Down the stretch: LSU begins a brutal six-game stretch to close the regular season this weekend at Florida.

- LSU comes into Gainesville trailing SEC leader Alabama by 2 1/2 games. The Tigers host the Crimson Tide next weekend at Alex Box Stadium.
- The Tigers have won 16 of 20 games since the start of April after being 17-12 in the first two months of the year.
- On April 6, LSU stood last in the SEC West with a 4-6 conference mark. Since then, the Tigers have won 10 of 13 league games to move into second place in the West.
- LSU needs one win or one loss by Arkansas to clinch a spot in the SEC Tournament for a record 18th consecutive year.

Scouting the Gators: Florida has returned to elite status in the SEC under former Mississippi St. skipper Pat McMahon.

- LSU coach Smoke Laval was an assistant coach at Florida in 1982 and '83 under Jack Rhine before joining Skip Bertman at LSU.
- The weekend will be a homecoming for Tiger outfielder Matt Heath, who played for the Gators in 1999 and 2000.
- The Gators have been the SEC's top hitting team all year long, and enters the weekend batting .358, 36 points higher than second place Ole Miss. Florida also leads the league in runs scored and is second in home runs with 84.
- Florida's home run assault is led by first baseman Ryan Shealy (19) and third baseman Pat Osborn (12).
- Florida is coming off of its third SEC sweep of the season, taking all three games from Mississippi St. in Starkville. The Gators have also swept Ole Miss and Vanderbilt at home.
- Gators coach Pat McMahon is a Jacksonville native who left Mississippi St. to replace Andy Lopez in June of 2001.
- In his four years at Mississippi St., McMahon was 8-8 against LSU, including the 2001 SEC Tournament championship that the Bulldogs won 4-1.

About the Series: LSU has won the last five meetings with the Gators and holds a 41-23 all-time edge.

- LSU swept the series last year in Baton Rouge, scoring 18-10, 4-3 and 10-7 victories and have won eight of the last nine meetings.
- The Tigers also won 10-0 in last year's SEC Tournament opener in a game that was called by the 10-run rule behind a three-hit shutout from Jason Scobie.
- LSU also defeated Florida 9-6 in the 2000 SEC Tournament championship game.
- Florida's only series victories against LSU have been in Gainesville, as the Gators swept the Tigers in 1996, and won two of three in 1988 and 1998. In all three of those years, the Gators reached the College World Series.
- The Tigers are 4-0 against the Gators on college baseball's biggest stage, defeating Florida twice in both the 1991 and 1996 College World Series. In both of those years, LSU went on to win the national championship.
- The teams first met in 1971, with the Tigers winning two of three in Baton Rouge.

#46 Soph. LH Lane Mestepey (6-0, 187, Zachary—Central Private)

Lane Mestepey saw his six-game win streak ended last week in a heartbreaking 2-1 loss at Tennessee, where the Volunteers won despite getting just one hit through the first 7.2 innings. Mestepey will try to bounce back in front of what promises to be a tough Florida crowd and Gator senior left-hander Jimmy Ramsahw (4-3, 4.61).

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

2002: Is 9-3 with a 2.93 ERA on the season; 20-6 for his career.

- Did not allow a walk over a span of 33.0 innings from Feb. 23 to Mar. 23.
- Was 4-0 with a 1.89 ERA in four starts in April, and has not lost since Mar. 16.
- Has thrown nine career complete games.
- Won his 20th game in spectacular fashion vs. Arkansas (4/26), throwing a complete game four-hit shutout for his first career shutout in 35 outings. Mestepey threw 80 of his 115 pitches for strikes and did not walk a batter and allowed just one batter to reach third base.
- Despite losing to Tennessee (5/4, Game 1), Mestepey allowed just one hit through the first 7.2 innings and four hits for the game.
- Giving up a miniscule 1.25 walks per nine innings (13 in 93.1 IP).
- Gave up a career high 12 hits in 8.2 innings at South Carolina (4/19), but still earned the win.
- Pitched third complete game of the season and the seventh of his career to defeat Georgia (4/12). Gave up just two runs and struck out five.
- Earned third straight victory with 6.2 innings at Auburn (4/5), allowing just two earned runs and striking out four.
- Walked none in 6.1 innings to improve to 5-2 with win over Mississippi St. (3/30).
- Picked up second complete game victory at Ole Miss (3/23) despite walking a career-high five batters.
- Gave up five runs (four earned) on nine hits in last outing vs. Vanderbilt (3/16).
- Earned second consecutive LSWA Pitcher of the Week honor for effort vs. UL-Monroe (3/9), giving up one run in eight innings.
- Earned complete-game victory at Houston (2/23), giving up just one run on six hits in the final 7.0 innings.
- Followed up Houston game with brilliant 8.0 inning stint vs. Long Beach St. (3/2, Game 2), striking out a career-best eight to improve to 2-0 to earn LSWA Pitcher of the Week honors.
- Struck out six in 7.0-plus innings against Birmingham-Southern (2/9). Carried a shutout into the eighth inning.
- Has 11 quality starts (6.0+ IP, <4 ER) out of 13 this season.

2001: Led the SEC in victories (11) and ERA (3.75), going 11-3 in 22 games (19 starts), pitching 139.1 innings.

- Named the national Freshman of the Year by Collegiate Baseball and was a third team All-American by the same publication.
- Named the 2001 SEC Freshman of the Year and was a first team All-SEC selection.
- Allowed two or fewer earned runs in 11 of 19 starts.
- Yielded only 2.39 walks per nine innings.
- Went 7.1 or more innings in his first eight SEC starts.
- Named SEC Pitcher of the Week on Apr. 16 for sterling Easter Sunday effort vs. Ole Miss. In complete-game victory, Mestepey walked none and scattered nine hits. Was 2-0 with a 1.20 ERA in two outings in 2001 against the Rebels.
- Four days before the Ole Miss victory, he allowed only one earned run over 7.2 innings against Tulane at Zephyr Field.
- Got victory in first career start vs. Kansas St. on Feb. 11, giving up six hits in 6.0 innings.
- Had superb effort in no-decision at Georgia on Mar. 10, giving up one earned run and striking out six in 7.2 innings.
- Fell just short of shutout on Mar. 24 at Mississippi St., allowing one run and no walks while fanning six over 8.1 innings.
- First complete-game came vs. Kentucky on Mar. 30, giving up one earned run and striking out five.
- Did not lose until Apr. 20 vs. Vanderbilt, and even in that loss, he threw a complete game.
- Turned in spectacular complete-game effort at Alabama on Apr. 27, giving up one earned run and fanning six to start LSU on its way to a three-game sweep in Tuscaloosa. He retired 18 of 19 batters faced in the fourth through eighth innings.
- Allowed no earned runs over 6.0 innings of victory vs. Ole Miss at SEC Tournament May 17.
- Made last effort of the year his best, going 10.0 innings and striking out six in Super Regional at Tulane, a game LSU won in 13 innings.

Ticket to Omaha?

For some reason, when LSU and Florida get together in Gainesville, more often than not one of the two teams will end up at the College World Series.

Since the league went to round robin play in 1986, the Tigers have visited Florida in every even-numbered year except 1994, when the teams did not play due to the SEC schedule rotation at the time. Since 1986, the Tigers have made the CWS in five of the seven years in which they have visited Gainesville, all except for 1988 and 1992.

For Florida, getting a series victory here might just go a long way in punching the Gators' ticket to Omaha. The Gators have won just three series from LSU all-time, and all came at home—in 1988, 1996 and 1998. In all three of those years, Florida appeared in the CWS, but never could get past the semifinal round. In fact, in 1996, the Gators swept LSU in Gainesville, then won a fourth meeting at the SEC Tournament in Birmingham, only to drop two decisions at Omaha to the eventual national champion Tigers.

Dominance of East on the line

This weekend's series marks the Tigers' last set against an SEC East foe this season, and the Tigers need one win to keep an impressive streak going.

In every season since the conference went to division play in 1992, LSU has had a winning record against the East Division. LSU enters the weekend 7-5 against the East after a 2-1 series win at Tennessee. LSU swept Georgia in April, but dropped to 0-3 to Vanderbilt in March and South Carolina in April.

The Tigers are 109-42-1 (.720) against the East since 1992, and have never lost three series in one season to the other side, something that will happen if Florida can take two this weekend.

Different time of the year

When LSU and Florida meet in May, it always has been in the SEC Tournament, save for one CWS meeting in 1991...until this year, that is.

This is the latest LSU and Florida have ever met in the regular season, beating the old mark of April 24-26 of 1998. In fact, since 1986, eight series have taken place in March.

The Tigers and Gators have split 14 meetings in May, but LSU has won the last two in the 2000 and 2001 SEC Tournaments.



Heath comes home

For the first time since leaving Florida after the 2000 season, LSU outfielder Matt Heath will get the chance to play in his home state this weekend when the Tigers face the Gators.

Heath, a native of Fernandina Beach, played for coach Andy Lopez for two seasons, batting .281 with four home runs in 34 games, but injuries limited him to nine games in 2000. Heath was 4-for-9 with a pair of doubles in the Gators' 1999 series against LSU in Baton Rouge, where the Tigers won two of three.

Heath certainly did some damage to his former mates in 2001, batting .583 (7-for-12) with 5 RBI in four LSU victories. In the SEC Tournament meeting last May 16, Heath went 3-for-3 with a triple, a home run, 3 RBI and three runs scored in a 10-0 Tiger rout.

Heath enters the weekend coming off of two of his best performances of the season at Tennessee. In Saturday's second game, he tied a school record for hits by going 5-for-6 to help LSU drub the Vols 16-4 and set a school record for hits in an away game with 24. One day later, his three run home run in the fifth inning put the game out of reach in a 6-2 Tiger triumph.

Heath is batting .296 for the season with five home runs, but is hitting .333 in SEC play despite going through a 4-for-30 slump that extended through the first game of the Tennessee series.

Tiger hit parade

Tennessee southpaw Ben Riley may have held LSU to five hits in the first game of last Saturday's series in Knoxville, but the Vols were powerless to stop the Tigers' hit parade in the final two games.

LSU collected an amazing 39 hits over the final two games, both Tiger victories, the most LSU has had over a two-game stretch since banging out 40 in two games against Duquesne last year.

The 24 hits LSU had in the second game against the Vols were a school record for a game away from Baton Rouge, and just one shy of the record for an SEC game and three short of the overall school record.

The Tigers have now had 15 or more hits in four of their last five games (all victories), and are 10-0 when rapping out 15 or more hits.

All of those hits have done wonders for LSU's batting average, which has risen by 10 points to .309 over the last six games, and five regulars in the Tiger lineup are hitting at .343 or better.

Pontiff earns academic honors

Not only is Wally Pontiff one of LSU's top hitters, but also one of the Tigers' top performers in the classroom as well.

Pontiff earned two academic awards this week, first being named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll for the second consecutive year. The junior from Metairie carries a 3.25 GPA in biology, and was one of five current Tigers to be named by the league office to the honor roll.

On Thursday, Pontiff was named to the Verizon District VI Academic Team, which includes players from Louisiana, Texas, Arkansas, New Mexico and Mississippi. Pontiff is now eligible for Academic All-America honors, something only four players have achieved: Tim Lanier (1994), Warren Morris (1995), Eddy Furniss (1996-98), Chris Demouy (1996),

Of course, Pontiff continues to hit, as he enters the weekend with a .365 batting average and ranks in the top 10 in three LSU career categories: batting average (8th at .355), doubles (8th with 47) and hits (10th with 237).

Barker earns LSWA honor with big week

Sean Barker won Louisiana Sportswriters' Player of the Week honors on Tuesday after a tremendous performance in the Tigers' four games last week, when he went 11-for-19 with 6 RBI and a 1.053 slugging percentage.

Barker's big game came in the second game of last Saturday's doubleheader against Tennessee, when he went 4-for-5 with three doubles, four RBI and three runs scored in the Tigers' 24-hit attack in a 16-4 triumph. Barker added three more hits on Sunday and finished the series in Knoxville at 9-for-14 (.6430) with a pair of home runs.

After being stuck in third place in the team batting race since the return of Aaron Hill, Barker's binge moved him to the top of the list with a .392 batting average, as the California native continues to lead the Tigers in RBI (50) and stolen bases (19). He heads into the weekend seventh in the league in batting average.

Barker, despite playing just under two seasons, has now taken over second place on the all-time LSU batting list at .376, trailing only Todd Walker, who hit .396 during his three All-America seasons from 1992-94.



Wilson, Tompkins strikeout machines
Prior to the Tigers' April 30 game against New Orleans, only Bo Pettit had struck out 10 or more batters in a game, and he had done so three times.

Last week, two Tigers cracked double figures in strikeouts. The first was Jake Tompkins, who was making a rare start since his move to the bullpen at the end of March. Tompkins struck out 10 in 4.2 innings in a 13-0 victory over UNO, then came back on Sunday at Tennessee and fanned two more in 2.0 innings. For the year, Tompkins has struck out 71 in 63.2 innings and walked only 24.

Brian Wilson did Tompkins one better last Saturday against Tennessee when he fanned 11 over 8.0 innings, as Wilson did not allow a run over his final seven innings after giving up four in the first.

The Tigers' 364 strikeouts on the year leaves them second in the SEC behind South Carolina's 419 heading into the weekend at Florida.

Pettit struck out 12 on Feb. 15 against Mercer and Mar. 15 against Vanderbilt, and also fanned 10 on Mar. 8 against Louisiana-Monroe.

Tiger trio among SEC best in ERA
LSU continues to stand second in the SEC with its 3.59 team ERA, trailing only Alabama at 3.36. Three Tigers also find themselves among the top 10 in the league in ERA.

Jake Tompkins comes into the weekend second in the league with his 2.69 ERA, trailing only league leader Blake Taylor of South Carolina, as the Gamecocks closer is on his way to the ERA crown with at 1.62. Just behind Tompkins are Lane Mestepey in fourth at 2.93 and Brian Wilson in sixth at 2.98.

South Carolina and Mississippi State also have two pitchers in the top 12 in ERA, but no other SEC school has three, a testament to the Tigers' deep pitching staff, which has posted a 2.71 ERA in going 16-4 since the beginning of April.

Although it is possible a collapse could take place with Florida and Alabama looming on the schedule, the Tigers are on pace to better the 4.74 ERA of 2001 and post their first season ERA under four since a 3.38 mark in 1996, the only time since 1994 the ERA has been under four. Under Skip Bertman, LSU's ERA was under four eight times in 18 years, including seven straight years from 1987-93.

Not giving up extra
LSU no longer has given up the most hits in the SEC; that distinction now belongs to Tennessee (in no small part thanks to the 44 hits LSU collected last weekend in Knoxville), but the Tigers still are the kings of giving up the single.

That's because of the 470 hits LSU has yielded this year, only 102 have gone for extra bases. The Tigers have given up the fewest doubles along with Ole Miss (74), the second fewest triples (4) and the fewest home runs (24). That total is way down from the 170 extra base hits (105 doubles, 14 triples, 51 home runs) allowed in 2001.

Still double play kings
LSU recorded "only" three double plays in the three games at Tennessee, but it was enough to keep them on top of the SEC in double plays turned, as the Tigers have recorded 54 twin killings this year, one better than Auburn, with Georgia (51) and Mississippi State (50) also having recorded at least 50 double plays.

The Tigers still are in the bottom three in the league in fielding percentage, but it has steadily risen all year, as the Tigers now stand at .959 on the season, helped by a .971 percentage since the beginning of April.

Going the distance
LSU pitchers have been among the most durable in the SEC, as evidenced by the seven complete games thrown by Tiger hurlers, the second most in the conference this season behind Alabama's eight.

Five of those complete games belong to sensational southpaw Lane Mestepey, who is tied with Alabama's Lance Cormier for the league lead. Cormier and Mestepey have pitched more complete games than eight of the 12 teams in the conference. Three teams in the league have just one complete game, while Georgia has none.

With his complete game in the 2-1 loss at Tennessee last Saturday, Mestepey gave the Tigers more complete games this year than they had in 2001 (six in 67 games). Bo Pettit (3/15 vs. Vanderbilt) and Brian Wilson (4/27 vs. Arkansas) have the Tigers' other complete games, both of which were shutouts. LSU and Auburn are tied for the league lead in complete game shutouts with three.



Holt still hot

J.C. Holt hasn't played much in recent weeks, but when he has, he's been the Tigers' hottest hitter. Since the start of April, Holt is batting .447 (21-for-47) with three home runs, 16 runs scored and a surprising .745 slugging percentage.

Holt has now hit safely in the last 10 games in which he has played, including 8-for-11 in his last three outings. Holt is only the second LSU player to have a double-digit hitting streak, joining Wally Pontiff, who has streaks of 19 and 12 games this year.

With runners in scoring position and two outs, the Tigers have nobody better this year, as Holt is 7-for-16 (.438) in those situations, as eight of his 21 RBI have come with RISP and two out. Holt is batting .360 in all situations with runners on base and two out.

For the year, Holt is batting .352, and he has been even better in clutch situations, batting .389 (14-for-36) with runners in scoring position and .324 with two out. Despite being a left-handed hitter, he is 6-for-11 when gets the opportunity to bat against southpaws.

RISP still rising

The Tigers continue to hit the ball well with runners in scoring position, as evidenced by their 14-for-33 effort in the final two games of the Tennessee series. The Tigers' .306 RISP average may still be only seventh in the SEC, but it's a far cry from 11th, which is where LSU was at the end of March.

Since the start of April, LSU is ripping at a .360 clip with RISP, as the Tigers have scored 170 runs and socked 29 home runs during that stretch.

In SEC play, the Tigers have performed better than their overall season average, batting .336 with RBI opportunities, which is 37 points than the final 2001 season RISP average of .299 in SEC competition.

Aaron Hill continues to hit well in clutch situations, as his .408 RISP average attests to. Also above .350 are J. C. Holt (.389), Sean Barker (.384), and Jason Columbus (.357)

But the new leader in RISP average is Chris Phillips, who is hitting .419 (13-for-31) in those key situations. Phillips has an incredible .526 RISP average since April began.

On the year, Phillips is batting .343 and is hitting a stellar .432 (16-for-37) in the Tigers' last 10 games.

Double vision

The Tigers' first game loss at Tennessee broke a string of 22 consecutive games in which LSU recorded at least one double.

The Tigers simply went out and started a new streak in the second game by rapping eight doubles, a season high by far and just two shy of the school record of 10 in the 1996 South II Regional Final against Georgia Tech.

Three Tigers had two doubles in a game at Knoxville, highlighted by Sean Barker's school record tying three in last Saturday's second game.

LSU now has 102 doubles on the year, including 66 since March 23, when the former streak of games with at least one double began.

Looking good late

In three of the Tigers' last five games, LSU has scored nine or more runs in the seventh inning or later to help turn close games into routs.

It started on Apr. 28 against Arkansas, when LSU scored nine times in the final two innings, including seven in the eighth, in a 13-5 triumph. It continued with 11 runs over the final three innings of a 13-0 win at New Orleans on Apr. 30, and 14 runs in the final three to defeat Tennessee 16-4 on May 4, overcoming a 4-0 deficit in the process.

For the year, the Tigers are batting a robust .334 after the seventh inning, and have scored 141 of their 356 runs in the late innings. The Tigers have outscored their opponents 142-101 after the seventh inning, including a 71-29 clip since the start of April. LSU has scored 59 and 56 runs in the seventh and eighth innings, respectively.

Best bet for late heroics? Try Sean Barker, who is hitting a cool .473 (27-for-57) in the late innings, along with Chris Phillips at .455 and Wally Pontiff at .431.

The Big Comeback

LSU's rally from a 4-0 deficit to win the second game of the Tennessee series last Saturday tied the largest deficit the Tigers have overcome to win this year. LSU won 8-4 at Houston on February 23 after trailing 4-0 going into the fifth inning.

In all, LSU has overcome deficits in 14 of its 33 victories this season, but has not won a game on its final at-bat since March 3 against Long Beach St.

LSU coach Smoke Laval
 Ray "Smoke" Laval may be following a legend at LSU in Skip Bertman, but Laval is no stranger to the LSU program, having served 10 years (1984-93) under Bertman as his top assistant and as a graduate assistant to Jack Lamabe (1979) before that.

Laval, who was named Bertman's successor on July 18, 2000, came back to Baton Rouge after seven successful seasons at Louisiana-Monroe. Laval guided the Indians to a 241-159 record from 1994-2000 and led ULM to three NCAA regional appearances, including the regional final in 2000 against LSU. He was named the Southland Conference Coach of the year in 1999 and led the Indians to the SLC crown in 1999 and 2000.

During Laval's tenure as Bertman's top assistant, LSU won 483 games, reached the College World Series five times, and won the national championship in 1991 and 1993. Laval worked with 24 future major league players during that time and recruited nine first-team All-Americans.

 This weekend in the SEC
 With no midweek games, we'll preview the penultimate weekend of SEC play in the 2002 campaign. LSU visits Florida this weekend before hosting Alabama to close the season. Here's a look at the rest of the league:

Mississippi St. at Alabama—Rivals separated by just 80 miles of US 82, but by much more than that in the standings. Bulldogs need big bounce back after being swept by Florida, but will be hard to get it at "The Joe", where Alabama is 28-2 this year. Tide lost two at Georgia and need to keep one-half game lead over South Carolina.

Georgia at Auburn—Another "backyard" battle, as the Bulldogs look to keep momentum from big series win over Alabama going, but have been inconsistent on the road (5-7 in the league on the road, 9-3 in Athens). Auburn won three one-run decisions from Vandy on final at bat to overtake MSU for 7th seed in SEC Tourney.

Tennessee at South Carolina—Vols fighting for post-season life, but Gamecocks might pull the plug, as Carolina is playing for the overall league title. Big Orange stole first game from LSU, but gave up 39 hits in two losses; Gamecocks won two from slumping Ole Miss.

Arkansas at Ole Miss—Rebels looking to get healthy and put Razorbacks' post-season hopes to rest. Hogs, meanwhile, became first team in more than a year to lose a series to Kentucky (at home, no less).

Kentucky at Vanderbilt—Two teams out of the post-season race entirely meet in Music City. Bat Cats on high of road series win at Arkansas; Commodores low after three last at-bat losses at Auburn.

Next weekend: Alabama at LSU; Ole Miss at Mississippi St.; Auburn at Arkansas; South Carolina at Georgia; Florida at Kentucky; Tennessee at Vanderbilt.
