LSU Tigers (3-3) vs. Kentucky Wildcats (2-4)

LSU LOOKS TO GET BACK ON THE WINNING TRACK AGAINST KENTUCKY

The LSU Fighting Tigers will look to even their record in conference play this Saturday when Kentucky comes to Tiger Stadium for a 7 p.m. contest. The Tigers fell to 3-3 overall and 1-2 in SEC play with a 41-9 loss at Florida last weekend in Gainesville, while Kentucky remained winless in SEC action as the Wildcats dropped a 20-17 decision to South Carolina in Lexington. Kentucky enters Saturday's contest riding a 3-game losing streak and the Wildcats are 2-4 overall and an 0-3 league play. Kentucky is 0-3 on the road this season having dropped games at Louisville (40-34 OT), at Florida (59-31) and at Ole Miss (35-17). Last year, Kentucky posted a 31-5 win over the Tigers in Lexington. Kentucky has won two straight against LSU and the Wildcats have never won three in a row against the Tigers since the series started back in 1949. LSU is 20-5-1 all-time vs. Kentucky in Baton Rouge.

TIGER MISCUES LEAD TO 41-9 LOSS AT FLORIDA

There has been one common theme in LSU's roller-coaster start this season - when the Tigers turn the ball over they don't win. The Tigers turned the ball over four times and got none in return last weekend en route to a 41-9 loss at Florida. Gator quarterback Rex Grossman completed 18-of-28 passes for 276 yards and 3 TD passes, all to Jabar Gaffney, while Robert Gillespie came up with 120 yards rushing on 19 carries to pace Florida. Grossman hit Gaffney with a pair of first half TDs to help the Gators to a 17-3 lead. The two hooked up for the third time less than five minutes into the third quarter on a 59-yard strike to move the lead to 24-3. The Tigers cut the lead to 27-9 on a 5-yard TD pass from **Josh Booty** to **Robert Royal** before Florida added two late touchdowns for the final margin of victory.

THE LSU-KENTUCKY SERIES

LSU owns a decisive advantage in its series with Kentucky, posting a 34-15-1 all-time record. The Tigers, however, have dropped back-to-back decisions to Kentucky. Two years ago Tim Couch led Kentucky on a late field goal drive to beat the Tigers 39-36 in a thriller at Death Valley, while a year ago Dusty Bonner led the Cats to a convincing 31-5 win in Lexington. The teams split their 10 meetings in the 1990s. LSU's last win was a 63-28 win in Lexington in 1997 in which Kevin Faulk registered a career-high five touchdowns to go along with 212 yards on the ground.

Notes On The Game:

- * The Tigers forced Florida to punt on its opening possession, marking the 11th consecutive game LSU has held the opposition without an opening possession score.
- * **Reggie Robinson's** second quarter reception marked the 23rd consecutive game in which he caught a pass. Josh Reed caught a pass in his ninth straight games since moving from running back to receiver and **Jerel Myers** extended his streak to 17 straight.
- * **Domanick Davis'** 31-yard punt return was the longest of his career (early 3rd quarter). It was the longest punt return by a Tiger since Larry Foster returned one for a touchdown 50 yards against Idaho in 1998.
- * The **Josh Booty** to **Domanick Davis** pass and run which covered 54 yards was the Tigers' seventh this season of 45 yards or more this season and the longest catch of Davis' career.
- * **Robert Royal's** fourth quarter touchdown reception was his third of the season, tying the most for a Tigers tight end since **Kyle Kipps** (when he was still a tight end) in 1998.

LSU VS. KENTUCKY

The LSU Tigers wrap up their tour against the SEC's Eastern Division on Saturday when they play host to Kentucky in Tiger Stadium. LSU is 1-2 in league play which includes a 1-1 mark vs. SEC Eastern Division teams. Saturday's game will also mark the start of a three-game home stand for the Tigers as LSU will host Kentucky, Mississippi State and Alabama before playing its final two games on the road. LSU enters the Kentucky contest holding a commanding 20-5-1 record vs. the Wildcats in games played in Baton Rouge. Overall, LSU leads the series with the Wildcats 34-15-1. The Wildcasts have however won the last two meetings between the teams - 31-5 last year in Lexington and 39-36 in 1998 in Baton Rouge. Kentucky has put together back-to-back wins against LSU four times, but the Wildcats have been denied a third straight win over the Tigers each time.

ABOUT KENTUCKY

Kentucky will carry a three-game losing streak into Saturday's contest in Baton Rouge. The three straight losses matches the longest losing streak for the Wildcats in the Hal Mumme era. Kentucky's freshman quarterback **Jared Lorenzen** stands 6-foot-4 and checks in at 275 pounds. Lorenzen, a left-hander, ranks first in the SEC with 317.0 yards passing a contest. He's attempted 292 passes through six games, that's over 100 passes more than any other quarterback in the SEC. Lorenzen has also throw for 1,902 yards and 12 TDs, both rank first in the league.

THE SABAN RECORD

LSU coach **Nick Saban** enters Saturday's contest against Kentucky with a 46-29-1 overall mark. Saban, who is in his seventh season as a collegiate head coach, guided Michigan State to four bowl games in five years. Saban opened his head coaching career at Toledo in 1990, where he guided the Rockets to a 9-2 mark and a share of the Mid-American Conference title.

Saban's string of serving six seasons as a head coach without suffering a losing record ranks as the nation's fourth-longest current streak.

LSU VS. THE SEC EASTERN DIVISION

LSU enters the Kentucky contest with a 1-1 mark vs. the SEC Eastern Division this season. The Tigers are 7-18-1 vs. SEC Eastern Division teams since the league split into divisions in 1992. A win on Saturday vs. Kentucky would give the Tigers a 2-1 mark vs. the SEC Eastern Division this season and it would mark only the third time (in nine years) in which LSU would finish with a winning record vs. the SEC East. LSU went 3-0 vs. the SEC East in 1997 and in 1996, the Tigers posted a 2-1 mark. Of LSU's seven wins vs. Eastern Division teams since 1992, three have come against Kentucky, while two were against Vanderbilt and one each vs. Florida and Tennessee.

RUN DOMANICK, RUN

LSU's sophomore tailback/return specialist **Domanick Davis** has developed into one of the top all-purpose threats in the SEC. Through six games, Davis ranks third in the SEC, and 29th in the nation, with an average of 139.8 all-purpose yards a contest. Against Florida on Saturday, Davis put together another impressive all-purpose yard performance as he racked up 193 yards on 15 attempts. Davis picked up only six yards rushing vs. Florida, but he added 57 yards receiving on two catches and he returned four kickoffs for 94 yards and two punts for 36 yards. The 193 all-purpse yards for Davis marked his second-highest total of the season, trailing only the 226 yards he accumulated against UAB.

DAVEY'S STREAK OF NO INTERCEPTIONS ENDS AT 70

LSU quarterback **Rohan Davey's** streak of consecutive passes without an interception came to an end in the opening drive of the third quarter against Florida. Prior to his interception against Florida, Davey had thrown 70 straight passes without an interception. That streak dated back to his final pass against Houston in the 10th week of the 1999 season. Through six games this season, Davey has completed 38 of 59 passes for 577 yards, 7 TDs and just one interception. Earlier this year, Davey connected on all 11 of his passes in LSU's win over Western Carolina. The 11 of 11 performance set the school-record and also stretched his streak of consecutive completions to 17 straight, which is the third-highest total in SEC history.

TIGERS DEFENSE CONTINUES TO BE TOUGH ON OPENING DRIVES

LSU extended its streak of holding the opposition without points on their opening drive against Florida on Saturday. The streak now stands at 11 straight games without allowing an opponent to score on their opening possession. The streak dates back to last year when Kentucky scored on its first possession on its way to a 31-5 victory over the Tigers in the sixth week of the season.

LSU DEFENSE FINALLY YIELDS FIRST QUARTER TD

The LSU defense finally gave up a first quarter touchdown as Florida scored a TD with 54 seconds left in the opening quarter on Saturday. Florida's first quarter TD was the first allowed by the Tigers since Houston scored in the opening stanza in Week 10 of the 1999 season. Through six games this season, the Tigers have allowed just 13 (3 by UAB, 3 by Tennessee, 7 by Florida) first quarter points, compared to the 33 points in which LSU has put on the board in the first period.

LSU DEFENSE STILL TOPS IN SEC BY ALLOWING JUST 3 RUSHING TDS

Despite giving up a pair of rushing touchdowns vs. Florida, the LSU defense still ranks first in the SEC by allowing only three rushing TDs all season. Through six games, Auburn and Florida are the only teams that have scored a rushing TD against the Tigers. LSU is currently allowing 125.2 yards rushing a contest. Last year, the Tigers allowed over 150 yards rushing a game, last in the SEC, and they also gave up 18 rushing touchdowns, which ranked 11th in the league.

REED HAS ANOTHER SOLID EFFORT VS. FLORIDA

When **Josh Reed** lined up at receiver for the first time against Alabama last season, the Tigers couldn't have possibly imagined what they discovered. Nine games later, Reed has developed into not only LSU's top receiving threat, but one of the most dangerous receivers in the SEC. Over the last nine games, Reed has surpassed the 100-yard barrier four times, including three times this season. Reed led LSU with four receptions for 50 yards vs. Florida on Saturday.

In six games this season, Reed has caught six TD passes, four of which have been 45 yards or longer, which includes a 75-yard TD reception vs. Auburn.

In LSU's three SEC games this season, Reed has caught 19 passes for 363 yards and 5 TDs.

Reed's 6 TDs this season are the most for an LSU player since **Sheddrick Wilson** had six in 1995. Wilson was the only LSU player in the 1990s with more than five TD receptions in a season. The last two LSU players to have more than six TD catches in a season were **Tony Moss** and **Eddie Fuller** with nine each in 1989.

Over the last nine games dating back to 1999, Reed is averaging four catches and nearly 80 yards per game.

BOOTY PASSES ENSMINGER ON LSU'S ALL-TIME PASSING YARDAGE LIST

With 184 yards passing vs. Florida, LSU junior quarterback **Josh Booty** moved past **Steve Ensminger** into eighth place on LSU's all-time passing yardage chart. Since joining the Tigers last year, Booty has already thrown for 2,850 yards. Booty currently stands 328 yards shy of passing **Chad Loup** (3,167 yards) for seventh place.

REED LEADS SEC AND RANKS FIFTH IN NATION IN RECEIVING YARDS/GAME

Despite catching four balls for just 50 yards vs. Florida, LSU sophomore wide out **Josh Reed** maintained his position as the top ranking receiver in the league with 104.8 receiving yards a contest. Reed also ranks fifth nationally. Reed's six receiving TDs ranks second in the league, while his 31 total catches are tied for second. In six

games this season, Reed has caught 31 passes for 629 yards for an average of 20.3 yards per reception.

ROBINSON AND MYERS EXTEND RECEPTION STREAKS

With receptions against Florida, LSU's **Reggie Robinson** and **Jerel Myers** kept their streak of games with at least one catch alive. Robinson has caught at least one pass in his last 23 games, while Myers has caught a pass in 17 straight games, which also represents every game of his career. Robinson's streak of 23 straight games with a receptions is the longest active streak on the team.

BIG PLAY RETURNS TO LSU PASSING ATTACK

LSU's big play passing attack made another appearance on Saturday vs. Florida as **Domanick Davis** turned a simple screen pass into a 54-yard gain for the Tigers. The 54-yard catch-and-run marks the seventh time this season the Tigers have had a pass play cover 45 yards or more. The 54-yard play was also the longest reception of Davis' career.

Through six games this season, the Tigers have recorded nine scoring plays of 30 yards or longer, which includes an 80-yard pass from Josh Booty to Reggie Robinson vs. Western Carolina and a 75-yard Booty to Josh Reed pass vs. Auburn. Those two scoring plays mark the first time since 1994 (Jamie Howard to Brett Bech, 76 and 81 yard passes). that the Tigers have had two scoring passing plays cover at least 75 yards in the same season.

So far this season, nine of LSU's 14 scoring plays through the air have been 30 yards or longer. Last year, the Tigers had just four TD passes of 30 yards or longer, three of which came in the season-finale vs. Arkansas.

LSU MAKING THE MOST OF MAKE-SHIFT O-LINE

LSU's offensive line took another hit against Florida as starting left tackle **Brandon Winey** missed the entire second half of the game with bruised ribs. **Jason Baggett** filled in for Winey in the second half. LSU's second half lineup on the offensive line was without four season-opening projected starters and a fifth player (Louis Williams) was playing a different position (center) from what he started the season at. So far this year, the Tigers have had four starters on the offensive line miss significant time. For the last two games, the Tigers have been without three players on the offensive line that were starters when the season-opened. Senior tackle **Trey Langely** (torn ACL) is out for the season after suffering his injury vs. Houston. Sophomore guard **Bob Wynne** (neck) hasn't played since the Houston game, while senior center **John Compton** (concussion) has missed the last two games. In their absence, **Louis Williams** moved from his normal spot at left guard to start at center and redshirt freshman **Rodney Reed**, a third team guard less than a month ago, started at left guard.

FIRST-TIME STARTERS FOR LSU THIS SEASON

Through six games LSU has used 10 first-time starters this season. Redshirt freshmen **Rodney Reed** was the latest first-time starter for the Tigers when he was inserted as a guard on the offensive line vs. Tennessee. In addition to those 10 first time starters, **Kyle Kipps** started at defensive end vs. Western Carolina, making him both an offensive and defensive starter during his LSU career. Prior to this season, Kipps had started 13 games at tight end, but he had never seen any time on the defensive side of the ball.

LOUIS WILLIAMS IS MR. VERSATILE ON LSU'S O-LINE

When **Louis Williams** lined up as LSU's starting center vs. Tennessee two weeks ago, it marked the fourth different starting position that the senior has played during his career. Williams, who has started 28 straight games for the Tigers, has started at the following positions during his career: center (2 starts), left tackle (22 starts), left guard (2 starts) and right guard (2 starts).

DOMANICK DAVIS MOVES UP KICKOFF RETURN CHARTS

With 94 yards in kickoff returns vs. Florida, sophomore **Domanick Davis** jumped all the way from ninth place to fourth place on LSU's all-time list for kickoff return yardage. In two years with the Tigers, Davis has returned 38 kicks for 917 yards (24.1 average).

Davis needs just 83 yards to become only the fourth player in school history to have 1,000 kickoff return yards in a career and he needs 150 yards to move past **Sammy Martin** (1,066 yards) into third place. holds the school-record with 1,780 yards on 70 returns. Last year, Davis set the school's single-season kickoff return record with 618 yards on 25 returns.

CORBELLO ADDS ANOTHER 40-YARD FIELD GOAL TO HIS LIST

John Corbello's 40-yard field goal against Florida marked the second time in two weeks in which the sophomore kicker has converted a field goal of at least 40 yards. Last week vs. Tennessee, Corbello kicked a career-long 47 yard field goal in the first quarter.

The 47-yarder vs. Tennessee was the longest field goal by an LSU kicker since **Wade Richey** hit a school-record 54-yarder against Kentucky in 1996.

TURNOVERS HAVE BEEN A PROBLEM IN THREE LOSSES

In LSU's three losses this season, turnovers have been one of the problems for the Tigers as they have turned the ball over seven more times (-7) than their opponent in games in which they have lost. On the other hand, LSU is +3 in the turnover category in games in which they have won. In LSU's last two losses (UAB and Florida), the Tigers turned the ball over 10 times, compared to just 3 turnovers for the opponent.

WILLIAMS EXTENDS STARTING STREAK

LSU senior offensive guard **Louis Williams** made his 28th straight start on Saturday. Williams, who has been in the Tiger starting lineup since the 1998 season-opener against Arkansas State, has the longest current starting string of any LSU player. Other starting streaks of significance are senior cornerback **Fred Booker** (23 straight), and sophomore split end **Jerel Myers** and junior free safety **Ryan Clark** each with 17 consecutive starts. Sophomore linebacker **Trev Faulk** has started 14 straight games.

Kentucky's Dusty Bonner hit on 26 of 41 passes for 294 yards as the Wildcats cruised past LSU, 31-5, in Lexington. LSU's offense did not score a touchdown for the first time all year as the Tigers' only scoring came on a 43-yard field goal by John Corbello in the first quarter. Kentucky opened the scoring in the first quarter when Kendrick Shanklin returned a punt 56 yards for a score just two minutes into the contest. Corbello cut the margin to 7-3 with his 43-yard field goal. The Wildcats stretched the margin to 14-3 on a 5-yard run by Derek Homer with 3:41 left in the first quarter. LSU's final points came with 51 seconds left in the first half when Jarvis Green's block of an Andy Smith punt went out of the endzone. Kentucky led 17-5 at halftime. The Wildcats put the game out of reach late in the third quarter on a 34-yard TD run by Anthony White. Rondell Mealey led LSU with 84 yards rushing, while Josh Booty connected on 12 of 33 passes for 154 yards and three interceptions.

LSU RIPS W. CAROLINA, 58-0, IN SABAN ERA OPENER

The Tiger offense sizzled, amassing 507 yards of offense in the opening 30 minutes while building a 37-0 lead before ultimately defeating Western Carolina 58-0 before an LSU record 87,188 fans last Saturday. Josh Booty threw for a career high 291 yards and a pair of touchdown passes, while Rohan Davey was a perfect 11-for-11 for 194 yards and three TD strikes as LSU wracked up a school record 485 yards passing. The Tigers wound up with 680 yards of total offense, the second highest total in LSU history and the most since 1977. Booty hit Reggie Robinson over the middle for an 80-yard strike on the third play of the game and the Tigers never looked back. Jerel Myers caught six balls for 117 yards and a pair of touchdowns, while Josh Reed hauled in five balls for 137 yards.

TIGER MISCUES LEAD TO 41-9 LOSS AT FLORIDA

There has been one common theme in LSU's roller-coaster start this season - when the Tigers turn the ball over they don't win. The Tigers turned the ball over four times and got none in return last weekend en route to a 41-9 loss at Florida. Gator quarterback Rex Grossman completed 18-of-28 passes for 276 yards and 3 TD passes, all to Jabar Gaffney, while Robert Gillespie came up with 120 yards rushing on 19 carries to pace Florida. Grossman hit Gaffney with a pair of first half TDs to help the Gators to a 17-3 lead. The two hooked up for the third time less than five minutes into the third quarter on a 59-yard strike to move the lead to 24-3. The Tigers cut the lead to 27-9 on a 5-yard TD pass from **Josh Booty** to **Robert Royal** before Florida added two late touchdowns for the final margin of victory.
