Tigers Face Tulane in Louisiana Superdome

Sixth-ranked LSU and No. 13 Tulane seek to set the college baseball single-game attendance record at 7:45 p.m. tonight when the teams meet in the Louisiana Superdome in New Orleans.

Two years ago, the state of Louisiana laid claim to the college baseball single game attendance record when an April 2002 game between Tulane and LSU drew a crowd of 27,673 in the Superdome, where LSU posted a 9-5 victory. Last season's Tulane-LSU game at the Superdome, a 9-5 TU victory, was witnessed by 18,319.

But on March 11, 2004, a crowd of 40,106 fans packed San Diego's brand new PETCO Park to watch a college game between San Diego State and Houston, breaking the mark set at the '02 Tulane-LSU contest.

Tonight's game marks the third meeting this season between LSU and Tulane. The Tigers blanked the Green Wave, 6-0, on March 2 at Zephyr Field in Metairie, before Tulane shut out LSU, 1-0, on April 6 at Alex Box Stadium in Baton Rouge.

LSU won two of three games at Tennessee last weekend, as the Tigers posted their fourth road series win against a Top 25 team. LSU has also defeated Central Florida, South Carolina and Auburn in three-game series on the road.

LSU (10-8) trails first-place Arkansas (13-5) by three games in the SEC Western Division with 12 conference games remaining this season. The Tigers play host to Alabama (6-12) this weekend in a three-game league series.

The LSU-Tulane Series

LSU leads the all-time series with Tulane, 156-118-3, as the teams first met in 1893. The Tigers have won five of the last eight games between the clubs.

LSU coach Smoke Laval has a 6-6 career mark against Tulane, while TU coach Rick Jones has a 13-15 career record versus LSU in 11 seasons as the Green Wave coach.

The Tigers enter the Tulane game Tuesday with an 11-1 mark this season against Louisiana schools, with the lone loss coming to Tulane on April 6.

LSU has won 14 of 15 games versus its in-state foes over the last two seasons. The Tigers have a 39-9 record against Louisiana schools during Laval's three-year tenure as head coach.

Tonight's game will be the 12th consecutive LSU-Tulane matchup in the New Orleans area to draw over 10,000 fans. The game marks the teams' third meeting in the Superdome (each year since 2002) and the schools have played each other at Zephyr Field in Metairie each year since 1998, including a three-game NCAA Super Regional series in 2001. Tulane has won seven of the past 11 meetings with LSU in the New Orleans area. The teams have split two games in the Superdome, and Tulane has a 6-3 mark versus LSU at Zephyr Field.

Mestepey Gets Start Tonight Versus Tulane

Junior left-hander Lane Mestepey makes his fourth career appearance and his third career start against Tulane tonight. In his three previous appearances versus the Wave, Mestepey is 0-0 with a 1.80 ERA in 20 innings, allowing 17 hits, eight runs (four earned), four walks and eight strikeouts. He pitched 2.1 shutout innings against the Wave earlier this season (April 6) in Baton Rouge, surrendering just one hit with two walks and one strikeout.

Mestepey is making his eighth start this season and second since March 20. He started last Tuesday's 21-10 victory at Southern University, but was not involved in the decision. Mestepey pitched 4.1 innings against the Jaguars, allowing eight runs (seven earned) on 10 hits with two walks and a season-high five strikeouts. Mestepey delivered a strong relief outing two week ago (April 14) against Southeastern Louisiana, limiting the Lions to two hits in four shutout innings with one walk and four strikeouts. Mestepey earned the win, the 26th of his LSU career.

Patterson Leads Tigers Last Week to Three Wins in Four Games

Junior left fielder Ryan Patterson led LSU to three wins in four games last week, batting .421 (8-for-19) with one triple, two homers, eight RBI, nine runs and a .500 on-base percentage. In LSU's series victory at Tennessee, Patterson was 5-for-15 at the plate with one triple, one homer, three RBI and five runs.

Patterson extended his current hitting streak to a team-high 14 games, the longest of his career. During the streak, Patterson is batting .415 (27-for-65) with four doubles, two triples, five homers, 21 RBI, 17 runs, a .449 on-base percentage and a .769 slugging percentage. Patterson has a .347 (67-for-193) cumulative batting average with 15 doubles, two triples, nine homers and a team-best 48 RBI.

Zeringue, Bumstead, Holt Excel in Series Win at Tennessee

- Right fielder Jon Zeringue helped lead the Tigers to the series win at UT, as he hit .583 (7-for-12) with one double, one homer, five RBI, two runs and a .533 on-base percentage.

- Senior right-hander Nate Bumstead rebounded on Sunday after a tough outing last weekend versus Georgia, when he worked just 1.1 innings. He pitched seven innings against Tennessee, limiting the Vols to one run on five hits with no walks and one strikeout as the Tigers recorded an 11-1 victory.

- Sunday's game featured an eight-run second inning by LSU, which sent 12 men to the plate in the frame. The Tigers collected eight hits in the inning, including a bases-loaded double by center fielder J.C. Holt, who extended his hitting streak to 12 games.

J.C. Holt Named to Golden Spikes Award Watch List

Junior center fielder J.C. Holt, a native of Sieper, La., is one of 30 players on the USA Baseball Watch List for the 2004 Golden Spikes Award. The award is presented annually to the nation's outstanding amateur baseball player. Holt, the 2003 MVP of the Cape Cod League, is LSU's leading hitter this season, batting .418 (74-for-177) with 15 doubles, three triples, four homers, 31 RBI, 55 runs and 12 stolen bases.

LSU has had one Golden Spikes Award winner in his history -- right-handed pitcher Ben McDonald captured the award in 1989, the year he was the nation's No. 1 overall draft pick by the Baltimore Orioles.

Smoke Laval

HEAD COACH • THIRD YEAR

Raymond "Smoke" Laval enhanced his reputation as one of the country's top college baseball coaches, as, in just his second season at the helm of the LSU program, he guided the 2003 Tigers to the Southeastern Conference title -- LSU's first since 1997 -- and a berth in the College World Series.

Laval, the 2003 SEC Coach of the Year, directed LSU to a 45-22-1 overall record and a 20-9-1 conference mark, as the Tigers finished No. 5 in the final Baseball America rankings.

The magnificent '03 campaign augmented the success Laval enjoyed in his inaugural season as LSU's coach, as he led the 2002 Tigers to a 44-22 overall mark, an appearance in the NCAA Super Regional and a No. 11 final national ranking.

Laval, who served seven seasons (1994-2000) as the head coach at the University of Louisiana-Monroe, assumed control of the LSU program from Bertman, who led the Tigers to five NCAA championships and 11 College World Series appearances during an 18-year (1984-2001) tenure. Laval worked as Bertman's top assistant coach for 10 seasons (1984-93), helping lead LSU to its first two NCAA titles in 1991 and 1993. During Laval's 10 years as assistant coach, LSU posted a 483-182-1 record, won five SEC titles, appeared in six College World Series and captured two national championships.

Laval was known at LSU as one of the nation's best recruiters and brightest assistant coaches, as the Tigers reached the College World Series in only the third season (1986) of the Bertman-Laval regime. LSU followed the '86 CWS appearance with Omaha berths in 1987, 1989 and 1990 before the Tigers claimed the school's first baseball national title in 1991. After LSU captured its second NCAA crown in 1993, Laval departed Baton Rouge to become the head coach at Northeast Louisiana (now Louisiana-Monroe).

During his assistant coaching tenure at LSU, Laval -- who worked as the Tigers' primary recruiter - tutored 24 players who would eventually reach the major leagues. Some of the major leaguers with whom Laval worked include all-stars Albert Belle and Paul Byrd and first-round pick Todd Walker.

Laval compiled a 241-159 (.603) mark as the head coach at ULM, guiding the Indians to NCAA Regional appearances in 1995, 1999 and 2000.

Laval began his coaching career in 1977 as an assistant at Jacksonville University before moving to Wolfson High School in Jacksonville as a baseball and football coach. He served as a graduate assistant at LSU in 1979 under former Tiger head coach Jack Lamabe before working two years as an assistant at Gulf Coast Community College in Panama City, Fla.

Laval served as an assistant coach at Florida for two seasons (1982-83) before returning to LSU to work under Bertman.

Laval holds a bachelor's degree (1977) from Jacksonville in physical education and a master's degree (1979) from LSU in administration. The McDonald, Pa., native played two seasons at Gulf Coast Community College, where he lettered as a catcher. He completed his playing career at Jacksonville, where he led the ninth-ranked Dolphins in hitting at the 1976 NCAA South Regional.

Laval and his wife, Pam, are the parents of two children, Brandon and Jamie.

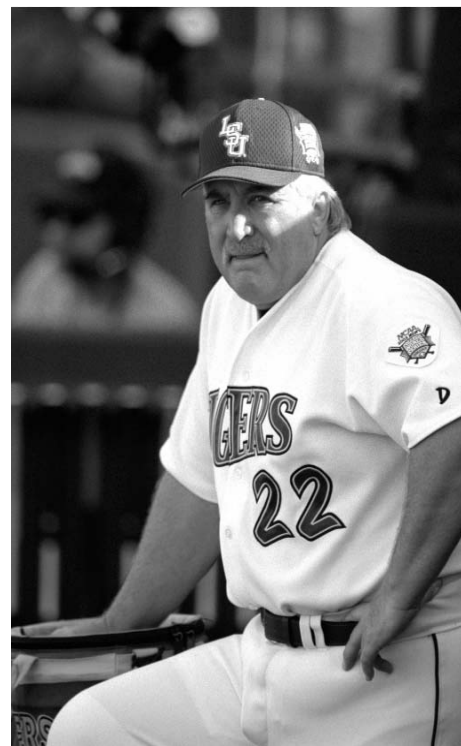

As a native of Western Pennsylvania, Raymond Peter Laval grew up as a Pittsburgh Pirates fan. He received the name "Smoke" in the late 1970s from his Gulf Coast Community College teammates, who derived the moniker from Smokey Burgess, a catcher for the Pirates in the 1960s.
