#24 LSU Tigers (7-3) at Arkansas Razorbacks (5-5)

LOOKS TO GRAB A SHARE OF SEC WESTERN DIVISION TITLE AS TIGERS TRAVEL TO FACE HOGS

LSU will look to grab a share of the SEC Western Division title on Friday as the Tigers travel to Little Rock to face Arkansas in a 1:30 p.m. game on CBS. LSU shared the SEC West title with Alabama in 1996 and Auburn in 1997. The Tigers are ranked No. 24 in the nation in this Associated Press Top 25, the first time for the Tigers to be ranked since the October 11 poll in 1998. LSU, winners of four straight, enters the game with a 7-3 overall mark and a 5-2 mark in league play. An LSU win ties the Tigers for first place in the SEC Western Division with Auburn (Auburn goes to SEC Championship game). Bragging rights for "The Boot" will be at stake on Friday with the winner hanging on to the trophy for the next year. Arkansas is coming off a 17-10 overtime win over Mississippi State on Saturday and the Razorbacks (5-5 overall, 2-5 in SEC) are one win shy of becoming bowl-eligible. LSU is perhaps one victory away from securing a berth in a New Year's Day bowl game. The Tigers have won five of the last six meetings between the two schools including a 35-10 decision in Baton Rouge a year ago.

TIGERS WEAR DOWN OLE MISS, END 10-GAME ROAD LOSING STREAK, 20-9

Josh Reed hauled in eight balls for 173 yards, his sixth 100-yard receiving game of the year, while **Domanick Davis** filled in for an injured **LaBrandon Toefield** with 106 yards on 25 carries with two TDs, as the Tigers ended a 10-game road losing streak with a 20-9 victory over Ole Miss in their last outing. After falling behind 3-0, LSU quarterback **Josh Booty** hit tight end **Eric Edwards** with a 32-yard scoring strike to give the Tigers a 3-0 halftime lead. Davis added two second half TDs and the Tiger defense kept an SEC opponent out of the end zone for the second time in three weeks. **Fred Booker** led the Tiger defense with an interception in the end zone in the first half before recovering a fumble later in the game.

LSU-ARKANSAS SERIES

The LSU-Arkansas series dates back to 1901 when the Tigers took a 5-0 decision in Baton Rouge. LSU holds a 28-15-2 lead in the series, which includes a 6-3 lead in games played in Little Rock. Last year, LSU took a 35-10 win in Baton Rouge. Two years ago, Arkansas posted a 41-14 win in Little Rock. LSU has won five of the last six against Arkansas and the Tigers hold a 5-3 lead since the Hogs joined the SEC. The teams met twice in the Cotton Bowl, LSU won 0-0 in 1946 and LSU won 14-7 in 1966.

Notes On The Game:

- * LSU head coach **Nick Saban** picked up the 50th win of his coaching career.
- * **Josh Reed** moved from fifth place to second place on the LSU single season receiving yardage list with eight catches for 173 yards. Reed ended the night with 1,111 yards on the season and became only the third LSU receiver to ever post a 1,000-yard receiving season.
- * Tailback **Domanick Davis** rushed for a season-best 106 yards to go with 2 TDs in filling in for an injured **LaBrandon Toefield**.
- * LSU's defense held Ole Miss without a touchdown marking the second time this year in which the Tigers have kept an SEC opponent out of the endzone (other came in 34-0 win vs. Kentucky).
- * The win snapped a 10-game losing streak on the road for the Tigers. Nine of those losses were in SEC play.
- * With a Vaught-Hemingway Stadium record crowd of 52,476, LSU played in front of a stadium record crowd for the fifth time in 10 games during the 2000 season.

LSU VS. ARKANSAS

The LSU Tigers will look to claim a share of the SEC Western Division title against Arkansas. LSU, winners of four straight, enters the game with a 7-3 overall mark and a 5-2 record in league play. The game will be televised by CBS, the seventh time this year in which the Tigers have appeared on network television. LSU is 4-2 on TV this year, which includes a 1-0 mark on CBS (beat Alabama, 30-28).

ABOUT THE RAZORBACKS

Arkansas enters Friday game needing a win over the Tigers to become bowl-eligible. The Razorbacks are coming off a 17-10 overtime win over Mississippi State last Saturday in Starkville. Three of Arkansas' five losses have come to ranked opponents. Arkansas has won eight straight games in Little Rock, a streak that dates back to a 1997 loss to Tennessee. The Razorbacks have had 24 players miss practice or game time this year with nine of those players being out for the year.

LSU NOTES OF INTEREST HEADING INTO THE ARKANSAS CONTEST

LSU is 1-2 on the road this year with its lone win coming two weeks ago at Ole Miss ... The win over Ole Miss snapped a 10-game road losing streak for the Tigers ... LSU hasn't won back-to-back road games since 1997 when the Tigers were 4-0 away from home ... A win on Friday would give LSU eight wins, the most for the Tigers since the 1997 team won nine games ... Also, LSU has a chance to win six SEC games for the only the seventh time in school history - 1936, 1958, 1961, 1988, 1996, and 1997 ... LSU will carry a four-game winning streak into the contest and a win by the Tigers will mark their longest winning streak since the 1988 team won five straight ... With a win, LSU can go 4-1 vs. the SEC West for only the third time (1995, 1996) since divisional play began in 1992.

LSU CRACKS AP TOP 25

After a two-year absence, the Tigers are back in the Associated Press Top 25 this week as LSU is ranked No. 24 in the nation. The ranking for the Tigers is their first since holding down the No. 21 spot in the October 11 poll in 1998. LSU lost to Kentucky later that week and the Tigers had been out of the poll until this week.

THE SABAN RECORD

LSU coach **Nick Saban** won the 50th game of his collegiate career when the Tigers beat Ole Miss in Oxford on Nov. 11. Saban enters the Arkansas game with an overall mark of 50-29-1. Saban, who is in his seventh season as a collegiate head coach, guided Michigan State to four bowl games in five years. Saban opened his head coaching career at Toledo in 1990, where he guided the Rockets to a 9-2 mark and a share of the Mid-American Conference title.

Saban's string of serving six seasons as a head coach without suffering a losing record ranks as the nation's fourth-longest current streak.

LSU AND ARKANSAS BATTLE FOR "THE BOOT"

LSU and Arkansas will be playing for "The Boot", a 24-karat gold trophy in the shape of the states of Arkansas and Louisiana that resembles a boot. This marks the fifth year in which the teams have played for "The Boot". LSU has won the coveted trophy three times - 1996, 1999 and 1999 with Arkansas taking home the trophy in 1998.

"The Boot" will sit on the LSU sideline during the game and will be awarded to the winner of the contest after the game.

BOOTY'S BEEN ON A ROLL FOR LAST FOUR GAMES

LSU quarterback **Josh Booty** has had the hot hand in the Tigers' last four games as the sophomore has completed 73 of 132 passes for 1,036 yards, 10 TDs, and just three interceptions over that span. LSU is 4-0 during the stretch. Booty tied a school-record with four TD passes in LSU's 30-28 win over Alabama three weeks ago. He was named SEC Player of the Week for his efforts vs. the Crimson Tide. He followed that with a 16 of 30 performance for 290 yards and 1 TD in LSU's 20-9 win over Ole Miss. For the season, Booty has thrown 17 TD passes, which is tied for fourth in school history, and his career total of 24 ranks seventh in LSU history. **Tommy Hodson** holds both the season TD pass mark (22 in 1989) and the career mark (69). This year, Booty has completed 139 of 263 passes for 2,056 yards, 17 TDs and 13 interceptions.

TURNOVERS (OR LACK OF) HAVE BEEN THE DIFFERENCE

The secret to LSU's success this season may be pretty simple - turnovers. LSU is +9 in the turnover column in games in which they have won compared to -7 in losses. In LSU's five SEC wins this season, the Tigers have turned the ball over just five times, while LSU has five turnovers in its two league losses. LSU has gone without a turnover three times this season, including two of its last four games. LSU didn't turn the ball over in wins over Kentucky (W, 34-0), Western Carolina (W, 58-0) and Alabama (W, 30-28). During its current four-game winning streak, LSU has turned the ball over just four times (1 fumble, 3 interceptions).

LSU LOOKS FOR SECOND STRAIGHT ROAD WIN

LSU heads to Little Rock in search of its second straight road win. The Tigers snapped a 10-game road losing streak two weeks ago with a 20-9 win over Ole Miss in Oxford. LSU hasn't won back-to-back road games since the 1997 season when the Tigers posted a perfect 4-0 mark away from Tiger Stadium. All four road victories in 1997 were against SEC teams.

TOEFIELD LISTED AS QUESTIONABLE FOR ARKANSAS GAME

LSU freshman tailback **LaBrandon Toefield** is listed as questionable for Friday's game against Arkansas in Little Rock. Toefield suffered a sprained left knee in the first quarter against Ole Miss two weeks ago. Toefield, who was named the SEC Player of the Week after rushing for 119 yards and 2 TDs in LSU's overtime win over Mississippi State, leads all freshman rushers in the SEC with 682 yards and 5 TDs on 165 carries. Against Ole Miss, Toefield has just nine yards and four carries before suffering the injury.

HIGH-OCTANE OFFENSE AT HOME

LSU's success at home this season can be in part contributed to the Tiger offense. In its seven home games this year, LSU is averaged 34.7 points a contest compared to averaging 15.3 points in road games.

LSU'S RED-HOT IN THE RED ZONE

LSU enters the Arkansas contest having scored 21 of the last 24 times in which it has entered the Red Zone. LSU had scored in 16 straight visits into the Red Zone before the Tigers missed a field goal in the third quarter vs. Alabama. The streak of scoring 21 of the last 24 times in the Red Zone dates back to the Tennessee game on Sept. 30. Since then, LSU has been in the Red Zone 24 times and the Tigers have responded with 16 TDs and 5 field goals. For the season, the Tigers have been in the Red Zone 37 times and they've scored 22 TDs (11 pass/11 run) to go with 8 field goals for an 81.1 scoring percentage.

LSU'S "D" HAS BEEN GOOD ON OPENING DRIVES

LSU's defense has done a good job of keeping opponents scoreless on its opening drive as the Tigers have allowed only one touchdown this season on an opening drive. Mississippi State is the only team to score on its opening drive against the Tigers this year as the Bulldogs scored on their second play from scrimmage against LSU on Oct. 21. LSU has kept its opponent from scoring on the opening drive in 14 of the last 15 games, a streak that dates back to the Kentucky contest in Week 6 of the 1999 season.

REED CONTINUES TO CLIMB LSU RECEIVING CHARTS

Josh Reed continued his outstanding play at wide receiver vs. Ole Miss as the sophomore hauled in 8 passes for a career-best 173 yards. Reed, who converted from tailback to wideout in Week 9 in 1999, has caught 64 passes for 1,111 yards this year. He ranks first in the SEC and fourth in the nation in yards per game (111.1) and he's first in the league and 14th in the nation with 6.4 catches a contest. Reed ranks third in the SEC with 10 TD receptions, a number that ranks second in LSU history to Wendell Davis' 11 TD catches in 1986. Reed currently ranks third in LSU history in receptions in season (64) and he's second all-time in yards in a season. Davis holds both marks with 80 receptions in 1986 and 1,244 yards in 1986. Reed also has six 100-yard receiving games this year, tying the school-record held by Davis (1986).

Of Reed's 10 TD receptions this season, four have been 45 yards or longer, including a 75-yard score vs. Auburn.

Reed seems to save his best for SEC games as in seven league games this season, he's caught 52 passes for 845 yards and 9 TDs.

BOOTY CONTINUES TO MOVE UP LSU PASSING CHARTS

With 290 yards passing vs. Ole Miss, junior quarterback **Josh Booty** continued his march up the LSU career passing yardage chart. Booty currently ranks sixth in school history with 3,886 passing yards. Booty is ranked seventh place in LSU history in career TD passes with 24. **Tommy Hodson** holds the school-record for passing yards (9,115) and TD passes (69).

LSU WITHIN REACH OF TOUCHDOWN PASS MARK

With 24 touchdown passes this season as a team, the Tigers are within two TDs of tying the school-record for TD passes in a season. The 1989 team holds the school record with 26 TD passes. LSU's current total of 24 ranks second in school history. LSU had 21 TD passes in 1982 and 1986 and 20 in 1971. Currently, **Josh Booty** leads the team with 17 scoring passes, while **Rohan Davey** has seven to his credit.

ROYAL SETS SCHOOL MARK FOR TD RECEPTIONS BY A TIGHT END

Senior **Robert Royal** set the school-record for TD receptions in a single-season by a tight end with his two scoring grabs vs. Alabama. For the season, Royal has five TD receptions, breaking the previous record of four held by **Doug Moreau** (1964) and **Brian Kinchen** (1986). For the season, Royal has caught 20 passes for 311 yards and 5 TDs.

ROBINSON EXTENDS RECEPTION STREAK; MYERS STREAK HALTED

With one catch vs. Ole Miss, LSU's **Reggie Robinson** kept his streak of games with at least one catch alive. Robinson has caught at least one pass in his last 27 games, the longest active streak on the team. For the first time in his career, LSU sophomore **Jerel Myers** did not have a reception in a game. Myers had caught a pass in 20 straight game before being shutout against Ole Miss. **Josh Reed** has also caught at least one pass in 13 straight games.

LSU DEFENSE HAS YIELDED JUST TWO FIRST QUARTER TDS THIS YEAR

The LSU defense has allowed only two first quarter TDs this year as only Florida and Mississippi State have found the endzone in the opening stanza vs. the Tigers. Dating back to last season, LSU has held nine of its last 11 opponents without a first quarter TD. Through 10 games this season, LSU has allowed just 23 first quarter points (2.3 per game) compared to the 64 points (6.4 per game) the Tiger offense has put on the board during that span.

BIG PLAY RETURNS TO LSU PASSING ATTACK

LSU has feasted on big plays in its passing game this season as the Tigers have have had seven passing plays of 45 yards or longer this year.

Through 10 games this season, the Tigers have recorded 11 scoring plays of 30 yards or longer, with the latest being a 32-yard scoring play from Josh Booty to Eric Edwards against Ole Miss. So far this season, 11 of LSU's 24 scoring plays through the air have been 30 yards or longer. Last year, the Tigers had just four TD passes of 30 yards or longer, three of which came in the season-finale vs. Arkansas.

Contrary to some reports earlier this year that said that Tiger Stadium had become an easy place for opponents to play, LSU has proven otherwise as the Tigers finished their home slate with a 6-1 mark in Death Valley, which included a 4-0 mark in SEC games. Dating back to last season, LSU has won three straight games in Tiger Stadium over Top 25 teams - def. No. 17 Arkansas, 35-17, in 1999 finale, def. No. 11 Tennessee 38-31 (ot) on Sept. 30 and def. No. 13 Mississippi State, 45-38 (ot) on Oct. 21. Also, dating back to last year, the Tigers have won five straight SEC games at home, the longest streak for LSU since a 5-game streak over a span of the 1995 and 1996 seasons.

LSU FINALLY STARTING TO GET SOME CONTINUITY ON O-LINE; SAME COMBINATION TO START FOURTH STRAIGHT GAME

After shuffling the offensive line around for the first six games, the Tigers have finally settled on a starting lineup and LSU will start the same unit on the offensive line for the fifth straight game on Friday against Arkansas.

Through 10 games, the Tigers have used four different combinations on the offensive line. Prior to Week 7 of the season, LSU wasn't able to go more than two games without making a change on the offensive line. Since the Kentucky game, however, the Tigers have been able to stay with the same combination of **Rodney Reed** (LT), **Rob Sale** (LG), **Louis Williams** (C), **Dwayne Pierce** (RG), and **Brandon Winey** (RT). That combination has started four straight games, all victories, and they have helped produce 34 points vs. Kentucky, 45 points to go along with a season-best 220 yards rushing vs. Mississippi State and 30 points vs. Alabama.

So far this year, the Tigers have had three season-opening starters on the offensive line miss significant time. For the last six games, the Tigers have been without three players on the offensive line that were starters when the season-opened. Senior tackle **Trey Langely** (torn ACL) is out for the season after suffering his injury vs. Houston. Sophomore guard **Bob Wynne** (neck) hasn't played since the Houston game, while senior center **John Compton** (concussion) hasn't played since the UAB contest.

RUN DOMANICK, RUN

LSU's sophomore tailback/return specialist **Domanick Davis** has developed into one of the top all-purpose threats in the SEC. Davis ranks fourth in the SEC and 29th nationally in with an average of 131.8 all-purpose yards a contest. Davis' average of 24.1 yards on kickoff returns is third in the SEC and 24th nationally, while his 11.9 yards per punt return is third in the league and 30th in the nation.

Davis, who could start at tailback vs. Arkansas in place of the injured **LaBrandon Toefield**, rushed for a season-best 106 yards on a career-high 25 carries vs. Ole Miss on Nov. 11. Davis also scored on two 1-yard runs vs. the Rebels.

LOUIS WILLIAMS IS MR. VERSATILE ON LSU'S O-LINE

When **Louis Williams** lined up as LSU's starting center vs. Tennessee in Week 5 of the season, it marked the fourth different starting position that the senior has played during his career. Williams, who has started 32 straight games for the Tigers, has started at the following positions during his career: center (6 starts), left tackle (22 starts), left guard (2 starts) and right guard (2 starts).

DOMANICK DAVIS MOVES UP KICKOFF RETURN CHARTS; SURPASSES 1000-YARD MARK

With 92 yards in kickoff returns vs. Alabama, sophomore **Domanick Davis** became only the fourth player in school history to reach the 1,000-yard mark in kickoff returns. Davis added 54 more kickoff returns yards vs. Ole Miss to run his career total to 1,124, just 55 yards shy of moving past Eddie Kennison into second place in LSU history. **Robert Dow** holds the school-record with 1,780 yards on 70 returns. Last year, Davis set the school's single-season kickoff return record with 618 yards on 25 returns.

In two years with the Tigers, Davis has returned 45 kickoffs for an average of 24.9 yards.

WILLIAMS EXTENDS STARTING STREAK

LSU senior center **Louis Williams** made his 32nd straight start vs. Ole Miss. Williams, who has been in the Tiger starting lineup since the 1998 season-opener against Arkansas State, has the longest current starting string of any LSU player. Other starting streaks of significance are senior cornerback **Fred Booker** (26 straight), and sophomore split end **Jerel Myers** and junior free safety **Ryan Clark** each with 20 consecutive starts. Sophomore linebacker **Trev Faulk** has started 17 straight games.

LSU MAKES THE MOST OF FAULK'S FUMBLE RECOVERIES

LSU needs sophomore linebacker **Trev Faulk** to recover more fumbles. This year, Faulk has recovered four fumbles and those turnovers have resulted in 17 points for the Tigers - 3 vs. Auburn, 7 vs. UAB and 7 vs. Kentucky. The only time this year in which Faulk recovered a fumble that hasn't resulted in points came last Saturday vs. Alabama.

FAULK, WILLIAMS AND BANKS EARN A SPOT ON ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT TEAM

Linebacker **Trev Faulk**, center **Louis Williams** and fullback **Tommy Banks** have all been named to the Verizon All-Academic District VI football team, the College Sports Information Directors of America announced.

Faulk, who leads the SEC with 96 tackles, has a 3.2 grade point average in Business Administration, while Williams has a 3.785 in Pre-Medicine and Banks a 3.427 in Microbiology.

The LSU Tigers ended the 1999 season in fine fashion with a stunning upset of 17th-ranked Arkansas in Tiger Stadium, 35-10. The game came in the heels of the dismissal of head coach **Gerry Dinardo**. Interim head coach **Hal Hunter** guided the Tigers to victory.

Arkansas opened the scoring for a 3-0 lead, but LSU would own the rest of the game. An 11-yard run by **Domanick Davis** put the Tigers ahead, and **Rohan Davey** threw scoring passes of 67 yards and 48 yards to **Reggie Robinson** and **Rondell Mealey** respectively to give LSU a 21-3 margin at halftime.

The teams exchanged touchdowns in the third quarter before the Tigers closed the scoring with another long TD pass from Davey to Robinson, this time for 60 yards.

Davey finished the day with 10 completions on 12 attempts for 224 yards and three touchdowns, good enough to earn SEC Offensive Player of the Week honors

LSU RIPS W. CAROLINA, 58-0, IN SABAN ERA OPENER

The Tiger offense sizzled, amassing 507 yards of offense in the opening 30 minutes while building a 37-0 lead before ultimately defeating Western Carolina 58-0 before an LSU record 87,188 fans last Saturday. Josh Booty threw for a career high 291 yards and a pair of touchdowns passed, while Rohan Davey was a perfect 11-for-11 for 194 yards and three TD strikes as LSU wracked up a school record 485 yards passing. The Tigers wound up with 680 yards of total offense, the second highest total in LSU history and the most since 1977. Booty hit Reggie Robinson over the middle for an 80-yard strike on the third play of the game and the Tigers never looked back. Jerel Myers caught six balls for 117 yards and a pair of touchdowns, while Josh Reed hauled in five balls for 137 yards.

Rohan Davey delivered one of the more memorable performances in recent Tiger history, capping a 318-yard, 4 TD performance with a 25-yard strike to **Robert Royal** on the first play of overtime to lead LSU past Tennessee 38-31. **Damien James** broke up a fourth down pass in the Tigers' end zone by **A.J. Suggs** to secure the victory for the Tigers. Davey threw a pair of first half TD passes to **Josh Reed**, while **LaBrandon Toefield** came up with a career-best 74-yard run to help the Tigers grab a commanding 24-6 lead at the half. Tennessee mounted a furious comeback, rallying for 16 fourth quarter points to knot the game at 31 with 1:30 to go. After LSU had a 46-yard attempt blocked as regulation expired, Davey calmly led the Tigers to the deciding touchdown. Reed finished with 146 yards and three touchdowns, while Toefield had his first career 100-yard rushing game, piling up 120 yards.
