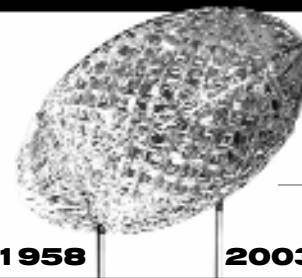

Tigers Close Out 2004 Home Slate Against Ole Miss

LSU closes out its 2004 home schedule on Saturday and in the process the Tigers will go after their 10th straight win in Tiger Stadium when Ole Miss comes to town for a 7 p.m. contest. The game will be broadcast on LSU's in-house pay-per-view network, TigerVision. LSU, winners of four straight overall, ran its record to 7-2 overall and 4-2 in league play following a 26-10 win over Alabama last week in Tiger Stadium. Ole Miss, losers of three straight, is 3-6 overall and 2-4 in SEC action. Last year, LSU posted a 17-14 win over the Rebels in Oxford. Saturday will also serve as Senior Night for the Tigers as eight members of the 2004 Class will be recognized prior to the game. The seniors that will be recognized include: QB Marcus Randall, CB Corey Webster, C Ben Wilkerson, CB Travis Daniels, LB Lionel Turner, DE Marcus Spears, LB Dorsett Buckels and WR Steve Mares. LSU will bring a 6-0 mark in Tiger Stadium in 2004 into the Ole Miss game. The Tigers haven't gone perfect at home since 1972 when LSU went 7-0. LSU, which has now won at least 7 games in all five years under Nick Saban, will bring the nation's No. 3 rated defense (249.8 yards per game) into the Ole Miss contest. The Tigers are No. 4 in the nation in pass defense (149.9 ypg) and 10th in the country in scoring defense (15.2 points per game). Offensively, Marcus Randall and JaMarcus Russell continue to share the QB position. The Tigers are averaging 27.7 points per game and 388 yards (172.6 rushing, 215.4 passing) a game.

Defense, Running Game Leads LSU Past Alabama, 27-10

LSU's defense scored for the third time in 2004 and the Tigers rushed for 192 yards against the nation's No. 1 rated defense in the 26-10 win over Alabama. Trailing 10-6 at halftime, DE Marcus Spears sacked Spencer Pennington deep in Alabama territory forcing a fumble that LB Cameron Vaughn picked up and ran 8 yards for the go-ahead score. Leading 13-10, the Tigers increased the margin to 20-10 on a 35-yard TD pass from JaMarcus Russell to Joseph Addai with 9:38 left in the contest. Addai capped the scoring with a 47-yard run with just over 4 minutes left in the contest. In what was projected as a defensive battle, the Tigers got the upper hand, holding the Crimson Tide to just 196 yards of offense, which included just 82 yards on the ground. The Tigers also intercepted a pass in the game, that coming by Corey Webster in the endzone that thwarted an Alabama drive that could have put the Crimson Tide up 11 early in the third quarter. Instead, Webster returned the interception 44 yards, switching both the momentum of the game as well as the field position into LSU's favor. For the game, Addai led the Tigers with 99 yards rushing, while Alley Broussard added 84 yards for LSU. Defensively, Spears paced a Tiger attack with 8 tackles, 2 sacks, 2 QB hurries and a forced fumble.

For years outsiders viewed the LSU football program as an unpolished gem, a potential giant waiting to be reborn in the world of college football. With the wealth of resources LSU has to offer, its tradition and the available talent within the state of Louisiana, all the program needed was the right person to lead it. In four years as head coach of the Tigers, Nick Saban has proven to be that leader.

Since taking over a program that suffered through seven losing seasons in the 1990s, Saban has guided the Tigers to the pinnacle of college football - winning the 2003 BCS National Championship with a 21-14 victory over Oklahoma in the Nokia Sugar Bowl. The victory culminated a four-year ride under Saban that has been unmatched in the history of Tiger football. Since taking the reigns in 2000, Saban has guided the Tigers to a 46-15 overall mark, while claiming a pair of SEC titles in 2001 and 2003. LSU's 2003 BCS National Championship is just the second for the Tigers in football, and the first since 1958.

Saban's ability to successfully lead the Tigers comes from a management style that focuses on the entire program, one that puts his players in position to have success, both on the field and in the classroom. Armed with a plan that starts with recruiting quality people, outstanding football players and good students, Saban and his staff have transformed LSU into a team that is sure to be a fixture among the nation's elite programs for years to come.

On the field, Saban has developed a reputation as a defensive mastermind who is among the best in the game - professional or college - when it comes to game day coaching decisions. His defenses are physical, aggressive and deceptive, while offensively, the Tigers put up staggering numbers with a wealth of skill players leading the way. His teams play hard, make good decisions on the field and have proven that they are confident enough to overcome any type of adversity that is thrown in their direction.

It's a style and system that has proven to be successful, both for the team as well as the individual as six Tigers have earned First Team All-America honors in four years, while 18 of his LSU players have gone on to be selected in the NFL Draft, including six in the 2004 draft.

Off the field, Saban demands excellence from his players in both the classroom as well as the community. While the Tigers were marching to the 2003 national title on the field, the LSU football team combined for a 2.52 grade point average. A few months later, the squad bettered that mark with a 2.76 average for the spring semester as the Tigers had 50 players with a 3.0 or better during the spring and just six athletes that failed to reach a 2.0.

In addition to the honors the Tigers garnered on the field, LSU had 25 players earn a spot in the SEC Academic Honor Roll in 2003. Once again, numbers that show not only is Saban committed to academics, but his players are also dedicated to receiving an education as well. Since December of 2000, 51 football players who played under Saban at LSU have earned their degree, which includes 13 members of the 2003 national championship squad.

A major part of enhancing and cultivating the education experience for the student-athletes at LSU has been the addition of the \$15 million state-of-the-art Cox Communications Academic Center for Student-Athletes. Saban spearheaded the fundraising for the center, which included donating \$50,000 of his own money to the cause. The center, the best of its kind in college athletics, features a 1,000-seat auditorium with over 100 computers in a 54,000-square foot facility that gives all of LSU's student-athletes the best chance to have success in the classroom.

Saban's mission statement for the LSU football program is simple. He wants his players to become better people for having been a part of the program. He also wants to develop his players so they can reach their full athletic potential, which will enable them to have the opportunity to win a championship. Finally, it's his plan to help each player graduate and launch their career so that when they leave LSU they can have the best opportunities to be successful in life.

Prior to LSU, Saban spent five years as the head coach at Michigan State, where he built the Spartans into a perennial Big Ten contender after going to four bowl games in five years.

The Game

The Tigers return to on Saturday in their final home game of the season as LSU hosts Ole Miss at 7 p.m. in Tiger Stadium. The Tigers enter the Ole Miss contest riding a 4-game winning streak following wins over Florida (24-21), Troy State (24-20), Vanderbilt (24-7) and Alabama (26-10). LSU is 7-2 overall and 4-2 in conference play. Ole Miss, 35-3 losers to Arkansas last week, is 3-6 overall and 2-4 in league play.

Who's In And Who's Out For The Tigers

LSU enters Ole Miss week with four players out of action. Senior C **Ben Wilkerson** ruptured the patella tendon in his left knee against Vanderbilt and is out for the remainder of the season. Wilkerson underwent successful surgery to repair the tendon on Nov. 1. In addition to Wilkerson's injury, freshman WR **Xavier Carter** fractured his clavicle following a kickoff return against Vanderbilt and will miss 4 to 6 weeks of action. Other injuries for the Tigers include WLB **Dorsett Buckels**, who tore the ACL in his knee in the opening kickoff against Florida and will be sidelined for the remainder of the year. In addition, DB **Mario Stevenson** (foot) has been out since the first week of the season after suffering a broken bone in his foot. Stevenson's timetable for a return is still uncertain at this time.

In The Polls

The Tigers moved up three spots to No. 14 in the Associated Press poll this week. The Tigers slid one spot to No. 14 in the USA Today/ESPN Coaches poll. LSU has been ranked for 31 consecutive ranking periods in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches poll and for 30 straight in the Associated Press poll.

It's Senior Day in Tiger Stadium

LSU will honor its senior class on Saturday in Tiger Stadium as the 8-member Class of 2004 will be recognized on the field prior to the game. Seniors on this year's LSU team include: QB **Marcus Randall**, CB **Corey Webster**, C **Ben Wilkerson**, CB **Travis Daniels**, LB **Lionel Turner**, DE **Marcus Spears**, LB **Dorsett Buckels** and WR **Steve Mares**. This year's senior class has combined to post a 38-11 record, win two SEC titles and one national title. In addition, the senior class will have gone to a bowl game each year.

About Ole Miss

Ole Miss is 3-6 overall and 2-4 in SEC action ... The Rebels are coming off a 35-3 loss to Arkansas and they've dropped three straight games since a 31-28 road win over South Carolina ... Ole Miss is averaging 19 points per game, while giving up 27.6 points a contest ... Ole Miss uses a 3-player rotation at quarterback with Ethan Flatt, Michael Spurlock and Robert Lane all seeing action for the Rebels ... Flatt has started 6 of their 8 games and leads the Rebels with 1,425 passing yards and 6 TDs ... Vashon Pearson has rushed for 640 yards for the Rebels ... PK Jonathan Nichols is one of the top kickers in the country, having connected on 15 of 21 field goals this year ... P Cody Ridgeway is second in the SEC with a 42.6 average ... David Cutcliffe is in his sixth season at Ole Miss with a 43-28 mark.

LSU has 3 players on its roster who call Mississippi home. Among those are offensive lineman **Will Arnold** from Gloster, defensive end **Sean Merrill** from D'Iberville, and tight end **Mit Cole** from Picayune.

LSU Runs Tiger Stadium Winning Streak To 9 Straight

LSU's 26-10 win over Alabama ran the Tigers' home field winning streak to 9 straight, a streak that covers all 6 games in 2004 and the final three home games in 2003. The last time LSU lost at home came on Oct. 11, 2003 when Florida posted a 19-7 win over the Tigers. Since then, LSU has outscored its opponents 335-102 at home for an average of 37.2-11.3 in those 9 games. The 9-game home winning streak is the longest for LSU since the Tigers won 15 straight at home from 1971-73. That streak started with a 28-8 win over Notre Dame on Nov. 20, 1971 and continued all the through a 26-7 win over Mississippi State on Nov. 17, 1973. Alabama snapped the streak a week later with a 21-7 win over LSU on Nov. 22, 1973. LSU hasn't had a perfect record at home since going 7-0 in Tiger Stadium in 1972.

LSU On A Nice Run - Tigers Are 20-3 Over Last 23 Games

Dating back to the start of the 2003 season, LSU has won 20 of its last 23 games. The 20-3 record is the best by an LSU team since the early 1970's when the Tigers were 20-2-1 over a 23-game span that covered the last two games of the 1971 season, all 12 games in 1972 and the first 9 games in 1973. Including the last 4 games of the 1971 season, LSU actually went 22-2-1 over a 25-game span from 1971-73.

Tigers Win Battle of Nation's Top Defenses

Last week's game against Alabama was billed as an old-school battle between two of the nation's top defenses. Alabama came in ranked No. 1 in the nation in both total defense and pass defense, while the Tigers were No. 4 in both categories. LSU's defense had the upperhand in the contest, holding the Crimson Tide to just 10 points and only 196 yards of offense. The LSU defense also shutout the Crimson Tide in the second half, while scoring a TD of its own in the third quarter on an 8-yard fumble return for a score by Cameron Vaughn.

Spears Still In Running For Two National Awards

LSU DE **Marcus Spears** is still in the running for a pair of national awards, having made the semifinalist cut for the Bednarik Award and the Lott Trophy. Spears is one of 12 semifinalists for the Bednarik Award, which goes to college football's outstanding defensive player. He's one of 7 semifinalists for the Lott Trophy, which is given to college football's defensive IMPACT player of the year, which is someone who has had the biggest impact on his squad both on and off the field. IMPACT stands for integrity, maturity, performance, academics, community and tenacity, all characteristics exhibited by Lott during his playing career. Through 9 games, Spears has 35 tackles to his credit and he ranks second in the SEC with 12 tackles for losses. Spears also has 17 QB hurries, 5 sacks and he's returned an interception 35 yards for a touchdown.

Niswanger Named First Team Academic All-District

LSU OL **Rudy Niswanger** has been named first-team academic all-district by the College Sports Information Director's of America, the organization announced on Friday. Niswanger, a native of Monroe, La. maintains a 4.0 grade point average in pre-medicine. Niswanger, who is a junior, will start at center for the second straight game against Ole Miss.

LSU's Been Nearly Unbeatable In November Under Saban

With the win over Alabama, the Tigers ran their November record in 2004 to 1-0. The Tigers are currently riding 5-game winning streak in games played in November, all coming last year. Since 2000, the Tigers are 12-3 in November under Saban. In addition, in November games played in Tiger Stadium, the Tigers are 7-1. The Tigers were 2-1 in November in 2000, 3-0 in 2001, 2-2 in 2002 and 4-0 in 2003. Alabama is the only team to beat LSU in Tiger Stadium in November under Saban. The Crimson Tide posted a 31-0 win over LSU in Baton Rouge on Nov. 16, 2002.

Tigers To Honor Fallen Seniors With T-Shirt

LSU players will honor their three fallen seniors by wearing a t-shirt under their jerseys on game day. The t-shirts feature the jerseys of the three injured seniors - #13 **Steve Mares** (broken leg), #34 **Dorsett Buckels** (torn ACL), and #55 **Ben Wilkerson** (ruptured patella tendon). The t-shirt also features a quote from Wilkerson stating, "I'm going to walk off this field", which is what he uttered to his teammates moments following his career-ending injury against Vanderbilt. Wilkerson did indeed walk off the Tiger Stadium field despite having a ruptured patella tendon in his left knee. The t-shirt also has a quote from Muhammad Ali, saying "champions don't belong on the ground".

Tigers To Go Without Wilkerson; O-Line To Wear #55 Decal On Helmets

LSU C **Ben Wilkerson** had his season (and collegiate career) come to an abrupt halt against Vanderbilt as he ruptured the patella tendon in his left knee against the Commodores. Wilkerson started 41 games at center during his career with LSU going 33-8 in those games. Dating back to the 2001 season (Wilkerson's first with the Tigers), he had started 41 of LSU's last 44 games with the Tigers going 33-8 over that span. **Rudy Niswanger**, a junior with a 4.0 grade point average, will start in Wilkerson's place. Members of the LSU offensive line will wear a #55 decal on their helmets to honor Wilkerson for the remainder of the season.

Tigers Move Up To No. 3 In Nation In Total Defense; 10th in Scoring Defense

By holding Alabama to 10 points and 192 yards of offense, LSU moved up a spot to No. 3 in the nation in total defense, allowing 249.8 yards per game. The Tigers also moved into the top 10 in scoring defense, allowing only 15.2 points per game. The Tigers rank fourth in the country in pass defense at 149.9 yards per game and they're first in the SEC and 11th in the nation in rushing defense at 99.9 yards per game. Last year, LSU ranked first in the nation in scoring defense (11.0 points per game), and total defense (252.0 yards per game).

LSU's Scoring Defense Average Misleading

While the Tigers are allowing 15.2 points per game, that number is not truly indicative of the type of defense that LSU has put on the field this season. Consider that of the 17 touchdowns LSU has allowed in 2004, 8 have come on drives of 40 yards or less, including 6 of 25 yards or less and 4 of 10 yards or less (5 and 3 yard vs. Florida; 10 and 2 yards vs. Troy). On the other hand, LSU's defense has only yielded one scoring drive of 80-yards or more and that came against Vanderbilt (83 yards) in week 8 of the season. Prior to Vanderbilt's 83-yard scoring drive, the longest against LSU this year was a 71-yard drive by Georgia. Last week, Alabama's lone touchdown came on a 53-yard drive.

Taking Note On The Tigers Under Saban

Here is a look at some notable trends for LSU during its first 61 games under **Nick Saban** ... LSU is 38-3 when leading at halftime and 36-3 when leading after three quarters ... The Tigers are 43-3 when scoring 20 or more points and 37-0 when scoring at least 25 points in a game ... On the other hand, the Tigers are 3-12 when failing to reach the 20-point mark ... LSU is 13-3 in games decided by 7 points or less and 6-2 in games decided by 3 points or less ... LSU is 31-1 when holding opponents to fewer than 100 team rushing yards and the Tigers are 20-0 when having a player rush for 100 yards.

Tiger D-Line Comes Up Big Again Vs. Alabama

LSU's defensive line continues to come up big for the Tigers as DE **Marcus Spears**, DT **Claude Wroten** and DT **Kyle Williams** combined for 23 tackles, 6 tackles for losses, 4 sacks and 6 QB hurries vs. Alabama. Against Alabama, Wroten had 4 tackles for losses and a pair of sacks, while Spears added 2 sacks and 2 tackles for losses. Over the last 3 games, the trio has combined for 10 sacks and 20 tackles for losses.

This Day vs. Night Thing In Tiger Stadium

Myth has it that LSU plays better at night in Tiger Stadium than they do during the day. The facts show that since 1960, LSU is 192-62-4 (.751) at night under the lights compared to a 17-21-3 (.451) mark in Tiger Stadium during the day. Since taking over in 2000, LSU coach **Nick Saban** has guided the Tigers to a 29-5 mark at home. LSU is 23-3 (.880) at night in Tiger Stadium under Saban and they are 6-2 (.750) at home during the day since 2000. Prior to Saban's arrival, LSU had only won 11 games at home during the day in 33 tries. From 1960 to 1999, LSU posted an 11-19-3 (.379) record at home during the day.

That Tiger Stadium Mystique Is Back Under Saban

LSU coach **Nick Saban** has restored the mystique that has made Tiger Stadium one of the toughest places for opposing teams to play. In 4-plus seasons at LSU, Saban has put together a 29-5 mark at home, which includes a 15-4 record in SEC games. LSU finished its 2003 season 6-1 at home after going 6-1 in Tiger Stadium in 2002. Under Saban, the Tigers are 6-2 vs. Top 25 teams in Tiger Stadium.

Tigers Are Bowl-Eligible For Fifth Straight Season

LSU's win over Vanderbilt gave the Tigers their sixth win of the season. In the process, the Tigers are now bowl-eligible for the fifth straight year, which is the longest streak for the school since going to 5 consecutive bowl games from 1984-88.

Tigers Have Kept Opponents To Less Than 20 Points 37 Times Under Saban

By holding Alabama to 10 points last week, the Tigers have limited their opponents to less than 20 points in 37 of the 61 games they have played under **Nick Saban**. Under Saban, the Tigers are 33-4 when holding its opponents to fewer than 20 points. Prior to the Florida game in 2003, LSU had won 18 straight contests when holding its opponent to less than 20 points. That streak dated back to a 14-3 loss to Arkansas in Little Rock in 2000. Of the 37 times that LSU has held its opponent to under 20 points, 21 of those have been when the opponent scored 10 points or less. LSU has also posted five shutouts under Saban, which is the most by any SEC team since 2000.

Skyler Continues To Climb Punt Return Charts

Skyler Green continues his climb up LSU's career punt return charts as he had 3 returns for 38 yards against Alabama, which runs his career total to 629 yards. The 629 yards ranks sixth in school history. Green is currently tied with **Pinky Rohm** and **Tommy Casanova** for the LSU record in career punt returns for TDs with 3. Green returned his third punt for a TD against Vanderbilt with a 65-yard return in week 8. For his career, Green has returned 41 punts for 629 yards and 3 scores. **Domanick Davis** holds the LSU career punt return yardage record with 1,126 yards on 94 returns.

Webster Closing In On LSU Career Interception Mark

With his third quarter interception against Alabama, LSU senior CB **Corey Webster** moved a step closer to the school's career interception mark. For his career, Webster has 16 interceptions, just 4 shy of tying **Mike Williams'** school-record for interceptions at 20. Webster intercepted 7 passes in 2002 and 2003. He has 2 interceptions to his credit this year. Webster tied the school-record for interceptions in a single-game with 3 against Florida in 2002.

LSU's Defense Scores Again

For the third time this year and the 10th time since the start of last season, LSU's defense scored a TD in a game as LB **Cameron Vaughn** picked up a fumble and scampered 8-yards for a score in the third quarter against Alabama. The TD proved to be the winning points for the Tigers as it gave LSU a 13-10 lead. LSU went on to win 26-10. It's the first TD for the Tiger defense since the Mississippi State game when **Marcus Spears** intercepted a pass and returned it 35-yards for a touchdown. Against Arkansas State in week 2 of the season, LSU linebacker **Ali Highsmith** intercepted a Nick Noce pass at the ASU 11-yard line and returned it to the 1-yard line where he fumbled, which was picked up by cornerback **Travis Daniels**, who walked into the endzone for the score. Last year, the Tigers scored a school-record 7 defensive TDs (5 interception returns, 2 fumble returns).

LSU's Kick Coverage Units Have Been Tremendous

LSU's coverage on both punts and kickoffs have been outstanding this year as the Tigers rank first in the SEC in both net punt coverage (1.3 average) and kickoff coverage (15.0 average). The longest punt return against LSU this year has been 13 yards and the longest kickoff return against the Tigers has been 34 yards.

Addai Comes Up Big Again, This Time Against Alabama

LSU RB **Joseph Addai** has had a knack for coming up big in key games for the Tigers. Earlier this year, Addai took the Tigers on his back and led them to a win over Florida in Gainesville. Last week, Addai rushed for 99 yards and 1 TD and caught 3 passes for another 46 yards and a score in the 26-10 win over Alabama. The 99 yards marked a career-best for Addai. Among his 99 yards was a 47-yard scoring run in the fourth quarter. Addai also scored on a 35-yard catch-and-run in the third quarter that gave the Tigers a 20-10 lead. Addai currently leads the Tigers with 507 yards rushing.

Expect A Lot of Quarterbacks On Saturday

LSU plays 2 quarterbacks, Ole Miss plays 3 so you may need a roster to tell which player is behind center when the Tigers and the Rebels meet on Saturday. For most of the year, the Tigers have gone with a 2-quarterback system. In the last 2 games, redshirt freshman **JaMarcus Russell** was first on the field for the Tigers, with **Marcus Randall** providing the relief. In 9 games, Randall has connected on 80 of 128 passes for 992 yards and 7 TDs, while Russell is 55 of 110 for 859 yards and 7 scores.

Another Fourth-Quarter Comeback

LSU's comeback from a 20-17 deficit late in the fourth quarter to beat Troy represents the eighth time, including three in 2004, that LSU has rallied to win games under **Nick Saban** despite trailing in the final quarter. Earlier this year, LSU rallied from a 15-7 fourth quarter deficit to force overtime against Oregon State before eventually beating the Beavers, 22-21. In consecutive games, LSU came from 21-17 down to beat Florida, 24-21 and then the Tigers rallied from a 20-17 deficit to beat Troy. Prior to Oregon State win, the last time the Tigers rallied to win in the fourth quarter came against Kentucky in 2002 when **Marcus Randall** connected with **Devery Henderson** on a 75-yard TD pass as time expired for a 33-30 LSU win. Over the 8 fourth-quarter comeback wins for the Tigers since 2000, Randall has been involved in 5 as he threw the game winning TD against Kentucky and Ole Miss in 2002 and then ran for the game-winning score against Oregon State in overtime. The following is a look at LSU's other fourth quarter comebacks under Saban that resulted in a victory for the Tigers:

One thing is certain about the LSU offense and that's the Tigers have a loaded backfield that includes juniors **Joseph Addai** and **Shyrone Carey** along with sophomores **Alley Broussard** and **Justin Vincent**. The Tigers have 3 running backs in its backfield that have a 100-yard game to their credit with Vincent leading the way with 6 career 100-yard games. Broussard has 2 career 100-yard games, while Carey has done it once. LSU is also 1 yard away from having four players with 100-yard games as Addai has rushed for as many as 99 yards in a game, but he's never topped the 100-yard mark. LSU's four running backs of Vincent, Broussard, Addai and Carey have combined to rush for 4,075 yards and 38 TDs.

Randall 6-6 As LSU's Starting QB; 4-0 As A Reliever

Marcus Randall ran his record as a relief quarterback to 4-0 as he came off the bench to help the Tigers to a 26-10 win over Alabama. This year, Randall has come off the bench to lead the Tigers to wins over Florida and Vanderbilt. His other relief victory came against Ole Miss in 2002. As a starter, Randall is 6-6, which includes a 4-2 mark in 2004 and a 2-4 record in 2002.

5 Turnovers + 19 Yards = 31 Points

It may look like bad math, but that's what 5 of LSU's turnovers resulted in against Florida and Troy. Florida and Troy took 5 LSU turnovers, drove a total of 19 yards on offense and still wound up with 31 points off of those turnovers. Florida had TD drives of 5 and 3 yards against LSU and then Troy followed that with TD drives of 10 and 2 yards. Troy also drove minus 1-yards and still managed to kick a second quarter field goal following an LSU interception that the Trojans returned to the LSU 7-yard line.

Tigers Have Surrendered Only 10 Second Half Points Over Last 4 Games

More proof that LSU's defense tends to get stronger as the game wears on, LSU has only surrendered 10 second half points over the last 8 second half quarters they've played. Dating back to the Florida game, LSU has now pitched second half shutouts against the Gators, Vanderbilt and Alabama. Since then, only Troy has scored in the second half against the Tigers as they put up 10 points in the final two quarters against the Tigers. This year, LSU is allowing only 5.2 points in the second half compared to 9.3 in the first half.

Turnovers Haven't Been Kind To LSU

Turnovers have been a problem for LSU through 9 games as the Tigers have turned the ball over 22 times, compared to just 16 takeaways by the Tiger defense. Of LSU's 21 turnovers, 14 have been fumbles, with the other 8 being interceptions. In addition, of LSU's 22 turnovers, 14 have come on the short side of the field and 7 have resulted in eventual touchdowns for the opponent. Florida and Georgia each scored 14 points off of LSU's turnovers, while Troy scored 17 of its 20 points off of turnovers.

LSU's Sack Streak At 34 Straight Games

With 4 sacks against Alabama, LSU ran its streak of games with at least one sack to 34 straight. The streak dates all the way back to the Miami (Ohio) game in 2002 when the Tigers sacked Ben Roethlisberger three times. Since then, LSU has had at least one sack in every game, which includes all 14 games in 2003. This year, through 9 games, the Tigers have 26 sacks that have accounted for 197-yards in losses. **Marcus Spears** leads the Tigers with 5 sacks, while **Kyle Williams** and **Claude Wroten** each have 4 sacks.

Bowe and Davis A Nice 1-2 Sophomore Punch At Receiver

LSU sophomores **Dwayne Bowe** and **Craig Davis** have teamed to give the Tigers a nice 1-2 punch at wide-out. Through 9 games, the duo has combined to catch 62 passes for 962 yards and 6 TDs. Davis leads the Tigers with 34 receptions for 540 yards and 1 TD, while Bowe has 28 catches for 422 yards and a team-best 5 TDs.

15 Tigers Have Caught Passes In 2004

A trademark of a **Jimbo Fisher**-offense is that of spreading the ball around. Through 9 games, the Tigers have done a lot of spreading it around as 15 different players have been on the receiving end of passes. Of the 15 players who have caught passes, 7 are wide receivers, 4 are running backs and 4 are tight ends. **Craig Davis** leads all receivers with 34 catches, **Joseph Addai** is tops among running backs with 18 catches and **David Jones** leads the tight ends with 6 receptions, including the game-winner against Troy.

Whitworth's The Rock On Tiger O-Line

LSU OT **Andrew Whitworth** will carry a streak of 36 straight starts on the Tiger offensive line into the Ole Miss game. Whitworth has started every game that he's played during his career, which includes 13 as a red-shirt freshman in 2002, 14 last year as a sophomore and 8 in 2004.

13 True Freshmen Have Seen Action So Far

With **Luke Sanders** seeing action against Troy, the Tigers have now had 13 true freshmen see action in 2004. The true freshmen who have seen action for the Tigers this year include LB **Luke Sanders**, LB **Ali Highsmith**, FB **Jacob Hester**, WR **Early Doucet**, DT **Glen Dorsey**, DB **Chevis Jackson**, WR **Xavier Carter**, OL **Brett Helms**, OL **Herman Johnson**, TE **Mit Cole**, DE **Charles Alexander**, DB **Craig Steltz** and HOLD **Joe Lawrence**. Doucet, Dorsey and Hester have played in all 9 games for the Tigers.

4 True Frosh Have Started For The Tigers In 2004

Early Doucet added his name to the list of true freshman starters for the Tigers this year when he was part of LSU's 4-wide set to open the game against Troy. Other true freshmen who have started this year include **Jacob Hester** at fullback, **Glen Dorsey** at defensive tackle and **Ali Highsmith** at linebacker.

11 Different Tigers Have Scored On Offense in 2004

Last year, LSU had 12 different players score offensive touchdowns all year. This year, through 8 games, the Tigers have had 12 players reach the endzone for a score on offense. Five different players have rushed for a score this year, while the Tigers have had 7 different receivers score. **Alley Broussard** leads the Tigers with 6 rushing TDs, while **Dwayne Bowe** is tops among receivers with 5 catches for scores. Spears Has Been Dominating Over Last 3 Games

LSU DE **Marcus Spears** has been dominating over the last 3 games as he's recorded 21 tackles, 10 tackles for losses and 4 sacks since the Troy game. Spears had 9 tackles, 6 of which went for losses, and pair of sacks vs. Troy. He followed that with 4 tackles, including 2 tackles for losses against Vanderbilt. Then against Alabama, Spears had 8 tackles, 2 tackles for losses, 2 sacks and a forced fumble against Alabama. For the year, Spears has 35 tackles, 12 tackles for losses, 5 sacks, 15 QB hurries. He's also returned an interception 35 yards for a TD against Mississippi State.

Randall Has Career Night Against Troy

LSU QB **Marcus Randall** set career-highs for completions (24) and passing yards (328) in the 24-20 win over Troy. The 24 completions bettered his previous career-high of 19 set against Texas in the 2003 Cotton Bowl, while the 328 yards passing surpassed the 264 yards he passed for against Kentucky in 2002. The 328 yards also marked the 14th-highest passing game in LSU history and it was the most by a Tiger quarterback since **Rohan Davey** threw for 444 yards against Illinois in the Sugar Bowl on Jan. 1, 2002.

Randall Leads Tigers To Another Fourth Quarter Comeback

Marcus Randall has already etched his name into Tiger football lore as the quarterback who was on the throwing end of the "Bluegrass Miracle", the 75-yard TD pass to **Devery Henderson** as time expired to beat Kentucky, 33-30, in 2002. In consecutive games in 2004, Randall led the Tigers to back-to-back fourth quarter comebacks. He did it against Florida on Oct. 9, leading the Tigers from a 14-0 first quarter deficit to a 24-21 win. Against the Gators, Randall guided the Tigers on a 6-play, 50-yard drive, culminating with a 10-yard TD pass to **Joseph Addai** for the winning points with only 27 seconds left. Then, against Troy on Oct. 23, Randall led the Tigers on a 4-play, 54-yard drive with just over 2 minutes left in the game for a 24-20 win over Troy. It marks the 4th fourth quarter comeback that Randall has directed during his career with the Tigers. The other came against Ole Miss in 2002 when Randall led LSU to a 14-13 win over the Rebels in Tiger Stadium.

Russell In Elite Company

With a pair of TD passes in each of his first two games in an LSU uniform, **JaMarcus Russell** did something that hasn't been done at the school since at least 1970. As far as detailed records account, Russell is the first LSU quarterback to toss at least 2 touchdown passes in his first two games as a Tiger. The only player since 1970 that came close was **Tommy Hodson**, who threw for a pair of TDs in his debut against Texas A&M in 1986. Hodson didn't throw any TD passes the following week in a 21-12 loss to Miami (Ohio).

Tigers Reach 50-Point Mark Again

For the fourth time in the last two seasons, LSU reached the 50-point mark with a 51-0 win over Mississippi State. The 51 points came just two weeks after the Tigers racked up 53 points in a 53-3 victory over Arkansas State. Last year, the Tigers beat Arizona, 53-13, and Arkansas, 55-24. In all, the Tigers have scored 50 points in a game five times under **Nick Saban**. The first time came in Saban's debut at LSU as the Tigers rolled to a 58-0 win over Western Carolina to open the 2000 season.

LSU Ranks Ninth In Active NFL Players

With 33 former Tigers on active NFL rosters, LSU ranks ninth among all schools with former players currently in the NFL. Miami tops the list with 43 followed by Florida State with 39. Notre Dame and Tennessee are next with 38, followed by Florida, Georgia and Ohio State with 36. Michigan is next with 35, then LSU at 33.

Wroten Named SEC Def. Lineman of the Week For Game Against Vanderbilt

LSU DT **Claude Wroten** played his best game in an LSU uniform against Vanderbilt with 6 tackles, including 3 resulting in 9-yards in losses against the Commodores. Wroten also added a pair of sacks, forced a fumble and had 4 quarterback hurries for the Tigers. Of Wroten's 6 tackles, 5 were solo stops. For his effort, Wroten earned SEC Defensive Lineman of the Week honors.

Randall Named SEC Player of the Week For Performance Against Florida

LSU senior quarterback **Marcus Randall** earned SEC Offensive Player of the Week on Oct. 11 after leading the Tigers to a 24-21 fourth-quarter comeback win over 12th-ranked Florida. For the game, Randall connected on 18 of 27 passes for 198 yards and two touchdowns, including the game-winner with 27 seconds left. Randall also rushed for 46 yards on 10 carries in the game. The 18 completions were one shy of tying his career best of 19 set against Texas in the Cotton Bowl. With the Tigers trailing 21-17 late in the fourth quarter, Randall, who has also engineered fourth quarter comeback wins over Ole Miss and Kentucky during his career, guided the Tigers on a 6-play, 50-yard drive during the final two minutes of the contest to beat the Gators. Randall clinched the comeback with a 10-yard TD pass to **Joseph Addai** with only 27 seconds left in the contest. The SEC Player of the Week honor is the second of Randall's career. He was named SEC Player of the Week in 2002 after leading the Tigers to a 14-13 win over Ole Miss on Nov. 23.

Webster Named SEC Defensive POW Following Win Over Miss. State

LSU CB **Corey Webster** earned SEC Defensive Player of the Week following his performance in the 51-0 win over Mississippi State. Webster, a senior from Vacherie, La., recorded two tackles, had an interception, forced a fumble and recovered a fumble in the Tiger shutout of the Bulldogs. Webster did most of his damage in the first quarter as he forced and recovered a fumble that led to LSU's second touchdown of the game. Three possessions later, Webster intercepted an Omarr Conner pass at the LSU 30-yard line. The Tigers scored seven plays later for a 20-0 lead.

• LSU began playing football in Tiger Stadium in 1924 and is currently in its 81st year in the venerable stadium on SATURDAY NIGHT.

• Under Nick Saban, the Tigers have posted a 29-5 HOME RECORD, including a 6-2 mark against ranked opponents. Against conference foes, Saban is 14-4 in Death Valley. In home games at night, LSU is 21-3 since Saban took over.

• LSU has won 17 OF ITS LAST 19 games at home, including a current nine-game winning streak.

• More than 85,000 FANS have attended each of LSU's last 33 home games. In that span, the Tigers have eclipsed the 90,000 mark 23 times, including a school-record 92,251 for the Sept. 20, 2003 game that pitted No. 10 LSU against No. 7 Georgia. The Tigers won the game 17-10.

• Since national attendance figures began being kept in 1957, LSU has ranked in the top 20 all 45 seasons. The Tigers have been in the top 15 for 43 of the 45 years and in the top 10 on 37 occasions, including 32 straight from 1957-88. Fourteen times, LSU has ranked in the TOP FIVE IN THE NATION, including the last three.

• Since 1960, LSU owns a stellar 192-62-4 (.751) record in traditional Tiger Stadium night games. On the other hand, the Tigers are just 17-21-3 (.451) at home during the day in that span.

• Death Valley is the SIXTH LARGEST on-campus stadium in the nation holding 91,600 fans.

Earthquake Game

October 8, 1988. Tommy Hodson connected with Eddie Fuller on 4-and-10 with 1:41 to play for the game-winning touchdown as LSU upset No. 4 Auburn. The play caused such a thunderous explosion from the crowd of 79,341 that the tremor caused by the vibrations measured on the seismograph across campus.

Halloween Night

October 31, 1959. No. 1 LSU trailed No. 3 Ole Miss, 3-0, late in the fourth quarter when Billy Cannon fielded a punt off the bounce at the 11-yard line. He raced 89 yards, careening off seven Rebel defenders, to paydirt to give the Tigers victory and all but clinch the 1959 Heisman Trophy.

LSU Defense Shuts Down Ole Miss and Eli in 17-14 Win

LSU's defense lived up to its billing as one of the nation's best as the Tigers shutdown Eli Manning and Ole Miss in a 17-14 win over the 15th-ranked Rebels in Oxford. For the game, the Tigers held the Rebels to only 227 yards of offense and 22 points below their season average. Ole Miss' defense struck first in the contest, picking off a Matt Mauck pass on LSU's first play from scrimmage and returning it 6-yards for a TD and a 7-0 lead just one minute into the contest. LSU pulled to within 7-3 on a 45-yard field goal by Chris Jackson midway through the first quarter and then took the lead for good on a 9-yard pass from Mauck to Michael Clayton just before halftime. The Tigers stretched the lead to 17-7 early in the fourth quarter on a 53-yard TD pass from Mauck to Devery Henderson. Manning then directed the Rebels on a 9-play, 76-yard scoring drive culminating on a 10-yard TD pass from Brandon Jacobs to pull to within 17-14 with 10:51 left. After Ole Miss missed a 36-yard field goal that would have tied the game with 4:15 left, the Tigers went three-and-out on their next possession, turning the ball back over to Rebels. The Tiger defense came up big again, forcing three incomplete passes by Manning before a blitz tripped up the Rebel quarterback on fourth-and-10, turning the ball back over to the Tigers with 1:50 to go. The Tigers ran the clock down to nine seconds before giving Ole Miss one more shot. Manning's desperation pass was knocked down at midfield as time expired.

Pair of QBs Lead LSU To 22-21 OT Win Over Oregon State

JaMarcus Russell started the comeback and then Marcus Randall finished it as the Tigers rallied from an 8-point deficit with less than two minutes remaining to force overtime and eventually beat Oregon State, 22-21, in Tiger Stadium in the season-opener for both teams. Trailing 9-0 at halftime, Russell replaced an ineffective Randall and pulled the Tigers to within 9-7 late in the third quarter on a 16-yard TD pass to Skyler Green. OSU answered with a 9-play, 65-yard drive to extend its margin to 15-7. The score remained that way until Russell rallied the Tigers on a 4-play, 64-yard drive capped with a 38-yard TD strike to Dwayne Bowe. Russell then converted the two-point conversion to tie the score at 15-15 with just over a minute left. In overtime and with Russell out with cramps, Randall returned to the field and scored on a 5-yard run to give LSU its first lead at 22-15. OSU followed with a TD of its own, however the extra-point attempt sailed wide right, the third missed PAT for the Beavers, and the Tigers escaped with a 22-21 win. For the game, Russell completed 9 of 26 passes for 145 yards and 2 TDs, while Randall was 7 of 18 for 66 yards and 1 interception. Vincent led the Tigers with 48 yards rushing, while Bowe caught 5 passes for 103 yards and a score.

Justin Vincent rushed for 102 yards and 2 TDs and three LSU quarterbacks combined to hit on 12 of 20 passes for 210 yards and 3 scores as the Tigers rolled to a 53-3 win over Arkansas State in Tiger Stadium. LSU wasted little time in establishing itself as the dominant team as the Tigers took the opening kickoff and marched 54 yards in 6 plays for a 7-0 lead following a 5-yard TD run by Vincent just two minutes into the contest. Auburn Scores Late To Hand LSU A 10-9 Defeat

Jason Campbell connected with Courtney Taylor on a 16-yard TD pass with just over a minute left to lift 14th-ranked Auburn to a 10-9 win over No. 4 LSU. The victory by Auburn snapped LSU's 10-game winning streak, one that dated back to a 33-7 win over South Carolina last October. The Auburn TD capped a contest that saw the LSU defense hold Auburn in check, limiting the Tigers to just 301 yards of offense, including only 131 yards on the ground. The LSU defense held Auburn's running back tandem of Carnell Williams (75 yards) and Ronnie Brown (67 yards) to 142 combined yards, 70 yards below their season average. LSU appeared to be in good shape early in the contest, taking the opening kickoff and marching 80 yards on 14 plays for a 6-0 lead following a Marcus Randall 9-yard TD pass to Dwayne Bowe. LSU's Ryan Gaudet pushed the PAT wide right, a point that would come back to haunt LSU. Auburn responded with a 14-play drive of its own that ended with a field goal. LSU, with JaMarcus Russell at QB, answered right back, going 55 yards on eight plays, capped with a 42-yard Chris Jackson field goal. That's all the scoring either team would get until the final minutes of the contest. LSU did have its chances in the second half, getting inside the Auburn 35-yard line twice, but the Tigers failed to capitalize on the opportunity. Alley Broussard led all running back with 84 yards on 10 carries, while Randall and Russell combined to hit on 12 of 28 passes for 168 yards and a TD.

Tigers Score Early And Often In 51-0 Rout Of Mississippi State

Alley Broussard scored a career-best 3 TDs, all in the first 17 minutes of the game, as the Tigers racked up 599 yards of offense in rolling to a 51-0 win over Mississippi State in Tiger Stadium. LSU set the tone early in the contest going 74 yards on 7 plays, five of which were runs, for a 7-0 lead just three minutes into the game. Following a MSU fumble on its first possession, the Tigers need only 6 plays to go 18 yards for a 14-0 lead midway through the first quarter. From there, the route was on as the Tigers built a 27-0 lead early in the second quarter following a 35-yard interception return for a TD by Marcus Spears. LSU led 34-0 at halftime. In the second half, the Tigers stretched the margin to 41-0 on an 8-yard run by QB JaMarcus Russell and then 48-0 on a 67-yard TD reception by Xavier Carter. For the contest, LSU picked up 31 first downs, while limiting MSU to just 7. LSU also held MSU to only 130 yards of offense, while intercepting a season-high 4 passes. The 51-point margin of victory was the biggest by LSU in an SEC game since a 61-6 win over Mississippi State in 1969. It was also LSU's first shutout since a 42-0 win over Mississippi State in 2001.

Greene Passes Georgia Past LSU, 45-16

David Greene threw 5 touchdown passes as third-ranked Georgia, behind a pair of first half LSU turnovers, raced out to a 24-0 lead midway through the second quarter and never looked back in a 45-16 win over the Tigers in Athens. Trailing 24-0, LSU mounted a rally that pulled the Tigers to within 24-10 at half-time. First, JaMarcus Russell guided the Tigers on a 7-play, 80-yard drive, capped with an 18-yard TD strike to Dwayne Bow with 1:23 left before halftime. After holding Georgia to three plays and out on its next series, the Tigers quickly moved 24 yards in two plays setting up a 31-yard field goal by Chris Jackson as time expired in the first half pulling LSU to within 24-10. With an apparent momentum swing towards LSU, the Tigers got the ball to start the second half and moved all the way to the UGA 34-yard line before the drive stalled out. From there, LSU could muster little offense as the Bulldogs stretched their lead to 31-10 at the 5:12 mark on a Greene-to-Fred Gibson pass. LSU wouldn't get any closer the rest of the way. The Tigers did close the contest with an 8-play, 80-yard TD drive engineered by QB Marcus Randall. For the contest, LSU managed only 314 yards of offense, compared to 430 for the Bulldogs. Russell led LSU by hitting on 9 of 17 passes for 131 yards and 1 TD, while Alley Broussard rushed for 45 yards in his first career start.

Randall, Addai Lead Tigers Past Florida, 24-21

Marcus Randall came off the bench to rally LSU from a 14-0 first quarter deficit to beat 12th-ranked Florida, 24-21, in Gainesville. Down 21-17 with just over two minutes left in the contest, Randall guided the Tigers on a 6-play, 50-yard drive, capped with a 10-yard scoring pass to Joseph Addai, for the come-from-behind win for the Tigers. Trailing 14-0 following a pair of first quarter interceptions that led to Florida scoring drives of 5 and 3-yards, Randall took over for an injured JaMarcus Russell. Randall pulled the Tigers to within 21-14 at half-time after engineering a pair of 80-yard scoring drives. Alley Broussard got the Tigers to within 14-7 on a 1-yard plunge early in the second quarter. Florida extended its lead to 21-7 with just over a minute left in the first half, before Randall engineered a 7-play, 80-yard drive, capped with a 15-yard TD pass to Early Doucet with 12 seconds left in the first half. Chris Jackson kicked a 47-yard field goal in the third quarter to get the Tigers to within 21-17 before a fourth quarter defensive struggle paved the way for LSU's last-minute come-back against the Gators. For the game, Randall connected on 18 of 27 passes for 198 and 2 TDs, while Addai led the Tigers with 93 yards rushing. Addai also caught 4 passes for 26 yards, including the game-winner. Offensively, the Tigers put up 464 yards (210 rushing, 254 passing) compared to just 236 (94 rushing, 142 passing) for the Gators.

Randall's Fourth Quarter Heroics Lifts LSU Past Troy, 24-20

Marcus Randall hit David Jones with a 30-yard TD pass with just over two minutes left, lifting LSU to a 24-20 come-from-behind win over Troy in Tiger Stadium. The Randall-to-Jones TD marked the third time this year that LSU has come from behind in the fourth quarter to win a game. The game-winning TD came less than two minutes after Troy had taken a 20-17 lead on a 24-yard FG by Greg Whibbs. LSU's **Xavier Carter** setup the Tigers' game-winning scoring drive with a 37-yard kickoff return to the LSU 47-yard line. LSU appeared to have picked up where they left off against Florida, taking the opening kickoff and going 79-yards on 9 plays for the game's first points, a 1-yard run by **Alley Broussard**. However, three first half turnovers by the Tigers kept Troy in the game as the Trojans had to only go 20 yards for their first TD and then went backwards a yard for a FG following another LSU turnover. Despite the first half miscues, LSU led 17-10 at halftime. Troy tied the game at 17-17 midway through the third quarter after another LSU turnover resulted in a just a 2-play, 2-yard scoring drive for the Trojans. The scored remained that way until Whibbs' go-ahead field goal late in the fourth quarter. Randall led the Tigers by connecting on 24 of 37 passes for a career-best 328 yards and 1 TD. Defensively, **Marcus Spears** had 9 tackles, including 6 for losses and a pair of sacks as LSU limited Troy to only 150 yards of offense.

Defense, Running Game Leads LSU Past Alabama, 27-10

LSU's defense scored for the third time in 2004 and the Tigers rushed for 192 yards against the nation's No. 1 rated defense in the 26-10 win over Alabama. Trailing 10-6 at halftime, DE Marcus Spears sacked Spencer Pennington deep in Alabama territory forcing a fumble that LB Cameron Vaughn picked up and ran 8 yards for the go-ahead score. Leading 13-10, the Tigers increased the margin to 20-10 on a 35-yard TD pass from JaMarcus Russell to Joseph Addai with 9:38 left in the contest. Addai capped the scoring with a 47-yard run with just over 4 minutes left in the contest. In what was projected as a defensive battle, the Tigers got the upper hand, holding the Crimson Tide to just 196 yards of offense, which included just 82 yards on the ground. The Tigers also intercepted a pass in the game, that coming by Corey Webster in the endzone that thwarted an Alabama drive that could have put the Crimson Tide up 11 early in the third quarter. Instead, Webster returned the interception 44 yards, switching both the momentum of the game as well as the field position into LSU's favor. For the game, Addai led the Tigers with 99 yards rushing, while Alley Broussard added 84 yards for LSU. Defensively, Spears paced a Tiger attack with 8 tackles, 2 sacks, 2 QB hurries and a forced fumble.
