TIGERS HOST MIDDLE TENNESSEE FOR HOMECOMING 2001

The LSU Fighting Tigers will look to build on last week's record-setting 35-21 win over Alabama and make it two victories in a row when they host Middle Tennessee at 7 p.m. in Tiger Stadium. The Middle Tennessee contest will serve as Homecoming for LSU and the Tigers will carry a 48-25-3 mark in Homecoming games into the contest. LSU has won five of its last six Homecoming games with the only blemish being last year's 13-10 loss to UAB. Middle Tennessee, winners of two straight, will carry a 7-2 mark into the contest. The Blue Raiders are members of the Sun Belt Conference and have already clinched at least a share of their conference title.

DAVEY, REED LEAD LSU TO 35-21 WIN OVER ALABAMA

Rohan Davey threw for an LSU record 528 yards on a school-record 35 completions, while Josh Reed shattered both the school and SEC records with 19 receptions for 293 yards as the Tigers upended Alabama, 35-21, in Tuscaloosa last weekend. LSU broke a 21-21 tie with four seconds left in the third quarter when Davey hit Reed with a 25-yard scoring pass. LaBrandon Toefield scored three short yardage touchdowns on the ground and put an exclamation point on his day with a 6-yard score midway through the fourth quarter to provide the final margin of victory. Defensively, linebacker Bradie James led the Tigers with 14 tackles, 13 of which were solo, while Jarvis Green added seven tackles and a pair of sacks in the victory. Ryan Clark posted the seventh interception of his career. With the win, LSU ran its road record to 3-1.

LSU FOOTBALL NOTEBOOK

LSU returns home for the first of three straight games in Tiger Stadium to close out the regular-season ... The Middle Tennessee contest will be LSU's seventh straight game without an open date ... LSU is idle next week ... The Tigers are 2-2 at home this year after posting a 6-1 mark in Tiger Stadium last season ... The Tigers wrapped up its record schedule with a 3-1 mark, only the fourth time since 1990 that LSU has posted a winning mark away from home ... LSU is 13-1 under Nick Saban when scoring at least 20 points in game ... On the other hand, the Tigers are 0-6 under Saban when failing to reach the 20-point mark ... LSU is 10-2 under Saban, including a 5-1 mark this year, when scoring first ... LSU is also 11-1 under Saban (5-1 in 2001) when leading at halftime and the Tigers are 10-1 under Saban (5-1 in 2001) when leading after three quarters ... Over his last 14 games (including the 2000 Peach Bowl), LSU QB Rohan Davey has thrown 25 TD passes compared to just six interceptions ... LSU hasn't been shutout since the Alabama game on Nov. 9, 1996 - a span of 58 games ... The Tigers are 2-0 this season, 5-0 under Saban, and 37-9 since 1990 when an LSU running back rushes for 100 yards in a game ... Overall, LSU has won seven straight games when having a 100-yard rusher ... LSU WR Josh Reed broke the SEC record for single-game receptions and yardage with 19 catches for 293 yards vs. Alabama on Saturday ... Reed enters the Middle Tennessee contest with 2,452 career receiving yards on 137 receptions ... Reed also broke the LSU record for career 100-yard games vs. Alabama as he posted the 14th 100-yard receiving game of his career, one better than Wendell Davis' 13 ... Over their last two games, the Tigers have forced six turnovers and they have responded with touchdowns on five of the six takeaways.

MORE ON MIDDLE TENNESSEE

Middle Tennessee is located in Murfreesboro, Tenn., which is just 32 miles from Nashville ... Nicknamed the Blue Raiders ... Are members of the Sun Belt Conference, which also features two teams from Louisiana - Louisiana-Monroe and Louisiana-Lafayette ... Played at the NCAA Division I-AA level through the 1998 season ... Moved to Division I-A in 1999 as an Independent for two years before joining the Sun Belt this season ... MT defensive coordinator Steve Davis served as defensive backs coach at LSU under Curley Hallman from 1991-93.

IT'S HOMECOMING THIS WEEK ON THE LSU CAMPUS

LSU will celebrate Homecoming this week as the Tigers host Middle Tennessee on Saturday night. LSU is 48-25-3 all-time in Homecoming games. Last year, the Tigers dropped a 13-10 decision to UAB on Homecoming. Overall, LSU has won five of its last six and seven of its last nine Homecoming games. LSU has also faced three current members of the Sun Belt Conference for Homecoming since 1996 - LSU beat New Mexico State, 63-7, in 1996; beat Idaho, 53-20, in 1997, and beat North Texas, 52-0, in 1999.

REED LEADS THE NATION IN RECEIVING YARDS PER GAME, RANKS SECOND IN RECEPTIONS

LSU wide receiver Josh Reed moved atop the nation in receiving yards per game with his 293-yard performance against Alabama. Through eight games, Reed is averaging 148.9 yards receiving a contest. In addition, Reed ranks second in the nation in receptions per contest with an average of 8.0 a game. Kevin Curtis of Utah State leads the nation with 9.57 catches per game. Reed also ranks first in the SEC and eighth in the nation in all-purpose yards with 163.9 yards per contest. Reed's 338 all-purpose yards (293 receiving, 40 kickoff returns, 5 punt returns) against Alabama was the second-highest total in school history trailing only the 376 yards by Kevin Faulk against Houston in 1996.

DAVEY, REED ASSAULT BOTH LSU AND SEC RECORD BOOKS

In what was perhaps the most outstanding offensive game in school history, LSU quarterback Rohan Davey and wide receiver Josh Reed combined to break or tie five SEC and LSU single-game records on Saturday against Alabama.

The following is a look at the records which were broken by Davey and Reed against the Crimson Tide:

Rohan Davey

528 yards passing - Single-game LSU record - breaks old mark of the 438 by Tommy Hodson against Tennessee in 1989. The total is only the fourth 500-yard passing game in SEC history and tied Kentucky's Jared Lorenzen for the second most single game yards in SEC history.

540 yards gained (528 passing, 12 rushing) - Ties SEC single-game record - Ties Archie Manning of Ole Miss in 1969 vs. Alabama for the most yards gained in a single-game in SEC history.

35 completions - Single-game LSU record - breaks old mark of 33 completions set by Jeff Wickersham vs. Mississippi State in 1983.

Josh Reed

293 yards receiving - Single-game SEC record - breaks both the LSU and SEC single-game record. Previous LSU mark of 248 was held by Todd Kinchen vs. Mississippi State in 1991, while the previous SEC record was 269 by Craig Yeast of Kentucky vs. Vanderbilt in 1998.

19 receptions - Single-game SEC record - breaks both the LSU and SEC record for receptions in a contest. Prior LSU mark was 14 by Wendell Davis vs. Ole Miss in 1986, while the SEC mark was 17 twice - most recently by Willie Goshua of Auburn in 1995 vs. Arkansas.

MORE ON LSU'S OFFENSIVE NUMBERS VS. THE CRIMSON TIDE

LSU's 611 yards of total offense were the most ever recorded against Alabama in the history of its program. The total eclipsed the previous mark of 609 set by Ole Miss and Archie Manning in 1969. Also, LSU's 528 yards easily surpassed the previous high against Alabama of 456 by Mississippi State in 1978. In addition, LSU's 35 completions were the most ever against Alabama, beating out the 33 completed by Manning and Ole Miss in 1969. LSU's 23 passing first downs were the most ever against Alabama, beating out the 19 by Mississippi State in 1978.

REED MOVES INTO THIRD ON LSU RECEIVING YARDS, RECEPTIONS LISTS

Almost lost in his record-setting game vs. Alabama was Josh Reed's meteoric ascent up the all-time LSU receiving lists. Reed moved into third place in both receiving yards and receptions in the Tiger victory on Saturday. Reed currently has 2,452 yards receiving, 173 shy of moving past Eric Martin for second place all-time in LSU history. Reed's 19 receptions vs. Alabama vaulted him from seventh place to third place in school history with 137 for his career. Reed is 15 catches from moving past Martin for second place in school history. Martin, who played at LSU from 1981-84, finished his career with 2,625 yards on 152 receptions.

REED 54 YARDS SHY OF SETTING LSU SINGLE SEASON RECEIVING RECORD

With 293 yards receiving against Alabama, Josh Reed became the fastest player in LSU history to reach 1,000 yards in a season (8 games). Reed enters the Middle Tennessee contest just 54 yards shy of breaking Wendell Davis' single-season receiving yard mark of 1227 set in 1986. Reed currently has 1,191 yards on 64 receptions. By averaging over 148 yards receiving per game, Reed is on pace to also break the SEC record for receiving yards per game of 132.9, which was set by Carlos Alvarez of Florida in 1969.

REED BECOMES SECOND PLAYER IN SEC HISTORY TO REACH 1,000 YARDS IN BACK-TO-BACK SEASONS

Josh Reed added another chapter to his record book on Saturday as he joined Joey Kent of Tennessee as the only players in SEC history to have back-to-back 1,000-yard receiving seasons. Actually, Reed and Kent are the only two players in the history of the league to have 1,000-yards receiving in more than one season. Period. Kent did it in 1995 and 1996.

REED BREAKS DAVIS' RECORD FOR MOST CAREER 100-YARD GAMES

With 293 yards receiving against Alabama, Josh Reed broke Wendell Davis' LSU mark for most career 100-yard games, reaching the century mark for the 14th time in his career. Reed reached 14 100-yard games in only 22 career games at the position. Wendell Davis recorded 13 100-yard games from 1984-87.

REED MOVES INTO SIXTH ON ALL-TIME LSU TOUCHDOWN LIST

With a 25-yard touchdown reception in the third quarter, Josh Reed moved into a sixth place tie on the all-time LSU receiving touchdowns list with 14, tying Carlos Carson and Eric Martin. Reed needs one more to match Eddie Fuller for fifth place with 15. Wendell Davis owns the LSU record with 19.

DAVEY SETS LSU RECORD FOR GAMES WITH 300+ YARDS PASSING

With a career-high 528 yards passing, quarterback Rohan Davey not only shattered the LSU single game record for passing yards, he posted his LSU-record fourth career game of 300+ yards passing. Davey went over 300 yards passing on a 12-yard pass to Josh Reed in the third quarter. It was Davey's third 300-yard game this season, setting an LSU record for most 300+ yard games in a single season (he threw for 356 against Tennessee and 383 against Tennessee). His other 300-yard game came against Tennessee in 2000. LSU is 3-1 when Davey throws for over 300 yards. He had shared the record for most 300 yard games with Jamie Howard who posted three from 1992-95. Davey now has three of the top seven passing performances in LSU history.

DAVEY JUMPS TO 7TH ON ALL-TIME LSU PASSING YARDAGE LIST; TIES TITLE ON TOUCHDOWN PASS LIST

With 528 yards passing vs. Alabama, Rohan Davey moved from ninth to seventh on the all-time LSU passing yardage list, moving past Chad Loup and Bert Jones in the process. Davey now has 3,409 yards passing for his career, just 542 yards behind Josh Booty for sixth place. In addition, with a pair of TD passes vs. the Crimson Tide, Davey moved his career total to 23, tying Y.A. Tittle for eighth place in school history. Davey is one shy of tying Booty (24) for seventh place and two short of Jeff Wickersham (25) for sixth place. Bert Jones stands in fifth place with 28 career TD passes.

DAVEY ON PACE TO SHATTER LSU SINGLE SEASON RECORD

With 2,341 yards passing in eight games, Rohan Davey is on pace to shatter the all-time LSU single season passing yardage record of 2,655 set by Tommy Hodson in 1989. Davey is only 315 yards shy of breaking that mark. The senior signal caller is on pace to become the first player in LSU history to throw for more than 3,000 yards in a single-season. Davey's current average of 293 yards per game puts him on a pace for 3,219 yards.

TOEFIELD BACK ON PACE TO BREAK LSU RUSHING TD MARK

With three rushing TDs vs. Alabama, LaBrandon Toefield ran his season total to 13, which puts the sophomore back on pace to break Charles Alexander's single-season mark of 17 set in 1977. Toefield's 13 rushing TDs are the most since Kevin Faulk scored 15 on the ground in 1997. Toefield also scored three touchdowns for the third time this season vs. Alabama - (3 vs. Tulane, 4 vs. Utah State, 3 vs. Alabama).

TIGERS COUNT ON TOEFIELD EARLY

LaBrandon Toefield's 3-yard touchdown on the Tigers' opening possession against Alabama marked only the third time this season that LSU scored a touchdown on its first possession. All three touchdowns have been by LaBrandon Toefield - (vs. Tulane, Kentucky, and Alabama).

CLAYTON QUIETLY HAS ANOTHER BIG GAME

Overshadowed by the gaudy numbers put up by Josh Reed, LSU freshman receiver Michael Clayton recorded his second 100-yard receiving game of his career with 124 yards on seven receptions against Alabama. Clayton also had a 41-yard catch, marking the fifth time in eight games in which he has at least one reception of 25 yards or better. For the season, Clayton has caught 30 passes for 527 yards and 5 TDs. Clayton ranks ninth in the SEC with 65.9 yards receiving a contest.

CLAYTON AND REED ARE THE NATION'S NO. 1A RATED RECEIVING DUO

Statistically speaking, Michael Clayton and Josh Reed are just about the nation's best receiving duo. Clayton and Reed are averaging a combined 214.8 yards receiving a contest, just a half yard behind the duo of Jabbar Gaffney and Reche Caldwell of Florida. Gaffney and Caldwell are combining for 215.3 yards per game, tops in the nation.

CLAYTON, REED BOTH REACH CENTURY MARK AGAIN

For the second time this season, LSU posted two 100-yard receivers in the same game as both Josh Reed and Michael Clayton eclipsed the century mark against Alabama. Reed caught 19 balls for 293 yards, both career highs, while Clayton hauled in seven passes for a career-high 126 yards. The two also both went over 100 yards in the same game in the Tigers' victory over Kentucky on Oct. 13.

JARVIS GREEN MOVES UP CAREER SACK LIST AT LSU

With a pair of sacks vs. Alabama, defensive end Jarvis Green moved from sixth place to fourth place on LSU's career sack list with 19 to his credit. The 19 career sacks ties Green with current NFL standout Chuck Wiley.

LSU FINISHES WITH WINNING ROAD RECORD FOR FIRST TIME SINCE 1997

One of Nick Saban's top priorities heading into the 2001 season was for his Tigers to take care of business on the road after managing only a 1-3 record away from Baton Rouge in his first season at LSU. The Tigers answered his call, taking a 35-21 decision at Alabama last weekend to finish 3-1 on the road during the 2001 season. The Tigers finished with a winning record on the road for the first time since 1997 when they went a perfect 4-0. It marked only the fourth time since 1990 that the Tigers had a winning record away from Baton Rouge. From 1998 to 2000, the Tigers were 2-11 on the road.

LSU BEATS BAMA IN CONSECUTIVE YEARS FOR FIRST TIME IN 31 YEARS

With a 35-21 victory over Alabama last weekend, the Tigers posted their first back-to-back wins in their series with the Tide since 1969-70. LSU has now won three of the last five meetings in Tuscaloosa dating back to 1993. The Tigers snapped a 31-year dry spell against the Tide in Baton Rouge with a 30-28 win last year.

TIGERS TOUGH TO BEAT WHEN SCORING 20+ POINTS

While the Tigers had their streak of winning under Nick Saban when scoring 20+ points against Ole Miss, they put up 35 against Alabama and won. LSU is now 13-1 under Saban when scoring better than 20 points. LSU has won 14 of 15 overall dating back to 1999 when reaching 20 points.

STREAKS EXTENDED

Free safety Ryan Clark made his 31st consecutive start dating back to the 1999 season opener against San Jose State ... Trev Faulk made his 28th consecutive start dating back to the Georgia game in the fourth week of his freshman season ... Jerel Myers made his 30th start in 31 career games with the only exception being the 1999 season finale against Arkansas when the Tigers opened in a three tight end alignment. ... Lionel Thomas' streak of 19 consecutive starts at strong safety came to an end, a streak that ranked third on the Tiger defense ... Thomas sat out the game with an ankle injury.

MORE STREAKS

With a 16-yard reception on the first offensive play of the game for the Tigers, Josh Reed extended his streak of consecutive regular season games with a catch to 22 games. Reed has caught at least one pass in every game he's played at receiver since moving to the position from running back prior to the 1999 Alabama game. In addition, Jerel Myers hauled in a 6-yard pass in the Tigers' opening drive, marking the ninth straight game he's had at least one catch, the second longest streak on the Tigers. Myers has now caught at least one pass in 30 of 31 career games.

LSU'S FINALLY TAKING ADVANTAGE OF OPPONENTS TURNOVERS

LSU has finally started taking advantage of the turnovers that it forces as the Tigers have scored touchdowns on five of their last six takeaways. Against Miss. State, LSU turned four MSU turnovers into 28 points and then against Ole Miss, the Tigers turned an Eli Manning interception into a TD. six plays later. Prior to the Mississippi State contest, LSU had only scored 17 points all season off of its 13 takeaways. The Tigers also went a span of three games - Tennessee, Florida, and Kentucky - of not scoring off a turnover. Over that three-game span, LSU had six takeaways that resulted in no points.

DAMIEN JAMES CONTINUES TO LEAD SEC IN INTERCEPTIONS

Damien James' has gone the last two games without an interception, however he still remains atop the league with five interceptions, a figure that ranks ninth nationally.

TIGER OFFENSE STILL ON RECORD PACE

LSU is on pace to break some of its most prestigious offensive records all in the same season. With 2,341 yards passing through seven games, quarterback Rohan Davey is on pace to become the Tigers' first 3,000-yard passer and break the single season LSU record of 2,655 by Tommy Hodson in 1989. On the other end of Davey's passes, Josh Reed is averaging 148.9 yards per game, which would break both the SEC and LSU record for yards per game. Carlos Alvarez of Florida (1969) holds the SEC mark with 132 yards per game. Reed is also only 54 yards away from breaking Wendell Davis' school-record of 1,244 yards receiving. Reed needs 167 to pass Travis McGriff of Florida for the SEC mark. McGriff's mark of 1,357 set in 1998. With 13 rushing touchdowns in eight games, LaBrandon Toefield is just four shy of tying and five away from breaking Charles Alexander's record of 17 rushing TDs set in 1977.

As a unit, the LSU offense is averaging 465.1 yards per game, which is on pace to break the school record of 440.3 yards per contest set by the 1987 team. Through eight games, LSU has accumulated 3,721 yards of total offense, which puts the Tigers on pace to break the school-record of 4,843 yards held by the 1987 team.

REED'S BIG PLAYS CONTINUE

Josh Reed continues to pile up huge chunks of yardage every time he gets his hands on the ball. Reed only caught three passes vs. Ole Miss, however two accounted for more than 30 yards each. Reed has at least one 30-yard reception in every game this season, and for the season, he has 12 receptions of 30 yards or better.

With five receptions for 64 yards vs. Alabama, Jerel Myers continued his consistent ways for the Tigers. Myers now has caught at least one pass in 30 of his 31 career games. The lone exception was last year's victory over Ole Miss. Myers has now caught at least one pass in nine straight games, the second longest on the team behind Josh Reed's 23 game streak. For his career, Myers has 118 receptions for 1,521 yards. The 118 receptions rank eighth in school history.

TIGERS TURN REVERSAL OF FORTUNES IN THE THIRD QUARTER

After being outscored 37-7 in the third quarter in their first five games of the season, the Tigers have outscored their opponents 49-11 in the third quarter of their last three games. The Tigers scored 14 points against Alabama last Saturday. LSU's third quarter turnaround started three weeks ago against Mississippi State as the Tigers put up 21 points against the Bulldogs. LSU followed that with 14 points against Ole Miss that gave them a 24-21 lead heading into the final quarter.

TOEFIELD CONTINUES TO LEAD THE SEC IN SCORING

With three TDs vs. Alabama, LaBrandon Toefield continues to lead the SEC in scoring with 9.8 points per game. Toefield has 13 TDs for a total of 78 points. Jeff Chandler of Florida is second in the league with 8.3 points a contest.

TIGERS SPREAD THE WEALTH IN PASSING GAME

One thing is for sure, LSU can never be accused of focusing on one receiver in its passing game as 14 different players - six split ends, four tight ends, three tailbacks and one fullback - have caught passes for the Tigers this season. Spreading the football around has become a trademark of the Jimbo Fisher offense as last year, 13 Tigers caught passes during the regular-season. The Tigers have five players - three wide receivers, one tight end and one running back - with at least 10 receptions this year.

LSU CONTINUES TO BE THE BEST IN THE LEAGUE ON THIRD DOWN

LSU continues to be the best in the SEC when it comes to third down situations as the Tigers have converted on 58 of their 114 third down opportunities this year for 50.9 percent.

LSU'S SPECIAL TEAMS COVERAGE HAS BEEN OUTSTANDING

LSU's special teams coverage continues to be outstanding as the Tigers are allowing an SEC-best 15.4 yards per kickoff return and only 4.4 yards per punt return. On 40 kickoff returns this season, the Tigers have allowed only 20 yards or more just 11 times. LSU has kicked off 45 times this year and its opponent has started outside the 20-yard line only 18 times.

HEAD COACH NICK SABAN

In his second year with the Tigers and eighth overall ... Has an overall mark of 56-33-1, which includes a 13-7 record at LSU ... Coached one season at Toledo (1990) and then spent five years as the head coach at Michigan State (1995-99) ... In first season as a head coach in 1990, led Toledo to a 9-2 mark and a share of the MAC title ... Spent the 1991-94 seasons as defensive coordinator of the Cleveland Browns ... In seven years as a collegiate head coach, has never had a losing record ... Guided Michigan State to a 9-2 overall mark and a second place finish in the Big 10 in 1999 ... In seven years, has led teams to five bowl games.

Davis finished with 266 all-purpose yards including 99 on the ground and a 71-yard punt return for a touchdown, while Clayton had two touchdowns, one rushing and one receiving.

Rohan Davey threw for an LSU record 528 yards on a school-record 35 completions, while Josh Reed shattered both the school and SEC records with 19 receptions for 293 yards as the Tigers upended Alabama, 35-21, in Tuscaloosa last weekend. LSU broke a 21-21 tie with four seconds left in the third quarter when Davey hit Reed with a 25-yard scoring pass. LaBrandon Toefield scored three short yardage touchdowns on the ground and put an exclamation point on his day with a 6-yard score midway through the fourth quarter to provide the final margin of victory. Defensively, linebacker Bradie James led the Tigers with 14 tackles, 13 of which were solo, while Jarvis Green added seven tackles and a pair of sacks in the victory. Ryan Clark posted the seventh interception of his career. With the win, LSU ran its road record to 3-1.
