**Tigers Look To Get Back On Winning Track at South Carolina**

LSU's 10th-ranked football team will look to get back on the winning track Saturday as the Tigers travel to Columbia, S.C., to face South Carolina. Kickoff for the contest is set for 6:45 p.m. CDT and will be televised to a national audience by ESPN2. LSU enters the contest coming off its first loss of the season, a 19-7 setback to Florida last week in Tiger Stadium. In four years under **Nick Saban**, LSU is 9-3 after a loss. South Carolina is 4-2 overall and 1-2 in league play after its 27-21 win over Kentucky last Thursday in Columbia. LSU is 5-1 overall and 2-1 in SEC action. The ESPN/USA Today Coaches poll has the Tigers ranked among the top 10 teams in the nation for the fifth straight week, while the AP voters has LSU in the top 10 and for the fourth consecutive week. Saturday's contest will feature two of the SEC's top defenses as LSU is ranked second in the league and sixth nationally in total defense (265.0 yards per game), while South Carolina is third in the conference and eighth in the nation (273.3 ypg). The Tigers are allowing an SEC-leading 10.3 points a game, second in the nation, while USC ranks fourth in the SEC and 18th in the nation with 16.5 points a contest. LSU features the league's top rushing defense (62.0 ypg), while South Carolina has the SEC's top passing defense (155.2 ypg). Saturday's game will mark LSU's first visit to Columbia since a 20-20 tie on Sept. 30, 1995.

**Flat Tigers Fall to Florida, 19-7**

A flat LSU football team couldn't overcome a series of penalties and a key injury to starting running back **Joseph Addai** as the Tigers dropped their first game of the season to Florida, 19-7, in Tiger Stadium. The Tigers actually scored the first points of the game as **Skyler Green**, subbing for an injured **Shyrone Carey**, returned a first quarter punt 80-yards for a touch-down and a 7-0 LSU lead. Florida responded with a 13-play drive to tie the game at 7-7 on a 22-yard pass from Chris Leak to Ran Carthon. The Gators took the lead for good at 10-7 on a 29-yard field goal by Matt Leach at the 3:17 mark in the first quarter. The Gators led 13-7 at halftime after another field goal by Leach. Florida extended its lead to 19-7 on a 35-yard pass from Leak to Ciatric Fason with 5:21 left in the third quarter. The Tigers had a couple of chances to get back in the game negated, one by a penalty and another on a fumble. A penalty wiped out a 42-yard pass from **Matt Mauck** to **Michael Clayton** in the third quarter that would have given the Tigers the ball at the Florida 28-yard line. Then late in the fourth quarter with the game still in doubt, Mauck hit **Devery Henderson** in stride with a pass to the Florida 31-yard line, which he then fumbled away at the UF 14-yard line. For the game, the Tigers sacked Leak six times and forced another Florida turnover on the LSU 1-yard line. Mauck completed 19 of 33 passes for 231 yards and a pair of interceptions, while Leak led Florida with 18 of 30 passing for 229 yards and a pair of scores.

**The Series**

LSU and South Carolina meet for only the 17th time on Saturday in Columbia with the Tigers holding a 13-2-1 lead in the series ... The 16 games that LSU has played against South Carolina is the fewest between the Tigers and any team in the SEC ... The next closest is the 23 games LSU has played against Georgia ... The game will be only the fourth between the teams since USC joined the SEC in 1992 ... Since joining the SEC, the teams have a 1-1-1 mark in three games ... Last year, LSU came from behind to post a 38-14 win over USC in Baton Rouge ... The teams tied 20-20 in Columbia in 1995, LSU's last visit to South Carolina ... LSU is 3-1-1 in games played at South Carolina ... The series dates back to a 7-6 LSU win in Columbia in 1930 ... LSU won 12 straight in the series, including a 30-13 win in the 1987 Gator Bowl, before South Carolina's 18-17 win in Baton Rouge in 1994 ... LSU coach Nick Saban is 1-0 vs. South Carolina.

# Nick Saban

HEAD COACH • FOURTH YEAR

For years outsiders viewed the LSU football program as an unpolished gem, a potential giant waiting to be reborn in the world of college football. With the wealth of resources LSU has to offer, its tradition and the available talent within the state of Louisiana, all the program needed was the right leader to lead it. Entering his fourth year as head coach of the Tigers, Nick Saban is that leader.

Since taking over in Baton Rouge in 2000, Saban has transformed the LSU football program into one that wins championships, while graduating players at the same time.

Equipped with a plan that gives his players the best chance to be successful on the field as well as in the classroom, Saban's impact on the program has been immediate and it's been powerful.

In just three years as LSU's head coach, Saban's on-field success has been nothing short of remarkable, as he's guided the Tigers to 26 victories, a pair of bowl wins, including one in the Bowl Championship Series, and the 2001 Southeastern Conference title. The Tigers have also played in back-to-back New Year's Day bowls for the first time since the 1960s.

On top of LSU's success on the gridiron, the Tigers are being recognized for their efforts in the classroom. Currently, all 22 of the Tiger seniors from the 2002 team are on pace to graduate within the next 12 months, while Rodney Reed earned First Team Academic All-America honors and Bradie James was awarded an \$18,000 post-graduate scholarship from the National Football Foundation last year.

Off the field, Saban and his players are active in the community, promoting goodwill by participating in such things as community service projects and visiting hospitals and schools in the Baton Rouge area on a regular basis. Saban has also worn the hat of fundraiser during his stay in Baton Rouge as he spearheaded an effort that raised more than \$15 million for a state-of-the-art academic center for student-athletes. The new Cox Communications Academic Center for Student-Athletes is part of Saban's plan to give his players the best opportunity to be successful when they finish their football careers. The center, which spans 54,000 square feet, is the best of its kind and features 100 computers, a 1,000-seat auditorium, a library and a communications center for training student-athletes.

Saban became the 31st head coach of the LSU Tigers on November 30, 1999, after five years as head coach at Michigan State.

He didn't waste anytime making his impact felt as he guided a team coming off back-to-back losing seasons to an 8-4 mark and a win over 15th-ranked Georgia Tech in the Peach Bowl in 2000 to rekindle the fire of a proud football tradition in Baton Rouge.

A year later in 2001, Saban guided the Tigers to their first outright SEC title since 1986 with a 31-20 win over second-ranked Tennessee in the SEC Championship game. LSU followed that with a 47-34 victory over Illinois in the Sugar Bowl to cap a 10-3 season for the Tigers.

Last year, Saban guided the Tigers to an 8-5 overall mark and a share of the SEC Western Division title. The Tigers also played in a New Year's Day bowl game for the second consecutive year, a first for LSU since the 1960's, with an appearance in the Cotton Bowl.

Prior to LSU, Saban spent five years as the head coach at Michigan State, where he built the Spartans into a perennial Big Ten contender after going to four bowl games in five seasons.

## This Week

LSU goes back on the road for the third time this season as the 5-1 and 10th-ranked Tigers travel to face South Carolina in Columbia. LSU is 2-0 on the road this season as the Tigers have wins away from home over Arizona (59-13) and Mississippi State (41-6). South Carolina enters the contest with a 4-2 overall mark and a 1-2 league record. All four of South Carolina's wins have come at home. The Tigers are 2-1 in league action after last week's 19-7 loss to Florida in Tiger Stadium. Last year, the Tigers rallied from a 14-6 halftime deficit to post a 38-14 win over the Gamecocks in Baton Rouge. Saturday's game will mark LSU's first visit to Columbia since 1995 when the teams battled to a 20-20 tie, which happens to be the last time the Tigers ended a football game in a tie.

## In The Polls

Despite last week's loss to unranked Florida, LSU remained among the top 10 teams in the nation as the Tigers are No. 10 in both polls this week. The No. 10 ranking for LSU marks the fifth straight week that LSU has been ranked among the top 10 teams in the nation in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches poll. LSU is in the AP Top 10 for the fourth straight week, the longest such streak in the AP poll since spending the first four weeks of the 1998 season in the top 10.

## About South Carolina

The Gamecocks are 4-2 overall and 1-2 in league play ... They enter the contest coming off a 27-21 win over Kentucky last Thursday in Columbia ... All four of South Carolina's wins this year have come at home ... South Carolina takes one of the SEC's best defenses into the contest as the Gamecocks are third in the league and eighth nationally in total defense (273.3 yards per game) and they are first in the conference and sixth in the nation in pass defense (155.2 ypg) ... South Carolina is also allowing only 16.5 points a game ... The Gamecocks are coached by **Lou Holtz**, who has an 0-1 mark vs. **Nick Saban** and an 0-2 record vs. LSU.

## It's ESPN2 For The Tigers and Gamecocks

LSU will make its fifth appearance on national television this year on Saturday against South Carolina as the contest will be televised on ESPN2. Kickoff is set for 6:45 p.m. CDT. LSU is 1-0 this year on ESPN2, defeating Mississippi State 41-6 on Sept. 27. Overall, LSU is 8-3 when televised on ESPN2 and 6-1 under **Nick Saban** on the Deuce.

## Win One For JB

The LSU football team has dedicated the 2003 season to longtime equipment manager **Jeff Boss**, who was diagnosed with brain cancer last January. Several members of the team, along with coach Nick Saban, presented coach Boss with a game ball from the Louisiana-Monroe game on Sept. 12 at his home. The ULM game was the first time in 24 years that coach Boss was not on the sidelines for an LSU contest. Then, on Sept. 29, LSU named its football locker room in Boss' honor with a formal ceremony that saw dozens of former Tiger football players, covering three decades, attend. In addition, the team will wear the letters "JB" on their helmets for the remainder of the season.

## The LSU Injury Report

LSU added another running back to the injured list on Saturday as starter **Joseph Addai** went down with a grade-2 sprain of the medial collateral ligament in his left knee. Addai is expected to miss the South Carolina contest. LSU should get back the services of RB **Shyrone Carey** (sprained MCL in left knee) and SS **Jack Hunt** (sprained MCL in right knee) vs. South Carolina. Both players were injured against Mississippi State on Sept. 27 and they missed the Florida contest.

## True Frosh RBs To The Rescue

With injuries to LSU's top two running backs in **Joseph Addai** and **Shyrone Carey**, the Tigers will turn to a trio of true freshman running backs to carry the load against South Carolina. **Justin Vincent** is expected to get the start vs. the Gamecocks with **Alley Broussard** and **Barrington Edwards** both expected to see plenty of action. Vincent will become the first true freshman to start at running back for the Tigers since Kevin Faulk started against Mississippi State in week 2 of the 1995 season. Incidentally, Faulk had 171 yards and 2 TDs on 23 carries in the road win over the Bulldogs. So far this season, Vincent has rushed for 132 yards and 2 TDs on 30 carries, while Edwards has 47 yards on 11 rushes and Broussard 8 yards on 11 attempts.

## Tigers Have Been Good Under Saban After A Loss

LSU has done a good job of bouncing back after a loss under **Nick Saban**. Heading into the South Carolina contest, LSU is 9-3 under Saban in the game immediately following a loss. LSU has lost back-to-back games under Saban only three times. LSU is 3-0 under Saban when the game following a loss comes on the road - LSU beat Georgia Tech in the Peach Bowl following a loss to Arkansas in 2000; LSU beat Alabama in Tuscaloosa following a home loss to Ole Miss in 2001; the Tigers beat Kentucky in Lexington following a loss to Auburn in 2002.

## Tigers Look To Go 6-1 For Second Straight Year

LSU will look to go 6-1 for the second straight year on Saturday when they travel to face South Carolina. LSU hasn't had at least a 6-1 start in back-to-back years since 1972-73. In 1972, LSU won its first seven games before losing, while the 1973 team won its first nine games before a setback. LSU will also look to open SEC play with a 3-1 mark in consecutive years for the first time since 1996-97.

## LSU-South Carolina Ties

There are only a couple ties between LSU and South Carolina. LSU wide receivers coach **Stan Hixon** held the same position at South Carolina from 1989-92. In addition, LSU Sr. Associate AD **Dan Radakovich** served as an Associate AD at South Carolina for six years. South Carolina has one Louisiana native on its roster, freshman Stanley Doughty is from St. Helena Central HS in Greensburg, La.

## Tiger Defense Brings Leak A Sack Lunch

LSU recorded a season-high six sacks against Florida on Saturday with defensive tackle **Chad Lavalais** leading the way with two. Other Tigers with sacks on Saturday were **LaRon Landry**, **Travis Daniels**, **Marcus Spears** and **Kyle Williams**. So far this season, LSU has 21 sacks to its credit, the most in the SEC. They are averaging just over 3 sacks per game. Lavalais leads the team with five sacks. Last year, LSU only had 27 sacks for the entire season.

## LSU Looks To Secure Second Straight Winning Season vs. SEC Eastern Division

A win over South Carolina will give the Tigers a winning record vs. the SEC Eastern Division for the second straight year and the third time in four years under **Nick Saban**. Currently, the Tigers are 1-1 vs. the East this season with the win coming against Georgia and the loss vs. Florida last week. LSU had won six straight against the East before Florida snapped the streak on Saturday. The last time LSU had a winning record against the SEC East in back-to-back seasons came in 1996-97. In all, Saban has an 8-4 mark vs. the SEC East, which includes a 31-20 win over Tennessee in the SEC Championship game in 2001. Prior to Saban's arrival and since the SEC went to divisions in 1992, LSU posted a 6-17-1 vs. the East from 1992 to 1999.

## Tiger D Stuffs The Run Again

LSU once again held an opponent to fewer than 100 yards rushing as the Tigers limited Florida to 81 yards on 40 attempts. The Tigers have yet to allow a team 100 yards rushing this season. So far this season, LSU has allowed 372 yards rushing in six games, an average of only 62 yards per contest. Florida became the first team to beat **Nick Saban** despite gaining less than 100 yards rushing. The Tigers are 19-1 under Saban when holding its opponent to less than 100 yards rushing.

## Skyler Green Makes Most of Punt Returns

**Skyler Green** has made the most of his opportunities in returning punts this year as the sophomore has returned two of his six punts returns for TDs, including an 80-yarder against Florida. On the first punt return of his career against Arizona, Green raced 62 yards for a touchdown. Green is the first player since Todd Kinchen in 1991 to have two punt returns for TDs in the same season and he's one shy of tying the school mark of 3 set by Pinky Rohm in 1937. Through six games, Green has returned 6 punts for 200 yards, an average of 33.3 yards a return.

## Donnie Jones Adds His Name To Another LSU Punting Record

For the second time in two games, **Donnie Jones** broke another career punting record at LSU, as he became the school's all-time leader in punting yards vs. Florida on Saturday. In four years with the Tigers, Jones has a total of 8,223 punting yards, which broke the mark of 7,976 held by Chad Kessler (1994-967). In LSU's game against Mississippi State, Jones broke Kessler's career punts mark. For his career, Jones has punted 195 times for an average of 42.2 yards per kick, a figure that ranks second to Kessler's 42.9 career average.

## TD-Less First Half Streak Comes To An End Against Florida

LSU's streak of keeping its opponent out of the endzone in the first half came to an end on Saturday as Florida became the first team this year to score a first half touchdown against the Tigers. Florida scored a first quarter TD on Saturday to become the first time to score in the first half against LSU since Texas had a pair of offensive TDs in the second quarter of last year's Cotton Bowl. Despite the TD, LSU has still only allowed 16 first half points this season for an average of just over 2 points a game.

## Tiger Defense Continues To Be Spectacular

LSU's defense continues to be one of the best all-around units in the SEC as the Tigers are ranked either Nos. 1 or 2 in the league in seven of 10 categories, including leading the conference in five categories. LSU ranks first in the SEC and second in the nation in scoring defense (10.3 points per game), they are first in the conference and fourth nationally in rushing defense (62.0 yards per game), and the Tigers are second in the SEC and sixth in the nation in total defense (265.0 ypg). LSU also leads the SEC in sacks (21 for 167 yards

## LSU's Been Good At Getting The Defense Off The Field On 3rd Down

While Florida may have converted 7 of 18 3rd-down attempts against the Tigers, LSU still leads the SEC in opponents 3rd down conversion percentage, holding the opposition to just 24.7 percent. On 93 3rd-down attempts this year, the opposition has converted only 23 against the Tigers.

## Tiger Defense Still Tough To Score On

LSU continues to lead the league in scoring defense as the Tigers are allowing only 10.3 points per game, a figure that ranks second in the nation. The 62 total points allowed by the Tigers is the fewest by an LSU team through six games since the 1985 team held its first six opponents to only 43 points. Last year, the Tiger defense allowed 63 points over the first six games of the season.

## LSU Buckles Down In The Redzone

The Tiger defense is holding its opponents to a staggering 46.2 percent scoring success rate when they get inside the LSU redzone. Against Florida on Saturday, the Gators had one redzone opportunity stopped at the 1-yard line when **Brandon Washington** forced a fumble that was recovered by **Adrian Mayes**. The Tigers also held the Gators to a field goal on another redzone chance in the second quarter. LSU also held Georgia to just three points despite three trips inside the redzone against the Tigers in a 17-10 win over the Bulldogs on Sept. 20.

## Tigers Still Rank No. 2 In SEC In Scoring

LSU still ranks second in the SEC in scoring as the Tigers are averaging 34.7 points a contest as they have scored 208 points through the first six games of the season. The 208 points by the Tigers are the most for an LSU team since the 1977 team scored 231 points over its first six games. The 1977 team still holds the school record for most points in a season with 375.

## How About Those Special Teams

A quick check of the special teams categories in the SEC shows that LSU leads the league in kickoff returns (26.4 yards per return) and punt returns (15.4), the Tigers are second in net punting with a 40.7 yard average and LSU is fourth in kickoff coverage, allowing only 18.9 yards per return. LSU ranks sixth in the nation in kickoff return average and the Tigers are eighth in puntn return average. LSU leads the SEC with two punt returns for TDs, both coming by **Skylar Green**.

## Tigers Rank Second In SEC In Interceptions

For the first time this year, LSU failed to record an interception in the game as the Tigers went without a pick against Florida. To date, LSU has 10 interceptions to its credit, second in the SEC. Florida leads the league with 11 picks. The Tigers have made the most of their interceptions as two have been returned for TDs (**Jack Hunt** 31 yards vs. UL-Monroe and **Travis Daniels** 48 yards vs. Miss. State) and another was returned to the opponent's 1-yard line. Of the 10 interceptions for LSU in 2003, four have resulted in a TD for the Tigers (2 by the defense and 2 by the offense). **Corey Webster** leads the Tigers with three interceptions, followed by **Travis Daniels** and **Jack Hunt** with two each.

## Go Figure

Between 1997 and Nov. 16, 2002, LSU failed to reach 20 points in an SEC contest 15 times. The Tigers lost all 15 of those games. Dating back to last year's Ole Miss game on Nov. 23, LSU has now won two of its last four SEC games when failing to reach the 20-point mark. Last year, LSU beat Ole Miss 14-13 for its final SEC victory and the Tigers opened up conference play this year with a 17-10 victory over Georgia. Prior to last year's win over Ole Miss, LSU had not won an SEC game when scoring less than 20 points since a 7-6 victory over Vanderbilt in 1997. You have to go all the way back to 1993 to find a two-game span when the Tigers won SEC games despite failing to reach 20 points. That year, LSU beat Ole Miss, 19-17 and then followed with a 17-13 win over Alabama. LSU also beat Mississippi State 18-16 that year.

## Saban Knows Pass Efficiency

One thing that LSU coach **Nick Saban** did over the summer was research pass efficiency and how a quarterback's efficiency related to wins and losses. Saban said the research proved that the quarterback with the better pass efficiency in a game usually leads his team to a victory. So far that has proven to be true as the Tigers have won all five games in which their quarterback pass efficiency was better than its opponent. The one time that the opponent had the better efficiency (Florida), the Tigers lost. Currently, LSU ranks second in the league and 16th in the nation in pass efficiency with a 146.1 rating. **Matt Mauck** is third in the SEC with a 140.8 QB rating.

## Tigers Keep Opponents To Less Than 20 Points For 25th Time Under Saban

By holding Florida to only 19 points, the Tigers have now limited their opponents to less than 20 points in 25 of the 43 games they have played under **Nick Saban**. Under Saban, the Tigers are 22-3 when holding its opponents to fewer than 20 points. Prior to the Florida game, LSU had won 18 straight contests when holding its opponent to less than 20 points. That streak dated back to a 14-3 loss to Arkansas in Little Rock in 2000. Of the 25 times that LSU has held its opponent to under 20 points, 12 of those have been when the opponent scored 10 points or less. LSU has also posted four shutouts under Saban.

## Clayton and Henderson A Nice 1-2 Punch At Wide Receiver

One thing is for certain and that is if defenses key too much on **Michael Clayton**, then **Devery Henderson** will make them pay. Focus on Henderson, then Clayton takes over. At least that's how it's been over the first six games of the year. Clayton and Henderson have combined for 60 catches for 948 yards and 8 TDs for the Tigers. Clayton has gone over 100 yards three times this year, while Henderson has done it twice. Clayton has led LSU in both yards and catches in three games, while Henderson has done it in the last two contests, including a 5-reception, 109-yard game vs. Florida. Clayton ranks third in the league in receptions per game (5.5), while Henderson is fifth with 4.50 a contest. Clayton is second in the SEC in yards per game (89.5) and Henderson is fifth at 68.5 yard a contest.

## Open Wide

QB **Matt Mauck's** spent last Monday (Oct. 6) taking the Dental Admissions Test. Mauck, who also considered pursuing a career in medicine, has now opted to becoming a dentist. Mauck, who carries a 3.8 grade point average, will graduate in December with a degree in kinesiology.

## Mauck's TD Streak Snapped At Nine Straight

**Matt Mauck's** streak of consecutive games with at least one TD pass came to an end vs. Florida on Saturday. Prior to the Florida game, Mauck had thrown a TD pass in every game that he started with the exception of his first two career starts - Va. Tech and the Citadel. Mauck had thrown at least one TD in nine straight games, a streak that dated back to last year's Miami (Ohio) game. Mauck's streak of having at least one TD pass in nine straight games was the most for an LSU player since Herb Tyler did it in 12 straight games covering the final two games of 1997 and all 10 games that he played in in 1998.

## Mauck Ties LSU Record With 17 Straight Completions

**Matt Mauck** played perhaps the best game of his career in the Sept. 13 game vs. Western Illinois. Lost in his overall numbers was the fact that he tied an LSU record by completing 17 straight passes over a two game span. Mauck completed his final 10 passes in LSU's 59-13 win over Arizona on Sept. 6 and he followed that by completing 7 straight vs. Western Illinois. The 17 straight completions ties the mark set by Rohan Davey, who completed 6 straight vs. Arkansas to close the 1999 season and then opened the 2000 season by hitting 11 straight vs. Western Carolina.

## Mauck Has Career Night In Win over Western Illinois

**Matt Mauck** put together a career night vs. Western Illinois as the junior from Jasper, Ind., posted career-highs for completions (23), yards (305) and TDs (4). For the contest, Mauck connected on his first seven passes and went on to complete 23 of 35 passes. He became LSU's first 300-yard passer since Rohan Davey tossed for 444 yards vs. Illinois in the 2002 Sugar Bowl. The four TD were the most by an LSU player since Josh Booty threw 4 TD passes in a win over Alabama in 2000.

## Clayton Joins The 2,000-Yard Club

**Michael Clayton**, a junior wide receiver, became only the fifth player in LSU history to record 2,000 receiving yards in a career as he went over the mark against Florida. Clayton currently ranks fifth in school history with 2,040 receiving yards. He's also fifth in LSU history in receptions with 137, he's sixth in receiving TDs with 15 and he ranks seventh in career 100-yard receiving games with six. With 33 catches for 537 this year, Clayton is only 163 yards from becoming the first player in LSU history with at least 700 yards receiving in each of his first three seasons. Clayton had 754 yards on 47 catches as a freshman and he followed that with 749 yards on 57 receptions last year.

## Run Skyler Run

In six games this year, **Skyler Green** has touched the ball in a variety of ways. He's rushed once for 15 yards, he's caught 16 passes for 231 yards, he's returned six punts for 200 yards and he's returned four kickoffs for 89 yards. In all, Green has touched the ball 27 times and he's accounted for 535 yards for an average of 19.8 yards every time he gets his hands on the ball. Green has also accounted for 5 TDs, including the game-winner vs. Georgia. Green puts the ball in the endzone every 5.4 times he touches the ball, the highest ratio on the team. To date, he's recorded three receiving TDs and he's returned two punts for touchdowns.

## 100-150-300 vs. Western Illinois A Rarity For Tigers

LSU's trio of QB **Matt Mauck**, RB **Shyrone Carey** and WR **Michael Clayton** combined for a rarity vs. Western Illinois on Sept. 13. Carey rushed for 124 yards, Clayton caught passes netting 162 yards and Mauck threw for 305 yards as the trio became just the fourth group in school history to have 100-yards rushing, 150-yards receiving and 300-yard passing in the same game. The last time the Tigers had a 100-yard rusher, a 150-yard receiver and a 300-yard passer in the same contest came against Illinois in the 2002 Sugar Bowl. In that game, Domanick Davis rushed for 122 yards, Josh Reed had 239 yards receiving and Rohan Davey threw for 444 yards. The other two times came in 2001 as well as the Tigers did it against Kentucky (Toefield 129 rushing, Reed 160 receiving, Davey 383 passing) and then against vs. Arkansas (Toefield 173 rushing, Reed 183 receiving, Davey 359 passing).

## 100 On The Ground And 100 Through The Air

Against Western Illinois, LSU had its first 100-yard rusher and 100-yard receiver in the same game since the Sugar Bowl in January of 2002. Against Western Illinois, **Shyrone Carey** rushed for 124 yards, while **Michael Clayton** caught 11 passes for 162 yards. It's the first time the Tigers have accomplished that feat since Domanick Davis rushed for 122 yards and Josh Reed had 239 receiving yards vs. Illinois. In addition, Clayton had 120 yards receiving in that Sugar Bowl contest vs. Illinois.

## Tiger Defense Continues To Be Stingy

Through 24 quarters this season, LSU's defense has held the opponent out of the endzone in 15 of those. Florida became the first team since Kentucky last year to score an offensive TD in the first quarter against the Tigers. Prior to the Florida game, LSU had allowed only 3 first half points all season, that being a field goal vs. Georgia in Week 4. In all, LSU has held all six of its opponents this year to less than 20 points.

## Mauck Win Streak Snapped At 10 Straight

**Matt Mauck's** winning streak as LSU's starter quarterback came to an end on Saturday at 10 straight with the loss to Florida. Mauck, who is 10-2 as LSU's starting quarterback, had not lost a game since his first start vs. Virginia Tech in last year's season-opener. Mauck's 10-1 start was the best by an LSU QB since Herb Tyler won 10 of his first 11, including his first eight, as a starter from 1995-96. In addition, Mauck has played in 15 games in his LSU career and the Tigers are 12-3 in those contests.

## Webster Nabs 10th Career Interception

He was a basketball superstar in high school. He came to LSU as a wide receiver and played there for a year before moving to the secondary. Now, in just his second season as a starter at CB **Corey Webster** has already moved up to seventh place in school history in interceptions after recording the 10th career pick vs. Georgia. The interception, which made Webster look more like a magician, came with just over a minute left in the contest and sealed LSU's 17-10 win over Georgia. The pick was the third of the year for Webster, who ranks second in the SEC and 20th nationally in the category. Webster began his career at LSU as a WR, catching seven passes for 74 yards in 12 games as a freshman. In 19 games on defense, Webster has 10 interceptions for 98 yards and 1 TD.

## The Long Ball

LSU has scored on plays of 40 yards or longer in three of its six games this year. While the Tigers did not have offensive scoring plays of at least 40 yards in their last two games, they did come close on two occasions. Against Georgia, **Matt Mauck** hit **Skyler Green** for a 34-yard TD late in the fourth quarter in what was the game winner for the Tigers. A week later, Mauck connected with **Devery Henderson** for a 36-yard TD pass to start the third quarter scoring for the Tigers. This year, LSU has thrown 12 TD passes with five of those going for at least 40 yards. Mauck has three TD passes of at least 40 yards this year, while backup QB **Marcus Randall** has accounted for the other two. Last year, the Tigers had just three touchdown passes from over 40 yards, with two of those coming in the Kentucky game.

## Saban Gets Win No. 31 at LSU and No. 74 Overall

LSU coach **Nick Saban** moved past Mike Archer into sole possession of sixth place in school history in wins with his 28th victory in the Tigers' win over Arizona. Saban picked up win No. 31 vs. Mississippi State, moving him to within one of tying Gerry DiNardo for fifth place at LSU. In just over three years with LSU, Saban has posted a 31-13 overall mark. Saban also has 74 career victories. In his 10th season overall, Saban has put together an overall record of 74-39-1. Charles McClendon holds the school-record with 137 victories in 19 years as LSU's head coach.

## Saban Adds Another Notch To SEC Belt

With the win over Georgia, LSU coach **Nick Saban** has now recorded at least one win over all but one SEC team. The only team Saban has yet to beat in the only team he hasn't faced - Vanderbilt. In just over three years at LSU, Saban has recorded 17 SEC victories - 18 counting the SEC title game in 2001. Saban has four wins over Mississippi State, three over Kentucky, two each against Alabama, Ole Miss and Tennessee and one over Georgia, Auburn, Florida, South Carolina, and Arkansas. Saban's current SEC mark, which includes regular-season games only, stands at 17-10.

## That Tiger Stadium Mystique Is Back Under Saban

LSU coach **Nick Saban** has restored the mystique that has made Tiger Stadium one of the toughest places for opposing teams to play. In his fourth season at LSU, Saban has put together a 20-5 mark at home, which includes a 10-4 record in SEC games. Under Saban, the Tigers are 5-2 vs. Top 25 teams in Tiger Stadium. LSU's 18 wins over Saban's first three years in Baton Rouge is the most over a three-year period for LSU in Tiger Stadium since the Tigers won 18 home games from 1972-74.

## Tigers Are Now 13-3 In Non-Conference Games Under Saban

After the win over Western Illinois, LSU moved its non-conference record under **Nick Saban** to 13-3. The Tigers were 3-1 in non-league games in 2000, followed by a 4-0 mark in 2001 and a 3-2 record last year. Included in the 13 non-SEC wins over the last three-plus years for the Tigers are bowl victories over Georgia Tech and Illinois.

## Taking Notes On The Tigers Under Saban

Here's a look at some notable LSU trends during its first 42 games under **Nick Saban** ... LSU is 26-2 when leading at halftime and 24-2 when leading after three quarters ... The Tigers are 29-3 when scoring 20 or more points and 28-0 when scoring 25 or more points ... On the other hand, LSU is 2-10 when failing to reach the 20-point mark ... LSU is 8-2 in games decided by 7 points or less and 3-1 in games decided by 3 points or less ... LSU is 19-1 when holding opponents to fewer than 100 yards rushing and the Tigers are 12-0 when having a 100-yard rusher.

## Jimbo Keeps Spreading It Around In The Passing Game

LSU offensive coordinator **Jimbo Fisher** has done a good job keeping opposing defenses off balance when it comes to the passing game. Through 6 games this year, LSU has had at 12 players catch at least one pass. In the opener vs. UL-Monroe, LSU had seven players catch at least one pass. A week later vs. Arizona, eight Tigers caught passes.

## Clayton Runs Streak To 32 Straight Games

LSU WR **Michael Clayton** ran his streak of consecutive games with at least one reception to 32 after recording 5 catches vs. Florida. Clayton has caught at least one pass in every game in which he has played during his career.

## Tigers Have Block Party vs. Western Illinois

LSU recorded both a blocked field goal and as well as a blocked punt against Western Illinois. **Travis Daniels** blocked the punt, which was the first for the Tigers since the 1999 game against Mississippi State, while **Chad Lavalais** blocked the field goal attempt. The blocked field goal was the first for LSU since 1998 when Arnold Miller blocked a kick against Notre Dame.

## True Freshmen On The Field

Through six games, LSU has now played 14 true freshmen. LSU opened the season by playing 11 true freshmen against UL-Monroe and then 12 played against Arizona. ## Tigers Have Experience on the O-Line

The LSU offensive line has been touted as one of the best in the nation. The Tiger offensive line may be one of the most experienced as the LSU front five have 121 career starts between them. **Rodney Reed** leads the way with 40, followed by **Stephen Peterman** with 31, **Ben Wilkerson** with 25 and **Andrew Whitworth** 19. **Nate Livings** has started all 6 games this season. LSU is 19-5 when Reed, Peterman and Wilkerson start on the offensive line together (8-0 in 2001, 6-4 in 2002, 5-1 in 2003).

## Reed Among Nation's Elite In Starts on Offensive Line

Senior OT **Rodney Reed** started his 40th straight game vs. Florida. Reed's 40 career starts ranks as the sixth-highest total among active Division I players. Marshall's Nate McPeck leads the way with 45 career starts.

## Pancakes Are Breakfast of Choice For LSU O-Line

A new wrinkle to this year's offensive grade sheet is the tracking of both pancakes and knockdowns for the LSU offensive line. Through 6 games **Andrew Whitworth** leads the Tigers with 10 pancakes. Offensive guard **Stephen Peterman** is tops among the Tigers with 64 knockdowns.

## Carey Fills In Nicely For Domanick

A concern for LSU heading into the season was how to replace the departed Domanick Davis, the school's all-time leader in both punt return and kickoff return yards. **Shyrone Carey** has put some of that concern to rest as he's averaging 11.2 yards on 17 punt returns this season. Against Arizona, Carey returned returned five punts for 58 yards, including a 35-yard return that setup LSU's first quarter field goal that put the lead at 10-0. In all, LSU is averaging 15.4 yards on 26 punt returns, a figure that ranks leads the SEC and ranks eighth nationally.

## Cap and Gown Tigers

LSU has two players on this year's roster who have already earned their bachelor's degree - OT **Rodney Reed** and C **Jimmy Courtenay**. Reed and Courtenay both graduated last May. Reed, who earned First Team Academic All-America honors last year, graduated with a 3.9 grade point average in accounting. He is currently pursuing his Master's in accounting.

## Clayton Has Teams Seeing Double (Triple, really)

**Michael Clayton** finally had his much-anticipated debut on defense vs. Arizona as the two-way player saw action on three plays at safety. Clayton did not record any statistics on defense, however he did make a tackle from his wide receiver position after an intercepted pass on offense. Clayton is actually playing three ways for the Tigers as he also serves as the backup holder on all placekicks as well as being on the kickoff coverage team. The Arizona contest marked the second time in Clayton's career that he has seen action on both sides of the ball. He did it for the first time last year vs. Texas in the Cotton Bowl.

## Peterman's Pulling Double-Duty Too

As of Tuesday, Aug. 26, senior offensive lineman **Stephen Peterman** began pulling double-duty as well, only his is as a player and daddy. Peterman's wife Colleen gave birth to a 6-pound, 10-ounce baby boy in Metairie, La. Peterman missed two days of practice to be with his wife during the birth, but he returned to the squad on Thursday and started on Saturday against UL-Monroe. The newest Peterman, Stephen Frederick, Jr., checked in at some 318 pounds lighter than his daddy.

## Gaudet Joins Elite List With 47-Yard FG

**Ryan Gaudet** added his name to a very short list of LSU kickers with his 47-yard field goal against Arizona. Gaudet's 47-yard field goal marked the first of his career and it marked the third-longest at LSU for a kicker on his first career make. Juan Roca holds the record as he connected on a 52-yard field goal vs. Wisconsin for his career make, while Wade Richey's first career make was a 48-yarder vs. Michigan State in 1995. Gaudet added another 47-yarder against Georgia. Gaudet, who made a pair of field goals vs. Mississippi State, is now 4 of 7 this season.

## Wilkerson Named to Rimington Watch List

Junior C **Ben Wilkerson** is one of 38 players named to the watch list for the Rimington Trophy. The award, established in 2000, is named for Nebraska's Dave Rimington, one of college football's most decorated offensive linemen. This is the second straight season Wilkerson has made the preseason watch list for the award. Wilkerson has started 20 games in his career and LSU is 15-5 in those games.

## Webster on Thorpe and Nagurski Watch List

Junior CB **Corey Webster**, who led the Southeastern Conference last season with seven interceptions, has been named to the Jim Thorpe Award and the Bronko Nagurski watch lists. The Thorpe award, presented annually to the nation's top defensive back, is named after history's greatest all-around athlete who excelled on both defense and offense during his football career. The Nagurski award is presented to the nation's top all-around defensive player.

## Peterman on Lombardi Watch List

Senior OG **Stephen Peterman**, a 2002 first-team All-SEC selection, has been named to the preliminary watch list for the Rotary Lombardi Award. Peterman is one of 41 players on the list for the award that is presented annually to the nation's top offensive or defensive lineman.

## Turner on Butkus Watch List

Junior LB **Lionel Turner** has been named to the preseason Butkus Award watch list. The Walker, La., native finished third on the team in tackles last season with 71 and recorded three sacks. The award is presented annually to the nation's top linebacker.

## Lavalais on Lombardi Watch List

Senior DT **Chad Lavalais** has been named to the Rotary Lombardi Award watch list. The Marksville, La., native is one of 74 players on the watch list for the award given annually to the nation's top defensive down lineman or player lined up with in five yards of the line of scrimmage.

Junior **Michael Clayton** is one of 31 receivers on the Biletnikoff Award candidates list that goes annually to the nation's top wide receiver. LSU's Josh Reed earned the award as the nation's receiver in 2001.

• Under Nick Saban, the Tigers have posted a 20-5 HOME RECORD, including a 5-2 mark against ranked opponents. Against conference foes, Saban is 9-4 in Death Valley. In home games at night, LSU is 15-3 since Saban took over.

• LSU has won NINE OF ITS LAST 10 games at home, including an eight-game win streak during the stretch. That was the longest home streak for the Tigers since winning eight straight from 1995-96.

• More than 85,000 FANS have attended each of LSU's last 23 home games. In that span, the Tigers have eclipsed the 90,000 mark 15 times, including a school-record 92,251 for the Sept. 20, 2003 game that pitted No. 10 LSU against No. 7 Georgia. The Tigers won the game 17-10.

• Since national attendance figures began being kept in 1957, LSU has ranked in the top 20 all 45 seasons. The Tigers have been in the top 15 for 43 of the 45 years and in the top 10 on 37 occasions, including 32 straight from 1957-88. Fourteen times, LSU has ranked in the TOP FIVE IN THE NATION, including the last three.

• Since 1960, LSU owns a stellar 184-62-4 (.745) record in traditional Tiger Stadium night games. On the other hand, the Tigers are just 15-21-3 (.434) at home during the day in that span.

• Death Valley is the SIXTH LARGEST on-campus stadium in the nation holding 91,600 fans.

### Earthquake Game

October 8, 1988. Tommy Hodson connected with Eddie Fuller on 4-and-10 with 1:41 to play for the game-winning touchdown as LSU upset No. 4 Auburn. The play caused such a thunderous explosion from the crowd of 79,341 that the tremor caused by the vibrations measured on the seismograph across campus.

### Halloween Night

October 31, 1959. No. 1 LSU trailed No. 3 Ole Miss, 3-0, late in the fourth quarter when Billy Cannon fielded a punt off the bounce at the 11-yard line. He raced 89 yards, careening off seven Rebel defenders, to paydirt to give the Tigers victory and all but clinch the 1959 Heisman Trophy.

## LSU Explodes After Halftime for Win

Trailing 14-6 at halftime, LSU put together a dominating half of football to roll to a 38-14 victory over South Carolina in Tiger Stadium. In the third quarter, LSU outscored South Carolina 25-0 and held the Gamecocks to only one-yard of total offense. Behind the play of first-time starter Marcus Randall, LSU scored two touchdowns and added a field goal to go along with cornerback Demetrius Hookfin's interception return for a touchdown to put the game out of reach at 31-14. Domanick Davis finished with 113 yards rushing, while Randall completed 12-of-23 passes for 183 yards. Randall added 36 yards rushing, including a 12-yard TD run. Defensively, "The James Gang" held South Carolina to only 275 yards of offense, including 63 yards and no points in the second half.

## LSU's Rolls Past UL-Monroe, 49-7

Matt Mauck threw three touchdown passes, Joseph Addai rushed for 81 yards and Michael Clayton caught six passes for 152 yards and a pair of TD passes as LSU rolled to a 49-7 win over Louisiana-Monroe in the season-opener for both teams. The game was only four minutes old when a thunderstorm rolled into Baton Rouge and caused a 39-minute delay because of lightning. After a scoreless first quarter, Mauck then threw three TD passes over the final seven minutes of the second quarter to put the Tigers up 21-0 at halftime. Shyrone Carey added a 1-yard run midway through the third quarter to give LSU a 28-0 advantage and the Tigers stretched the margin to 35-0 with a 31-yard interception return just 16 seconds later. Louisiana-Monroe scored its only points of the contest on a 12-yard run by Kevin Payne with 14:10 left in the fourth quarter. Freshman Alley Broussard capped the scoring for the Tigers with a 1-yard run with 10:39 left in the contest. For the game, the Tigers racked up 474 yards of offense (306 passing, 168 rushing) compared to just 240 yard for the Indians (59 rushing, 181 passing).

LSU scored on its first seven possessions, including a 15-play, 80-yard drive to open the contest, as the Tigers had little trouble with Arizona, posting a 59-13 win over the Wildcats in Tucson, Ariz. Mauck-To-Green Leads LSU Past No. 7 Georgia, 17-10

Matt Mauck connected with Skyler Green for a 34-yard touchdown pass with 1:22 left in the contest as 10th-ranked LSU knocked off seventh-ranked Georgia, 17-10, before a record crowd of 92,251 in Tiger Stadium. The win lifted LSU to 4-0 overall and 1-0 in SEC action and it marked the first Tiger victory over a top 10 team in Tiger Stadium since a 28-21 win over No. 1 Florida in 1997. The Tigers led 7-3 at halftime thanks in part to an outstanding defensive effort by LSU over the first 30 minutes. In the first half alone, Georgia got inside the LSU 30-yard line five times and came up with only three points. Trailing 3-0, the Tigers took a 7-3 lead on a 21-yard run by Shyrone Carey with 3:10 left in the first half. The Tigers extended their margin to 10-3 on a 47-yard field goal by Ryan Gaudet at the 6:23 mark in the third quarter. LSU appeared to have the game in hand, but a fumble by Mauck at the Georgia 15-yard line with less than 5 minutes left gave the Bulldogs another chance. Two players later Georgia's David Greene hit Tyson Browning on a screen pass, which he took 93 yards for a touchdown to tie the score at 10-10. Devery Henderson returned the ensuing kickoff 48 yards to the LSU 49-yard line to setup the game-winning touchdown for the Tigers. Georgia got into LSU territory in the final minute, but an interception by Corey Webster at the 22-yard line sealed the Tiger victory.

Opportunistic Tigers Feast on Mississippi State, 41-6

LSU turned three Mississippi State turnovers into 21 points and the Tiger defense limited the Bulldogs to only 31 yards rushing as LSU rolled to a 41-6 win in Starkville. After a slow start, LSU took a 7-0 lead late in the first quarter on a 1-yard run by Shyrone Carey. Leading 10-0 after a Ryan Gaudet field goal, the Tigers stretched the margin to 17-0 midway through the second quarter on another 1-yard run by Carey. Carey's second TD was setup by an interception by Jack Hunt, who returned the pick to the MSU 1-yard line. A flat LSU football team couldn't overcome a series of penalties and a key injury to starting running back Joseph Addai as the Tigers dropped their first game of the season to Florida, 19-7, in Tiger Stadium. The Tigers actually scored the first points of the game as Skyler Green, subbing for an injured Shyrone Carey, returned a first quarter punt 80-yards for a touchdown and a 7-0 LSU lead. Florida responded with a 13-play drive to tie the game at 7-7 on a 22-yard pass from Chris Leak to Ran Carthon. The Gators took the lead for good at 10-7 on a 29-yard field goal by Matt Leach at the 3:17 mark in the first quarter. The Gators led 13-7 at halftime after another field goal by Leach. Florida extended its lead to 19-7 on a 35-yard pass from Leak to Ciatric Fason with 5:21 left in the third quarter. The Tigers had a couple of chances to get back in the game negated, one by a penalty and another on a fumble. A penalty wiped out a 42-yard pass from Matt Mauck to Michael Clayton in the third quarter that would have given the Tigers the ball at the Florida 28-yard line. Then late in the fourth quarter with the game still in doubt, Mauck hit Devery Henderson in stride with a pass to the Florida 31-yard line, which he then fumbled away at the UF 14-yard line. For the game, the Tigers sacked Leak six times and forced another Florida turnover on the LSU 1-yard line. Mauck completed 19 of 33 passes for 231 yards and a pair of interceptions, while Leak led Florida with 18 of 30 passing for 229 yards and 2 TDs.
