## Tigers Battle Arkansas For SEC Western Division Title and The Boot

LSU will go after a berth in the SEC Championship game for the second time in three years on Friday as the third-ranked Tigers host Arkansas at 1:30 p.m. in Tiger Stadium. The game will be televised to a national audience by CBS. LSU (10-1 overall, 6-1 SEC) enters the contest coming off a 17-14 win over 15th-ranked Ole Miss last week, while Arkansas (8-3, 4-3) won its fourth consecutive game with a 52-6 victory over Mississippi State. Also at stake on Friday will be "The Boot", a 24-karat gold trophy in the shape of the states of Louisiana and Arkansas. The Razorbacks currently have ownership of "The Boot" after last year's 21-20 win over LSU. This will be the eighth year in which LSU and Arkansas have battled for "The Boot". Friday's game will match the nation's best team against the run in LSU against the Razorbacks, who rank fifth in the country in rushing offense. LSU enters the game allowing only 57.7 yards rushing per game, while Arkansas is averaging 240.4 yards rushing a contest. Overall, LSU ranks first in the nation in scoring defense, allowing only 9.4 points per game. Arkansas leads the SEC in scoring with 35.0 points per game, while the Tigers are third in the conference with 33.2 points a contest. LSU QB **Matt Mauck** ranks second in the SEC in pass efficiency with a 150.0 rating, while WR **Michael Clayton** leads the SEC in both receptions (66) and yards (918), while WR **Devery Henderson** ranks first in the conference in TD receptions (10). Friday's game will also serve as "Senior Day" for the Tigers as LSU will honor its 21 seniors in a pre-game ceremony.

## LSU Defense Shuts Down Ole Miss and Eli in 17-14 Win

LSU's defense lived up to its billing as one of the nation's best as the Tigers shutdown Eli Manning and Ole Miss in a 17-14 win over the 15th-ranked Rebels in Oxford. For the game, the Tigers held the Rebels to only 227 yards of offense and 22 points below their season average. Ole Miss' defense struck first in the contest, picking off a **Matt Mauck** pass on LSU's first play from scrimmage and returning it 6-yards for a TD and a 7-0 lead just one minute into the contest. LSU pulled to within 7-3 on a 45-yard field goal by **Chris Jackson** midway through the first quarter and then took the lead for good on a 9-yard pass from Mauck to **Michael Clayton** just before halftime. The Tigers stretched the lead to 17-7 early in the fourth quarter on a 53-yard TD pass from Mauck to **Devery Henderson**. Manning then directed the Rebels on a 9-play, 76-yard scoring drive culminating on a 10-yard TD pass from Brandon Jacobs to pull to within 17-14 with 10:51 left. After Ole Miss missed a 36-yard field goal that would have tied the game with 4:15 left, the Tigers went three-and-out on their next possession, turning the ball back over to Rebels. The Tiger defense came up big again, forcing three incomplete passes by Manning before a blitz tripped up the Rebel quarterback on fourth-and-10, turning the ball back over to the Tigers with 1:50 to go. The Tigers ran the clock down to nine seconds before giving Ole Miss one more shot. Manning's desperation pass was knocked down at midfield as time expired.

# Nick Saban

HEAD COACH • FOURTH YEAR

For years outsiders viewed the LSU football program as an unpolished gem, a potential giant waiting to be reborn in the world of college football. With the wealth of resources LSU has to offer, its tradition and the available talent within the state of Louisiana, all the program needed was the right leader to lead it. Entering his fourth year as head coach of the Tigers, Nick Saban is that leader.

Since taking over in Baton Rouge in 2000, Saban has transformed the LSU football program into one that wins championships, while graduating players at the same time.

Equipped with a plan that gives his players the best chance to be successful on the field as well as in the classroom, Saban's impact on the program has been immediate and it's been powerful.

In just three years as LSU's head coach, Saban's on-field success has been nothing short of remarkable, as he's guided the Tigers to 26 victories, a pair of bowl wins, including one in the Bowl Championship Series, and the 2001 Southeastern Conference title. The Tigers have also played in back-to-back New Year's Day bowls for the first time since the 1960s.

On top of LSU's success on the gridiron, the Tigers are being recognized for their efforts in the classroom. Currently, all 22 of the Tiger seniors from the 2002 team are on pace to graduate within the next 12 months, while Rodney Reed earned First Team Academic All-America honors and Bradie James was awarded an \$18,000 post-graduate scholarship from the National Football Foundation last year.

Off the field, Saban and his players are active in the community, promoting goodwill by participating in such things as community service projects and visiting hospitals and schools in the Baton Rouge area on a regular basis. Saban has also worn the hat of fundraiser during his stay in Baton Rouge as he spearheaded an effort that raised more than \$15 million for a state-of-the-art academic center for student-athletes. The new Cox Communications Academic Center for Student-Athletes is part of Saban's plan to give his players the best opportunity to be successful when they finish their football careers. The center, which spans 54,000 square feet, is the best of its kind and features 100 computers, a 1,000-seat auditorium, a library and a communications center for training student-athletes.

Saban became the 31st head coach of the LSU Tigers on November 30, 1999, after five years as head coach at Michigan State.

He didn't waste anytime making his impact felt as he guided a team coming off back-to-back losing seasons to an 8-4 mark and a win over 15th-ranked Georgia Tech in the Peach Bowl in 2000 to rekindle the fire of a proud football tradition in Baton Rouge.

A year later in 2001, Saban guided the Tigers to their first outright SEC title since 1986 with a 31-20 win over second-ranked Tennessee in the SEC Championship game. LSU followed that with a 47-34 victory over Illinois in the Sugar Bowl to cap a 10-3 season for the Tigers.

Last year, Saban guided the Tigers to an 8-5 overall mark and a share of the SEC Western Division title. The Tigers also played in a New Year's Day bowl game for the second consecutive year, a first for LSU since the 1960's, with an appearance in the Cotton Bowl.

Prior to LSU, Saban spent five years as the head coach at Michigan State, where he built the Spartans into a perennial Big Ten contender after going to four bowl games in five seasons.

## This Week

LSU returns to action on Friday at 1:30 p.m. against Arkansas in Tiger Stadium in the regular-season finale for both teams. The game will be televised to a national audience by CBS. LSU at 10-1 overall has a shot to become just the second team in school history to win 11 games in a single-season (the 1958 team posted an 11-0 mark en route to the national title). In addition, a win over Arkansas will put the Tigers in the SEC Championship game for the second time in three years. LSU's 10-1 mark is the best for the Tigers through 11 games since the 1961 squad posted a 10-1 mark. LSU's 6-1 SEC record is the best for the Tigers since the 1988 team recorded a 6-1 league record. LSU has never won seven conference games in a single-season. Arkansas, winners of four straight, brings an 8-3 overall mark and a 4-3 league record into Friday's contest.

## In The Polls

The Tigers remained No. 3 in the nation in both the Associated Press and USA Today/ESPN Coaches poll on Sunday. The Tigers have been ranked No. 3 in the nation for three straight weeks, the highest LSU has been ranked for three consecutive weeks since 1959 when the Tigers held down the No. 3 spot in the AP poll for the final three ranking periods. LSU is currently ranked among the top 10 in the AP poll for the 10th straight week, while they are in the USA Today/ESPN Coaches poll top 10 for the 11th straight week. The BCS standings are due out on Monday night and the Tigers are expected to inch up a spot to No. 3 after spending the last two weeks at No. 4 in poll. The Tigers were ranked No. 12 in the first BCS standings, followed by two weeks at No. 7.

## LSU and Arkansas Battle For "The Boot"

For the eighth consecutive year, LSU and Arkansas will battle for "The Boot", a 24-karat gold trophy in the shape of the states of Arkansas and Louisiana that resembles a boot. LSU has won the trophy four times - 1996, 1997, 1999 and 2001 - while Arkansas has claimed the trophy three times 1998, 2000 and 2002. "The Boot" will sit on the Arkansas sidelines during Friday's game and will be presented to the winning team following the contest.

## Tigers Look For Berth in SEC Title Game For Second Time In Three Years

For the third time in four years under **Nick Saban**, LSU heads into the final regular season game of the year with a chance to advance to the SEC championship game. A win over Arkansas on Friday puts the Tigers in the league's title game for the second time in three years. LSU beat Auburn, 27-14, in 2001 to advance to the league title game, where the Tigers upset second-ranked Tennessee, 31-20. Last year, LSU appeared to be headed for the championship game before a last-minute Arkansas rally put the Hogs in Atlanta for the title game with their 21-20 victory over the Tigers.

## Win One For JB

The LSU Athletic Department suffered a tremendous loss on Oct. 27 as longtime equipment manager **Jeff Boss** passed away after a 10-month battle with brain cancer. Boss, who was 54-years old, is survived by his wife, Karen, and a 13-year old daughter, B.J. Over 500 people attended the memorial service for Boss on Oct. 29, including former LSU football coaches Jerry Stovall, Bill Arnsperger and Mike Archer, along with current head coach **Nick Saban**. Boss had served as LSU's equipment manager since 1980. The LSU football team has dedicated the 2003 season to Boss. Several members of the team, along with coach Saban, presented coach Boss with a game ball from the Louisiana-Monroe game on Sept. 12 at his home. The ULM game was the first time in 24 years that coach Boss was not on the sidelines for an LSU contest. Then, on Sept. 29, LSU named its football locker room in Boss' honor with a formal ceremony that saw dozens of former Tiger football players, covering three decades, attend. The "JB" will remain on the helmets and the jerseys for the remainder of the season.

LSU will honor 21 seniors on Friday afternoon prior to the Arkansas game. This year's senior class has combined to post a four-year mark of 36-13, which includes a 21-10 record in SEC games. ## Lavalais Named SEC Player of the Week

For the second time this year, LSU defensive tackle **Chad Lavalais** has been named the SEC Defensive Player of the Week. Lavalais won the honor after posting 5 tackles, including 2 for losses, in LSU's 17-14 win over Ole Miss on Saturday. Lavalais also added a pair of quarterback hurries and a PBU in leading the Tiger defense that held the Rebels to only 7 offensive points and just 227 yards of offense. The Tiger defense also held Ole Miss to only 27 yards rushing in the game. Lavalais, a finalist for the Nagurski Award, was also named SEC Player of the Week following LSU's win over Auburn in late October.

## LSU's Been Good On "Senior Day"

LSU enters Friday game with Arkansas riding a streak of four straight wins on "Senior Day" as the Tigers have won their regular season home finale dating back to 1999. Last year, LSU beat Ole Miss, 14-13, on "Senior Day". Dating back to 1995, LSU has posted wins on "Senior Day" in seven of the last eight years with the only loss coming to Alabama in 1996.

## LSU Goes After Win No. 11 Overall And No. 7 In SEC Action

On Friday, LSU has a chance to do something that only one other team in school history has ever done and that's win 11 games in a single-season. In addition, a win over Arkansas will give the Tigers their seventh SEC win, which would mark the most by an LSU team in conference play. LSU's only 11-win season came in 1958 when the Tigers posted an 11-0 mark en route to the school's only national title in football. LSU has won 10 games or more in a season seven times in its history.

## Saban Joins Pepsodent Paul On Short List At LSU

By winning his 10th game of the season on Saturday vs. Ole Miss, LSU coach **Nick Saban** joined former Tiger coach Paul Dietzel as the only two coaches in school history to produce more than one 10-win season. Saban has now done it twice, going 10-3 in 2001 and standing at 10-1 this season. Dietzel guided the Tigers to an 11-0 mark in 1958 and then followed that with a 10-1 record in 1961, his last season at LSU. Other 10-win coaches at LSU include Edgard Wingard (10-0 in 1908); Mike Archer (10-1-1 in 1987); and Gerry DiNardo (10-2 in 1996).

## Tigers Are 5-1 In Games When Ranked No. 3; Lone Loss To Ole Miss in '60

For the third straight week, LSU will play a game as the nation's No. 3 ranked team. In its history, LSU is 5-1 in games as the third-ranked team in the nation. The only loss during that 6-game span came to Ole Miss in the 1960 Sugar Bowl by a 21-0 count. The Tigers were 2-1 as the No. 3 ranked team in 1959 and they were 1-0 as the nation's third-ranked squad in 1958.

## About Arkansas

The Razorbacks enter the game with an 8-3 overall mark and 4-3 league record ... Arkansas has won four straight since going 4-3 over its first seven games ... Arkansas is coming off a 52-6 win over Mississippi State on Saturday and over its last three games, the Razorbacks have outscored their opponents by a 128 to 32 margin ... The Razorbacks are coached by Houston Nutt, who has a 83-49 mark in six seasons with Arkansas ... The Razorbacks have one of the league's top rushers in Cedric Cobbs, who ranks third in the SEC with 1,010 yards on 179 carries and they also possess one of the top offensive linemen in the nation in Shawn Andrews ... The Razorbacks rank first in the SEC in rushing offense (240.4 yards per game) and they are first in the league in scoring with 35.0 points per contest.

## The LSU Injury Report

The Tigers came out of the Ole Miss game in good shape as no significant injuries were reported. For the second straight game the Tigers were back at full strength in the offensive backfield with the return of **Shyrone Carey** (knee). While he didn't see any action, OG **Nate Livings** (knee) returned to practice last week and could have played vs. Ole Miss. Livings has not seen any game action since the first half of the South Carolina contest. TE **Demetri Robinson** has missed LSU's last four games with a groin injury. Special teams contributor **Gino Giambelluca** (broken hand) played for the first time since the Louisiana Tech game against Ole Miss.

## Tigers Back On CBS

LSU will make its fourth appearance on CBS this year when they face Arkansas on Saturday. LSU is 2-1 on CBS this year and the Tigers are 16-14-1 all-time on the network, which includes a 6-4 record under **Nick Saban**. Last week, LSU beat Ole Miss, 17-14, on CBS with other games on the network this season being a 17-10 win over Georgia and a 19-7 loss to Florida. Friday's game will mark the eighth time that LSU and Arkansas will meet on CBS since the Razorbacks joined the SEC in 1992. Over those eight games on CBS, LSU has won four with three of those coming in Tiger Stadium.

## That Tiger Stadium Mystique Is Back Under Saban

LSU coach **Nick Saban** has restored the mystique that has made Tiger Stadium one of the toughest places for opposing teams to play. In his fourth season at LSU, Saban has put together a 22-5 mark at home, which includes an 11-4 record in SEC games. LSU is 5-1 at home this year after going 6-1 in Tiger Stadium last season. Under Saban, the Tigers are 6-2 vs. Top 25 teams in Tiger Stadium. LSU's 18 wins over Saban's first three years in Baton Rouge is the most over a three-year period for LSU in Tiger Stadium since the Tigers won 18 home games from 1972-74.

## Taking Notes On The Tigers Under Saban

Here is a look at some notable LSU trends during its first 49 games under **Nick Saban** ... LSU is 31-2 when leading at halftime and 29-2 when leading after three quarters ... The Tigers are 33-3 when scoring 20 or more points and 32-0 when scoring 25 or more points ... On the other hand, LSU is 3-10 when failing to reach the 20-point mark ... LSU is 9-2 in games decided by 7 points or less and 4-1 in games decided by 3 points or less ... LSU is 23-1 when holding opponents to fewer than 100 yards rushing and the Tigers are 16-0 when having a 100-yard rusher.

## Just How Loud Is Tiger Stadium?

Two students from LSU's Department of Astronomy and Physics were on the field for the Auburn game. The students registered a reading of 117 decibels, which matched the highest reading ever recorded in Tiger Stadium. A reading of 117 decibels was first recorded in LSU's game against Alabama in 1996. The reading of 117 decibels vs. Auburn matched that of the 1996 reading and can be compared to that of a rock concert. It is believed that LSU's game against Auburn in 1988 had a higher decibel reading, the only official reading from that game came on the seismograph machine across campus in the Geology Department.

## Mauck Is 15-2 As LSU's Starting QB; One Shy Of Tying Best Start in LSU History By A QB

With a win over Ole Miss, **Matt Mauck** ran his record to 15-2 as LSU's starting quarterback. The 15-2 start by Mauck as the Tiger signal-caller is one shy of tying Herb Tyler for the best start in school history. Tyler won 16 of his first 18 starts for the Tigers and finished his career with a 27-11 mark. Mauck had a 10-game winning streak as a starter snapped vs. Florida, which was the first loss for the junior since his first career start against Virginia Tech to open the 2002 season. Mauck's 10-1 start was the best by an LSU QB since Tyler won 10 of his first 11, including his first eight, as a starter from 1995-96. In addition, Mauck has played in 20 games in his LSU career and the Tigers are 17-3 in those contests.

## Odds and Ends About The Tiger Defense

Here's a few quick notes about the LSU defense, a unit that is ranked first in the nation in scoring and second against the run ... The defensive leader is DT **Chad Lavalais**, who spent a year serving as a guard in a prison before enrolling in school ... The team's best cover corner **Corey Webster** is a converted wide receiver ... SS **Jack Hunt** spent his first two years with the Tigers on the offensive side of the ball as a wide receiver ... DE **Marcus Spears** could have gone anywhere in the country to play basketball ... Spears also played his first season with the Tigers as a tight end before moving to defense on a full-time basis as a sophomore ... LB **Eric Alexander** played as a defensive back and a special teams player for the first three years of his college career ... CB **Travis Daniels** burnt his redshirt season after injuries forced him into the fourth quarter of the SEC Championship game in 2001 ... Daniels made the most of his chance, breaking up a pass in the endzone ... FS **LaRon Landry** is a true freshman and he leads the Tigers with 58 tackles.

## LSU "D" Rated No. 1 In Nation in Scoring Defense And vs. The Run

The Tiger defense continues to be not only one of the best in the SEC, but one of the top units in the nation. LSU enters the Arkansas contest with the nation's No. 1 rated scoring defense (9.4 points per game) and the nation's top defense against the run (57.7 yards per game). In 11 games this season, the Tigers have allowed only one team to reach the 100-yard mark in rushing yards and that came against Louisiana Tech (121 yards on 25 carries). The Tigers also rank third in the nation in total defense, allowing 256.7 yards per game (57.7 rushing, 199.0 passing). LSU's defense has yielded only 11 touchdowns all season - 2 rushing, 9 passing. Through 11 games, of the 103 points scored against LSU, only 26 have come in the first half. In addition, LSU is the only team in the nation that has yet to allow 20 or more points in a game. LSU's streak of 11 straight games of holding its opponent to less than 20 points ties the mark set by LSU teams in 1958, '60, '61 and '62.

## Mauck Sets LSU Single-Season TD Pass Mark With 23

With a pair of TD passes vs. Ole Miss, LSU QB **Matt Mauck** broke Tommy Hodson's record for touchdown passes in a single-season with 23. Hodson held the mark of 22 TD passes since 1989. Mauck, who has thrown 11 TD passes over LSU's last five games, has thrown at least one TD pass in 10 of LSU's 11 games this year. For his career, Mauck has tossed 32 touchdown passes, which ranks as the fourth-best total in school history. In 17 games as LSU's starting quarterback, Mauck has tossed at least 3 TD passes in a game 6 times, which includes 4 TD passes twice. Hodson holds the LSU career mark with 69 TD passes.

## Mauck Has Tiger Offense Running On All Cylinders Over Last 5 Games

Since the loss to Florida, LSU QB **Matt Mauck** has had the Tiger offense clicking as the junior has completed 99 of 143 passes (69.2 percent) for 1,174 yards and 13 touchdowns. The Tigers are also averaging averaging 465.5 yards of offense and 31 points in wins over South Carolina, Auburn, Louisiana Tech, Alabama, and Ole Miss. The Tigers are also rushing for 214.4 yards over the 5-game stretch with Justin Vincent (439 yards, 3 TDs) and **Alley Broussard** (328 yards, 3 TDs) leading the way. Also during LSU's current 5-game winning streak, the Tigers have converted on 33 of 72 3rd-down opportunities.

## Lavalais Named Finalist For Nagurski Award, Leads Tigers With 6 Sacks and 14 TFLs

DT **Chad Lavalais**, the SEC Defensive Player of the Week after LSU's win over Auburn, is one of five finalists for the Bronko Nagurski Award, which is presented annually to college football's outstanding defensive player by the Football Writers Association of America and the Charlotte Touchdown Club. Lavalais currently leads the Tigers with 6 sacks and 14 tackles for losses this season. Lavalais, a former prison guard, has 48 tackles and 21 quarterback hurries this year. For his career, Lavalais has 10 sacks and 30 tackles for losses.

## LSU Starting Defense Has Yet To Allow A Rushing TD

LSU's starting defense enters the Arkansas game riding a streak of 11 straight games without allowing a rushing touchdown. LSU has allowed 2 rushing TDs this season, but those came in the fourth quarter of wins over Louisiana-Monroe and Arizona, games in which the starting lineup had long left the field.

## Tiger Defense Continues To Be Stingy

Through 44 quarters this season, LSU's defense has held the opponent out of the endzone in 30 of those. Florida became the first team since Kentucky last year to score an offensive TD in the first quarter against the Tigers. Prior to the Florida game, LSU had allowed only 3 first half points all season, that being a field goal vs. Georgia in Week 4. In all, the Tigers have held all 11 of its opponents this year to less than 20 points, something that hasn't been done at LSU since 1962 when the Tigers held all 11 of their opponents to less than 20 points.

## LSU's Rodney Reed Named National Scholar-Athlete

**Rodney Reed**, who is one of the most decorated student-athletes in LSU football history, added another honor to an already impressive resume as he was selected a National Scholar-Athlete by the National Football Foundation. The award is one of the top academic honors available to a college football player and it carries with it an \$18,000 post-graduate scholarship. Reed is one of only 15 football players covering all NCAA divisions as well as NAIA to receive the award. He also becomes the second National Scholar-Athlete in as many years for LSU, joining Bradie James, who was honored last year. Past LSU recipients of the award include: offensive lineman Robert Dugas (1977), linebacker Nacho Albergamo (1987), quarterback Sol Graves (1990) and punter Chad Kessler (1997). "This is a tremendous honor and something that I am extremely proud of," Reed said. "It is quite an accomplishment that two student-athletes from the same school have won the award two years in a row. It's good to get recognized and it speaks well for the program. I think this also speaks highly for the academic center and the way Coach Saban stresses academics and not just football."

## Three Tigers Named To Academic District VI Team

LSU QB **Matt Mauck**, OT **Rodney Reed** and SS **Jack Hunt** have all been named to the First Team Academic District VI squad, the College Sports Information Directors of America announced. District VI is comprised of universities in the states of Louisiana, Texas, New Mexico, Oklahoma, Arkansas and Mississippi. To be eligible for the team, players must have at least a 3.2 overall grade point average. Mauck, a pre-dentistry major, has a 3.72 grade point average. Reed, a First Team Academic All-America in 2002, earned a spot on the all-district team for the third straight year. Reed graduated in May with a 3.9 grade point average in accounting. He is currently pursuing a Master's degree in accounting. Hunt carries a 3.39 grade point average in chemistry. All three Tigers are now eligible for the Academic All-America team, which will be announced later this month.

## Clayton Named One Of 10 Semifinalists For Biletnikoff Award

LSU WR **Michael Clayton** is one of 10 players from across the nation named as a semifinalist for the Biletnikoff Award. Clayton, a junior from Baton Rouge, is the only player from the Southeastern Conference on the list. Clayton currently leads the SEC with 66 receptions for 918 yards and 8 TDs. Clayton is the only player in LSU history to have at least 700 yards receiving in three consecutive seasons. Clayton has also caught at least one pass in all 37 games of his collegiate career. Former LSU standout Josh Reed won the Biletnikoff Award in 2001.

LSU CB **Corey Webster** has been named one of 12 semifinalists for the Jim Thorpe Award, which goes annually to college football's best defensive back. Webster, a junior from Vacherie, La., has started all 11 games at cornerback for the Tigers and he's recorded 42 tackles, 4 interceptions and 21 passes defended. He's also forced a fumble and had three quarterback hurries. Webster, a converted wide receiver, ranks among LSU's all-time leaders with 11 career pass interceptions, which includes tying a school-record with three in one game last year against Florida.

## LSU Starts 6-1 in SEC Action For First Time Since 1988

LSU's win over Ole Miss moved the Tigers to 6-1 in league play, marking the best start in conference action since 1988. LSU tied for the SEC title in 1988 with a 6-1 league mark. LSU has never won seven SEC games in a single-season.

## Jones Named Named Semifinalists For Ray Guy Award

LSU P **Donnie Jones** is one of 10 players from across the country named to the list of semifinalists for the Ray Guy Award, the Greater Augusta Sports Council announced. Jones, a Second Team All-Southeastern Conference pick in 2002, is currently averaging 43.1 yards on 49 punts. LSU's net punting average of 40.3 ranks second in the SEC and 10th in the nation. Of his 49 punts, Jones has had 17 downed inside the 20-yard line. Jones, a Baton Rouge native, currently holds the LSU career record for punts with 217 and punting yards with 9,152 and he ranks second in school history with a 42.2 punting average.

## Tiger Defense Has 4 Scores Of Its Own

In addition to being difficult to score on, the Tiger defense has also created points of their own this season, scoring four touchdowns in 2003. The Tigers have returned three interceptions for touchdowns - **Jack Hunt** vs. UL-Monroe and Louisiana Tech and **Travis Daniels** vs. Mississippi State and they have returned one fumble for a score - **Jason LeDoux** vs. South Carolina. The four defensive TDs are the most by an LSU team since the 1991 team scored four touchdowns.

## Tiger Defense Still Tough To Score On

In 11 games this year, LSU has yielded only 103 points to its opponents. The 103 points is the fewest by an LSU team since the 1970 squad held its first 11 opponents to 96 points.

## Clayton, Henderson, and Green... LSU's Triple-Threat Receiving Corps

One thing is for certain and that is if defenses key too much on **Michael Clayton**, then **Devery Henderson** will make them pay. Focus on Henderson, then Clayton takes over. Concentrate on Henderson and Clayton and then **Skyler Green** will take over. At least that's how it's been over the first 10 games of the year. Clayton, Henderson and Green have combined for 151 catches for 2,147 yards and 18 TDs for the Tigers. Clayton has gone over 100-yards four times this year, while Henderson has done it three times and Green once. Clayton ranks first in the SEC in both receptions per game (6.0) and yards per game (83.5). Henderson is seventh in receptions with 4.2 a contest and Green eighth with 3.6 a game. Henderson's 69.8 yards per game ranks fourth in the league. Clayton leads the team with 66 receptions for 918 yards and 8 TDs, with Henderson second with 46 receptions for 768 yards and a SEC-best 10 scores and Green next with 39 catches for 457 yards and 4 TDs.

## Vincent and Broussard Join Hilliard and James From '82 Tigers On Elite List

True freshmen **Justin Vincent** and **Alley Broussard** have each gone over 100-yards rushing twice this season. Vincent had 127 yards vs. Auburn and 105 yards vs. Ole Miss. Broussard rushed for 108 yards vs. South Carolina and 106 vs. Louisiana Tech. Vincent and Broussard are the first true freshman running backs at LSU to rush for 100 yards in a single-game in the same season since Dalton Hilliard and Garry James did it in 1982. Hilliard rushed for 100 yards five times as a true freshman in 1982, while James did it three times. In LSU's last 5 games, all starts by Vincent, he's rushed for 439 yards and 3 TDs on 72 carries. Vincent leads all Tigers in rushing with 571 yards and 5 TDs on 102 carries. Broussard has accounted for 336 yards and 4 TDs on 70 attempts, while LSU's third true freshman running back Barrington Edwards has 155 yards rushing on 32 attempts.

## LSU's Held 10 of 11 Opponents To Less Than 100 Yards Rushing

Louisiana Tech became the first team this year to crack the 100-yard mark vs. LSU this season as the Bulldogs rushed for 121 yards against LSU on Nov. 1. Prior to that, LSU had held its first eight opponents to fewer than 100 yards rushing, which included limiting Auburn to 50 yards rushing and holding South Carolina to zero rushing yards. Tech became the first team since Texas in last year's Cotton Bowl to rush for 100 yards in a game against LSU. In addition, Tech running back Ryan Moats had 124 yards rushing to become the first player since Arkansas' Fred Talley (118 yards) to rush for 100 yards in a game against LSU as he did it in Week 12 last year. Florida rushed for 81 yards against LSU on Oct. 11 to become the first team to beat LSU under Nick Saban despite gaining less than 100 yards rushing. The Tigers are 22-1 under Saban when holding their opponent to less than 100 yards rushing. LSU's current stretch of holding 10 of its first 11 opponents



to under 100 yards rushing is the best stretch by an LSU defense since the 1970 squad held 10 of its 11 regular-season opponents to less than 100 yards. The only team during the regular-season that gained 100 or more yards against the Tigers in 1970 was Baylor, who had 104 yards in Week three. The 1970 LSU team still holds the school record for rushing defense (52.2) and rushing yards allowed for a season (574). To date, LSU has allowed 635 yards on 302 carries.

### Tiger Defense Continues To Be Spectacular In All Phases

Whether it's against the pass or the run, the Tiger defense has been one of the best all-around units in the SEC. LSU is ranked either Nos. 1 or 2 in the SEC in eight of 11 categories, including leading the conference in six categories. LSU leads the league and the nation in scoring defense (9.4 points per game) and rushing defense (57.7 yards per game), the Tigers are first in the SEC in pass efficiency defense (94.2 rating), sacks (33), opponent 1st downs (151), and opponents' 3rd-down conversion percentage (24.1). LSU ranks second in the SEC and third in the nation in total defense, allowing only 256.7 yards per game.

### Open Wide

QB **Matt Mauck** spent Monday, Oct. 6 taking the Dental Admissions Test. Mauck, who also considered pursuing a career in medicine, has now opted to becoming a dentist. Mauck, who carries a 3.8 grade point average, will graduate in December with a degree in kinesiology.

### LSU's Been Good At Getting The Defense Off The Field On 3rd Down

One of the obvious keys to LSU's success has been their ability to get the defense off the field on third-down situations. Through 11 games, the Tigers lead the SEC with a 24.1 third-down conversion percentage by their defense. In 166 third-down attempts this season, LSU has allowed its opponent a first down on 40 of those tries. Florida is the only team to have a better third-down percentage than LSU in a game as the Gators converted 7 of 18 attempts, compared to just 3 of 12 for the Tigers. The Tigers are even better on third-down once the opponent crosses midfield as LSU has allowed only 9 of 51 third-down attempts this season for 17.6 percent.

### Skyler Makes Most of Punt Returns; Leads Nation For 4th Week

For the fifth week straight week, **Skyler Green** stands atop the nation in punt returns, averaging 22.2 yards on 17 returns. Green had 2 punt returns for 22 yards vs. Ole Miss, running his season total to 378 yards on 17 returns. The 378 yards ranks as the fifth-highest single-season total in LSU history. To date, Green has returned two punts for TDs, including an 80-yarder against Florida. On the first punt return of his career against Arizona, Green raced 62 yards for a touchdown. Green is the first player since Todd Kinchen in 1991 to have two punt returns for TDs in the same season and he's one shy of tying the school mark of 3 set by Pinky Rohm in 1937.

### Mauck Comes Out Firing vs. Louisiana Tech

**Matt Mauck** tied a school-record by completing his first 14 passes in LSU's 49-10 win over Louisiana Tech. The 14 straight completions tied the mark set by Chad Loup vs. Arkansas in 1993. In addition, Mauck finished the game 18 of 20 for 90.0 percent, which set the school-record for completion percentage in a single-game with a minimum of 20 passes. Mauck also set a career-best for passing yards with 311 and he tied a career-best with 4 TDs, all coming in the first half.

### Clayton Joins The 2,000-Yard Club; Ties Davis For LSU Career TD Mark

WR **Michael Clayton** tied Wendell Davis for career TD receptions at LSU with his touchdown grab vs. Ole Miss. For his career, Clayton has 19 TD passes, including 8 this year. Clayton, who is only the fifth player in school history to have at least 2,000-yards receiving in a career, currently ranks second in school history with 170 receptions and he's fourth in receiving yards with 2,421.

Clayton is also seventh in school history in 100-yard games with seven. With 66 catches for 918 yards this year, Clayton is the first player in LSU history with at least 700 yards receiving in three consecutive seasons. Clayton had 754 yards on 47 catches as a freshman and he followed that with 749 yards on 57 catches last year.

### Henderson Closing In On Single-Season Receiving TD Record

LSU WR **Devery Henderson** is within 1 TD of tying the school-record for receiving touchdowns in a season. Currently, Henderson has 10 TD receptions this year, one shy of the mark of 11 held by Wendell Davis in 1986. For his career, Henderson has 18 TDs, which ranks as the third-highest total in school history. Davis (1984-87), along with **Michael Clayton**, hold the mark with 19. Henderson's 10 TD receptions this year leads the SEC.

### Donnie Jones Adds His Name To Another LSU Punting Record

**Donnie Jones** now holds two of LSU's three career punting records as the Baton Rouge native holds the school mark in punting yards (9,152) and total punts (217). In four years with the Tigers, Jones has a total of

9,152 punting yards, which broke the mark of 7,976 held by Chad Kessler (1994-967). In LSU's game against Mississippi State, Jones broke Kessler's career punts mark. For his career, Jones has punted 217 times for an average of 42.2 yards per kick, a figure that ranks second to Kessler's 42.9 career average.

## Throwing To The Tight Ends

LSU's tight ends aren't just for blocking as the rotation of **Eric Edwards**, **David Jones**, **Keith Zinger** and **Demetri Robinson** have caught their share of passes this season. The foursome have accounted for 26 receptions for 308 yards and 2 TDs. Edwards leads all LSU tight ends with 14 catches for 141 yards and 2 TDs. Against South Carolina, LSU tight ends caught nine passes, that's the most in a single-game for that position in LSU history. Edwards led the way with 5 receptions for 37 yards and 1 TD. The 5 receptions by Edwards was the most by an LSU tight end since Robert Royal caught 5 passes for 72 yards against Utah State in 2001.

## Mauck Starts Another TD Streak

After having his streak of consecutive games with a TD pass snapped at nine against Florida, QB **Matt Mauck** got started on another streak, throwing for 2 TDs vs. South Carolina, 3 vs. Auburn, 4 vs. Louisiana Tech, 2 vs. Auburn and 2 vs. Ole Miss. In 17 career starts, Mauck has thrown at least one TD pass in 14 games. The nine straight games with at least one TD pass was the longest streak by a Tiger since Herb Tyler did it in 12 straight games covering the 1997 and 1998 seasons.

## TD-Less First Half Streak Comes To An End Against Florida

LSU's streak of keeping its opponent out of the endzone in the first half came to an end against Florida as the Gators became the first team this year to score a first half touchdown against the Tigers. Florida's first quarter TD marked the first time LSU had given up an offensive TD since last year's Cotton Bowl when Texas scored a pair of second quarter touchdowns against the Tigers. Through 11 games, LSU has allowed only 26 first half points for an average of 2.4 points per game. Dating back to last year, LSU has had it opponents scoreless in the first half in nine of its last 13 games.

## LSU Buckles Down In The Redzone

The Tiger defense is holding its opponents to a staggering 47.4 percent scoring success rate when they get inside the LSU redzone. Against Florida, the Gators had one redzone opportunity stopped at the 1-yard line when **Brandon Washington** forced a fumble that was recovered by **Adrian Mayes**. The Tigers also held the Gators to a field goal on another redzone chance in the second quarter. LSU also held Georgia to just three points despite three trips inside the redzone against the Tigers in a 17-10 win over the Bulldogs on Sept. 20. So far this season, in 21 redzone chances for its opponent, LSU has allowed only 10 scores - 6 touchdowns and 4 field goals.

## Tigers Rank No. 3 In SEC In Scoring; Needs 11 Points To Set Single-Season Scoring Mark

LSU ranks third in the SEC in scoring as the Tigers are averaging 33.2 points a contest as they have scored 365 points through the first 11 games of the season. The Tigers enter the Arkansas game just 11 points shy of breaking the school record for points in a season of 375 held by the 1977 squad.

## How About Those Special Teams

A quick check of the special teams categories in the SEC shows that LSU leads the league and rank fourth in the nation in punt returns (15.3). The Tigers are second in the SEC and 10th in the nation in net punting (40.3) and they are third in the league in kickoff coverage (18.0) and fourth in kickoff returns (23.5).

## Go Figure

Between 1997 and Nov. 16, 2002, LSU failed to reach 20 points in an SEC contest 15 times. The Tigers lost all 15 of those games. Dating back to last year's Ole Miss game on Nov. 23, LSU has now won three of its last five SEC games when failing to reach the 20-point mark, which includes wins of 17-14 vs. Ole Miss in 2003 and 14-13 vs. the Rebels in 2002. Prior to last year's win over Ole Miss, LSU had not won an SEC game when scoring less than 20 points since a 7-6 victory over Vanderbilt in 1997. You have to go all the way back to 1993 to find a two-game span when the Tigers won SEC games despite failing to reach 20 points. That year, LSU beat Ole Miss, 19-17 and then followed with a 17-13 win over Alabama. LSU also beat Mississippi State 18-16 that year.

## Saban Knows Pass Efficiency

One thing that LSU coach **Nick Saban** did over the summer was research pass efficiency and how a quarterback's efficiency related to wins and losses. Saban said the research proved that the quarterback with the better pass efficiency in a game usually leads his team to a victory. So far that has proven to be true, as the Tigers have won all 9 games in which their quarterback pass efficiency was better than its opponent. LSU is 1-1 in games in which the opponent had a better pass efficiency - losing to Florida and Chris Leak and beat-

ing Ole Miss and Eli Manning. Currently, LSU ranks first in the league and ninth in the nation in pass efficiency with a 151.0 rating. Matt Mauck is second in the SEC and 12th in the nation with a 149.99 QB rating.

## Vincent Continues Climb Up Freshman Rushing List At LSU

With 571 yards rushing through 11 games, running back **Justin Vincent** ranks seventh in school history in freshman rushing yards. Dalton Hillard holds the school's freshman rushing record with 902 yards in 1982, while Kevin Faulk stands in second place with 852 yards in 1995. Fellow Tiger rookie **Alley Broussard** currently stands in 10th place in school history for freshman rushing yards with 336 on 72 carries. LSU sophomore **Joseph Addai** finished his rookie campaign with 438 yards, which ranked as the eighth-most in school history.

## Tigers Have Experience on the O-Line

The LSU offensive line has been touted as one of the best in the nation. The Tiger offensive line may be one of the most experienced as the LSU front five have 146 career starts between them. **Rodney Reed** leads the way with 45, followed by **Stephen Peterman** with 36, **Ben Wilkerson** with 30 and **Andrew Whitworth** 24. **Rudy Niswanger** got his first career start vs. Auburn, replacing the injured **Nate Livings** at left guard. Niswanger has now started 4 straight games for the Tigers. Livings had started LSU's first 7 games before suffering a knee injury vs. South Carolina. LSU is 24-5 when Reed, Peterman and Wilkerson start on the offensive line together (8-0 in 2001, 6-4 in 2002, 10-1 in 2003).

## Tigers Keep Opponents To Less Than 20 Points For 25th Time Under Saban

By holding Ole Miss to 14 points, the Tigers have now limited their opponents to less than 20 points in 30 of the 48 games they have played under **Nick Saban**. Under Saban, the Tigers are 27-3 when holding its opponents to fewer than 20 points. Prior to the Florida game, LSU had won 18 straight contests when holding its opponent to less than 20 points. That streak dated back to a 14-3 loss to Arkansas in Little Rock in 2000. Of the 30 times that LSU has held its opponent to under 20 points, 16 of those have been when the opponent scored 10 points or less. LSU has also posted four shutouts under Saban.

## Mauck Ties Career High For Completions Against Alabama

For the third time this year, **Matt Mauck** either reset or tied his career highs for completions, this time hitting on 24 passes vs. Alabama. The 24 completions tied his previous mark of 24 set against South Carolina earlier this year. Mauck also broke his career-best for attempts with 36 against Alabama.

## Mauck Has Completion Strings of 17 and 16 This Year

QB **Matt Mauck** has recorded completion streaks of 17 and 16 this year for the Tigers. The 17 straight tied a school-mark and were over a 2-game span. Mauck completed his final 10 passes in LSU's 59-13 win over Arizona on Sept. 6 and he followed that by completing 7 straight vs. Western Illinois. The 17 straight completions ties the mark set by Rohan Davey, who completed 6 straight vs. Arkansas to close the 1999 season and then opened the 2000 season by hitting 11 straight vs. Western Carolina. Mauck's 16 straight completions covered games against Auburn (last 2 passes) and Louisiana Tech (first 14 passes).

## LSU On The Road Under Saban

The Tigers are 5-0 this season on the road and they are 12-7 on the road in the **Nick Saban** era. LSU was 2-3 in road games in 2000, followed by a 3-1 mark in 2001 and a 2-3 record last year. LSU posted a perfect road mark for the first time since the 1997 squad won all four of its road games.

## Run Skyler Run

In 11 games this year, **Skyler Green** has touched the ball in a variety of ways. He's rushed twice for 24 yards, he's caught 39 passes for 457 yards, he's returned 17 punts for 378 yards and he's returned 6 kickoffs for 133 yards. In all, Green has touched the ball 65 times and he's accounted for 992 yards for an average of 15.3 yards every time he gets his hands on the ball. Green has also accounted for 6 TDs, including the game-winner vs. Georgia. To date, he's recorded 4 receiving TDs and he's returned 2 punts for touchdowns.

## 100-150-300 vs. Western Illinois A Rarity For Tigers

LSU's trio of QB **Matt Mauck**, RB **Shyrone Carey** and WR **Michael Clayton** combined for a rarity vs. Western Illinois on Sept. 13. Carey rushed for 124 yards, Clayton caught passes netting 162 yards and Mauck threw for 305 yards as the trio became just the fourth group in school history to have 100-yards rushing, 150-yards receiving and 300-yard passing in the same game. The last time the Tigers had a 100-yard rusher, a 150-yard receiver and a 300-yard passer in the same contest came against Illinois in the 2002 Sugar Bowl. In that game, Domanick Davis rushed for 122 yards, Josh Reed had 239 yards receiving and Rohan Davey threw for 444 yards. The other two times came in 2001 as well as the Tigers did it against Kentucky (Tofield 129 rushing, Reed 160 receiving, Davey 383 passing) and then against vs. Arkansas (Tofield 173 rushing, Reed 183 receiving, Davey 359 passing).

He was a basketball superstar in high school. He came to LSU as a wide receiver and played there for a year before moving to the secondary. Now, in just his second season as a starter at CB **Corey Webster** has already moved up to among the top 10 in school history in interceptions with his 11th career pick vs. Ole Miss. For the year, Webster has four interceptions. Webster began his career at LSU as a WR, catching seven passes for 74 yards in 12 games as a freshman. In 24 games on defense, Webster has 11 interceptions for 98 yards and 1 TD.

## The Long Ball

LSU has scored on plays of 40 yards or longer in six games this year, which includes a 53-yard TD pass from **Matt Mauck** to **Devery Henderson** against Ole Miss. This year, LSU has thrown 25 TD passes with 9 of those going for at least 40 yards. Mauck has 7 TD passes of at least 40 yards this year, while backup QB **Marcus Randall** has accounted for the other two. Last year, the Tigers had just three touchdown passes from over 40 yards, with two of those coming in the Kentucky game. ## Saban Gets Win No. 36 at LSU and No. 79 Overall

**Nick Saban** continues his climb up the school charts for victories as he recorded his 36th win at LSU against Ole Miss, moving into sole possession of fourth place in school history. Saban had been tied with Gaynell Tinsley for fourth place in school history. In his fourth year with the Tigers, Saban has posted a 36-13 overall mark. Saban also has 79 career victories. In his 10th season overall, Saban has put together an overall record of 79-39-1. Charles McClendon holds the school-record with 137 victories in 19 years as LSU's head coach.

## Saban Adds Another Notch To SEC Belt

With the win over Georgia on Sept. 20, LSU coach **Nick Saban** has now recorded at least one win over all but one SEC team. The only team Saban has yet to beat in the only team he hasn't faced - Vanderbilt. In just over three years at LSU, Saban has recorded 20 SEC victories - 21 counting the SEC title game in 2001. Saban has four wins over Mississippi State, three over Kentucky and Alabama, and two each against Auburn, Ole Miss, South Carolina and Tennessee and one over Georgia, Florida, and Arkansas. Saban's current SEC mark, which includes regular-season games only, stands at 20-10.

## Jimbo Keeps Spreading It Around In The Passing Game

LSU offensive coordinator **Jimbo Fisher** has done a good job keeping opposing defenses off balance when it comes to the passing game. Through 11 games this year, LSU has had at 15 players catch at least one pass. Against South Carolina, nine different Tigers caught at least one pass and of the 26 LSU completions, 12 went to wide receivers, 9 went to tight ends and 5 went to running backs.

## Clayton Runs Streak To 37 Straight Games

LSU WR **Michael Clayton** ran his streak of consecutive games with at least one reception to 36 after recording 9 catches for 83 yards vs. Ole Miss. Clayton has caught at least one pass in every game in which he has played during his career.

## Tigers Rebound Again Under Saban After A Loss

One thing is certain and that is LSU does a good job of bouncing back after a loss under **Nick Saban**. After the 33-7 win over South Carolina, LSU is now 10-3 under Saban after a loss. LSU has lost back-to-back games under Saban only three times. LSU is 4-0 under Saban when the game following a loss comes on the road - LSU beat Georgia Tech in the Peach Bowl following a loss to Arkansas in 2000; LSU beat Alabama in Tuscaloosa following a home loss to Ole Miss in 2001; the Tigers beat Kentucky in Lexington following a loss to Auburn in 2002; LSU beat South Carolina in Columbia following a loss to Florida in 2003.

## LSU Secures Second Straight Winning Season vs. SEC Eastern Division

LSU's win over South Carolina gave the Tigers a winning record vs. the SEC Eastern Division for the second straight year and the third time in four years under **Nick Saban**. The Tigers were 2-1 vs. the East this year. LSU had won six straight against the East before Florida snapped the streak on Saturday. The last time LSU had a winning record against the SEC East in back-to-back seasons came in 1996-97. In all, Saban has a 9-4 mark vs. the SEC East, which includes a 31-20 win over Tennessee in the SEC Championship game in 2001. Prior to Saban's arrival and since the SEC went to divisions in 1992, LSU posted a 6-17-1 vs. the East from 1992 to 1999.

## True Freshmen On The Field

Through 11 games, LSU has played 15 true freshmen. LSU opened the season by playing 11 true freshmen against UL-Monroe and then 12 played against Arizona. ## Pancakes Are Breakfast of Choice For LSU O-Line

A new wrinkle to this year's offensive grade sheet is the tracking of both pancakes and knockdowns for the LSU offensive line. Through 11 games **Andrew Whitworth** leads the Tigers with 15 pancakes. Offensive guard **Stephen Peterman** is tops among the Tigers with 112 knockdowns.

## Cap and Gown Tigers

LSU has two players on this year's roster who have already earned their bachelor's degree - OT **Rodney Reed** and C **Jimmy Courtenay**. Reed and Courtenay both graduated last May. Reed, who earned First Team Academic All-America honors last year, graduated with a 3.9 grade point average in accounting. He is currently pursuing his Master's in accounting.

## Peterman's Pulling Double-Duty

As of Tuesday, Aug. 26, senior offensive lineman **Stephen Peterman** began pulling double-duty as well, only his is as a player and daddy. Peterman's wife Colleen gave birth to a 6-pound, 10-ounce baby boy in Metairie, La. Peterman missed two days of practice to be with his wife during the birth, but he returned to the squad on Thursday and started on Saturday against UL-Monroe. The newest Peterman, Stephen Frederick, Jr., checked in at some 318 pounds lighter than his daddy.

I'd been warned prior to my first visit to Baton Rouge that the legendary Death Valley mystique was a myth. That assessment couldn't have been more wrong. Tiger Stadium was as loud as any I've ever heard during the dramatic fourth quarter of Saturday's Georgia game, the festivities surrounding it as advertised.

The streets were lined with purple and gold. Smoke emanated from the grills in the parking lot. Shouts of "Go Tigers" and "Tiger Bait" echoed from the stadium deep into the heart of campus.

• LSU began playing football in Tiger Stadium in 1924 and is currently in its 80th year in the venerable stadium on SATURDAY NIGHT.

• Under Nick Saban, the Tigers have posted a 22-5 HOME RECORD, including a 6-2 mark against ranked opponents. Against conference foes, Saban is 10-4 in Death Valley. In home games at night, LSU is 17-3 since Saban took over.

• LSU has won NINE OF ITS LAST 10 games at home, including an eight-game win streak during the stretch. That was the longest home streak for the Tigers since winning eight straight from 1995-96.

• More than 85,000 FANS have attended each of LSU's last 26 home games. In that span, the Tigers have eclipsed the 90,000 mark 17 times, including a school-record 92,251 for the Sept. 20, 2003 game that pitted No. 10 LSU against No. 7 Georgia. The Tigers won the game 17-10.

• Since national attendance figures began being kept in 1957, LSU has ranked in the top 20 all 45 seasons. The Tigers have been in the top 15 for 43 of the 45 years and in the top 10 on 37 occasions, including 32 straight from 1957-88. Fourteen times, LSU has ranked in the TOP FIVE IN THE NATION, including the last three.

• Since 1960, LSU owns a stellar 186-62-4 (.745) record in traditional Tiger Stadium night games. On the other hand, the Tigers are just 15-21-3 (.434) at home during the day in that span.

• Death Valley is the SIXTH LARGEST on-campus stadium in the nation holding 91,600 fans.

### Earthquake Game

October 8, 1988. Tommy Hodson connected with Eddie Fuller on 4-and-10 with 1:41 to play for the game-winning touchdown as LSU upset No. 4 Auburn. The play caused such a thunderous explosion from the crowd of 79,341 that the tremor caused by the vibrations measured on the seismograph across campus.

### Halloween Night

October 31, 1959. No. 1 LSU trailed No. 3 Ole Miss, 3-0, late in the fourth quarter when Billy Cannon fielded a punt off the bounce at the 11-yard line. He raced 89 yards, careening off seven Rebel defenders, to paydirt to give the Tigers victory and all but clinch the 1959 Heisman Trophy.

## Hogs Win With Last Minute Drive

Matt Jones connected with Decori Birmingham on a 30-yard TD pass with nine seconds left as the Razorbacks overcame a 10-point fourth quarter deficit to beat LSU 21-20. LSU appeared to have iced the game with a 29-yard field goal by John Corbello with 40 seconds left, however the Razorbacks went 81 yards in 31 seconds, keyed by a 50-yard pass from Jones to Richard Smith, to record the come-from-behind win. LSU dominated the first half, leading 10-0 at halftime on a 67-yard Marcus Randall-to-Skyler Green pass followed by a 49-yard field goal by Corbello at the halftime buzzer. Arkansas pulled to within 10-7 on a 1-yard run by Mark Pierce before LSU stretched the margin to 17-7 on a 5-yard run by Randall late in the third quarter. Fred Talley pulled the Razorbacks to within 17-14 on a 56-yard run midway through the fourth quarter. Randall completed 14-of-25 passes for 203 yards a TD for the Tigers, while Domanick Davis rushed for 67 yards. Jones completed only 4-of-16 passes for the Razorbacks, with two coming on their final possession of the game.

### LSU's Rolls Past UL-Monroe, 49-7

Matt Mauck threw three touchdown passes, Joseph Addai rushed for 81 yards and Michael Clayton caught six passes for 152 yards and a pair of TD passes as LSU rolled to a 49-7 win over Louisiana-Monroe in the season-opener for both teams. The game was only four minutes old when a thunderstorm rolled into Baton Rouge and caused a 39-minute delay because of lightning. After a scoreless first quarter, Mauck then threw three TD passes over the final seven minutes of the second quarter to put the Tigers up 21-0 at halftime. Shyrone Carey added a 1-yard run midway through the third quarter to give LSU a 28-0 advantage and the Tigers stretched the margin to 35-0 with a 31-yard interception return just 16 seconds later. Louisiana-Monroe scored its only points of the contest on a 12-yard run by Kevin Payne with 14:10 left in the fourth quarter. Freshman Alley Broussard capped the scoring for the Tigers with a 1-yard run with 10:39 left in the contest. For the game, the Tigers racked up 474 yards of offense (306 passing, 168 rushing) compared to just 240 yard for the Indians (59 rushing, 181 passing).

LSU Storms Past Arizona, 59-13, In The Desert

LSU scored on its first seven possessions, including a 15-play, 80-yard drive to open the contest, as the Tigers had little trouble with Arizona, posting a 59-13 win over the Wildcats in Tucson, Ariz. Quarterbacks Matt Mauck and Marcus Randall combined to connect on 19 of 25 passes for 299 yards and two TDs and Joseph Addai rushed for 86 yards and a pair of scores to lead the Tigers. **Mauck-To-Green Leads LSU Past No. 7 Georgia, 17-10**

Matt Mauck connected with Skyler Green for a 34-yard touchdown pass with 1:22 left in the contest as 10th-ranked LSU knocked off seventh-ranked Georgia, 17-10, before a record crowd of 92,251 in Tiger Stadium. The win lifted LSU to 4-0 overall and 1-0 in SEC action and it marked the first Tiger victory over a top 10 team in Tiger Stadium since a 28-21 win over No. 1 Florida in 1997. The Tigers led 7-3 at halftime thanks in part to an outstanding defensive effort by LSU over the first 30 minutes. In the first half alone, Georgia got inside the LSU 30-yard line five times and came up with only three points. Trailing 3-0, the Tigers took a 7-3 lead on a 21-yard run by Shyrone Carey with 3:10 left in the first half. The Tigers extended their margin to 10-3 on a 47-yard field goal by Ryan Gaudet at the 6:23 mark in the third quarter. LSU appeared to have the game in hand, but a fumble by Mauck at the Georgia 15-yard line with less than 5 minutes left gave the Bulldogs another chance. Two players later Georgia's David Greene hit Tyson Browning on a screen pass, which he took 93 yards for a touchdown to tie the score at 10-10. Devery Henderson returned the ensuing kickoff 48 yards to the LSU 49-yard line to setup the game-winning touchdown for the Tigers. Georgia got into LSU territory in the final minute, but an interception by Corey Webster at the 22-yard line sealed the Tiger victory.

**Opportunistic Tigers Feast on Mississippi State, 41-6**

LSU turned three Mississippi State turnovers into 21 points and the Tiger defense limited the Bulldogs to only 31 yards rushing as LSU rolled to a 41-6 win in Starkville. After a slow start, LSU took a 7-0 lead late in the first quarter on a 1-yard run by Shyrone Carey. Leading 10-0 after a Ryan Gaudet field goal, the Tigers stretched the margin to 17-0 midway through the second quarter on another 1-yard run by Carey. Carey's second TD was setup by an interception by Jack Hunt, who returned the pick to the MSU 1-yard line. The Tigers led 24-0 at half-time after Travis Daniels returned an interception 48-yards for a TD with less than a minute remaining in the first half. MSU then fumbled on its third play of the second half and the Tigers struck again one play later, this time Matt Mauck connected with Devery Henderson for a 36-yard TD pass to stretch the lead to 31-0. LSU led 34-0 before MSU finally scored with just over 10 minutes left in the contest. For the game, Mauck completed 12 of 19 passes for 171 yards and 1 TD, while Justin Vincent led the Tigers with 58 yards rushing and 1 TD on six carries. Carey added 50 yards rushing and 2 TDs on 13 carries. Henderson led all receivers with a career-best seven receptions for 114 yards and a score. Defensively, the Tigers sacked MSU quarterback Kevin Fant five times and limited the Bulldogs to only 239 yards of offense.

**Flat Tigers Fall to Florida, 19-7**

A flat LSU football team couldn't overcome a series of penalties and a key injury to starting running back Joseph Addai as the Tigers dropped their first game of the season to Florida, 19-7, in Tiger Stadium. The Tigers actually scored the first points of the game as Skyler Green, subbing for an injured Shyrone Carey, returned a first quarter punt 80-yards for a touchdown and a 7-0 LSU lead. Florida responded with a 13-play drive to tie the game at 7-7 on a 22-yard pass from Chris Leak to Ran Carthon. The Gators took the lead for good at 10-7 on a 29-yard field goal by Matt Leach at the 3:17 mark in the first quarter. The Gators led 13-7 at halftime after another field goal by Leach. Florida extended its lead to 19-7 on a 35-yard pass from Leak to Ciatric Fason with 5:21 left in the third quarter. The Tigers had a couple of chances to get back in the game negated, one by a penalty and another on a fumble. A penalty wiped out a 42-yard pass from Matt Mauck to Michael Clayton in the third quarter that would have given the Tigers the ball at the Florida 28-yard line. Then late in the fourth quarter with the game still in doubt, Mauck hit Devery Henderson in stride with a pass to the Florida 31-yard line, which he then fumbled away at the UF 14-yard line. For the game, the Tigers sacked Leak six times and forced another Florida turnover on the LSU 1-yard line. Mauck completed 19 of 33 passes for 231 yards and a pair of interceptions, while Leak led Florida with 18 of 30 passing for 229 yards and 2 TDs.

Tigers Ride Freshman Running Backs to 33-7 Win Over South Carolina

True freshman running backs Justin Vincent, Alley Broussard and Barrington Edwards combined to rush for 222 yards and 2 TDs and quarterback Matt Mauck connected on 24 of 30 passes for 199 yards and 2 scores as 10th-ranked LSU rolled past South Carolina, 33-7, in Columbia. Playing without its two starting running backs in Joseph Addai and Shyrone Carey, who were both out with knee injuries, the Tigers rushed for a season-high 263 yards on 52 carries. LSU finished with 482 yards off offense, while holding South Carolina to only 254 yards of offense, including zero rushing yards. LSU jumped out to a 19-0 first half lead and never looked back in cruising to the victory. LSU had first half drives of 21-plays and 97 yards and 14-plays and 91 yards that both culminated in touchdowns, the second of which gave LSU a 19-0 lead on a 1-yard run by Vincent just before halftime. South Carolina pulled to within 19-7 after a 77-yard TD early in the third quarter before LSU linebacker Jason LeDoux put the game out of reach with a 15-yard fumble return for a touchdown later in the quarter. Vincent added another 1-yard run midway through the fourth quarter for LSU's final point. Broussard led LSU with 108 yards rushing on 19 attempts, while Vincent had 77 yards and 2 TDs rushing and added another 46 yards receiving on four receptions.

### LSU Shuts Down Cadillac, Auburn in 31-7 Win

In a game that featured the nation's top rushing defense in LSU against one of the best at running the football in Auburn, LSU came out on top, limiting Auburn to 50 yards rushing in a 31-7 win in Tiger Stadium. LSU struck early and often in the game as the Tigers rolled up 21 first half points and never looked back in posting its biggest win over Auburn since a 35-7 victory in 1972. Matt Mauck connected with Devery Henderson on a 64-yard scoring pass on the sixth play of the game for a 7-0 LSU lead. After the LSU defense stopped Auburn on a fourth-and-one at the 48-yard line, the Tigers needed only six more plays for take a 14-0 advantage as Mauck found Michael Clayton for an 18-yard TD. Alley Broussard capped the first quarter scoring with a 5-yard run for a 21-0 LSU lead, which is where the game stood at halftime. Ryan Gaudet kicked a 33-yard field goal and then Mauck hit Henderson for another TD pass to give the Tigers a 31-0 lead in the third quarter. Auburn, who was held to only 193 yards of offense, scored its only points late in the fourth quarter. For the game, Justin Vincent led the Tigers with 127 yards rushing, while Mauck completed 17 of 28 passes for 224 yards and 3 TDs. Henderson caught 6 passes for 101 yards and 2 TDs, while Clayton had 6 catches for 59 yards and 1 score. The LSU defense limited Cadillac Williams, who was considered a Heisman Trophy Candidate, to 61 yards on 20 carries.

**LSU Dominates Louisiana Tech in 49-10 Homecoming Win**

LSU quarterback Matt Mauck completed his first 14 passes, four of which went for touchdowns, as the seventh-ranked Tigers dominated Louisiana Tech in every phase of the game in a 49-10 win over the Bulldogs. For the game, the Tigers racked up a season-high 653 yards of offense - 372 passing, 281 rushing, while holds Tech's high-powered passing attack to only 220 yards. The contest was never in doubt as LSU scored on five of its first six offensive possessions to take a 49-3 lead at halftime. The Tigers led 28-0 after 15 minutes and then tacked on another score just seconds into the second quarter for a 35-0 advantage. Josh Scobee finally got Tech on the board with a 29-yard field goal early in the second quarter. LSU followed that with scoring plays of 50 yards on a Mauck to Devery Henderson pass and then a 22-yard TD run by Alley Broussard. For the game, Mauck tied an LSU single-game record by completing 14 straight passes and he set the school-record for completion percentage as he connected on 18 of 20 passes for 311 yards. Broussard led the Tiger ground game with 106 yards and 1 TD on 16 carries, while Barrington Edwards added 66 yards on 11 attempts. **Tiger Defense Shuts Down Alabama, 27-3**

Matt Mauck threw for 251 yards and 2 TDs and LSU's defense limited Alabama to only 65 yards rushing as the third-ranked Tigers dominated the Crimson Tide, 27-3. The Tigers jumped on Alabama early, taking a 10-0 lead on a 23-yard TD pass from Matt Mauck to Michael Clayton. The Tigers, who held the Crimson Tide without a first down in the first quarter, took a 17-0 lead late in the second quarter on a 3-yard TD pass from Mauck to Eric Edwards. The Tigers tacked on another score to run the margin to 24-0 on a 4-yard run by Alley Broussard mid-way through the third quarter. Chris Jackson added a 33-yard field goal for a 27-0 LSU lead before Alabama's Brian Bostick put the Crimson Tide's only points on the scoreboard with a 27-yard field goal with 6:39 left in the contest. For the game, LSU held Shaud Williams, the SEC's top rusher, to only 29 yards (85 yards below his season average of 114.0 per game). Michael Clayton led all LSU receivers with a career-best 12 catches for 130 yards and 1 score, while the Tigers got a balanced rushing attack with freshmen Justin Vincent rushing for 83 yards on 16 carries and Broussard 79 yards and 1 TD on 11 attempts.

Shuts Down Ole Miss and Eli in 17-14 Win

LSU's defense lived up to its billing as one of the nation's best as the Tigers shut-down Eli Manning and Ole Miss in a 17-14 win over the 15th-ranked Rebels in Oxford. For the game, the Tigers held the Rebels to only 227 yards of offense and 22 points below their season average. Ole Miss' defense struck first in the contest, picking off a Matt Mauck pass on LSU's first play from scrimmage and returning it 6-yards for a TD and a 7-0 lead just one minute into the contest. LSU pulled to within 7-3 on a 45-yard field goal by Chris Jackson midway through the first quarter and then took the lead for good on a 9-yard pass from Mauck to Michael Clayton just before halftime. The Tigers stretched the lead to 17-7 early in the fourth quarter on a 53-yard TD pass from Mauck to Devery Henderson. Manning then directed the Rebels on a 9-play, 76-yard scoring drive culminating on a 10-yard TD pass from Brandon Jacobs to pull to within 17-14 with 10:51 left. After Ole Miss missed a 36-yard field goal that would have tied the game with 4:15 left, the Tigers went three-and-out on their next possession, turning the ball back over to Rebels. The Tiger defense came up big again, forcing three incomplete passes by Manning before a blitz tripped up the Rebel quarterback on fourth-and-10, turning the ball back over to the Tigers with 1:50 to go. The Tigers ran the clock down to nine seconds before giving Ole Miss one more shot. Manning's desperation pass was knocked down at midfield as time expired.
