Tigers Play Host to Vanderbilt in Alex Box Stadium

Fifth-ranked LSU (36-13, 14-10) returns to SEC action this weekend as the Tigers play host to Vanderbilt (34-14, 12-12) in a three-game conference series at Alex Box Stadium.

First pitch for Game 1 of the LSU-Vanderbilt series is 6:30 p.m. Friday, Game 2 is set for 2 p.m. Saturday and Game 3 will be played at 1 p.m. Sunday.

The games can be heard statewide on the LSU Sports Network (WDGL-FM 98.1 in Baton Rouge). All three games can also be heard on the internet at www.LSUsports.net.

Friday's game will be televised live by Cox Sports Television (Cable Ch. 37 in Baton Rouge). There is no television coverage of the games on Saturday and Sunday.

LSU trails first-place Arkansas (16-8) by two games in the SEC Western Division standings with six games remaining in the conference regular season. Arkansas travels to play Mississippi State (8-16) this weekend in Starkville.

Vanderbilt is in fourth place in the SEC Eastern Division, four games behind first-place Florida. The Commodores have won seven of their last eight games, including five of their last six SEC contests.

LSU coach Smoke Laval will send junior left-hander Lane Mestepey (5-1, 4.04 ERA) to the mound Friday, while Vanderbilt coach Tim Corbin will counter with junior lefty Jeremy Sowers (7-4, 3.16 ERA), who is second in the SEC in strikeouts with 87.

Mestepey, a two-time all-SEC selection who missed the 2003 season due to shoulder surgery, will be making just his second start in an SEC game this season. His last conference start came at South Carolina on March 20, when he allowed four earned runs on four hits in three innings with three walks and no strikeouts.

The LSU-Vanderbilt Series

Vanderbilt has won four of its last six meetings with LSU, posting series victories over the Tigers last season in Nashville and in 2002 in Baton Rouge.

LSU leads the all-time series, 42-23, though the Tigers hold a slim 6-5 edge over the Commodores in games played this decade. LSU has a 24-13 advantage in games played in Alex Box Stadium.

Highlights from LSU's Series Win at Kentucky Last Weekend

- LSU won its seventh SEC series in eight weekends as the Tigers captured two of three games at Kentucky May 7-9. LSU has won nine of its last 10 SEC series, dating back to last season.
- The conference series win at Kentucky was LSU's fifth this season after losing the opening game of the weekend. The Tigers pounded out a season-high 23 hits in Sunday's 15-4 Game 3 win at UK, as LSU launched three homers and collected two doubles. The 23 hits marked the highest single-game total for LSU since May 4, 2002, when the Tigers collected 24 hits in a win at Tennessee.
- LSU posted a team batting average of .412 (47-for-114) in the Kentucky series, scoring 29 runs while recording four doubles and four homers. LSU raised its SEC-leading cumulative batting average to .334 with the weekend offensive outburst.
- Right fielder Jon Zeringue enjoyed a superb weekend, hitting .600 (9-for-15) in the series with four runs scored and three RBI. Zeringue is now hitting .419 (78-for-186) on the year with 16 doubles, two triples, 11 homers and 45 RBI.
- Designated hitter Nick Stavinoha continued to swing a hot bat, as he hit .583 (7-for-12) in the series with one double, one homer, four runs and four RBI.
- After going hitless in his first nine at-bats, first baseman Will Harris finished the series with a flourish, as he was 4-for-5 on Sunday with one double, one homer, two runs and three RBI.
- Right-hander Nate Bumstead recorded his eighth victory on Sunday, working 6.1 innings with a season-high seven strikeouts to defeat Kentucky. Bumstead, who retired 14 straight UK batters at one point in his outing, allowed two runs on five hits with no walks.
- Right-hander Jordan Faircloth delivered another solid outing on Saturday, earning a relief victory with three shutout innings against the Wildcats. Faircloth limited UK to two hits while recording no walks and one strikeout.

Jon Zeringue Named to Golden Spikes Award Watch List

LSU outfielder Jon Zeringue is one of 30 players appearing on this week's 2004 Golden Spikes Award "Watch List." The Golden Spikes Award is presented annually by USA Baseball to the nation's outstanding amateur player.

USA Baseball will announce its five finalists for the award in June. Former LSU pitcher Ben McDonald was the 1989 Golden Spikes Award recipient.

Zeringue, a junior from Thibodaux, La., leads the Southeastern Conference in hitting with a .419 (78-for-186) batting average. He is also ranked No. 1 in the SEC in on-base percentage (.479), No. 2 in slugging percentage (.704), No. 2 in total bases (131), No. 2 in hits (78), No. 6 in doubles (16), No. 7 in runs scored (49), No. 10 in home runs (11) and No. 12 in RBI (45).

Zeringue is batting a remarkable .462 (42-for-91) in SEC games only with three doubles, one triple, seven homers, 23 RBI and 26 runs.

He was 9-for-15 (.600) at the plate in last weekend's three-game series at Kentucky with three RBI and four runs.

Zeringue, the third-round selection of the Chicago White Sox in the 2001 major league draft, earned second-team all-SEC honors last season.

LSU has had one Golden Spikes Award winner in his history -- right-handed pitcher Ben McDonald captured the award in 1989, the year he was the nation's No. 1 overall draft pick by the Baltimore Orioles.

Nick Stavinoha Named LSWA Player of the Week May 11

Designated hitter Nick Stavinoha was named Louisiana Sportswriters Player of the Week on May 11, as he helped lead the Tigers to a series win at Kentucky. Stavinoha hit .583 (7-for-12) in three games with one double, one homer, four runs and four RBI. He recorded a .917 slugging percentage and a .643 on-base percentage in the series.

Stavinoha's two-run homer on May 8 at UK highlighted a three-run eighth inning to break an 8-8 tie and propel the Tigers to an 11-8 win.

Stavinoha has been LSU's hottest hitter in recent games, batting .526 (10-for-19) in his last five contests with two doubles, one homer, seven RBI and four runs. Stavinoha has raised his cumulative average to .337 (57-for-169) with 11 doubles, one triple, six homers, 33 runs and 38 RBI.

Clay Harris Named SEC Player of the Week April 5

LSU first baseman Clay Harris, who led LSU to a series victory at Auburn April 2-4, was named SEC Player of the Week by the league office on April 5.

Harris enjoyed a superb week, batting .467 (7-for-15) in four games with three homers, one double, eight RBI, six runs, a 1.133 slugging percentage and a .500 on-base percentage. Harris hit .455 (5-for-11) in the Auburn series with two homers, one double, seven RBI, three runs, a 1.091 slugging percentage and a .462 on-base percentage.

Harris, who led LSU in home runs last season with 16, entered the week with just one this season; however, he homered in three straight games to raise his total to four.

His solo shot at UNO on March 30 broke a 23-game drought without a homer. Harris hit a two-out, two-run blast in the top of the ninth inning April 2 at Auburn to send the game to extra innings, and his eighth-inning solo homer April 3 at Auburn tied the contest at 3-3 as LSU went on to a 5-3 win.

Harris broke a scoreless tie on April 4 at Auburn with a seventh-inning RBI single, sparking the Tigers to a 3-2 victory.

Matt Liuzza Named to Johnny Bench Award Watch List

LSU catcher **Matt Liuzza**, a sophomore from Metairie, La., was named March 22 as the SEC Player of the Week after leading the Tigers to a series victory at South Carolina.

Liuzza hit three homers and one double in the series, collecting five RBI and posting a .933 slugging percentage. He hit two homers in Game 3 (a 12-7 victory), becoming the first LSU player to have a multi-homer game this season.

Liuzza's two homers came against USC ace Matt Campbell, who had not allowed run in 27.2 innings entering the game. Liuzza hit a solo shot in the second inning to tie the game at 1-1, and his three-run blast in the fourth gave the Tigers a 4-1 lead they would never relinquish.

Liuzza was 6-for-15 (.353) at the plate in LSU's four games from March 16-21 -- including a 14-0 victory over UNO -- with one double, four homers, seven RBI and five runs.

Liuzza compiled a 14-game streak -- the longest of his career -- from Feb. 14-March 12, exceeding the 12-game streak he compiled during the 2003 season. During the 2004 streak, Liuzza batted .407 (22-for-54) with five doubles, two homers, 13 RBI and 10 runs.

Liuzza's name appears on the Johnny Bench Award "Watch List" released in early March. The Johnny Bench Award is given annually to the nation's outstanding collegiate catcher. Former LSU Brad Cresse was the first recipient of the award in 2000.

The 2004 Johnny Bench Award ceremony will take place on June 30, in Wichita, Kan.

Dirks Named To Roger Clemens Award Watch List

Freshman left-hander **Clay Dirks'** name has been added to the "Watch List" for the 2004 Roger Clemens Award, which is given to the nation's outstanding collegiate pitcher. The "Cy Young Award" of college baseball, the Clemens Award ceremony will take place on July 15 in Houston.

In a four-hit shutout of Tulane on March 2, Dirks allowed just two Green Wave runners to reach second base, and he retired 20 of the final 22 batters he faced. For that effort, Dirks was named the SEC Pitcher of the Week by the league office, and he earned National Pitcher of the Week recognition from the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association.

Dirks, a redshirt freshman from Hernando, Miss., allowed just one double and three singles against Tulane, and recorded one walk and seven strikeouts. Dirks, who was making just the third start of his collegiate career, missed the 2003 season after undergoing surgery on his elbow in the summer of 2002.

The LSU Injury Report

INF Bryan Harris -- Harris, a transfer from Santa Ana (Calif.) College, was projected to be the Tigers' starter at third base; however, a hernia operation limited his participation during fall practice, and he underwent arthroscopic surgery in January to remove bone chips from his right knee. He is scheduled to receive a medical redshirt this season.

RHP Brandon Nall -- LSU's closer at the beginning of 2003, he pitched in just six games last season before suffering a torn labrum in his shoulder, which required surgery. He could return to the mound at some point this season, depending upon the progress of his rehabilitation.

OF Quinn Stewart -- A starter in 37 games last season, Stewart had the hamate bone in his left wrist removed in early March, and he will receive a redshirt this season. Even without the wrist injury, Stewart likely would have received a redshirt this year due to the tremendous depth LSU has in the outfield. With current starting outfielders Jon Zeringue, J.C. Holt and Ryan Patterson expected to be drafted this June, Stewart should be one of the outfield starters in 2005.

Smoke Laval

HEAD COACH • THIRD YEAR

Raymond "Smoke" Laval enhanced his reputation as one of the country's top college baseball coaches, as, in just his second season at the helm of the LSU program, he guided the 2003 Tigers to the Southeastern Conference title -- LSU's first since 1997 -- and a berth in the College World Series.

Laval, the 2003 SEC Coach of the Year, directed LSU to a 45-22-1 overall record and a 20-9-1 conference mark, as the Tigers finished No. 5 in the final Baseball America rankings.

The magnificent '03 campaign augmented the success Laval enjoyed in his inaugural season as LSU's coach, as he led the 2002 Tigers to a 44-22 overall mark, an appearance in the NCAA Super Regional and a No. 11 final national ranking.

Laval, who served seven seasons (1994-2000) as the head coach at the University of Louisiana-Monroe, assumed control of the LSU program from Bertman, who led the Tigers to five NCAA championships and 11 College World Series appearances during an 18-year (1984-2001) tenure. Laval worked as Bertman's top assistant coach for 10 seasons (1984-93), helping lead LSU to its first two NCAA titles in 1991 and 1993. During Laval's 10 years as assistant coach, LSU posted a 483-182-1 record, won five SEC titles, appeared in six College World Series and captured two national championships.

Laval was known at LSU as one of the nation's best recruiters and brightest assistant coaches, as the Tigers reached the College World Series in only the third season (1986) of the Bertman-Laval regime. LSU followed the '86 CWS appearance with Omaha berths in 1987, 1989 and 1990 before the Tigers claimed the school's first baseball national title in 1991. After LSU captured its second NCAA crown in 1993, Laval departed Baton Rouge to become the head coach at Northeast Louisiana (now Louisiana-Monroe).

During his assistant coaching tenure at LSU, Laval -- who worked as the Tigers' primary recruiter - tutored 24 players who would eventually reach the major leagues. Some of the major leaguers with whom Laval worked include all-stars Albert Belle and Paul Byrd and first-round pick Todd Walker.

Laval compiled a 241-159 (.603) mark as the head coach at ULM, guiding the Indians to NCAA Regional appearances in 1995, 1999 and 2000.

Laval began his coaching career in 1977 as an assistant at Jacksonville University before moving to Wolfson High School in Jacksonville as a baseball and football coach. He served as a graduate assistant at LSU in 1979 under former Tiger head coach Jack Lamabe before working two years as an assistant at Gulf Coast Community College in Panama City, Fla.

Laval served as an assistant coach at Florida for two seasons (1982-83) before returning to LSU to work under Bertman.

Laval holds a bachelor's degree (1977) from Jacksonville in physical education and a master's degree (1979) from LSU in administration. The McDonald, Pa., native played two seasons at Gulf Coast Community College, where he lettered as a catcher. He completed his playing career at Jacksonville, where he led the ninth-ranked Dolphins in hitting at the 1976 NCAA South Regional.

Laval and his wife, Pam, are the parents of two children, Brandon and Jamie.

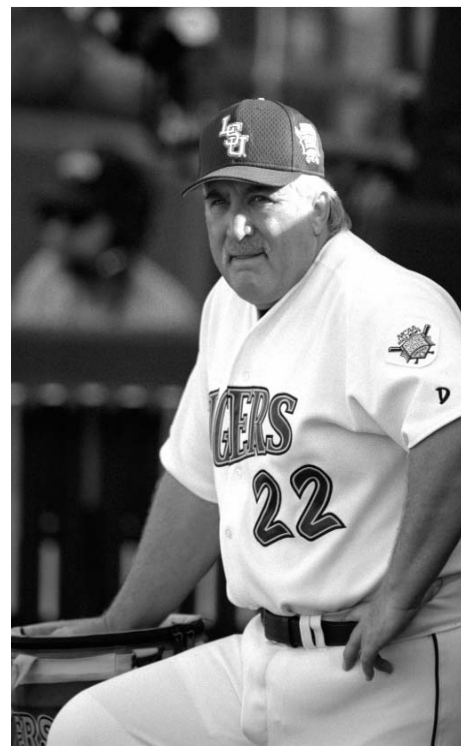
