniels returned an interception 48-yards for a TD with less than a minute remaining in the first half. MSU then fumbled on its third play of the second half and the Tigers struck again one play later, this time Matt Mauck connected with Devery Henderson for a 36-yard TD pass to stretch the lead to 31-0. LSU led 34-0 before MSU finally scored with just over 10 minutes left in the contest. For the game, Mauck completed 12 of 19 passes for 171 yards and 1 TD, while Justin Vincent led the Tigers with 58 yards rushing and 1 TD on six carries. Carey added 50 yards rushing and 2 TDs on 13 carries. Henderson led all receivers with a career-best seven receptions for 114 yards and a score. Defensively, the Tigers sacked MSU quarterback Kevin Fant five times and limited the Bulldogs to only 239 yards of offense.

LSU and Florida meet for the 50th time on Saturday with the Gators leading the series, 26-20-3 ... Last year, LSU posted a 36-7 win in Gainesville to snap a 4-game losing streak to the Gators ... LSU hasn't won back-to-back games over Florida since 1986-87 when the Tigers won 28-17 in Gainesville in '86, followed by a 13-10 victory in Baton Rouge in '87 ... Overall, Florida has won four of the last five and 13 of the last 15 against LSU ... In its last trip to Baton Rouge, Florida posted a 44-15 win ... LSU's last win over Florida in Tiger Stadium came in 1997 by a 28-21 count when the Gators were ranked No. 1 in the nation ... That victory marks the only time LSU has beaten the nation's No. 1-ranked team ... Last year's 36-7 LSU win in Gainesville was the largest by the Tigers since a 48-7 win in 1971 ... LSU coach Nick Saban is 1-2 vs. Florida, which includes a 1-0 mark vs. Ron Zook.

# Nick Saban

HEAD COACH • FOURTH YEAR

For years outsiders viewed the LSU football program as an unpolished gem, a potential giant waiting to be reborn in the world of college football. With the wealth of resources LSU has to offer, its tradition and the available talent within the state of Louisiana, all the program needed was the right leader to lead it. Entering his fourth year as head coach of the Tigers, Nick Saban is that leader.

Since taking over in Baton Rouge in 2000, Saban has transformed the LSU football program into one that wins championships, while graduating players at the same time.

Equipped with a plan that gives his players the best chance to be successful on the field as well as in the classroom, Saban's impact on the program has been immediate and it's been powerful.

In just three years as LSU's head coach, Saban's on-field success has been nothing short of remarkable, as he's guided the Tigers to 26 victories, a pair of bowl wins, including one in the Bowl Championship Series, and the 2001 Southeastern Conference title. The Tigers have also played in back-to-back New Year's Day bowls for the first time since the 1960s.

On top of LSU's success on the gridiron, the Tigers are being recognized for their efforts in the classroom. Currently, all 22 of the Tiger seniors from the 2002 team are on pace to graduate within the next 12 months, while Rodney Reed earned First Team Academic All-America honors and Bradie James was awarded an \$18,000 post-graduate scholarship from the National Football Foundation last year.

Off the field, Saban and his players are active in the community, promoting goodwill by participating in such things as community service projects and visiting hospitals and schools in the Baton Rouge area on a regular basis. Saban has also worn the hat of fundraiser during his stay in Baton Rouge as he spearheaded an effort that raised more than \$15 million for a state-of-the-art academic center for student-athletes. The new Cox Communications Academic Center for Student-Athletes is part of Saban's plan to give his players the best opportunity to be successful when they finish their football careers. The center, which spans 54,000 square feet, is the best of its kind and features 100 computers, a 1,000-seat auditorium, a library and a communications center for training student-athletes.

Saban became the 31st head coach of the LSU Tigers on November 30, 1999, after five years as head coach at Michigan State.

He didn't waste anytime making his impact felt as he guided a team coming off back-to-back losing seasons to an 8-4 mark and a win over 15th-ranked Georgia Tech in the Peach Bowl in 2000 to rekindle the fire of a proud football tradition in Baton Rouge.

A year later in 2001, Saban guided the Tigers to their first outright SEC title since 1986 with a 31-20 win over second-ranked Tennessee in the SEC Championship game. LSU followed that with a 47-34 victory over Illinois in the Sugar Bowl to cap a 10-3 season for the Tigers.

Last year, Saban guided the Tigers to an 8-5 overall mark and a share of the SEC Western Division title. The Tigers also played in a New Year's Day bowl game for the second consecutive year, a first for LSU since the 1960's, with an appearance in the Cotton Bowl.

Prior to LSU, Saban spent five years as the head coach at Michigan State, where he built the Spartans into a perennial Big Ten contender after going to four bowl games in five seasons.

## This Week

LSU returns to action after having last weekend off as the Tigers host Florida at 2:30 p.m. in Tiger Stadium in a game televised to a national audience by CBS. LSU enters the game ranked No. 6 in the nation in both polls and the Tigers sport a 5-0 overall mark and a 2-0 SEC record. LSU posted a 41-6 win over Mississippi State in its last outing on Sept. 27. Florida comes to Tiger Stadium coming off a 20-17 last-minute loss to Ole Miss. The Gators are 3-3 overall and 1-2 in league play. Last year, LSU posted a 36-7 victory over Florida in Gainesville in the first meeting between **Nick Saban** and **Ron Zook**. Saturday's contest will mark the first time since 1989 that Florida enters its game with LSU unranked. The last time LSU was the only ranked team in an LSU-Florida meeting was in 1986 and the Tigers won, 28-17, in Gainesville.

## In The Polls

LSU held steady at No. 6 in the national rankings this week as Nos. 1-6 in both polls remained the same. The Tigers have now been ranked among the top 10 teams in the nation for three straight weeks, its longest streak such streak since 1998 when LSU spent the first four weeks of the season in the top 10. LSU's No. 6 ranking is the highest for the Tigers since 1998 when the Tigers moved to No. 6 after a 53-20 win over Idaho in Week 3. The following week the sixth-ranked Tigers dropped a 28-27 decision to then-No. 12 Georgia and dropped to No. 11 in the nation.

## About Florida

The Gators are 3-3 overall and 1-2 in league play ... They are averaging 35 points per game, while allowing just 18.2 points a contest ... Florida is third in the SEC in total offense with 422.7 yards per game - 158.3 rushing, 264.3 passing ... The Gators are ninth in the SEC in total defense as they are giving up 353.3 yards per game -152.2 rushing, 201.2 passing ... Florida has two of the SEC's top specialists in punter Eric Wilbur (43.6 yards per punt) and punt returner Kiewan Ratliff (14.5 yards per return) ... The Gators are coached by **Ron Zook**, who is in his second year with Florida ... Zook has an overall mark of 11-8, which includes an 0-1 record vs. LSU.

## Tigers Are Back On CBS

LSU returns to CBS for the second time this year on Saturday. The Tigers beat Georgia, 17-10, in a game televised by CBS on Sept. 20. The Florida game will mark LSU's 30th appearance on CBS and they have a 15-13-1 record on the network, which includes a 5-3 record under Nick Saban. LSU is 3-1 under Saban on CBS in Tiger Stadium, which includes wins over Alabama (2000), Arkansas (2001) and Georgia (2003). LSU has won four of its last five games on CBS.

## Win One For JB

The LSU football team has dedicated the 2003 season to longtime equipment manager **Jeff Boss**, who was diagnosed with brain cancer last January. Several members of the team, along with coach **Nick Saban**, presented coach Boss with a game ball from the Louisiana-Monroe game on Sept. 12 at his home. The ULM game was the first time in 24 years that coach Boss was not on the sidelines for an LSU contest. Then, on Sept. 29, LSU named its football locker room in Boss' honor with a formal ceremony that saw dozens of former Tiger football players, covering three decades, attend. In addition, the team will wear the letters "JB" on their helmets for the remainder of the season.

## Who's In And Who's Out For The Tigers

LSU heads into the Florida week with the status of a couple players still up in the air. RB **Shyrone Carey** and SS **Jack Hunt** both suffered sprained medial collateral ligaments against Florida. Carey (left knee) and Hunt (right knee) sat out of practice last week. They are scheduled to be re-evaluated by team doctors early this week. Neither injury required surgery. LB **Lionel Turner** (knee) is expected to return to practice on Monday after undergoing arthroscopic knee surgery on Sunday, Sept. 28. Turner will play against Florida. LSU will also get back the services of DE **Marquise Hill** (ankle) and LB **Adrian Mayes** (wrist) against Florida. Both players missed the Mississippi State game after suffering injuries in the win over Georgia.

## LSU Remains The Highest-Ranked Team In The SEC

LSU continues to be the SEC's highest-ranked team as the Tigers are currently No. 6 in the nation in both polls. LSU has been the league's highest-ranked squad for three straight weeks. The last time LSU was the top-ranked SEC team came in 1989 when the Tigers were No. 7 in the AP preseason poll followed by Auburn at No. 8. The last time the Tigers were the top-ranked SEC team this deep into a season came in 1987 when the Tigers were ranked No. 5 in the nation following a 42-17 win over Ole Miss in Week 8 that moved their record to 7-0-1.

## Tigers Eye 6-0 Start

LSU heads into the Florida contest looking to run its record to 6-0 for the first time since 1973 when the Tigers won their first nine games. LSU is 5-0 for the first time under **Nick Saban**. Since joining the SEC in 1933, the Tigers have started 5-0 five times (1958-59-69-72-73) and LSU has won its first six games five times as well (1958-59-69-72-73).

## LSU After An Open Date

Under **Nick Saban**, LSU is 4-2 in games immediately following an open date. Last year, the Tigers won both of their games that followed an open date as the Tigers beat Mississippi State on Sept. 28 after a Sept. 21 open date and then beat Kentucky on Nov. 9 following a Nov. 2 open date. LSU was 1-1 in both 2000 and 2001 following open dates.

## LSU-Florida Ties

LSU has 11 players on its roster who call Florida home, while the Gators have two players from Louisiana on its roster. LSU's Florida natives include LB **Dave Peterson** (Bristol), DB **Travis Daniels** (Hollywood), OL **Steve Arflin** and WR **Amp Hill** (Jacksonville), TE **Demetri Robinson** (Lake City), WR **Dwayne Bowe**, OG **Terrell McGill**, DT **Torran Williams** (Miami), LB **Willie Demps** (Pensacola), OL **Brian Johnson** (Tallahassee), and DB **Keron Gordon** (Tampa). Florida's two Louisiana natives are CB Deshawn Carter (Hammond), and DT Sylvester McGrew (New Orleans). Florida offensive coordinator Ed Zaunbrecher held the same position at LSU from 1984-90).

## Saban, LSU Look To Continue Win Streak Against SEC East

LSU will take a 6-game winning streak against SEC Eastern Division foes into Saturday's contest. The winning streak dates back to a 29-25 win over Kentucky in 2001. LSU followed that with a 31-20 win over Tennessee in the SEC Championship game in 2001 and last year, the Tigers reeled off wins over South Carolina, Florida and Kentucky. LSU ran the streak to six straight with a 17-10 win over Georgia on Sept. 20. LSU's last loss to an SEC Eastern Division foe came in 2001 to Florida by a 44-15 count. Since coming to LSU in 2000, **Nick Saban** has guided the Tigers to a 8-3 mark vs. the SEC East. Prior to Saban's arrival and since the SEC went to divisions in 1992, LSU posted a 6-17-1 vs. the East from 1992 to 1999.

## LSU Defense Continues First Half TD-less Streak

By keeping Mississippi State out of the endzone in the first half, LSU ran its streak of keeping its opponents without a first or second quarter TD to five straight games. Through five games in 2003, LSU has allowed only 3 first half points, those coming on first quarter field goal by Georgia's Billy Bennett. In the first half this year, LSU is outscoring its opponent to the tune of 103 to 3, or an average of 20.6 to .6. The three first half points allowed by the Tiger defense over the first five games is the fewest by an LSU team since at least 1945.

## Tiger Stadium Win Streak At Four Straight

LSU will also take a 4-game winning streak in Tiger Stadium into Saturday's game. The win streak started with a 14-13 victory over Ole Miss last year followed by wins over UL-Monroe, Western Illinois and Georgia this season. The Tigers have a 20-4 mark under Nick Saban in Tiger Stadium.

## LSU Offense Off To Quick Start

Through 5 games, the LSU offense has scored a staggering 201 points for an SEC-leading average of 40.2 points per game. The 201 points over five games is the most by an LSU team since the 1930 Tigers scored 244 points over their first five games of the season. The school record for points in a season is 375 set by the 1977 squad. LSU is currently on pace to break that mark as the Tigers only need to average 25 points over their next seven games to break that school record.

## And What About The Defense

LSU's defense has been just as good as the offense as the Tigers have yielded only 43 points over the first five games of the year, for an SEC-leading average of 8.6 points a contest. The last time a Tiger squad held its first five opponents to a combined 43 points or less was in 1985 when LSU limited its first five opponents to 43 points. That year, LSU allowed 13 points to North Carolina, 3 to Colorado State, 20 to Florida, 7 to Vanderbilt and 0 to Kentucky over the first five weeks of the season.

## LSU Leads SEC In Both Scoring Offense And Scoring Defense

The Tigers enter the Florida contest leading the SEC in both scoring offense as well as scoring defense. LSU is currently averaging 40.2 points a game, seventh in the nation, while the defense is limiting opponents to only 8.6 points a contest, third in the nation. Of the 43 points that LSU has allowed this year, 36 have come against the defense as Arizona scored a TD on a fumble recovery in the LSU endzone.

## Tigers The Best In the League In Total Defense; 4 of 5 Opponents Held To Less Than 240 Yards

After limiting Mississippi State to only 239 yards of offense, LSU returned to the top spot in the SEC in total defense as the Tigers are allowing only 256 yards per game. The 256 yards per game ranks fourth in the nation. LSU also leads the SEC in rushing defense, allowing only 58.2 yards per game, which ranks fourth in the nation. The Tigers are sixth in the SEC in pass defense, allowing 197.8 yards per contest, but the Tigers are first in the SEC and third in the nation in pass efficiency defense with a 82.1 rating. So far this season, Georgia is the only team to go over 300 yards against the Tigers as the Bulldogs amassed 411 yards in a 17-

10 loss to LSU. LSU has also held all five of its opponents to fewer than 100 yards rushing in each game, including 13 yards to Western Illinois and 31 yards to Mississippi State.

## Tigers Lead SEC In Interceptions

With a pair of interceptions against Mississippi State, the Tigers continue to lead the SEC in interceptions with 10 through five games. The Tigers have made the most of their interceptions as two have been returned for TDs (Jack Hunt 31 yards vs. UL-Monroe and Travis Daniels 48 yards vs. Miss. State) and another was returned to the opponent's 1-yard line. Of the 10 interceptions for LSU in 2003, four have resulted in a TD for the Tigers (2 by the defense and 2 by the offense). Corey Webster leads the Tigers with three interceptions, followed by Travis Daniels and Jack Hunt with two each.

## How About Those Special Teams

A quick glance at the SEC statistical team leaders and you'll see that the Tigers rank among the top four in the league in just about every special teams category. Not too bad for a group that has freshmen handling all kick-offs and place kicks, at least seven freshmen on the kickoff coverage unit as well as a first-year snapper. LSU leads the SEC and ranks fifth nationally in kickoff returns (28.1), they are second in net punting (39.6), third in punt returns (12.6), and fourth in kickoff coverage (18.9). LSU's .500 field goal percentage ties for 8th in the SEC.

## Go Figure

Between 1997 and Nov. 16, 2002, LSU failed to reach 20 points in an SEC contest 15 times. The Tigers lost all 15 of those games. Dating back to last year's Ole Miss game on Nov. 23, LSU has now won two of its last three SEC games when failing to reach the 20-point mark. Last year, LSU beat Ole Miss 14-13 for its final SEC victory and the Tigers opened up conference play this year with a 17-10 victory over Georgia. Prior to last year's win over Ole Miss, LSU had not won an SEC game when scoring less than 20 points since a 7-6 victory over Vanderbilt in 1997. You have to go all the way back to 1993 to find a two-game span when the Tigers won SEC games despite failing to reach 20 points. That year, LSU beat Ole Miss, 19-17 and then followed with a 17-13 win over Alabama. LSU also beat Mississippi State 18-16 that year.

## Saban Knows Pass Efficiency

One thing that LSU coach Nick Saban did over the summer was research pass efficiency and how a quarterback's efficiency related to wins and losses. Saban said the research proved that the quarterback with the better pass efficiency in a game usually leads his team to a victory. So far that has proven to be true as the Tigers and quarterback Matt Mauck led the SEC and rank ninth in the nation in pass efficiency with a 155.6 rating. LSU has had the better quarterback pass efficiency rating in all five of its games this year, and a result, the Tigers are 5-0. Mauck currently leads the SEC with a 150.9 pass efficiency rating.

## Tigers Keep Opponents To Less Than 20 Points For 23rd Time Under Saban

By holding Mississippi State to only 6 points, the Tigers have now limited their opponents to less than 20 points in 24 of the 42 games they have played under Nick Saban. Under Saban, the Tigers are 22-2 when holding its opponents to fewer than 20 points, which includes riding a 18-game winning streak when the feat is accomplished. The only two times that the Tigers have surrendered less than 20 points and loss under Saban came in 2000 when UAB beat LSU, 13-10 and Arkansas posted a 14-3 victory in a driving rainstorm in Little Rock. Of the 24 times that LSU has held its opponent to under 20 points, 12 of those have been when the opponent scored 10 points or less. LSU has also posted four shutouts under Saban.

## Clayton and Henderson A Nice 1-2 Punch At Wide Receiver

One thing is for certain and that is if defenses key too much on Michael Clayton, then Devery Henderson will make them pay. Focus on Henderson, then Clayton takes over. At least that's how it's been over the first five games of the year. Clayton and Henderson have combined for 50 catches for 779 yards and 8 TDs for the Tigers. Clayton has gone over 100 yards three times this year, while Henderson has done it once. Clayton has led LSU in both yards and catches in three games, while Henderson did it with a career-best 7 receptions for 114 yards and a TD vs. Mississippi State. Clayton ranks third in the league in receptions per game (5.6), while Henderson is fifth with 4.40 a contest. Clayton is second in the SEC in yards per game (95.4) with Henderson eighth at 60.4 yard a contest.

## Comparing Clayton And Reed After Five Games

In 2001, Josh Reed became LSU's first Biletnikoff Award winner, which goes to the college football's top wide receiver. After five games, Michael Clayton is putting up similar numbers to Reed during his award winning and record-setting season. Through 5 games, Clayton has caught 28 passes for 477 yards and 4 TDs. In 2001, Reed had 32 receptions for 667 yards and 1 TD over the Tigers' first five games.

## Open Wide

QB **Matt Mauck's** week got off to a big start as the Tiger signal-caller spent Monday morning taking the Dental Admissions Test. Mauck, who also considered pursuing a career in medicine, has now opted to becoming a dentist.

## Mauck's Thrown A TD Pass In Nine Straight Games

QB **Matt Mauck** enters the Florida contest having thrown at least one TD pass in nine straight games, a streak that dates back to the Miami (Ohio) game last year. Over that 9-game span, all LSU wins, Mauck has tossed 19 TD passes compared to just three interceptions. Mauck's streak of having at least one TD pass in nine straight games is the most for an LSU player since Herb Tyler did it in 12 straight games covering the final two games of 1997 and all 10 games that he played in in 1998.

## Mauck Ties LSU Record With 17 Straight Completions

**Matt Mauck** played perhaps the best game of his career in the Sept. 13 game vs. Western Illinois. Lost in his overall numbers was the fact that he tied an LSU record by completing 17 straight passes over a two game span. Mauck completed his final 10 passes in LSU's 59-13 win over Arizona on Sept. 6 and he followed that by completing 7 straight vs. Western Illinois. The 17 straight completions ties the mark set by Rohan Davey, who completed 6 straight vs. Arkansas to close the 1999 season and then opened the 2000 season by hitting 11 straight vs. Western Carolina.

## Mauck Has Career Night In Win over Western Illinois

**Matt Mauck** put together a career night vs. Western Illinois as the junior from Jasper, Ind., posted career-highs for completions (23), yards (305) and TDs (4). For the contest, Mauck connected on his first seven passes and went on to complete 23 of 35 passes. He became LSU's first 300-yard passer since Rohan Davey tossed for 444 yards vs. Illinois in the 2002 Sugar Bowl. The four TD were the most by an LSU player since Josh Booty threw 4 TD passes in a win over Alabama in 2000.

## Double-Trouble At Running Back

LSU's running back tandem of **Joseph Addai** and **Shyrone Carey** have proven to be a nice tandem for the Tigers. Through five games, Carey has rushed for 307 yards and 6 TDs on 65 carries, while Addai has 286 yards and a pair of scores on 66 attempts. Carey has scored at least one TD in all five games this year, including the two he scored against Mississippi State. Three weeks ago with Addai have an off night vs. Western Illinois, Carey picked up the slack at running back and responded with a career-high 124 yards and a TD on 21 attempts. At 5-foot-6, Carey is the shortest LSU running back to ever rush for 100 yards in a game.

## Jones Sets One School Record, Sets Sights On Another

**Donnie Jones**, a senior punter from Baton Rouge, became LSU's all-time leader in punts with 187 after punting five times against Mississippi State. The 187 punts surpassed the 186 punts by Chad Kessler from 1994-97. In addition, Jones currently ranks second in career punting yards with 7,835, just 142 shy of breaking Kessler's mark of 7,976. Jones also ranks second in school history in career punting average at 41.9 yards per kick. Kessler holds the school record with a 42.9 career average.

## Clayton on the Move

**Michael Clayton**, a junior wide receiver, is moving up the LSU career record books. The Baton Rouge native enters the Florida game ranked sixth in career receiving touchdowns with 15. Clayton also ranks tied for fifth in career receptions with 132 and he's sixth in career receiving yards with 1,980. Clayton also ranks seventh in school history in career 100-yard games with six. Clayton needs just 20 yards to become only the fifth 2,000-yard receiver in LSU history.

## 100-150-300 vs. Western Illinois A Rarity For Tigers

LSU's trio of QB **Matt Mauck**, RB **Shyrone Carey** and WR **Michael Clayton** combined for a rarity vs. Western Illinois on Sept. 13. Carey rushed for 124 yards, Clayton caught passes netting 162 yards and Mauck threw for 305 yards as the trio became just the fourth group in school history to have 100-yards rushing, 150-yards receiving and 300-yard passing in the same game. The last time the Tigers had a 100-yard rusher, a 150-yard receiver and a 300-yard passer in the same contest came against Illinois in the 2002 Sugar Bowl. In that game, Domanick Davis rushed for 122 yards, Josh Reed had 239 yards receiving and Rohan Davey threw for 444 yards. The other two times came in 2001 as well as the Tigers did it against Kentucky (Toefield 129 rushing, Reed 160 receiving, Davey 383 passing) and then against vs. Arkansas (Toefield 173 rushing, Reed 183 receiving, Davey 359 passing).

## 100 On The Ground And 100 In The Air

Against Western Illinois, LSU had its first 100-yard rusher and 100-yard receiver in the same game since the Sugar Bowl in January of 2002. Against Western Illinois, **Shyrone Carey** rushed for 124 yards, while **Michael Clayton** caught 11 passes for 162 yards. It's the first time the Tigers have accomplished that feat since

## Tiger "D" Keeps First Quarter Streak Alive

By holding Mississippi State out of the endzone in the first quarter, the LSU defense ran its streak TD-less first quarters to nine straight dating back to last season. The last time an opposing offense scored a touchdown on the Tigers in the first quarter came against Kentucky in week 9 of last year. Texas scored a first quarter TD against the Tigers in the Cotton Bowl, but that was on a return of a **Marcus Randall** fumble. Dating back to last year's season-opener, the LSU defense has allowed only 4 first quarter touchdowns.

## Tiger Defense Continues To Be Stingy

Through 20 quarters this season, LSU's defense has held the opponent out of the endzone in 13 of those. In week 1, Louisiana-Monroe didn't score until the fourth quarter and the same was true in week 2 as Arizona's offense didn't score until there was only four minutes left in the contest. For the first time this season, LSU allowed points prior to the fourth quarter as Western Illinois scored on its first second half possession. Georgia became the first team to score in the first half against the Tigers as the Bulldogs connected on a field goal in the first quarter. The Tigers looked as if they may have had their first shutout of the season before Mississippi State finally scored with 10 minutes left in the contest on Sept. 27.

## Mauck Is An Accountable Starting QB

Since taking over as LSU's starting quarterback at the beginning of last season, **Matt Mauck** has led the Tigers to a 10-1 mark. What Mauck has also done is be directly involved in 22 of LSU's 43 offensive touchdowns over that 11-game span. In 11 games as a starter, the Tigers have scored 43 offensive touchdowns (these numbers take in to account whether Mauck was in the game or not), and he's either passed or rushed for 22 of those. Of the 43 offensive TDs that LSU has scored in his 11 starts, Mauck has passed for 19 TDs and rushed for another three.

## Mauck Moves To 10-1 As A Starter

Matt Mauck ran his record as LSU's starting quarterback to 10-1 with the Tiger win over Mississippi State. As a matter of fact, the win was the 10th straight for Mauck after opening his career with a loss last year at Virginia Tech. The 10-1 start by Mauck is the best by an LSU quarterback since Herb Tyler won 10 of his first 11, including his first eight, as a starter from 1995-96. In addition, Mauck has played in 14 games in his LSU career and the Tigers are 12-2 in those contests.

## Webster Nabs 10th Career Interception

He was a basketball superstar in high school. He came to LSU as a wide receiver and played there for a year before moving to the secondary. Now, in just his second season as a starter at CB **Corey Webster** has already moved up to seventh place in school history in interceptions after recording the 10th career pick vs. Georgia. The interception, which made Webster look more like a magician, came with just over a minute left in the contest and sealed LSU's 17-10 win over Georgia. The pick was the third of the year for Webster, who ranks second in the SEC and 13th nationally in the category. Webster began his career at LSU as a WR, catching seven passes for 74 yards in 12 games as a freshman. In 18 games on defense, Webster has 10 interceptions for 98 yards and 1 TD.

## The Long Ball

LSU has scored on plays of 40 yards or longer in three of its five games this year. While the Tigers did not have offensive scoring plays of at least 40 yards in their last two games, they did come close in both contests. Against Georgia, **Matt Mauck** hit **Skyler Green** for a 34-yard TD late in the fourth quarter in what was the game winner for the Tigers. A week later, Mauck connected with **Devery Henderson** for a 36-yard TD pass to start the third quarter scoring for the Tigers. This year, LSU has thrown 12 TD passes with five of those going for at least 40 yards. Mauck has three TD passes of at least 40 yards this year, while backup QB **Marcus Randall** has accounted for the other two. Last year, the Tigers had just three touchdown passes from over 40 yards, with two of those coming in the Kentucky game.

## Saban Gets Win No. 31 at LSU and No. 74 Overall

LSU coach **Nick Saban** moved past Mike Archer into sole possession of sixth place in school history in wins with his 28th victory in the Tigers' win over Arizona. Saban picked up win No. 31 vs. Mississippi State, moving him to within one of tying Gerry DiNardo for fifth place at LSU. In just over three years with LSU, Saban has posted a 31-12 overall mark. Saban also has 74 career victories. In his 10th season overall, Saban has put together an overall record of 74-38-1. Charles McClendon holds the school-record with 137 victories in 19 years as LSU's head coach.

## Saban Adds Another Notch To SEC Belt

With the win over Georgia, LSU coach **Nick Saban** has now recorded at least one win over all but one SEC team. The only team Saban has yet to beat in the only team he hasn't faced - Vanderbilt. In just over three years at LSU, Saban has recorded 17 SEC victories - 18 counting the SEC title game in 2001. Saban has four wins over Mississippi State, three over Kentucky, two each against Alabama, Ole Miss and Tennessee and one over Georgia, Auburn, Florida, South Carolina, and Arkansas. Saban's current SEC mark, which includes regular-season games only, stands at 17-9.

## That Tiger Stadium Mystique Is Back Under Saban

LSU coach **Nick Saban** has restored the mystique that has made Tiger Stadium one of the toughest places for opposing teams to play. In his fourth season at LSU, Saban has put together a 20-4 mark at home, which includes a 10-3 record in SEC games. Under Saban, the Tigers are 5-2 vs. Top 25 teams in Tiger Stadium. LSU's 18 wins over Saban's first three years in Baton Rouge is the most over a three-year period for LSU in Tiger Stadium since the Tigers won 18 home games from 1972-74.

## Tigers Are Now 13-3 In Non-Conference Games Under Saban

After the win over Western Illinois, LSU moved its non-conference record under **Nick Saban** to 13-3. The Tigers were 3-1 in non-league games in 2000, followed by a 4-0 mark in 2001 and a 3-2 record last year. Included in the 13 non-SEC wins over the last three-plus years for the Tigers are bowl victories over Georgia Tech and Illinois.

## Skyler Has Memorable Debut As Punt Returner

**Skyler Green's** first career punt return will go down as one that will be hard to forget. Green returned his first career punt 62 yards for a touchdown in LSU's win over Arizona. The 62-yard return is the longest by a Tiger since Domanick Davis had a 78-yard punt return for a TD vs. Mississippi State last season.

## Taking Notes On The Tigers Under Saban

Here's a look at some notable LSU trends during its first 42 games under **Nick Saban** ... LSU is 26-2 when leading at halftime and 24-2 when leading after three quarters ... The Tigers are 29-3 when scoring 20 or more points and 28-0 when scoring 25 or more points ... On the other hand, LSU is 2-9 when failing to reach the 20-point mark ... LSU is 8-2 in games decided by 7 points or less and 3-1 in games decided by 3 points or less ... LSU is 12-4 in September under Saban ... LSU is 19-0 when holding opponents to fewer than 100 yards rushing and the Tigers are 12-0 when having a 100-yard rusher.

## Jimbo Keeps Spreading It Around In The Passing Game

LSU offensive coordinator **Jimbo Fisher** has done a good job keeping opposing defenses off balance when it comes to the passing game. Through 5 games this year, LSU has had at 12 players catch at least one pass. In the opener vs. UL-Monroe, LSU had seven players catch at least one pass. A week later vs. Arizona, eight Tigers caught passes. In five games, LSU has completed 88 passes with the wide receivers accounting for 72 of those receptions, while the tight ends and running backs have each caught nine passes.

## Clayton Runs Streak To 31 Straight Games; Has Sixth Career 100-Yard Game

LSU WR **Michael Clayton** ran his streak of consecutive games with at least one reception to 31 after recording 3 catches vs. Mississippi State. Clayton has caught at least one pass in every game in which he has played during his career. With a career-best 162 yards receiving against Western Illinois, Clayton now has recorded six 100-yard games during his career, three of which have come in 2003. In four games, Clayton has caught 28 passes for 480 yards and 4 TDs.

## Tigers Have Block Party vs. Western Illinois

LSU recorded both a blocked field goal and as well as a blocked punt against Western Illinois. **Travis Daniels** blocked the punt, which was the first for the Tigers since the 1999 game against Mississippi State, while **Chad Lavalais** blocked the field goal attempt. The blocked field goal was the first for LSU since 1998 when Arnold Miller blocked a kick against Notre Dame.

## Tigers Have Experience on the O-Line

The LSU offensive line has been touted as one of the best in the nation. The Tiger offensive line may be one of the most experienced as the LSU front five have 116 career starts between them. **Rodney Reed** leads the way with 39, followed by **Stephen Peterman** with 30, **Ben Wilkerson** with 24 and **Andrew Whitworth** 18. Nate Livings has started all five games this season. LSU is 19-4 when Reed, Peterman and Wilkerson start on the offensive line together (8-0 in 2001, 6-4 in 2002, 5-0 in 2003).

## Reed Among Nation's Elite In Starts on Offensive Line

Senior OT **Rodney Reed** started his 39th straight game vs. Mississippi State. Reed's 39 career starts ranks as the seventh-highest total among active Division I players. Marshall's Nate McPeck leads the way with 44 career starts.

## Pancakes Are Breakfast of Choice For LSU O-Line

A new wrinkle to this year's offensive grade sheet is the tracking of both pancakes and knockdowns for the LSU offensive line. Through five games **Andrew Whitworth** leads the Tigers with 10 pancakes. Offensive guard **Stephen Peterman** is tops among the Tigers with 56 knockdowns.

## Carey Fills In Nicely For Domanick

A concern for LSU heading into the season was how to replace the departed Domanick Davis, the school's all-time leader in both punt return and kickoff return yards. **Shyrone Carey** has put some of that concern to rest as he's averaging 11.2 yards on 17 punt returns this season. Against Arizona, Carey returned returned five punts for 58 yards, including a 35-yard return that setup LSU's first quarter field goal that put the lead at 10-0. In all, LSU is averaging 12.6 yards on 22 punt returns, a figure that ranks third in the SEC.

## Cap and Gown Tigers

LSU has two players on this year's roster who have already earned their bachelor's degree - OT **Rodney Reed** and C **Jimmy Courtenay**. Reed and Courtenay both graduated last May. Reed, who earned First Team Academic All-America honors last year, graduated with a 3.9 grade point average in accounting. He is currently pursuing his Master's in accounting.

## Clayton Has Teams Seeing Double (Triple, really)

**Michael Clayton** finally had his much-anticipated debut on defense vs. Arizona as the two-way player saw action on three plays at safety. Clayton did not record any statistics on defense, however he did make a tackle from his wide receiver position after an intercepted pass on offense. Clayton is actually playing three ways for the Tigers as he also serves as the backup holder on all placekicks as well as being on the kickoff coverage team. The Arizona contest marked the second time in Clayton's career that he has seen action on both sides of the ball. He did it for the first time last year vs. Texas in the Cotton Bowl.

## Peterman's Pulling Double-Duty Too

As of Tuesday, Aug. 26, senior offensive lineman **Stephen Peterman** began pulling double-duty as well, only his is as a player and daddy. Peterman's wife Colleen gave birth to a 6-pound, 10-ounce baby boy in Metairie, La. Peterman missed two days of practice to be with his wife during the birth, but he returned to the squad on Thursday and started on Saturday against UL-Monroe. The newest Peterman, Stephen Frederick, Jr., checked in at some 318 pounds lighter than his daddy.

## Gaudet Joins Elite List With 47-Yard FG

**Ryan Gaudet** added his name to a very short list of LSU kickers with his 47-yard field goal against Arizona. Gaudet's 47-yard field goal marked the first of his career and it marked the third-longest at LSU for a kicker on his first career make. Juan Roca holds the record as he connected on a 52-yard field goal vs. Wisconsin for his career make, while Wade Richey's first career make was a 48-yarder vs. Michigan State in 1995. Gaudet added another 47-yarder against Georgia. Gaudet, who made a pair of field goals vs. Mississippi State, is now 4 of 7 this season.

## Wilkerson Named to Rimington Watch List

Junior C **Ben Wilkerson** is one of 38 players named to the watch list for the Rimington Trophy. The award, established in 2000, is named for Nebraska's Dave Rimington, one of college football's most decorated offensive linemen. This is the second straight season Wilkerson has made the preseason watch list for the award. Wilkerson has started 20 games in his career and LSU is 15-5 in those games.

## Webster on Thorpe and Nagurski Watch List

Junior CB **Corey Webster**, who led the Southeastern Conference last season with seven interceptions, has been named to the Jim Thorpe Award and the Bronko Nagurski watch lists. The Thorpe award, presented annually to the nation's top defensive back, is named after history's greatest all-around athlete who excelled on both defense and offense during his football career. The Nagurski award is presented to the nation's top all-around defensive player.

## Peterman on Lombardi Watch List

Senior OG **Stephen Peterman**, a 2002 first-team All-SEC selection, has been named to the preliminary watch list for the Rotary Lombardi Award. Peterman is one of 41 players on the list for the award that is presented annually to the nation's top offensive or defensive lineman.

Junior LB **Lionel Turner** has been named to the preseason Butkus Award watch list. The Walker, La., native finished third on the team in tackles last season with 71 and recorded three sacks. The award is presented annually to the nation's top linebacker.

I'd been warned prior to my first visit to Baton Rouge that the legendary Death Valley mystique was a myth. That assessment couldn't have been more wrong. Tiger Stadium was as loud as any I've ever heard during the dramatic fourth quarter of Saturday's Georgia game, the festivities surrounding it as advertised.

The streets were lined with purple and gold. Smoke emanated from the grills in the parking lot. Shouts of "Go Tigers" and "Tiger Bait" echoed from the stadium deep into the heart of campus.

And that was just Friday night. -- Stewart Mandel, SI.com (Sept. 21, 2003)

• LSU began playing football in Tiger Stadium in 1924 and is currently in its 80th year in the venerable stadium on SATURDAY NIGHT.

• Under Nick Saban, the Tigers have posted a 20-4 HOME RECORD, including a 5-2 mark against ranked opponents. Against conference foes, Saban is 9-3 in Death Valley. In home games at night, LSU is 15-3 since Saban took over.

• LSU has won NINE OF ITS LAST 10 games at home, including an eight-game win streak during the stretch. That was the longest home streak for the Tigers since winning eight straight from 1995-96.

• More than 85,000 FANS have attended each of LSU's last 22 home games. In that span, the Tigers have eclipsed the 90,000 mark 14 times, including a school-record 92,251 for the Sept. 20, 2003 game that pitted No. 10 LSU against No. 7 Georgia. The Tigers won the game 17-10.

• Since national attendance figures began being kept in 1957, LSU has ranked in the top 20 all 45 seasons. The Tigers have been in the top 15 for 43 of the 45 years and in the top 10 on 37 occasions, including 32 straight from 1957-88. Fourteen times, LSU has ranked in the TOP FIVE IN THE NATION, including the last three.

• Since 1960, LSU owns a stellar 184-61-4 (.745) record in traditional Tiger Stadium night games. On the other hand, the Tigers are just 15-20-3 (.434) at home during the day in that span.

### Earthquake Game

October 8, 1988. Tommy Hodson connected with Eddie Fuller on 4-and-10 with 1:41 to play for the game-winning touchdown as LSU upset No. 4 Auburn. The play caused such a thunderous explosion from the crowd of 79,341 that the tremor caused by the vibrations measured on the seismograph across campus.

### Halloween Night

October 31, 1959. No. 1 LSU trailed No. 3 Ole Miss, 3-0, late in the fourth quarter when Billy Cannon fielded a punt off the bounce at the 11-yard line. He raced 89 yards, careening off seven Rebel defenders, to paydirt to give the Tigers victory and all but clinch the 1959 Heisman Trophy.

## Tigers Blast The Gators 36-7

In one of the most dominating performances by an LSU team in recent history, the Tigers rolled to a 36-7 win at Florida. LSU never trailed, jumping out to a 10-0 lead behind a pair of first quarter interceptions by Corey Webster, the second of which he returned 45 yards for a touchdown. LSU began its second-half domination with a 12-play, 80-yard drive capped by a 13-yard strike from Matt Mauck to Devery Henderson. The lead was 26-7 after another Mauck-to-Henderson TD. Blaine Bech then scored on a 35-yard run on a fake field goal and John Corbello kicked his third field goal for the final margin. LSU limited Florida to 237 yards of offense, including just 163 passing yards. Mauck connected on 13-of-20 passes for 153 yards and 2 TDs and added another 67 yards on the ground. Domanick Davis led the Tigers with 84 yards rushing.

### LSU's Rolls Past UL-Monroe, 49-7

Matt Mauck threw three touchdown passes, Joseph Addai rushed for 81 yards and Michael Clayton caught six passes for 152 yards and a pair of TD passes as LSU rolled to a 49-7 win over Louisiana-Monroe in the season-opener for both teams. The game was only four minutes old when a thunderstorm rolled into Baton Rouge and caused a 39-minute delay because of lightning. After a scoreless first quarter, Mauck then threw three TD passes over the final seven minutes of the second quarter to put the Tigers up 21-0 at halftime. Shyrone Carey added a 1-yard run midway through the third quarter to give LSU a 28-0 advantage and the Tigers stretched the margin to 35-0 with a 31-yard interception return just 16 seconds later. Louisiana-Monroe scored its only points of the contest on a 12-yard run by Kevin Payne with 14:10 left in the fourth quarter. Freshman Alley Broussard capped the scoring for the Tigers with a 1-yard run with 10:39 left in the contest. For the game, the Tigers racked up 474 yards of offense (306 passing, 168 rushing) compared to just 240 yard for the Indians (59 rushing, 181 passing).

LSU Storms Past Arizona, 59-13, In The Desert

LSU scored on its first seven possessions, including a 15-play, 80-yard drive to open the contest, as the Tigers had little trouble with Arizona, posting a 59-13 win over the Wildcats in Tucson, Ariz. Quarterbacks Matt Mauck and Marcus Randall combined to connect on 19 of 25 passes for 299 yards and two TDs and Joseph Addai rushed for 86 yards and a pair of scores to lead the Tigers. Michael Clayton led all receivers with six catches for 109 yards and a 48-yard TD reception. Addai opened the scoring for LSU with a 1-yard run midway through the first quarter. LSU QB Matt Mauck connected on 23 of 32 passes for a career-best 305 yards and four TDs as the Tigers overcame a slow start to post a 35-7 win over Western Illinois last Saturday in Tiger Stadium. Mauck-To-Green Leads LSU Past No. 7 Georgia, 17-10

Matt Mauck connected with Skyler Green for a 34-yard touchdown pass with 1:22 left in the contest as 10th-ranked LSU knocked off seventh-ranked Georgia, 17-10, before a record crowd of 92,251 in Tiger Stadium. The win lifted LSU to 4-0 overall and 1-0 in SEC action and it marked the first Tiger victory over a top 10 team in Tiger Stadium since a 28-21 win over No. 1 Florida in 1997. The Tigers led 7-3 at halftime thanks in part to an outstanding defensive effort by LSU over the first 30 minutes. In the first half alone, Georgia got inside the LSU 30-yard line five times and came up with only three points. Trailing 3-0, the Tigers took a 7-3 lead on a 21-yard run by Shyrone Carey with 3:10 left in the first half. The Tigers extended their margin to 10-3 on a 47-yard field goal by Ryan Gaudet at the 6:23 mark in the third quarter. LSU appeared to have the game in hand, but a fumble by Mauck at the Georgia 15-yard line with less than 5 minutes left gave the Bulldogs another chance. Two players later Georgia's David Greene hit Tyson Browning on a screen pass, which he took 93 yards for a touchdown to tie the score at 10-10. Devery Henderson returned the ensuing kickoff 48 yards to the LSU 49-yard line to setup the game-winning touchdown for the Tigers. Georgia got into LSU territory in the final minute, but an interception by Corey Webster at the 22-yard line sealed the Tiger victory.

Opportunistic Tigers Feast on Mississippi State, 41-6

LSU turned three Mississippi State turnovers into 21 points and the Tiger defense limited the Bulldogs to only 31 yards rushing as LSU rolled to a 41-6 win in Starkville. After a slow start, LSU took a 7-0 lead late in the first quarter on a 1-yard run by Shyrone Carey. Leading 10-0 after a Ryan Gaudet field goal, the Tigers stretched the margin to 17-0 midway through the second quarter on another 1-yard run by Carey. Carey's second TD was setup by an interception by Jack Hunt, who returned the pick to the MSU 1-yard line. The Tigers led 24-0 at half-time after Travis Daniels returned an interception 48-yards for a TD with less than a minute remaining in the first half.
